## MONTREAL, SEPTEMBER 24, 1880.

THE ROYAL AGRICULTURAL COMMISSION.
The report of Messrs. Clare S. Read and Albert Pell, M.P., assistant commissioners to inquire into the agriculture of the United States, has been publisherl. Beyond a reek's stay in Manitoba, the whole of their time was spent in inquiries in the United States, but their report has as much interest for this country as for our southern neighbors. If the basin of the Mississippi contains, exclusive of inland seas, $500,000,000$ of neres, our "fertile bell" in the North.West covers 600,000 square miles of the finest whent land on the American continent; and the advantages accruing to the American farmers as well as the disadvantages which they have to contend with are equally common to us. The report is consequently of much importance to setllers in our North-Western prairie lands.
The difficulties in the way of American farmers are stated by the commissioners with commendable detail. They may be briefly summed up as follows: (1) The cost of growing; (2) The cost of freight to Chicago; (3) The cost of freight to New York and thence to Liverpool. To this, the commissioners add for the future, (1) an increased compensation to the farmer for his present excessive labor; (2) the cost of renewing the perishable farm machinery; (3) the exhaustion of the soil and the cost of annual manuring. The cost of production of a quarter of wheat and its delivery to Liverpool are estimated by the commissioners at 47s. 93d. The details of the various items
entering into their calculation will show the care taken to make it accurate.

The price paid per acre of prairie land, the cultivation required, the cost of manual labor, horse and steam power are set at a sum of $\$ 10$ per acre, including rates and cost of conveying the crops six miles to the local railroad depot or elevator. The yield of wheat in the United States over a long series of years appears to have just exceeded 12 bushels per acre. With that yield, the western famer can deliver from his waggon at the depot without loss at is fod a bushel of 60 pounds, or a quarter of 480 lbs . at 28 s . The transportation of the crop from the local depot or eleva. tor to a shipping port on the Jakes, Chicrgo for instance, is estimated by the conmissioners at (is. Sth. on an arerage per quarter. Coming next to freight, account has been taken of the terms on which grain can be moved intind by lake and camal or by "all rail." The difference be. tween these two modes of trimsportation is considerable, being, on an average of five years. 3.5. 5d. by water, lake ancl canal, and 6s. 10 d . by rail, for a quarter of 480 lbs. The water route heing closed by ice from November to April, about 5 s . 2 d . is the average of the two rates. The difference between the cost of transportation by sail or steam has been on the average of the last five years inconsidejable, and may be placed at 4 s . 9 dd . In addition to the above charges, those for handling and weighing have to be taken into account, as well as the lake insurance, dock and town dues, and porterage at Liverpool, shortage, marine insurance, commission, and interest on money. The sum of all these particulars is as follows :

According to the commissioners' report, the difficulties in the way of American competition with European markets may be said to be insuperable if wheat cannot be landed in Liverpool at less than 48 shillings per quarter, yet last year $15,000,000$ quarters of wheat were shipped to England, and the average of their sale was much below 48 shillings. The difficulties in the future are not discouraging. The increased compensation to the farmaer for his present excessive
labor will be found in the enhanced value of his land when new population settles around him. The cost of renewing the perishable farm machinery is not peculiar to the United States; English farmers have similar expense to incur. The exhaustion of the soil and the cost of ammal manuring will of course increase the expenses of growing whent; but, as the commissioners themselves say, it cannot come immediately. The accumulated vegetable deposits of centuries, and the untold number of grass crops that burn or rot upon the prairies, are not to be exhausted in a fer years.

Of the cost given in the report as to l:uding wheatat Liverpool, more than half is put down for thunsportation. The supposition on which this cost rests is that the figures given are to remain permanent, if not to be increased. When we compare the actual cost of transporta. tion whth what it was fifteen years ago, we find an indication of what the cost will be in the future, becoming always cheaper in cousequence of new improvements in labor-saving machinery, de.

Ten yenrs ago, before the introduction of steel rails, the cost of transporting grain by mal from Chicago to New York was 30 cents per 100 pounds, that being the expenditure made by the railronu company for that service on roads laid with iron rails. At that time the cars could not be loaded with more than ten tons of grain each. In the meantime the steel rails, of which the cost is no greater. now than was the cost of the iron rail ten years ago, have come into general use, and the railroad company can move on steel rails cars containing a greatly increased weight of grain 1000 miles at an actual cost of from 15 cents to 20 cents per 100 pounds. The railroad company, therefore, can now carry 100 pounds of grain at a profit of 50 per cent., and charge no more per 100 pounds than it cost them to perform the same service ten years ago.
At the close of 1881 the Welland Canal will be completed, and propellors will be launched adapted to the transportation of catule from Chicago to Montreal, thence to be transported to ocean vessels. In like manner for six months in the year the same great water route will be open for the transportation of breadstuilis and grain delivered alongside the ocean steamer at $\pi$ rate not exceeding 8 to 10 cents per 100 pounds, Whatever may be the rate to which the lake and canal navigators will lower their freight, the great railroad interest will not hesitate to perform the same service at the same rate. The cost of internal transportation
which within ten years has been reduced fully one-half, will with successive years bo still further reduced, each reduction serving to increase production and render. ing more imperious an exportation at prices low enough to meet the foreign demand.

## COLLECTIOS OF DEBTS

Judging from complaints that we have received from time to time of the want of facility for the collection of debts by country merchants, we should infer that the Act passerl in the last session of the Ontario Legislature, entilled, "An Act to "extencl the jurisdiction and to regulate "the offices of Division Courts," is by no means generally known. There has been always considerable opposition to the legislation intended to protect the interests of creditors, mainly on the ground that it is unvise to encourage merchants to grant credit, and that, if obstacles were placed in the way of recovering their debts, they would be more cautious than they are at present. Such was substantially the view talsen by Mr, J. G. Worts of Toronto, in a paper read before the Toronto Bourd of 'lrade, towards the end of 1875. Mr. Worts seems to have attributed the numerous insolvencies which had taken place chielly to injudicious credits. Mr. Worts advocated, it we are not mistaken, a restriction on suits in Division Courts to debts of $\$ 100$ or over. There is no doubt that there is a great deal of truth in the statement that the credit system has been pushed to an extent that has caused great inconvenience, but the chief cause of the insolvencies from which the country has suffered has been the depreciation in the value of the stocks in trade of the retail merchants, which took place to an extent that was ruinous to merchants with small capitals. Mr. Worts' lecture led to a good deal of discussion at the time, but we have no doubt that the Act of the Ontario Legislature, which was subsequently passed, and the object of which was to grant increased facilities to the creditor class, was in accordance with public opinion.

The principal feature of the new Act is the extension of the jurisdiction of the Division Courts frons $\$ 100$ to $\$ 200$ in cases where "the amount or the original "amount of the claim is ascertained by " the signature of the defendant, or of "the person whom, as executor or "administrator, the defendant repre" sents." The jurisdiction thus extended to ascertained debts has likewise been extended from $\$ 40$ to $\$ 00$, in cuses of claims for damages. Provision has been made for change of venue on the
defendant. obtaining an ordor to that effect from the judge of the County in which the action is brought. There are very important provisions in the new Act for securing the competency of clerks and bailifts, and for enguiring into complaints against them, which were veiy numerous under the old systrm of appointment. The provision mate for the inspection of the bools and Court papers will, it may be hoped, secure uniformity in the system. It will likewise be the duty of the inspector to see that lawful fees only are tavel and allowed as costs. The Act of last sessim is certainly a great' improvement on the former one, and throws a great responsibility on the executive. We think, however, that it is far from improbable that before very long the District Courts will be abolished, which, as an appeal is provided for the Division Courts in all cases of $\$ 100$ and upwards, can hardly be considered necessary.

## GRAPHIC COMPANY:

The adjourned meeting of the sharehollers of the Graphic Company was held on Tuesday, the 2lst instant, at the office of the Company, to consider the expediency of accepting the Act passed by the Quebec Legislature at its last session, the object of which was to reduce the capital stock, and to capitalize the arrears of interest due to the preferential shareholders. It will be recollected that a day or two prior to the former meeting called for the same purpose, early in August, it was announced in the papers that actions had been instituted both against the Company and the directors by a Mr. Russell of New York, who bolds in trust certain shares of first preference stock formerly owned by Mr. Dugald J. Bannatyne, one of the original directors of the Company, and who continued on the Board until he transferred his stock to a trustee. The directors had already determined to propose an ad. journment of the meeting in accordance with the desire of several shareholders, but it was evident from the attendance of Mr. Macmaster at the meeting, he having obtained a qualification a few days previously, that the object was to obstruct the proceedings. It was stated in Mr. Macmas ter's presence that there was no intention to proceed with the actions, but this, of course, was denied. It was, naturally anticipated that declarations would be served without unnecessary delay, but until the very day before the meeting no step was taken by the plaintiti. On thal day a letter was sent to the
secrelary, announcing that an injunction would be applierl for that day to restrain the sharehoiders from accepting the Act of the Legislature, and accordingly such application was made to Judge Rainville on the ground that the act interfered with the vested rights of the petitioner. Mr. Bethune, Q.C., appeared for the Graphic Company, and showed that the B. N. A. Act gave the local Legislatures exclusive jurisdiction over all cases aflecting property and civil rights in the Province, and that the Court had no jurishliction to adjudicate on the provisions of the Act, the power of the Legislature being supreme. The petition was dismissed, Judge Rainville stating that his brother judges whom he had consulted concurred in his decision. At the meeting on Tuesduy the President, Sir Francis Hincks having stated its object, two resolutions were proposed, one for the reduction of the capital stock from 7500 shares to 5000 , the other for the capitalization of the arrears of interest. 'lhe first was moved by George Steplien, Esq., and seconded by J. L. Morris, Esg., and the second was moved by C. Geddes, Esq., and seconded by D. R. Stodart, Esq. On á ballot beingtaken, there were more than two thirds of the aggregate votes in favor of the resolutions and not one in the negative.

Tue Pacieic Rahway.-We observe that the Pacific Railway is still likely to be a bone of contention between the rival political parties. There is as yet insufficient information in possession of the public to justily any positive expression of opinion as to the merits of the schame. We confess that we are not surprised that the syndicate that has been formed consists chiefly of persons connected with Canada and the United States, and that the manarement will be in their hands. We shall take an early opportunity of noticing the chief points in controversy by the political journals.

## THE BANK STATEMENTS.

The usual monthly returns of the asseta and liabilities of the Chartered Banks have been published unusually early this month, but we regret to have again to complain of the very reprehensible delay in furnishing the Dominion note returns, which are much more simple, and have to be furnished by only five agencies, all of which should be able to render them at Ottawa by the 5 th or 6 th of the month. 'Ihese returns ought to be furnished concurrently with those of the Banks. The Bank returns show an increase both in circulation and in deposits. The amount
due by agencies in forejgn countries has been reduced by nearly will millions, while the discounts have been increased by about $1 \frac{1}{2}$ millions. Moncy continues abundant, and the rate of interest low. The Government has been alvised to reduce its rate of interest, but that would be a questionable policy. It is the in. terest of the Govermment to oblain all the money it can at 4 per cent., and if it was to drive its repositors atway it might be dillicult to induce them to come back. ## THE DOMLNON EXHIBITION.

"Canadu's Greatest Exhibition," which has been open to the public in the spacious grommes in Hount Royal Park during the past ten days, will be closed this (Friday) evening. The Duminion Exhibition has been beld at Montreal thia year for the first time, and notwithishading many disadvantages our citizens have ndmirably succeded in their indefatigable eflorts to render it a most musual success. For obvious reasons the daily attendmace of sight seers thring the first week was not very large; the Toronto Induatrial show was still open, rud active preparations were in progress for the appronching Provincind Exhibition nt Hamilion, and other Western Fall Fatiss, besides the public annomecement that the agriculamal and live stuck exhibit would not be complete matil the format opening of the Exhibition by His Excellency the Governor General. This tuok plate on tuesdiy aftemoon last, when the margaiticent btildings umi spucions fair grounds presented a scene not easily efliced from the memory. The number ot people of all sorts and condtions, from all parts of this contiueat, Lhere paeked together, has been variously estimnited from 30,000 to 100,000 , but facts go to show that these are extreme figures, and that the tuth lay half way hetween. The Goveraor Genemal having replied to a sumble matress, risited the dilferent departments of the Great Exhibition, but, not anlike everybody else, found it impossible to satisfy himself that day, and has made two visits since. Ahthongh doubtless the largest mumber of strangers in the city at one lime was on 'Inesday, extraordinmry crowds have flocked to the Dominion show every day since, and many citizens who delayed their Visit mitil after the uncomfortable " jam," were forced to despair. Herein may be traced the trisdom of the energetic citizens' committee in providing ran atmost endless programbe of oulside altractions, all of which were carried out with renarlable sucesss. These inchoded a fine art gallery exhibition in Phillips sq., horticultumanad fruit show, dog and pet stock show, concerts, national society games and anausements, horse races, lhurosse tournmment, electric light excursions, magnilicent torpedo display (illastrating the modern system of warfare), illuminating the mountain by lengal hights, and the linbor by variegated colored lights, unequalled displays of fireworks, milithry toreh light'procession, fire brigade review, daily balloon ascensions, by Proi, Grimley,
New York, piano recitala, bud music in public
squares, etc. These uncommon attractions donbtess infuenced the stay in the city of thousauds of visitors, to the financial advaninge of our merchants and otber business men. But it is with the more practical fretures of the show that the Joursal of Commeres has to do. The weather during the greater part of the time was delightfil. Our limited amount of space prevents our giving an extended account of the numerous exhibits, or the prize list; our chicf aim is merely to notice briethy some of the leading features of the colossal whibition which evince the progress made in the quality and variety of Canmdian manufactures, or which may suggest improvements for the tature. Those who also attedded the Turonto show slate that die exfibit of live. stock here, while ereditable as regards quality, Was compatatively small. 'Lhis may be accomated for, probnbly, by the fact of the two whibitions being leld at the same time; had this been nvoided, doubtless many more exhibitors at the western fair wonld bave come here thso. The arrangement of the different chasses of horses here in statls was bad, oceasioning a great deal of conftision. The display of agrienlumal implements for steam or horse power, in the centre of the gronnds, was a highly credituhle one, and inchaded various machines embudying unmistakeable improvements, but the Whole dxhibit contained such at variely of articles usefuland interesting in the main only to husbandmen, that the avemge visitor passed on my io the Urystal Palace or Industrial Hall, without stopping to examine. The erection of a shed over the implements, which sloould nlso be in motion by stema power, to keep pace with the times, is a needed improvenent.
Ong entering the main buidiag, the eye is coufronted with a scenc of varied attractions, which is bewidering. Attention, however, is almost irresistiny drawn to the pianoplatform, n handsemely carpeted square to the leth. The Sew lout Compmy made a tine exhibit, inclu. ding the squate nind upright Weber Grands, Hate's square and upright makes, another manwactured by a German, and one by themselves. L. E. N. Pritte, of this city, was the only exhibitor of liuropean, American and Candian organs and pianos, lus carried off no fever than uine prizes: Hazelton Syuate Piano, lst Extra prive ; Framich o Bach, Square Piano, 2nd Exat prize ; Hers, of Paris, Uprirht Piano 1st Extra prize ; Hazelton Upright Piano, Ist dipluma, Church Urgan (Recds), Dominion Orgun Co, lst prize; Cabinet Orgau, Dominion Organ Cn., 1st diphomat Trunk Organ, Dominiun Urgan $\mathrm{Co}_{\mathrm{a}}$, Ist diptoma; Church Organ (K:n'ms \& Cu., Woodstock), ist diploma; Oremsteal Organ, Alexnoder; of Paris, lst Ex.

Among the other piano extsibitors were Iteintamat, Toronto, Thomas, Hamilton, and Wm. Bell \& Co., Guelph. THE FAULKNER GUARAN'PEF CLATM.
In the Court of Queen's Bench, this cily, last Friday, judgment was rendered in the prolonged case of the Citizens Iusurance Co., appeliants, and the Grand Trunk Ruilway Co., respondents.

The catse as cited was stated to be "an action by the Grand Trank Railway Co. on a guamatee policy of insurance." The condition of tho poliey as elamed is that one Fatuliner should honesily, diligently and fithfully discharge and transnet the duties devolving upon him in his employment by the saic compmay, phatiths "and that"he, the sitid David Fankner, should faiblally accomm for and pay over to the said malluay compary all such money" de., "he shonld receive for or fiom the sutd company." The breach is that Fubliner had received $\$ 22$, 489.65 of the money of the company, and that he hat not fathifully accounted for or paid over nay portion of said stum except 5412.6 . The thets are hat Fitulkner drew he money from the Bunk of Bontreal on the 2end Jtwe, 1877, at litale before 12 o'elock; that the carried the money in two bars 10 his oftee in Jacques Cartier Square, in a buiking used by phaintift, nnd laving oceasion to go out to his hameh, he placed the two bigs under his desk, locked the door of his roon, nud went ont. When he returned in twenty minutes or half an hour after, he fond the door unlocked; that the bag with the totes in it had been opened, and all the moncy, except a $\$ 10$ lill, whieh lias fallen on the flour, had bech carried off. The batg with the siver was untouched."
"The insurance company, appellants, contend that Famkner has finthfully recounted for the whole money which was stolen in his absence, and that it them was may negligence it, was on the paty of the railway contmeny; which did not provide him with the proper means of preserving the money entrusted to his cure, and, consequenty, hat compnay defendant is not liable. It may at once be said that the company phaintill has never alleged, am does not contend lat Fralkner is gulty of dishonesty in the mater. His antecedents and his conduct at the time of the transaction repel any suspicion of the sort. But the policy warrants his naigence and fidelity. Did he use all the cutre it man dealing with so latge a sum of money ought to have used? Gould he have taken greater precautions under the circumtaken greater brecautions under the circum-
stances? It seents to us he did not exercise common prudence in leaving this harge sum of money under the table, in what may almost be called an open room, for it was a badly fastened dout on a common stair wilhont my gumbian, and lenving the buildug. Agnin, we find nothing to slow that the Grand Trunk RaitWay Company, by its artangements, either ordered or stmetioned such a proceeding. It evilently was not necessary. He could have placed the money in the vami down stairs, it he had liked,-he could easily hure phaced it in the galvanized iron box,-he need not have drawn it frum the bate till after his lanch, and above all he might lave sent ont for his lunch, or done wihhout it. Jle was, therefore, guilty of negligence, nad we think the judrment shomat be contimed." This wis the numimons judgment of the Court.
The Citiaens Insurance Co. intend appealing the ease to the l'rivy Council.

An mpontant sum, involving a clam of several milliuns of dollars' world of stock in the St. Path, Minneapolis \& Mititoba Railway Cumpany, was decided by the Supreme Vourt recently. More than a year ago J. P. Farley, Receiver of the St. Pam \& Pacitic Rond, brought suat against the St. Panh, Minneaphis Manituha Cumpuny, J. J. Hill nud N. W. Kittson, Directors tor the possession of one-fifth of the Company. The St. Patul, Minneapolis © Manitoba is successor to the St. Patul E Pacife, and was reorganized by Hill and kituson, in company with Messris. Geo. Slephen, R. B. Anerus and other Montreal capitalists, who thraished the mones. The enterprise las been enormuosly prolitable. Betore the Ganadim blan was conceived Parley, Hill and Kittson contrived a plan for the reorganizntion of a road similar to that afterward carried out. There wits dificulty in obtaining money for the execation of this phan, however, and while it was pending, Hill atud Kittson found the Canadian paty who would put money in the scheme, only on condition of their sharing actively in ths execution. Accordingly the Farley plan was dropped, and be with it, and the Company formed and orgraized the road with the mones of the doncreal party. Farley then sued for one-tifth of the stock in the new company on the grotud that he was one of the originators of the phan which made the stock valuable. Jue Supreme Court now decides, that, though Farley hati a right to st share in the fruits of the original scheme, II ill and Kitisun conld not jusily absadon him and place themselves in competition with that scheme go long as there was a reasomathe chance of its sucecse; yet that its nbolition through the fallure to borrow money for its execution of any of the parties to the contrace left them free to enter no urranrement with any one else. This is what Hill and Kittson did with Stephen and Smith. The Court decided that this act was proven and Iegal, nad that. Farley had no riglat to object to it, and no claim of interest in the profits of the armagement. This takes a serious embarrasment on of the path of the new Company.

## GENERAL MAREETS.

Thensdax Sept. 29, 1880.
The Fall business is progressingisatisfuctority, and the experience in this market during the past week has in most instances been equal to experfations. The Dominion Exhibition attracted a latger crowd to the eity than has been wimess ad here atone time for many years, and trale, both wholesale and retail, more especially the bater, has derived considerable impular from the presence of so many visitors. The busituess week was bruken by the formal opening of the Great Exhibition by the Governor General on hast luesday, which was observed as a holiday by many of the large business men, who closed np to allow their employees to wituess the sights; the unmerous attractions of the Citizens' Committee programme Lus also tended to interrupt business, but the general country store-kecper was here from every purt of our glurions Dominion. Our reporter could trace him in nearly every warelouse ho bas entered duting the past two days. His purchases were not large, bat they spread over a great variety of branches of commerce. Jhis sorting-up trade constitutes the leading feature, perhaps, of the week's business. The export movement of farmand dairy produce is slow as yet, but will likely become more active as the season advances, and the home and foreign matkets work more harmoniously.
The lucal financial position has not umdergone any notuworthy chauge during the week. Where is au inerensed confidence in the future, but no materinlly incrensed demand as yet for accommodation, which is offered so freely and at such reasonable rates by the banks. The demand usual at this season for money to move the crops has not yet began to make itself felt, and rates of discount, therefore, have not been affected, still ranging from 6 to 7 per cent, for commercial paper, as to mome and date, an exception being mude in favor of prime short dittes. Call and short dated loans on good collaterals are made at 3 to 4 and time loans at 4 to 5 per cent., as to circumstunces Sterling Exchange rules dall at 8 g to $8 \ddagger$ prem. for round amonnts, and $8 \%$ to st do crsh over the counter. Dralts on New York are drawn at $1-16$ to $\frac{1}{8}$ prem. The share market hits been developing more strength since our last reference, and an average advance of 2 per cent. has been gained for all the leading speculative securities. Among the minor class, we notice that the Cornwall Cotton Cos'. stock is partaking of the general improvements; shares of the company which were offered last fiall at 10 to $12 d$ are now wanted at 90 , and are still 'adrancing. $\$ 50$ shares changed hamds the other day at 90 per cent., and S 10,000 of the Company's bonds sold to-day at par. The opiaion was expressed that after the immense rise of last month some reaction was inevitable: but with prosperity and cheap "money during the coming winter, which are almost absolute certainties and with banks and lonn socicties reducing their rates of interest, the demand cannot fail to be sufticienty strong to sustain prices. During the present week only one session per day
of the Local Stock Exchange is held. 'The receipts of wheat in Ubicago hate been gradually increashig during the week, until yesterlay 150,000 bushels was reported, and the market sold down to 92 EL . Uctober, mad 92 c c. November, closing at 9 za c. October aud 93 c . Novenber. There is still an impression among the trade in the West that the famous Keene has gone into the whent deal again this year, Oorn is also reported lower in Chicago, year, Oorn is also reporten
at abower in 40 c . Octuber, and 4 ic . Nuvember. In the local grain market there seems to be no transactions of importance taking place. Yesterday $a$ few ears of No. 2 Cunidia spring wheat changel hands at 5.17 and $\$ 1.10$ was bid for n lot of No. 2 Canada red winter to arrive, but the seller refused to set a price upon it. A cargo of No. 2 Toledo red wiater was offered at SLOTh and a cargo wi No. 1 white Michigan ut 51.08 . Uorn is ensier and lower being offered to arrive at 52c. Pease are steady at 85 c to 8 bc in cargo lote to arrive, but it is believed that prices will recede. A lot of 100,000 bushels was ollered yesterday at S0c for delivery between October 5th and Norember 12th, sellers' option. Rye is quoted at 85c in cargo lots and 821 c in cars. Barley is steady at 65 c 20 70 c . In seeds there is no charge; limothy is still quoted at $\$ 2.3 \mathrm{~s}$ to S2.85, and clover at $\$ 4.75$ 10 55 , as to size of lot. The demand for flour in this market is very quiet, and prices rule steady, and but sliphtly changed, in buyers' favor, since the date of our last report. Superior Exira has sold in small lots at $\$ 5.25$, Extra at 55.172 , Strong Bakers' at $\$ 6.25$, and medium at $\$ 5.60$. Oataseal is rather easier $;$ sales reported at $\$ 4.30$.

'the factories are all still very busy closing up back orders in hand. Fall parcels have been for the most part shipped, and as it is yet too early for repent orders, no large sales are expected to be made until after the tavellers stami out on their sorting up trip, during next month. Payments so far this month lave been very fair, rad show an improvement over several previous months in this respect. No change in prices expected until spring samples are sent out in December.

Cattle.-The market on Monday last was somewhat overcrowded, and consequently a number of animals remuined unsold. The public Liverpool cable is now queted at 64 .

Duy Goans.-Wrade bas continued good on the whole, some houses being busier than others, but all report numerous country customers in the mulset, as the result of the cheap excursions and Dominion Exhibition. Purchases, however, liave been uniformly small, as these retail dealers report that the faill tamio in the country bas not yet been filly opened, owing chiefly to firmers not having marketed mach of their grain. Several of our dealers state that they have already sold 25 per cent. more goods this year than last, and mennwitle orders are merely for sorting-up parcels of fall and winter wear. Remittances continue satisfactory. The wincey questiou has been settled for the time being by a letter from the Department of Gustoms at Ottawn returning the samples forwarded by the Dry Guods Association, and instructug the oflicers here to charge the additional duty of $7 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{e}$ pre lb only on $A$ berdeen winceys, or such goods as contain part wool.

The bulk of the stock receives has been inferior, and sold at from $\$ 1$ to $\$ 1.25$ per barrel. Penches.-Rpceipts yesterdny were about 500 haskets; Cling Stones sold at 75 c , and Free Stones ai Sl.25. Peurs are much more plentiful, and under a gond demand are selling at $\$ 5$ to $\$ 6$ per brl; the offerings are quite large. The season is uver for Rartletts. Grapes are very. scarce during the past three days; Concords worth 5c; Delawares, 6c, and Rogers, 7e per 1b

No phams in the murket．Lemons：very scarce at \＄6 per box．The first shipment of sweet lla－ vann Oranges are expected to arrive here on Saturday next．

Funs．－Trade for the past week is reported rather active；a large number of buyers，at－ tracted to the city by the Dominion Exlibition and cheap excursions，have been selecting their fall and winter stocks of manufactured fars， hats，ete．A few bought largely，but purchatses were generally light，sullicient to meet reguire－ ments until the visit of travellers on their sort－ ing－np trip in November．The mannatenrers here are all very busy filling the bahance of fill orders for furs，the majority of which are usually shipued between ine lohh sieptember and las Normber．It is too carly get for any repori of raw furs，as the skins are not expected $t 0$ come forward matil late in November，nbont the time of the commencement of eold weather． Remittances good．

Mamwain and Iron．－The wholesale houses have been very busy since our lust mference． Visitors to the Exhibition have been purchasing small sorting－up pareels of all kiads of genemh hardware，mat this，logether with the orders now being recerved finn tavellers in the west， has impartad tresh life and activity for the moment；one or two houses netually reported thet they were behind with their opders．So specmintive sules，lamever，are to be noted， the demand being fitir and legilimate，with remithances reported fiestochass．Pricess ure still maintaned at last week＇s guthations， but the fact of bensy groots being laid down in Western Camadian cities by the stemaship nod railway companies almost ats cheaply us in Montreal places importers here at a disulvan－ tage in having tomed the vestern congretition． consequently the upwated movement in callucs is necessarily slower than it otherwise might be．Bur lron is reported in aclive demant，as westera manufacturers ate now layiter in their winter supplies，and one or two large tots have changed hands at quotations．In Pig lrom there is very litule doing here as yet，but lower purices in New York have somewhat aflected this market，and sules of round lors could not now be made except at r reduction．
Hides and Skins．－Receipts of green hides in this market continue very fair，and prices are nominally onchangert．The demand con－ tinues fully equal to the supply，and the local tanner frequentiy refered to in these columns continues to offer 0 oce per cut．more to butchers than other dealers，and to a sulect tew he puys even ！le．yer lb．；yet he admits that he hias had to relinquish a number of hatchers，who have gone to other denters，or pay lic．a！ round，which he refuses to do．He complains that he will lose 50 to 75 bides this week，on account of the butchers prefering to sell to deaters who inspect thair own hites instend of prying the Governmeut inspector，as prescribed by law．The offerings of shecpskins continue fairly large，but all are wanted，at firmprices， ranging from 85 c ．to $\$ \mathrm{Bl}$ ，aceording to size and quality．

Leatier．－Trade during the past week has been rather disappointing to dealers，who expected increased activity but found it not． The demand from shoe mandiacturers has fallen off somewhat，and sales have beea for the most part of a retatl chancter．A good many counary merchants have been in the market，but their phrchases were confined to rmall lots of sole lenther，calfskins and harness． It is believed that the shoe manulacturers are holding back until the sorting－up demand commences to be felt more effectumily，when they will undoubtedly be compelled to stock up．Prices remain lirm and unchanged．Re－ nittances continue good．

Phovisions．－Business bas been fairly active during the week．Mess Pork has been moving
of freely at former quotations，and the market rules very firm．Lurd is quiet and stendy at 120 to 12je for Fuirbanks＇；wo lots of b00 pails were sold yesterday at lec．Rags have been mather more active this week，and prices have ulvanced fot to 2 c ，being now quoted at lise to 14c ；the market to－day rules stendy．fhams．－ Stocks held here very light indeed，and the de－ mand is only small．Sales to the local trade are reported at 122 c to 1 Be，for Canndu Smoked． Amerienn Canvassed are very scarce nud high， quoted at 732 c to 1 dc ．The latger relail grocers quollad these prices，but they ate regarded as being too high for consumers genernlly．

Satr－lhas been in moderate request in this market during the week，but the season is now well adranced，consequently the amouat of busi－ ness dune is not as large as for some previons weeks．Prices are somewhat lower，Liverpool contre behy now quoted at 53c．And 55 c ．for elevens and tens，respectively；and factury filled at goc．to \＄1 per bag．Eureka still worth 3゙2．

Wines and Liguons．－The market at lime of Writing is quiet，ulhongh merehmis hare had a busy week filling small orders tor numerous country store keepers．No large transetions have been theard of in this market for some time，and quobations remain unchanged．A trade sale held leree to－day wha well atuended， imal satisfactory pricts were realized．

IVouh－－The home matket continues without famation，and the few sales that are made here are within a smatl compatss and at unchanged quotations．Cabrada pulled is ghoted at 30 c wide．In foreign wools there is no movement whatever reporten，but buyers chaim to have the best of the situation，ama a change in prices is expected to take effect shority，A report of the New Fork murket says：＂Business has not been very active thus far this week，and the general latacket appetrs to have madergone little or wo change，with fow features worthy of note．The increased anmmion at buston last week is reflected here $m$ n showing of somewhat greater tirmbess amontr holders，and possibly a more carefal ollering on the part of a fer who were previmsly mither inchmed to push businesz，the numet showing a somewhat gheatier tonc than early in the mamb．Mant－ facturers，hovever，lave scarcoly been repre－ semed in sullicient numb． $\mathrm{P} s$ to hithee any great amome of animation，and the stronger fope of business to come is the principal gain made． It is likely that the wamb of a fint ressortment in the hatuds of our denlers may tend in a mea－ sure to keep buyers awity to some extent，but． Whether the possibility of finding sute will bring in larger quantities ramains to be seen， As lor some time pasi，carpet wouls rule quite strong，in view of the smatl supply here and small adidions expected tor some the to come． Combry holders of all kinds of stucti remain tirn atad contident．
