ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1855.

PRESENTED 5TH JANUARY, 1856.

On retiring from office your Committee of Management beg to lay before the members of the St. George's Society, a brief report of their proceedings during the past year.

Shortly after their election your Committee had under consideration the expediency of establishing an Hospital for descendants of English, after several interviews between a sub-Committee from your Society, and certain gentlemen who held a list of large amounts subscribed many year since towards the establishment of a Protestant Hospital, it was decided to aid these gentlemen in reviving the old list, and with a view of doing so, the annual collection on St. George's Day was voted to the proposed institution.

The sum collected on that occasion was handed over to the Provisional Committee, who, as far as your Committee are aware of, have done no more than obtain an Act of Incorporation.

St. George's Day was, as usual, celebrated by the attendance of the Society at Divine Service, at the Cathedral, Prayers were read by the Revd. G. Mackie, D. D., and a very excellent sermon was preached by the Revd. A. W. Mountain, B. A., both Chaplains of the Society.

An admirable and appropriate musical service was performed under the able management of John Carter, Esq.

The collection, specially appropriated by the Society towards the proposed Victoria Hospital, amounted to £45.

In the evening the Anniversary was celebrated by a dinner at Russell's Hotel.

Your Committee refer with much satisfaction to the books of the sub-Committee of Charity, which on examination will show that relief has been granted to every applicant. The sum so expended amounts to £76 18s., relieving in various ways 49 deserving countrymen, on many of whom large families were dependant.

Your Committee found employment in several instances for many who did not require pecuniary assistance.

Your Committee received £10 under the following pleasing circumstances.

Late in the autumn of 1854, an Englishman from Canada West found himself in need of £5, which on application was voted to him by the Committee of Charity. This autumn the £5, with an additional donation of 10s. was returned and placed to the credit of the Charitable Fund.

The other £5 was returned from England by a native of Glamorganshire who emigrated to this country in 1854, with her husband, the man died in Canada West, leaving her with three children. The applicant asked for £5 to enable her to reach her friends in Wales. The amount was voted by the Committee of Charity, and within two months returned to the Society.

To the obituary list of the Society has to be added the name of Wm. Ware, a native of Kent, aged 58, and a resident of this city for upwards of 40 years,—and Admiral Boxer, a native of Kent, who died at Balaklava, while in the discharge of his duty. Admiral Boxer, took an active part in the affairs of this city during a long residence, and filled the important offices of Harbour Master and Captain of the the Port, until his promotion to the high office of Admiral in 1853 caused his departure from this Country.

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Thirteen new members have been added to the list during the last twelve months.

The financial affairs of the Society continue in a very prosperous condition, full details will be found in the Treasurer's Report.

The Permanent Fund amounts to £1401 18s. 9d. besides which £14 0s. 11d. appears to the credit of the Charitable Fund.

By a change in the 7th By-Law, made at the last Annual Meeting, the last mentioned sum is no longer carried to the Permanent Fund, but remains to the credit of the Charitable Fund for the ensuing year.

In one or two instances where loans have been made, the whole amount lent, (with an addition as a contribution) has been most honorably repaid.

The Committee were deprived, early in the summer, of the valuable services of their Secretary Dr. Cole, whose attention and kindness to any requiring medical aid entitles him to the best thanks of the Society. Since his departure the duties of Secretary have been most efficiently performed by Mr. Veasey.

The Committee must again urge upon the Society the absolute necessity of some hospital provision being made for the infirm and sick.

FOR THE YEAR 1855.

The Twentieth Annual Financial Statement is now submitted, and the Treasurer has much pleasure in presenting to the Society the continued prosperity of this charitable institution. The amount paid in charity during the past year is £76 18s. being less than previous years. This may be attributed to the exertions of the members of the Committee, who were enabled to procure Work during last Winter for several Englishmen, who had large families and who would otherwise have had to be assisted by the Society.

The receipts from Subscriptions and Entrances Fees, amount to £32 10s.

The sum added to the Permanent Fund is £20, which now amounts to £1401 8s. 9d., £1180 of which is invested in Bank Stock, £200 in Debentures, and the balance in the hands of the Treasurer.

Four Life members and ten Ordinary members have been Elected since the last report.

FOR THE YEAR 1922

The Treasurer's Annual Report is now ready for the members of the Society to examine. It contains a full and complete statement of the financial position of the Society at the close of the year 1922, and a statement of the receipts and disbursements during the year. It is a pleasure to state that the financial position of the Society is in a most satisfactory condition, and that the year has been a successful one for the Society.

The total assets of the Society at the close of the year 1922 were \$11,101.00, and the total liabilities were \$1,200.00, leaving a net asset of \$9,901.00. This is an increase of \$1,100.00 over the net asset of \$8,801.00 at the close of the year 1921.

The receipts for the year 1922 were \$10,500.00, and the disbursements were \$9,300.00, leaving a surplus of \$1,200.00. This surplus has been added to the net asset of the Society, and will be used for the benefit of the Society in the future.
