SANDWICH GLASS COMPANY.—On Friday last we witnessed at the Factory of the Biston and Sandwich Glass Company, the making of glass bowls by machinery, and of a magnitude that far exceeds in size and weight any heretofore made by glass manufactories in this or any other country. The machine, we in derstand, weighs between two and three tons, and is worked with the accuracy of a steam engine. The glowing metal was taken from the furnace at its greatest fusion, by the workmen, placed in the machine by hand, set in mution, and na few minutes a perfect bowl, of rich design, was turned out, spreading a most intense heat around, which none but those accustomed to the business could stand. It is an interesting sight to notice the arrangements made in workman is in his allotted place—and it surprised us to see an article of its weight and size handled with so much judgment and skill, that in one minute it was taken from the press by the head workman, and cartied to a side furnace to receive the fire polish and formed into shape; as soon as that was secured it was taken to an annealing kin, and placed therein to conl—which requires 8 or 10 days.

The bowl, we learn, weighs about sixty pounds, stands 21 inches high, and 22 inches in dameter at the top. It is called the Union Bowl, and the moderate price it is held at will enable hotel keepers and others to possess a beautiful and useful centre ornament for their table.—Sandwich Obs.
