General Foreign Notes. The Boer, earnest Protestants as they are, have just passed a law that does them as much honor as did their victory over the filibuster Rhodes and Jameson.

At the suggestion of Rev. Father Abdallah Seraphin, superior of the Catholic mission of Sandjak d'Amidit a divine service was organized on the 5th of July, for the repose of the soul of the great scientist, M. Pasteur.

The consecration of a bishop is an event familiar to all, but the formal blessing of an abbot is of a rare occurrence. Hence when the Abbot of Beaucense in the Deux Sevres was solemnly blessed, the Dent was the crowd that gathered from all parts of the diocese to witness the ceremony.
