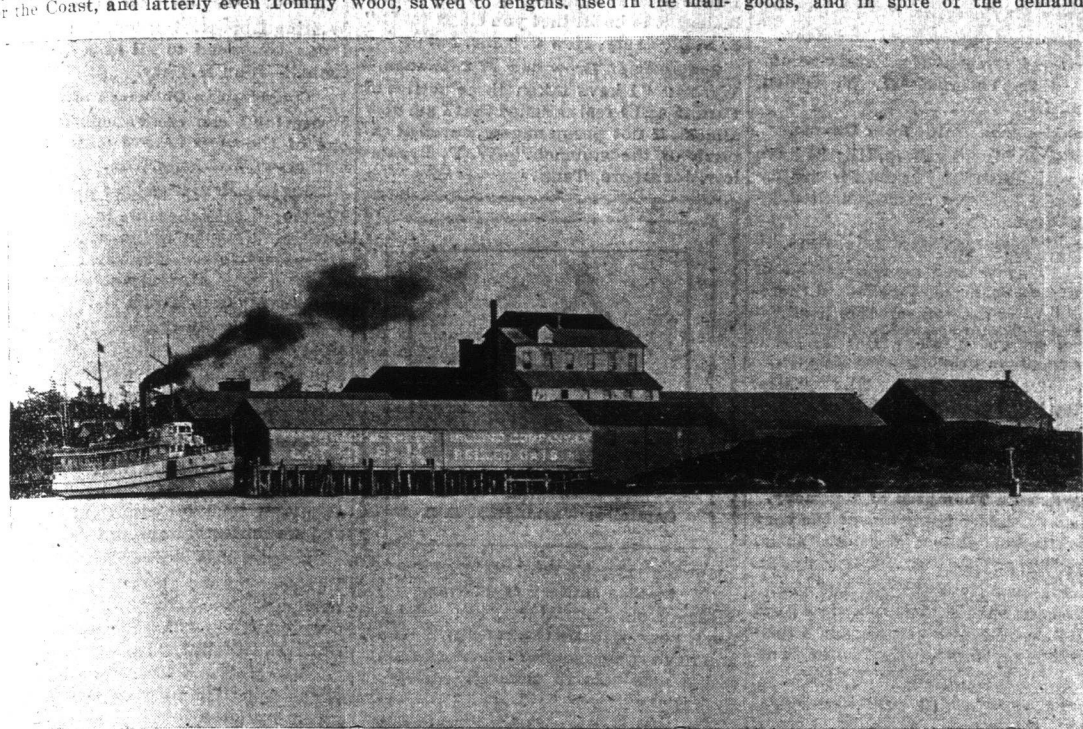

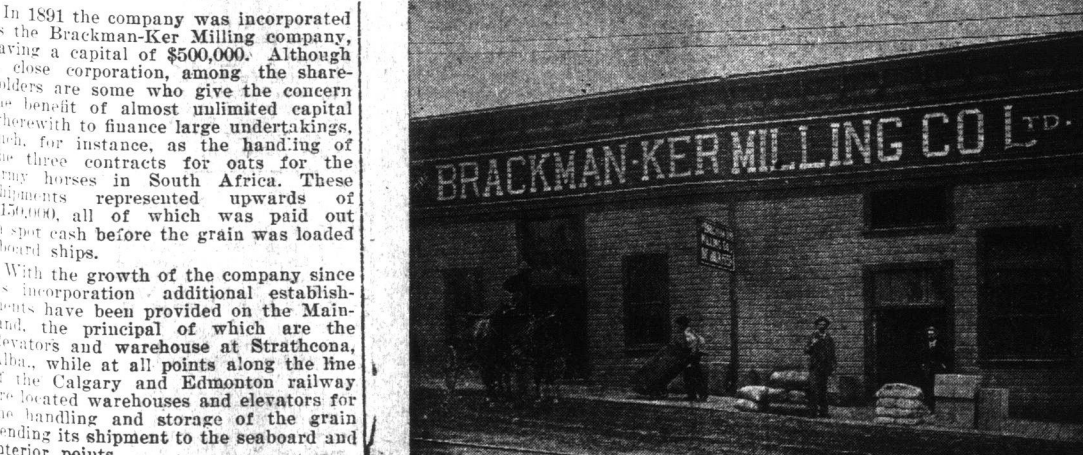

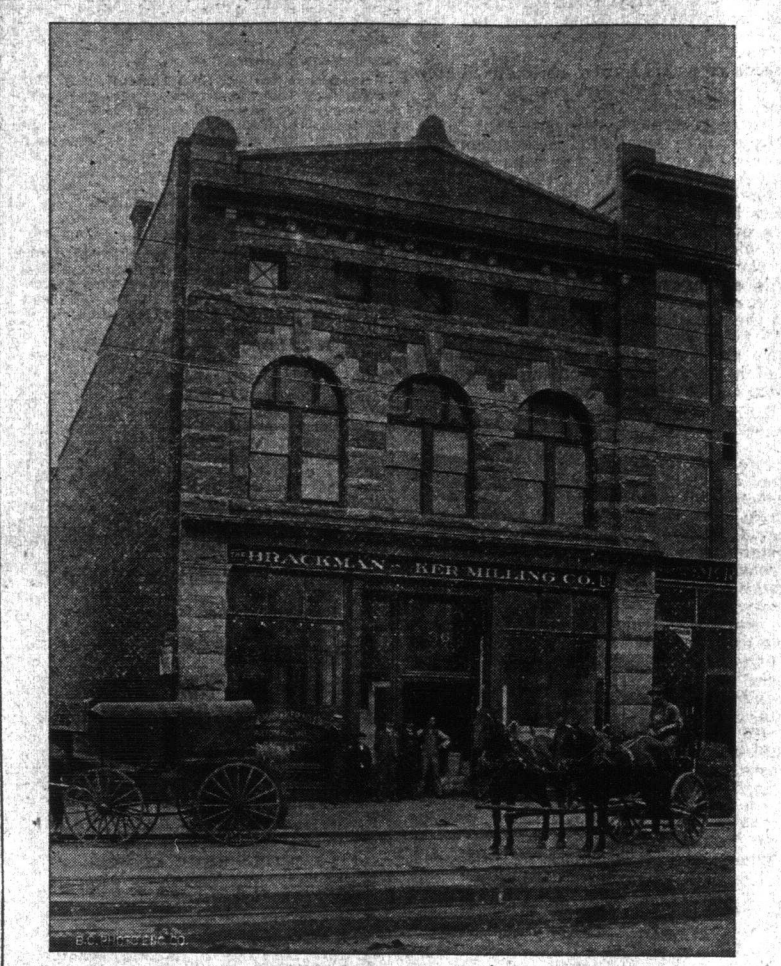

WAREHOUSE AT NELSON, B. C.

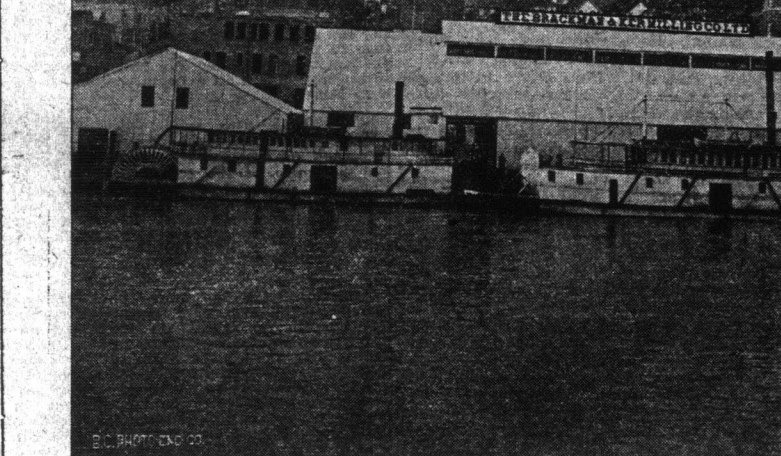

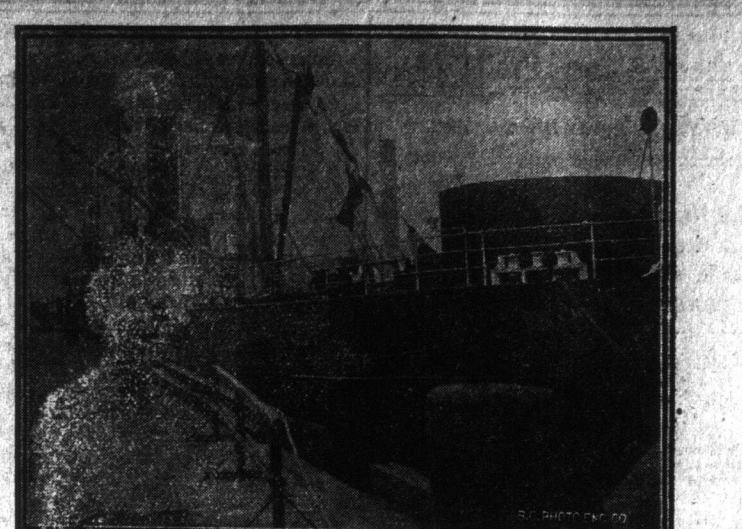
TEAMS LOADING AT BRACKMAN-KER CO.'S MILLS.
