High Constable Moe of Sherbrooke, Que., Was Astonished at Lawrence, Massachusetts ON SEEING HUDELL AND BROOKS.

The Letter is Charged With a Double Murder and the Former as an Accomplice. Sherbrooke, Que., Aug. 13.—Last week the police authorities here received information from the authorities at Dover, N.H., that they had three men under arrest for burglary, and suggested that one or more of them might be of the Sherbrooke jail-breakers.

The High Constable, Mr. Moe, went to look them over, but none of the trio were those sought for. However, in looking at the other prisoners in custody at Lawrence, Mass., where the burglars were jailed, he was astonished to find among them Danville burglars, who disappeared from April Jail here, where they were awaiting trial for burglary at Danville. Brooks was awaiting trial for the charge of a double murder, and Huddell was held as an accomplice. It appears that on July 15th while on the railroad track at Dover, they came into a station with two gentlemen who were accompanied by Indians.
