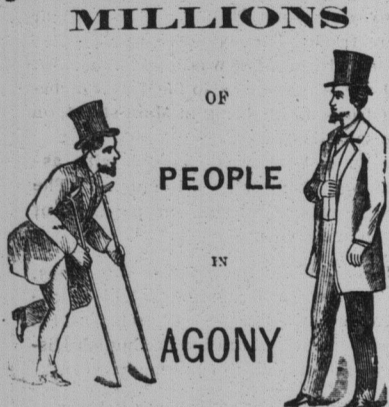

UNITED STATES.
