This combination of existing eiements may lead to far reaching changes in liberal arts education on this continent The extremity of the small coilege may result in a more wide curriculum which offers a maximum in personal developmen and discipline.

The "Great Books" system of liberal education breaks with he general trend toward professionalized arts courses and is therefore called radical, while at the same time it represents
