Ottawa, Ont., May 19—East and west were at loggerheads this morning over a clause in the bill to provide for the branding and inspection of picked fish. The clause states that no man can have his fish branded unless he is a British subject. It reads:
"Unless such fish have been caught by British subjects, domiciled and residing in Canada, cured and packed by British subjects in Canada or on board of Canadian vessels and boats in accordance with the regulations."
W. Kyte proposed an amendment to eliminate this "British subject" qualification. He said it was a hardship against Nova Scotia fishermen who had gone to the United States becoming subjects of that country, and afterwards returned to Canada. Until they became British subjects again, which could not be within five years according to the new act, they could not do business.

H. S. Stevens of Vancouver opposed this amendment vigorously, stating that the difficulty in British Columbia was to get control of their own fisherles. The measure as it stood would help them to re-establish white fishing in British Columbia waters. Eventually the matter was left in abeyance and will come up at a future meeting of the committee.

Market opened at 16 in Quebec Ry., and advanced, but settled back - Iron! and Steel strong.

Montreal, May 19.—Apart from two or three specialties, there was not much activity to the local market today. Trading in London this morning was quiet and Wall Street was only moderately active. The tone of the market was, however, strong.

The most active feature of the day was Quebec Railway. The market opened strong at 16 and later advanced to 16 3-4. This was followed by reaction and the market closed at 16. There was no official statement as to the cause for this movement, but Sir Rodolphe Forget, president of the company went to Ottawa last night and if is understood that he was accompanied by others who are principally interested in the stock of the Quebec undertaking. The opinion is expressed that an announcement of interest to shareholders will be made this week. C. P. R. was one of the 194. Part of the strength in this issue is no doubt due to the general firmness of the market this week, but it disposed of some months ago. The Iron and Steel issues were strong, but not all active. Iron sold up to 23 1-2 in the afternoon and Scotia was traded in at 62. The outlook for both companies has improved with the opening of navigation.

Laurentide was steady at 180, and there seemed to be some enquiry for the stale of a large block of Power which will be available after the development on which work is now being carried on is completed. (F. B. McCURDY & CO.)




