



The tests upon which most dependence can be placed are auscultation,

galvanism, and the examination by the ophthalmoscope. These can be used only by skilled per-sons, and it consequently follows that there is a possibility of a person's being buried alive.

THE loss caused in the United States by fir still continues to be enormous. During last year this loss amounted to \$64,315,900, of which the insurance covered \$36575,000. For the four years from 1875 to 1878, inclusive, the total loss was \$275,314,585, of which the insuranc companies bore \$147,674,700. Of the establish ments which are classed by the insurance com-panies as extra hazardous on account of their speial liability to fire, due to the nature of th business carried on in them or to their constru tion of inflammable materials, the total numbe burned in 1878 was 5,229, valued at \$42,557,200 and insured for \$23,970,990. 




