#### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

Orders for white pine lumber show no falling off, dealers and consumers apparently having entered the market with a determination to fully replenish broken stocks. Although some of the new cut is in shipping condition, this has had no perceptible effect upon prices, which continue firm, while one or two of the higher grades exhibit indications of an early advance. There is little probability that lower prices will rule for pine lumber for some months to come, and if the present favorable conditions continue, lower prices need not be expected this year. Georgian Bay manufacturers report many inquiries for stock for shipment to Michigan. The disastrous fire at French river has taken out of the market about 15,000,000 feet of pine, a circumstance which cannot be ignored. In the city of Ottawa the strike of carpenters has given a set-back to the lumber trade, but negotiations are now under way which are likely to result in an early settlement of the difficulties. The lath market continues strong. The present prices, although not as high as those which ruled two years ago, should stimulate production this year, and the supply will doubtless become greater as the season advances.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Considering that the foreign demand for lumber is exceptionally dull, the shipments so far this season from Quebec have made a favorable showing. During the past month one firm has shipped from Montreal 30,000,000

feet of lumber. The best grades of pine and spruce deals are in demand, but the production of the Maritime Provinces, which is of a lower grade, is moving slowly. An average quantity of clapboards, laths and cedar shingles are being shipped to the Eastern States. Some of the small manufacturers are still cutting the price of shingles, and sales have been made at \$2.80 for extras on Boston rate of freight, but the average quotation is about \$2.90, and \$2.60 for clears. Recent rains have improved the outlook for the drives, but all the danger is not yet past.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

Recent rains throughout Manitoba and the Territories have improved the crop outlook and the lumber trade in sympathy. Building is particularly brisk in Winnipeg, the amount of work under way being much greater than at the same time last year. Indications point to a good demand for lumber throughout the summer and fall. British Columbia manufacturers report a moderate demand for lumber and shingles, although so far this spring the quantity of shingles disposed of in Manitoba and the Territories has been below the average. The demand from Ontario has been fairly good. Recent lumber charters would seem to indicate an improvement in the export trade.

UNITED STATES.

The crop reports issued by the United States Government have been of the most encouraging nature, and have assisted in maintaining the strength of the lumber market. The developments of the past week have been along the line of further improvement; the demand is increasing; lumber of last year's cut is decidedly scarce. Statistics compiled by the secretary of the Mississippi Valley Lumbermen's Association show that the shipments of northern pine lumber during the month of May were 21 per cent. greater than the shipments of the corresponding month one year ago. Buffalo, Tonawanda and other distributing centres report heavy shipments to the Eastern States. Some of the lower grades of pine were recently advanced in price, which advance is being maintained and likely to prevail for some time. The Ashland Lumber Company, of Ashland, Wis., recently sold 1,500,000 feet of white pine to eastern parties, for immediate shipment, and it is

said that part of the lumber brought a higher price than the company had ever received for the same grade heretofore. The new list of the Chicago lumber dealers went into effect on June 3rd. It makes an advance of 50 cents on stock boards and siding, and one dollar on box boards. These facts clearly indicate the trend of the white pine market. In spruce the position seems equally strong, one of the main factors of strength being the hanging up of the east branch drive on the Penobscot river and the consequent shutting down of a number of mills at Bangor. Hardwoods are selling a little more freely. A scarcity of dry basswood is announced in many directions, as very little of the new cut is yet in shipping condition. The manufacturers of Michigan maple are endeavoring to unify their interests and prices of this lumber may be benefited thereby. At present culls are selling at from \$5 to \$7 at the mill, common at \$10 to \$12, and firsts and seconds at \$15 to \$17. Stocks of shingles and lath do not seem to accumulate, and the market is firm.

GREAT BRITAIN.

In giving a correct impression of the position of the British timber market, it cannot be stated that there has been any visible improvement; in fact, the likelihood of an improvement seems more remote than ever. Timber brokers and merchants are advising shippers to exercise the utmost precaution in making consignments, so as to give the market an opportunity to recover. The chief reason of the depression is the large stock held at most of the leading ports. The returns of the Surrey Commercial Docks, London, show that the stock of deals is 1,000,000 pieces greater than at the corresponding date one year ago; in other words, the present supply is sufficient for nearly four months, whereas the average supply is about two months. Elsewhere are given figures showing the stock of foreign and Colonial deals at the public docks in London on May 31st for two years, which tell their own story. While prices of pine deals have held firm, the buying has been limited. Spruce prices have continued to decline, excepting first quality 3x9 and 11 inch, 12 feet and up, the supply of which is light. Quebec pine deals of first quality are quoted at \$24 5s to £29 15s per std, a decline of 10s as compared with one month ago. There has been

a similar decline in other grades and a drop of 15s in third quality New Brunswick spruce. Quebec square and waney timber is inquired for, and prices show a tendency to stiffen. Ash has been imported quite largely from the United States.

**STOCKS AND PRICES.**

Warren Copp has cut 800,000 feet of lumber in Pictou county for Rood & McGregor, of New Glasgow, N.S.

Saginaw valley manufacturers have advanced the price of shingles 10 and 15 cents per thousand. At Minneapolis white and red cedars have been advanced about 5 cents

Quotations of cooperage stock at Buffalo are as follows: No. 1 dry elm flour barrel staves, \$7.50 to \$7.75; No. 2, \$4.75 to \$5; basswood heading, 5 3-4 to 6 cents; No. 2, 4 to 4 1-4 cents, coiled hoops, 6 ft., \$7.50 to \$7.75; 5 1-2 ft., \$4 to \$4.50.

The following are the quotations adopted by the Chicago lumber dealers for shingles and laths in carload lots: Extra pine shingles, \$2.75; standard pine, \$2.25; clear pine, \$3; clear cedar, \$7.85; extra cedar, \$2.65; standard cedar, \$2.10; white pine lath, \$2.60; mixed dry, \$3.10; No. 2, \$2.75. In the Lake Superior district green or partially dry lath is selling at \$3.25 to \$3.35 or No. 1 white pine.

Of the London market for Canadian timber Messrs. Denny, Mott & Dickson say: There has been little feature in this market. Waney pine, oak and elm have all been little enquired for; but the small supplies on hand and largely increased cost of next season's supplies cause prices to continue to stiffen, as it seems indisputable that a very modest demand for the rest of the year would more than exhaust the possible supply.

Messrs. S. P. Musson, Son & Company, in their market report of June 8th, refer to the Barbadoes lumber market as follows: Since the "Trad-

er," from Shelburne, N.S., with white pine, which was placed at \$25.75 and \$20.07 for shipping and second quality respectively, there has been no arrival of consequence. A small lot of 10,000 feet has been sold at \$23.65 as it run. The market is virtually bare, and first receipts will do well, although one or two cargoes have been contracted for at \$24 and \$19 customary delivery. In spruce the "F. B. Wade" arrived on the 29th ultimo, from West Dublin, with a lot of 22,000 feet, which was sent in vessel to Trinidad, and on the 30th the "J. K. Dawson" arrived from same port to our address with 250,000 feet. The crop being so nearly over, and dealers being unwilling in the present position to carry much stock, the most we could obtain was \$17.05 and \$13.05 for shipping and second quality respectively; and we doubt if next receipts will bring these prices.

By the recent fire in the Conger Lumber Company's yard at Parry Sound, Ont., Hames & Company, of Buffalo, lost 1,000,000 lath, and the Saginaw Lumber & Salt Company about \$2,000 worth of lumber. The heaviest losers were the Skillings, Whitneys & Barnes Company.

**FIRES**

The saw mill situated at Port Arthur, Ont., owned by Seaman & Company, was last week destroyed by fire.

The saw mill of R. M. Sully at Venosta, Ont., was burned a few days ago.

Fire was discovered in the lumber yard of the Sumner Company at Bathurst, N.B., on the 16th inst. The mills were saved, but lumber to the value of nearly \$60,000 was destroyed.

Practically all the lumber in the yards of the Ontario Lumber Company at French river, Ont., was destroyed by fire on the 16th inst. The lumber, about 15,000,000 ft., was owned by the Ontario Lumber Co., and represented nearly an entire season's cut. It is understood that the loss is largely covered by insurance. The saw mill and other buildings were saved.

**THE LIVERPOOL MARKET.**

The following review of the Liverpool market is given by Farnworth & Jardine: The business of the past month has been unsatisfactory. The arrivals have not been unduly large, and the deliveries have been fair, but buyers lack confidence, and a serious decline in some of the leading articles has taken place. Stocks generally for the season of the year are on the

heavy side, and shippers should act with caution by consigning moderately.

**CANADIAN WOODS.**—Waney Pine.—Of Waney there have been no arrivals, the stock is reduced to a moderate compass, and values are firm. For square there has been only a limited demand, and the stock is sufficient. Red Pine.—The demand is slow; stocks are ample. Oak.—There has been no import; the demand is quiet, but the stock of 1st quality wood is fairly moderate. Elm.—The demand has been disappointing, and the stock for the season of the year is too heavy. Ash.—The import chiefly consists of shipments from the United States, which have been on a large scale; there has been a fair demand, but sales are difficult to effect, and stocks are increasing. Pine Deals.—The arrivals have been considerably in excess of the corresponding month last year; the deliveries have been unsatisfactory, but there is little change in value to report; the stock is too large. Red Pine Deals continue in fair demand, but prices are easier.

**NEW BRUNSWICK AND NOVA SCOTIA SPRUCE AND PINE DEALS**

—The arrivals during the past month have been large, viz., 4,280 standards, against 1,520 standards during the corresponding month last year. The deliveries have been fairly satisfactory, but the stock is much too heavy; sales are difficult to effect, and there has been a sharp decline in value; it is very desirable that shippers should act with caution in consigning moderately until our markets are more settled. Pine deals continue in fair demand; prices are steady; stocks are light.

**BIRCH.**—Of logs, chiefly from Quebec, the arrivals have been small; there has been a fair consumption, but the stock is sufficient; there is little change in value to report. Planks have again come forward too freely, and although the deliveries have been fairly satisfactory, the stock is much too heavy, and recent sales have only been effected at very low prices.
