The trade and navigation returns show that the value of goods imported directly into the Maritime Provinces has declined enormously of late years. This is not so much because our people use less as because our import trade has been transferred from our own ports to the ports of the Upper Provinces, especially Montreal.

THURSDAY, March 3.
