Predictions often prove the source which originates that good or evil which is realized in their final accomplishment. To create misfortune, it is only necessary to anticipate it by a constant recourse to the nature of those fearful forebodings which too often hasten its premature birth.

In view of the above remarks, it cannot be doubted that there exists at the present moment no little apprehension on the nature of an anticipated outbreak, or insurrectionary movement, in England, favored by that great Occasion of national interests which has drawn together the vast assemblage now congregated in the City of London.

The intimation given by the Duke of Wellington some months ago, that it was expedient to increase the military force of the Metropolis, at least during the time of the Exhibition, was no obscure intimation of that spirit of prophecy to which we have alluded.

London journals have also adverted to the subject, and in referring to the objects contemplated by such a commotion, and the means likely to be employed for its success, have, we think, given a notoriety to the matter which might (if there be really such a design) essentially aid the projectors of so mad and unprincipled a scheme.

It is not natural to suppose there will be occasional tremors around the Crystal Palace during the great Exhibition. That feeling of jealousy looking to the results of national competition, the bustle and turmoil inseparable from such a vast concourse, and the countless throng of adventurers, in the shape of thieves, gamblers, and pick-pockets, will all combine to produce those temporary commotions common among all similar assemblages.

With regard to any revolutionary movements by these dissatisfied political elements, who are now traversing many portions of Europe with a view to the extermination of certain existing Governments, we think there is not the slightest cause for alarm—at least on the shores of England.
