THE TRADE QUESTION.

The trade question as between Canada and the United States is up again with a mighty insistence. There is an international commission now sitting in Quebec seeking to settle it. The people of Canada are represented in these negotiations by a Government that, when out of office, declared that they as a party were for "continental free trade," "unlimited reciprocity," "commercial union."

First, that they are determined to maintain Canada as a separate political entity on this continent, independent of the United States, the government of which (Canada) is based on the British constitutional system as against the republican polity of our neighbors. That is more than anything else to us.

Next, that we intend, if any trade preference is to be shown, that it be shown in the large measure and with the widest liberality toward the Mother Country. Third, that we can get along very well without any kind of reciprocity with the United States. That certain kinds of reciprocity may be extremely dangerous to our political and commercial independence.
