WHEAT CABLES CAME FIRM

Sharp Advance in Cereal Futures at Liverpool.

The Rise of a Penny a Cental in That Market Not Followed at Chicago. Where Futures Fell Off Fractionally in Price-Corn Market Off-Notes and Gossip.

World Office, Saturday, Toronto, July 7. In Liverpool today, wheat futures advanced about 1/2 cent per bushel. In the same market maize futures rose 1/4 to 3/8 cent.

Chicago today wheat futures made a small fractional decline for the day. The New York receipts of wheat for the week just ended were 55,000 bushels, and shipments 570,000. Receipts of wheat amounted to 51,000 cases, and shipments 520,000.

Exports of wheat from America this week equalled 8,000,000 bushels, as against 7,000,000 the corresponding week of last year. Receipts of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth today, 137 cars, as against 128 cars last Saturday and 336 cars a year ago.
