At a Meeting of the Board of the Roman Catholic School Commissioners of the City of Montreal, held the 22nd August, 1877, it was

RESOLVED :—That henceforth the Principals of Schools under the control of this Board, be instructed to open no Class unless a *minimum* of **TEN QUALIFIED PUPILS** present themselves to attend the same.
