At Present the Most Active Centre Outside the Lake of the Woods is the Saw Bill Region—Work Going Ahead at Hawk Bay—Good Reports of the Fox—Transportation Facilities—Ten Thousand People Will Go Into the Algoma District This Season.

Mr. George T. Marks, Mayor of Port Arthur, left for home on Saturday evening, after spending several days in Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal and Kingston, looking after the interests of the proposed Rainy River Railway and the legislation asked from the Ontario Government by the town which he is chief magistrate.

At Hawk Bay the mining operations have been vigorously pushed, and the vein looks and assays well. New buildings have been erected, and a complete plant has been installed. A mill will not be erected until next winter.

putting its money into development into the country without any such experience. Of course it is a hard country, in a way, to prospect because of the immense water stretches. And yet, these very disadvantages are in another way, an advantage, for two reasons: after leaving the C. P. R. can transfer themselves at small intervals of one point to another, cheap prospecting.

In fact, there is no reason why two men should not thus spend the whole summer prospecting in Algoma at an outlay of not more than \$300 or \$400. During the winter, however, if they did not find something that would more than pay them for their small investment of time and money, Mr. Marks, in concluding the interview, said that he looked for great developments in the country between the Rainy Lake and the Mattawan and Attikamegon ranges.

SHELTER FOR HANCOCK.

The Hastings Town Wants a Blast Furnace. The Times of Bancroft, Hastings County, advocates the establishment of iron smelting works at that point. This paper says: "The operation of a blast furnace of 10 tons daily would necessitate the mining of about 40,000 tons of iron ore, and the purchase of 10,000 tons of wood each year. The present market price of green hardwood is \$1.25 per cord and upward. If made into charcoal, which farmers can do and use for their wood which could not otherwise be sold, the weight is reduced from 4000 pounds to about 1000 pounds, and the product, 40 bushels of charcoal, is worth \$2 at any point on the railways, so that it can be hauled 10 miles quite profitably. The annual product would be 15,000 tons of charcoal at a cost of \$12 per ton, as very large quantities of labor in iron mining, cutting wood, burning charcoal and operating the furnace, and would aggregate over \$200,000 each year, four times our present revenue from the cheese industry. Employment would be given to over 300 men and a large number of teams every day in the year."

COAL NEAR WINNIPEG.

Has the Prairie Province a Deposit of the Precious Fuel?—The Tribune.

Says the Winnipeg Tribune: A number of unexplored areas in the west of this province, and in particular, the large undeveloped mining district in the world, and quite capable of supporting a population, engaged in mining and agriculture, equal to that of all the rest of Ontario. Of course, the coal fields in this province are not agricultural lands there, but this is not the case, as there are large tracts of farming lands in this region as the out doors. Though all timbering has been done in the province, because the market that the development of the mines will create will be immense. And further, the farmers of this region may always find employment in the winter for themselves and their teams in transporting supplies from the railways to the mines.

School of Prospecting.
