Berlin, Oct. 26 .- Chancellor von Caprivi has handed his resignation to the Emperor. Count Zueulenburg, President of the Ministerial Council, has also re-

signed. Dr. Miquel, Prussian Finance Minister, has been appointed President of the Coun-cil. Prince von Hohenlohe-Shillingsfurst Governor of Alsace-Lorraine, was offered the Chancellorship, but declined. Be-

the Chancellorship, but declined, Be-fore offering the Chancellorship to Prince Hohenlohe, Emperor William con-sulted with the envoys from Bavaria, Wurtemburg, Saxony and Baden. It is reported that Prince Hohenlohe declin-ed the office owing to his age. The Emperor has summoned Gen. Count Wal-dersee, the political soldier, who was conspicuous in the final intrigues against Bismarck. The general inference is that he intends to make him Caprivi's suc-cessor. Should Waldersee become Chan-cellor, the office of Prussian Premier probably would be given him shortly, and thus the division of the two posts, which was effected at the time of the School bill crisis, would be ended. There is a rumor that Gen. Bronsart von Sch-ollendrof is a candidate for the Prus-sian Premiership and the Chancellorship. Either of these generals would be ac-ceptable to the Conservatives, who have become totally estranged from the Government under the Caprivi re-gime. fore offering the Chancellorship
