MANITOBA'S LEGISLATURE. Discontinuance of a Motion of Separation of Schools.

Winnipeg, Jan. 30.—The Legislature of Manitoba was opened this afternoon in the absence, through illness, of Lieutenant-Governor Schull, Chief Justice Taylor was commissioned to open the Legislature.
