

Continued From Page 1. prohibited, and the companies are given five years in which to dispose of their present stock holdings. The line of investments made legal for these funds is specified.

Agents Will Suffer. The commissions and emoluments to agents are limited, and bonuses, gifts and other considerations, except such as are fixed by the bill, are prohibited. Loans and advances to agents are prohibited. All salaries of the officers above \$500 per year must be fixed annually, and with the approval of the superintendent of insurance.

Mr. Morton took up the changes in the bill he would suggest. In brief, he believed that with certain qualifications insurance companies should be allowed the same latitude in the matter of investments as is now granted. 

The following letter from Sir John Beverley Robinson of New York appeared in The New York Herald: "Many Canadians, like myself, have read with much interest the letters from the Canadian Northwest in recent issues of The Sunday Herald."

"No doubt there is at present a large emigration from this country to Canada and I hope may continue, but if your correspondent will make a careful canvass of some of those American cities where they are living long enough in the country to be so well acquainted with the conditions of life and order as to be able to give an intelligent opinion, he will find that they are living under the rule of law and order as maintained."

"Canada owes her prosperity to her people up to this time, and while no doubt the influx of farmers and others from this country is of much benefit to her, still, should they cease to go it would not retard her great future. Americans are going there simply because they wish to share in this prosperity, and the majority of them have no desire to interfere in the internal affairs of a contented and prosperous people, content with their present form of government."
