The Papal Aggression Bill has indee majority; but its inadequacy to meet either the gain the scattered elements of discord, which hreaten to tear the Church asunder, or to bring about an harmonious action amongst those to whom the nce of our pure national faith is specially onfided-furnishes but too well-grounded hat the present Ministers are not destined to carry out this great work to any successful consumn tion. If we quit the confines of religious contro versy, and enter the arena of polifics, we find the ontending parties almost equally matched. With decreasing majorities, the Whigs find them selves unequal either " to ignore" the claims of by the Wastern window, in front of which is the Protectionists, backed by a formidable united earty, or to venture upon any scheme of finance, legal, commercial, or social improveme which they can hope to carry through Parlie Their Budget may, by good luck, become emadied into law, but at every successive stage of the Bills necessary to carry it out, the opposition will harrass them, and never allow them to forget that the slight difference of only 13 votes preserves the entire Budget from being rejected altogether The proposed Chancery Reform Bill is doomed Lord Lyndhurst has dealt its death blow.
