
The Earl Grey Skating Club of Montreal.



HISTORICAL SKETCH.

The Club was founded in the year 1908, through the initiative of Mrs. Henry Joseph and Mrs. C. C. Hole and under the patronage of His Excellency the Governor General and Her Excellency the Countess Grey. The object of the Club was to revive the interest in figure skating in Montreal which had been gradually falling off of late years.

It was decided that until the Club was able to obtain quarters of their own they should secure several skating periods a week at the Victoria Rink, and under these conditions a very successful season was enjoyed. The second season the skating had improved to such an extent that the Club team, which went to Ottawa to compete for the Earl Grey Trophy, brought back that much coveted Trophy to Montreal and Miss Iris Mudge also won the Minto Challenge Trophy.

The present season promises to be even more successful than the two preceding, and next year there is every prospect of having a fine rink and club house of our own.

CONSTITUTION.

- The Club shall be called "THE EARL GREY SKATING CLUB."
- The Club shall consist of Patrons, Honorary Members and Elected Members.
- 3. The officers of the Club shall consist of a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, who with a committee of five members shall form the executive of the Club.

They shall be elected annually at the Annual Meeting of the Club. Four shall form a quorum. Vacancies occurring shall be filled up by the Committee.

- 4. The Committee shall have power to adopt or amend by-laws and Rules for skating, which shall remain in force until passed on by the next Annual General Meeting unless rescinded by a special general meeting.
- 5. All members shall be elected by the Committee. Candidates for membership shall be proposed and seconded by members on forms adopted by the Committee, which must be sent by post to the Secretary.
- 6. The crest or badge of the Club shall be a shield surmounted by a coronet, bearing the letters E. G. S. C.

RULES.

- The Annual Subscription shall be Two Dollars.
 The Club Membership shall not exceed four hun-
- dred.
- Subscriptions shall be payable in advance on the 1st December, or on election.

Members in arrears on 1st February shall be considered as having resigned.

- Visitors introduced by a member will be given a complimentary ticket admitting them to the Club-Rooms but will require to pay the regular rink charge for skating.
- The Committee shall appoint annually two auditors who shall examine the books of the Club and report to the Executive Committee previous to the Annual Meeting.
- 6. The Committee are empowered to suspend, for a period within their discretion, the privileges of a member contravening any of the Rules or Regulations.

CLASSES & SKATING TESTS:-

No member shall be eligible as a candidate for a test until he has passed all preceding tests; and no member shall have the privilege of wearing the badge of a class until he has passed the necessary tests.

The badges of the classes shall be as follows:
Ordinary membersClub pin.
Fourth class membersClub pin, white.
Third class members
Second class membersClub pin, red.
First class membersClub pin, blue.


The judges for all tests shall be appointed by the Skating Committee and shall not judge a test higher than that for the class in which they themselves at the time stand.


Every candidate must be passed by two judges and obtain a minimum of SO per cent of the marks.

The regulations shall be those adopted by the International Skating Union.

A .- GENERAL.

The figure skating is divided into, (a) the skating of prescribed exercises (compulsory figures), and (b) the skating of optional figures for a specified length of time (free skating). The adjudication of the prizes follows from the whole number of marks attained in both divisions.

B.—COMPULSORY FIGURES.

EveryTcompulsory figure can be begun only "from rest," that is, by a single stroke off the other foot (unemployed foot); the beginning must be made at the crossing-point of the eight. The change from one foot crossing-point of the eight. The change from one foot to the other must be made without pause by putting down the hitherto unemployed, now employed, foot, and a simple stroke with the lately employed, now unemployed, foot. Every figure must be repeated three times, both on the right and left foot, the repetition

times, both on the right and the root, and responsible follows without pause, as above.

The success of every compulsory figure is marked with the numbers, 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, of which 0—" not skated," 2—" pass," 4—" good," 6—" faultless," 1, 3, and 5 are intermediate. In assigning a mark, there ranks, in the first place, correct tracing on the ice; in the second, carriage and movement; in the third, size of the figure; in the fourth, approximately accurate covering of the traces in the triple repetition. These four points of view count as of descending importance in the foregoing order.

C .- FREE SKATING.

The free skating is marked (a) for the contents of the program performed (difficulty and variety); (b) for the manner of performance tharmonious composition, sureness, carriage and movement, etc.), in each case with the numbers 0 to 6 with the same significance as in the compulsory figures.

D.—DETERMINATION OF THE RESULT.

On each marking eard, in every compulsory figure, the mark given is multiplied by the factor of value which belongs to the figure in question in proportion to its difficulty, and is to be taken from the appended diagrams of compulsory figures. The total sum of these products on each marking card for each skater individually gives the number of points for compulsory figures which he has carned with the individual judge.

The marks given for free figures under (a) and (b) are added, and the sum multiplied by the factor announced a the advertisement; the number of points for free figures. This factor must be arranged so that the highest possible points for free figures amount to about the half of the

highest possible for compulsory figures.

The number of points for free figures plus the number of points for compulsory figures gives for each skater individually the total number of points which he has earned from the individual judge.
