MINUTES OF THE CONFERENCE
OF
New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island,
TAKEN AT
ST. STEPHEN, N. B.,

From the 22nd of June to the 28th of June, included, 1876.

THE THIRD ANNUAL MEETING of the NEW BRUNSWICK and PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND CONFERENCE began in Saint Stephen, N.B., at 9 o'clock, A.M., June 22nd, 1876. The Rev. D. D. CURRIE in the chair.

After the reading of the Scriptures by the Secretary, the Rev. ROBERT DUNCAN, the 478th hymn was sung, and the Rev. HENRY DANIEL offered prayer.

The roll was called and fifty-six members of the Conference answered to their names.

The Rev. ROBERT DUNCAN was elected President; the Rev. HOWARD SPRAGUE, A.M., Secretary; and the Rev. JOSEPH HART, Journal Secretary.

The Revs. ROBERT WILSON, C. W. DUTCHER, and C. H. PAISLEY, A.M., were appointed Assistant-Secretaries, and the Rev. R. W. WEDDALL, A.B., Assistant Journal Secretary.

QUESTION VII.—

Who have Died since Last Conference?

RICHARD WEDDALL,

Who was born in Howdon, England, in the year 1811. Being the child of pious parents, he was taught to fear God in his youth. When about sixteen years of age he obtained the assurance of pardon through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

He laboured for some years in the capacity of a local preacher, and then gave himself to the full work of the ministry. The Committee of the Wesleyan Missionary Society made choice of him as a suitable candidate for foreign work, and sent him, after a period spent in the Hoxton Institution, to the Jamaica District, his first station being Belize, on Honduras Bay. During five years spent on this station his labours were crowned with success. Owing to the failure of his health he was transferred to Nova Scotia, and landed in Halifax on the 5th January, 1845. He laboured successively on the Picton, Horton, Liverpool, Lunenburg, Hopewell, Parsboro, Sheffield, Wilmot, Canning, Bedeque, Bathurst, and Richibucto Circuits. While at the last-named place he was compelled by severe affliction to ask for a supernumerary relation.

He was a faithful and successful minister of Christ. Some of his circuits were the scenes of signal displays of saving grace, especially Horton, where scores were brought to Christ through his instrumentality.

When no longer able to do circuit work, he selected Fredericton as his home, and there spent the closing years of his life.

He was an affectionate husband, a kind and faithful parent. His Christian character and gentlemanly bearing made him many friends, who deeply sympathize with his bereaved wife and family.

The evening before his death he attended service and offered the closing prayer, and also spoke of assisting in the communion service on the following day. But his work was done, and, in accordance with his often-expressed desire to die on the Lord's Day, while the bells of Sabbath morning were calling the people to the earthly sanctuary, the angel of death carried the servant of God to the service of the heavenly temple. In the 64th year of his age, and the 37th of his ministry, Richard Weddall ended his pilgrimage and entered into rest.

Your Committee, thankful for the tokens of the Divine favour granted to these nurseries of the Church in a large number of conversions during the year, would commend them to the prayerful consideration of our ministers and people.

I. FINANCES.

With the view of promoting the financial improvement of our work, it is resolved:—

1. That the Superintendents of Circuits are urged to remember the great importance of explaining and enforcing the Christian duty of methodical and liberal contribution to the support of the work of God, and this especially on the occasion of admitting members to the Church.

2. That, at the ensuing Financial District Meetings, a deputation shall be appointed to visit each Circuit on which the full allowance for ministerial support has not been obtained, and that arrangements shall be made for holding meetings, if possible, at every preaching-place on such Circuit, with the view of stimulating our churches and congregations to additional giving; and, as far as practicable, to the providing of an adequate support for the ministry and for the Connexional Schemes of our Church.

II. MUTUAL ANNUITANT SOCIETY.

1. That the Conference approves of the formation of a Mutual Annuitant Society in the Conference, and of the appointment of a Committee to prepare, during the year, rules and regulations for such a Society, and to submit them to the next Conference, and,

III. HOME MISSIONARY MONEY OF THE CONFERENCE OF EASTERN BRITISH AMERICA.

With regard to the balance of Home Missionary Money, remaining in the possession of the Conference of Eastern British America at the time of the union with the Canada Conference, it is resolved :

1. Whereas, the late Conference of Eastern British America did, before its dissolution in 1874, order that, if it should appear that the terms of the proposed union with the Canada Conference should require it, there should be a transfer of the control of the invested and surplus funds of the Home Missionary Society of the said Conference of Eastern British America to the General Missionary Society.

And whereas, a demand is now made by the Central Missionary Board for such transfer,

Therefore, *Resolved*: That, although in the opinion of very many members of this Conference such demand is based upon a somewhat strained construction of the Article of Union that provides for the establishment of a General Missionary Society, yet this Conference concludes it is better that the transfer demanded should be made ; and it reaches this conclusion the more cheerfully because of the pledge by which the demand seems to be accompanied, that any special claims upon such funds, or upon the income arising therefrom, in the Eastern Section of the work, will receive liberal consideration.

2. Whereas, there existed in the Conference of Eastern British America a Parsonage Aid Fund, the annual income of which consisted almost entirely of a special grant of £250 sterling from the English Missionary Society.

And whereas, the said English Missionary Society has agreed to pay to our General Missionary Society the sum of £5,000 sterling, to aid in carrying on the mission work in the Eastern Section of our united Church.

And whereas, the immediate and prospective exigencies of our work demand the erection of many more ministerial residences on our mission stations,

Therefore, *Resolved*: That, in the judgment of this Conference, annual grants by the Central Missionary Board to Parsonage Aid Funds, in the three Eastern Conferences, from the income derived from the Home Mission Fund of the former Conference of Eastern British America and the above mentioned £5,000 stg. from the English Missionary Society, to the extent of at least \$1.250, will be eminently proper, wise, and profitable for the Missionary Society.

IV. MINISTERS REMOVING.

That, in the case of Ministers removing, they shall be held responsible for the supply of the pulpits on the Circuits which they are leaving, for two Sabbaths after the close of the Conference, and shall be required to provide for the pulpits of their new Circuits on the third Sabbath after Conference.

V. REV. HENRY POPE, JUNR.

That the members of the Conference deeply sympathise with their beloved brother, the Rev. Henry Pope, Junr., ex-President, in his protracted and painful illness, and earnestly pray that he may be sustained and comforted by Divine grace during his year of rest from ministerial labour, and that, if it be consistent with God's will, he may then be restored to the active work of a ministry, which has ever been most valuable to our Church.

VI. VOTES OF THANKS.

1. That the thanks of the Conference be presented to the Rev. D. D. Currie, ex-President, for the faithful and successful discharge of the duties of his office as President of the Conference during the past year.

2. That the thanks of the Conference be presented to the Rev. Robert Duncan, for the very satisfactory performance of the duties of the Secretaryship of this Conference during the past year.

3. That the thanks of the Conference are due, and are hereby presented, to James U. Thomas, Esq., of St. John, for his promptness in paying, as executor of the estate of the late Robert Robertson, Esq., of St. John, the sums bequeathed by him to our Connexional Funds.

4. That the Conference thankfully acknowledges the services of the Rev. John Prince, Superintendent of the St. Stephen Circuit, in making such satisfactory arrangements for the comfort of the Ministers attending this Conference, and requests him to express from his pulpit, next Lord's day, our sense of obligation to the members of our Church and other friends, for their kindness in the entertainment of the ministers of the Conference.

5. That the thanks of the Conference be presented to the proprietors and managers of the several lines of railroads and steamboats, for special advantages afforded in journeying to and from this Conference.

6. That the thanks of the Conference are due, and are hereby presented, to George W. Burbidge, Esq., A.M., Barrister-at-law, St. John, for his able and generous services in connection with the Committee on Legislation, and in preparing, for publication with these Minutes, the Act relating to our Church, passed by the New Brunswick Legislature at its last session.

APPENDIX I.

STANDING ORDERS.

I.—DISTRICT MEETINGS.

The Chairmen of Districts are peremptorily required to procure three complete copies of the Minutes of the several annual and other meetings of the District Committees, financial and ordinary, duly signed by the Chairman and Secretary; one of these copies shall be inserted in the District Records, the second shall be reserved for the use of the Conference, and the third shall be delivered to the Secretary for preservation in the archives of the Conference. Furthermore, it is required that the last mentioned copies be handed in on the forenoon of the day preceding that on which our first preparatory committee meeting may be appointed to be held, that the secretaries may prepare classified lists of all matters which are to come before the Conference, and thereby expedite business.

2. That as much trouble has been caused at different sessions of Conference in consequence of alterations made in the District Minutes, it is determined that when the Minutes of the several Districts shall have been signed by the Chairmen and Secretaries, they shall not be altered, except by special permission of the Conference.

II.—PROVINCIAL WESLEYAN.

That in regard to subscriptions for the *Wesleyan*, inquiry to be instituted in the District Committees respectively, as to the fidelity of each brother responsible for the collection of such moneys—the accounts being previously sent to the chairmen, and distributed at the Annual District Meetings.

III.—MISSIONARY LISTS.

Each Superintendent is required to present, at the Annual District Meeting, prepared on foolscap paper and made up in Canada currency, a perfect list of all Missionary

moneys collected on his Circuit; and each Chairman is required to present such lists to the Missionary Secretary, in a state ready for publication, on the day previous to the meeting of the Missionary Committee.

IV.—CHILDREN'S FUND.

The Financial Secretaries of the several Districts are required to send to the Secretary of the Children's Fund, immediately after the Annual District Meeting, the names of all the Ministers in their respective Districts who are claimants upon the Children's Fund for the current year; and to state the number of children for whom allowance is claimed; and, as far as possible, the name and date of birth of each of the said children.

V.—BOOK ROOM ACCOUNTS.

Resolved, That every Minister and Preacher is peremptorily required to settle his account with the Book Steward each year, at or before the meeting of Conference.

VI.—TIME FOR COLLECTIONS IN AID OF THE CONNEXIONAL FUNDS.

2. Then ascertain from each member of the Church, and, as far as practicable, from each attendant of the congregation, what each proposes to give as his or her weekly or monthly contribution.

3. Let these sums be entered by a Steward appointed for that purpose in a book which he shall keep as Treasurer of the Quarterly Board.

4. If the total amount of these sums does not equal the amount needed, then let the Steward apportion the deficiency among all such as are willing, for Christ's sake, to assume such deficiency, setting down to each person, with his or her consent, the additional amount which they think he or she ought weekly or monthly to pay.

5. Let the Steward then adopt and carry out a plan by which every one shall have the opportunity of regularly contributing each week or month by envelope or otherwise, not grudgingly or of necessity, the sum which has been pledged by him or her. Let these contributions be paid over regularly to the Steward appointed to receive them, and be brought up by him to the Quarterly Meeting. The said Steward shall keep an individual account of all these pledges and contributions, and shall pay over the same, under the direction of the Quarterly Official Meetings, to the preacher or preachers authorized to receive them.

6. That Quarterly Official Meetings, adopting the envelope system, be recommended not to include in their estimate the claims of Missions, but to provide for these as in time past by special collections and subscriptions.

7. That in the opinion of this Conference, the minimum salary of ministers should be \$750.

8. That in the opinion of this Conference, the minimum amount of young men's salary should be \$200.

9. That in the opinion of this Conference, the salary of ordained, but unmarried, ministers should be \$520.

10. When a deficiency occurs upon a Circuit having two preachers (a married and single man), it shall be borne by each, according to a *pro rata* amount.

APPENDIX II.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE METHODIST CHURCH OF CANADA,
WITHIN THE BOUNDS OF THE CONFERENCE OF NEW
BRUNSWICK AND PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND :

DEARLY BELOVED,—

Accustomed from year to year, while assembled in Conference, to greet you in the name of the Lord, we would not at this time forget the honored usage. Though we may write many of the same things that have been written to you in the past, it is not grievous unto us, because we trust it may help to your comfort and profit. We have, while addressing you, many mercies crowding upon our memories to call forth gratitude to God, on our own and your behalf.

The Ministers of our Conference have been wonderfully sustained in bodily health and strength, while laboring in the vineyard of the Lord, during the past year. Their lives have been precious in the sight of the Master. True, one of our supernumerary brethren was called upon to put off the tabernacle, yet we have abundant reason to believe that for him to die was not to "be unclothed, but clothed upon." The name of Richard Weddall will not soon cease to be remembered among us.

We also have reason to be thankful to God that a larger measure of spiritual success than ordinary has been given to us during the year. Answers of blessing have come to the united petitions of ministers and people. On many of our circuits, where special efforts have been put forth, God has opened the windows of Heaven. Our town and city circuits have shared largely in these manifestations of God's favor, and the country charges have not been left to the

complaint, "Who hath believed our report, and to whom is the arm of the Lord revealed?" While in many places, at home and abroad, there has been the cup of straitening in the things of this life, the higher blessings have not been withheld;—we have not been straitened in the Lord. Every district in our Conference shows an increase in membership, amounting in the aggregate, for the year, to 1,183 members, with 558 on trial. Therefore, in this year of spiritual grace and power, we pray that you may all be partakers in some degree of the benefit; and that a higher and more unreserved consecration to God's work, in whatever sphere you may be placed, may be marked by those who are to be won to the Gospel. Even to the not over attentive observer, may there be exhibited evidence of more heed to those things which are "true and honest and just, and pure and lovely and of good report."

We would also call your attention to the varied Funds and Institutions of our Church, and ask you to strive to make yourselves acquainted with their object and aim. Many of your ministers find yet that circuits, which should be teachers of others, have need that others should teach them. The more knowledge you possess of the great result to be gained by the sustentation of these Institutions and Funds, the more, we believe, they will command your sympathy and liberality; and if in your *prayers* they should often come up, it will help to quicken you in regard to them.

We regret to have to report a falling off in receipts for Missionary purposes, this year, in comparison with last. We trust that we will soon be able to report a more favorable showing. If, through financial pressure, there arises the necessity of a cutting off, let it not be in the amount contributed to the cause of the Lord, but in those things where a cutting off would be a blessing. For still, we fear, among us, there are foolish and hurtful desires indulged which help to lower instead of elevating our souls. When prosperity comes again to you, when He who says the gold and silver belong to Him, enlarges you, "Be ye also

enlarged." With some of our people, this is already the case. Their wealth is a blessing to the world and the Church of God. Not only the mission cause calls for your self-denial and liberality, but the condition of many of our ministers, laboring with increased deficiencies from year to year, on dependent circuits, calls for help. Brethren, a scantily-supplied ministry must almost necessarily be a feeble and half-hearted one. Distraction of mind, worldly cares and anxieties must interfere with the minister's freedom, power, and usefulness in his sacred work.

It has been the boast of our Methodism, somewhat, in the past, that it not only provides a field of labor, but sustentation for the laborer. Take care that our boasting of you on this behalf be not found to be in vain. Never forget that He who hath ordained a preached Gospel hath also appointed that the man that preached that Gospel should live by it; that the dispenser to you of spiritual things should be a partaker of your wordly things. Now, brethren, though we speak as if we had a primary regard for your material gifts, in reality it is not so. The members of the church of your choice know how to be abased and how to abound; but, in all things, the uppermost desire, we trust, is that fruit spiritual may abound to your account, and their prayer is that God may "supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus." "And when ye abound in all things, in faith and utterance and knowledge, and in all diligence, and in your love to us, see that ye abound in this grace also." Of you may it individually be said, "He hath dispersed abroad—his righteousness remaineth for ever."

Our Educational Institutions are increasing in facilities for the work of higher education, and for training men for the great work of preaching the Gospel. These Institutions, in both male and female departments, we commend to your continued sympathy and support.

We are glad to find a growing interest on the part of our people in Sabbath-school work. This is a field which gives

APPENDIX III.

AN ACT

TO AMEND AND CONSOLIDATE THE LAWS RELATING TO
THE METHODIST CHURCH OF CANADA.

39 VICTORIA, *Chapter* 12 (New Brunswick).

39 VICTORIA, *Chapter* (Prince Edward Island).

The following is the New Brunswick Act. Where the Prince Edward Island Act varies from this the variation is indicated immediately after each section. There are a few unimportant verbal differences not indicated. These arose from the engrossing of the legislature not being entirely accurate. A few practical suggestions have been added after some of the sections, and a few additional forms at the end of the Act. The marginal references are not those of either Act, as neither has yet been published.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to amend and consolidate the several Acts relating to the Church or religious body now known as "The Methodist Church of Canada;"

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. All ordained ministers of the Methodist Church of Canada in full connexion with the Annual Conference of New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, and their successors,

shall be a body corporate, having perpetual succession by the name of "The Annual Conference of New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island in connection with the Methodist Church of Canada," and by that name shall have full power to sue and be sued, to purchase, receive and hold grants and devises of real and personal estate, and to improve the same, and to demise, sell, assign and dispose of the same, and to receive the rents and profits thereof for the use of the Conference or Church, and to have a common seal with the power to break or renew the same at pleasure, and shall have and exercise all the rights, powers and privileges incident to a body corporate, according to the laws of this Province.

Shall exercise its powers in accordance with rules and usage of the Methodist Church of Canada.

2. The said Annual Conference, shall in all matters be regulated and governed by and shall exercise its powers in accordance with the doctrines and discipline of the Methodist Church of Canada, and the rules and usages thereof, and subject thereto, may make by-laws, not inconsistent with law, and appoint officers for the management of any funds, institutions and objects connected with the said Annual Conference.

Acts done at Conference in Prince Edward Island good in New Brunswick, and vice versa.

3. Any appointment made, or other act done, or order, judgment, or resolution of the said Annual Conference passed or determined at any meeting held at any place in Prince Edward Island, shall be as binding and obligatory in this Province as if passed within this Province, when certified under the hand of the President and Secretary of the Annual Conference, or any persons acting in their stead.

P. E. I. For "Prince Edward Island" read "New Brunswick."

The proceedings of each Conference should be certified as directed in this section.

How proved.

4. A copy of any such minute of appointment, act done, order, judgment, or resolutions certified and signed by the President, or acting President, Secretary, or acting Secretary, verified by an affidavit of a credible person that it was signed in his presence, or that, being acquainted with the handwriting of such President or Secretary, he verily believes the signature to be their proper handwriting respectively, and also that the persons signing are the President and Secretary respectively, or were acting as such, shall be evidence of such appointment, act, order, judgment or resolution of the Annual Conference in any proceeding whatever, and in any Court in this Province.

5. Affidavits may be sworn before a Commissioner for taking affidavits in the Supreme Court, or Justice of the Peace, or if sworn out of this Province before any person authorized to take affidavits to be read in the Supreme Court of this Province.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

6. Each Board of Trustees of any Church, Mission House, Burial Ground, School House, or other property held in trust for the use and benefit of any Church or Congregation in connection with the Methodist Church of Canada, and their successors, and each Board of Trustees to be hereafter appointed for such purposes, and their successors, shall be a body corporate, having perpetual succession, by the name of "The

Trustees of the (*name, if any*) Methodist Church at _____." (*The place in which the trust property is situated, or where the church is situated for the benefit of the congregation worshipping in which the property is held in trust*), or by such other name as is or shall be mentioned in the trust deed or other act or instrument by which the trusts respectively are or shall be created, and by that name shall be capable of taking by grant or devise, holding and possessing lands, tenements, moneys, and other property heretofore conveyed to them, or which shall be hereafter conveyed, devised, or bequeathed, given, granted or sold to them, and of suing and being sued in any of Her Majesty's Courts of law or of equity, and may have a common seal with power to break or renew the same at pleasure, and shall have and exercise all the rights, powers and privileges incident to a body corporate, according to the laws of this Province.

New Trustee Boards, how formed.

7. Hereafter Boards of Trustees shall be created by the appointment of the Quarterly Official Meeting upon the nomination of the Superintendent of the Circuit. Each Board of Trustees, now existing or hereafter constituted, shall consist of not less than seven Trustees, nor more than twenty-one, and the Superintendent of the Circuit, for the time being, shall be ex-officio a member and Charman of each Board of Trustees within his Circuit. A majority of the members at any time, constituting any such Board of Trustees, shall be a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of said Board of Trustees.

Record Book, what it is to contain, &c.

8. Each Board of Trustees shall keep a Book of Records, in which shall be duly entered a description of the lands and premises

held

held in trust, the corporate name of the Board of Trustees, the names of the first Trustees, the appointment of any successor or successors in the Trust, and the minutes of all meetings of the Board. The person or persons so appointed successor or successors as aforesaid, shall be entitled, in conjunction with the then surviving or remaining Trustees, to hold and possess the lands and all the appurtenances thereof, without any deed of conveyance or assignment being made to them; and the production of such entry in the Book of Records, or a duly authenticated copy thereof, shall be sufficient evidence of the appointment of such successor or successors in any of Her Majesty's Courts of law or equity, and of his or their possession of co-ordinate rights and privileges with other Trustees from the time of the appointment of such successor or successors respectively, of the corporate name of the Board, the members thereof, and of all matters and things lawfully done and transacted by such Board at any regularly constituted meeting.

The greatest care should be exercised to see that the Record Book contains all that is required by this section, that all Trustee Meetings are properly organised, and that all minutes are regularly and properly entered.

ments differing from those following or not, shall hereafter hold the same in their corporate capacity as such Trustees, under and upon the trusts and for the purposes and under the directions and provisions set out in the several sub-sections of this section, or under and upon such of them as may be applicable for such and the same ends, uses, intents, and purposes, and with, under, and subject to such and the same powers, provisions, declarations and agreements, and to be controlled, disposed of and managed by the like authorities, Trustees and persons appointed and to be appointed, and acting in the same manner and with the same duties, powers, liabilities, and restrictions in every particular and respect as are expressed, contained and declared in the said sub-sections, and every such deed shall be construed as if the following trusts and directions were part of or contained in said deed, saving always such rights as may have been acquired by any person or corporation prior to the passing of this Act.

To build, &c.

(1) Upon trust that the said Board of Trustees or corporation shall and do, with and out of the moneys now or which may hereafter be possessed by them for that purpose, and as soon as conveniently may be, erect and build upon the parcel and tract of land held by them for that purpose or upon some part thereof, and from time to time, and at all times hereafter, whenever it shall be necessary, repair, alter, enlarge and rebuild a Church or place of religious worship, and a dwelling house or dwelling houses, Vestry room, School room, and other Offices and conveniences, as and in such manner as the Board of Trustees for the time being shall from time to time deem necessary and expedient.

(2) And upon further trust from time to time, and at all times after the erection thereof, to permit and suffer the said church, with the appurtenances, to be used, occupied and enjoyed as and for a place of religious worship by a congregation of Methodists in connexion with the Methodist Church of Canada as aforesaid, and for public and other meetings and services held according to the rules and discipline and general usages of the said Methodist Church; and do and shall from time to time, and at all times hereafter, permit and suffer such person as is hereinafter mentioned or designated, and such person only, to preach and expound God's Holy Word, and to perform the usual acts of religious worship therein, and burial services in the burial ground thereto belonging, that is to say, such person as shall from time to time be approved and for that purpose duly appointed by the said Annual Conference, and also such other person as shall be thereunto from time to time duly permitted or appointed (according to the rules and discipline of the said Methodist Church of Canada) by the Superintendent Minister for the time being of the Circuit in which the said Church shall for the time being be situated; and also such other person as shall be from time to time duly appointed by any authority lawfully constituted by the said Annual Conference, to fill up any vacancy at any time occasioned by the death, removal or suspension of a Minister in or during any interval between the sittings of the said Annual Conference, but only until the next Annual Conference, and in no case any other person or persons whomsoever.

To permit Min-

(3) And upon further trust from time to time, and at all times hereafter, to permit and suffer such Minister of the said Methodist Church

Church of Canada, to reside in, use, occupy and enjoy, free from the payment of any rent for the same, the dwelling house, with the appurtenances (if any there be), erected thereon for that purpose, during such time as the said Minister may be duly authorized so to do by his being appointed by the said Annual Conference, according to the rules and discipline thereof, to the circuit or station in which the same may be situated, without the let, suit, hinderance or denial of the said Board of Trustees, or of any person on their behalf: And it is hereby declared, that the times and manner of the various services and ordinance of religious worship to be observed and performed in the said church, shall be regulated according to the rules and discipline and general usage of the said Methodist Church of Canada; and that the officiating minister for the time being, whether appointed by the said Annual Conference or permitted and appointed as in these presents is mentioned, shall have the direction and conducting of the same worship, in conformity, nevertheless, to the said rules and discipline and general usage of the said Methodist Church of Canada; provided always, that no person whomsoever shall at any time hereafter be permitted to preach or expound God's Holy Word, or to perform any of the usual acts of religious worship upon the said parcel or tract of land and hereditaments, nor in the said church, nor in or upon the appurtenances thereto belonging, or any of them, or any part or parts thereof, who shall maintain, promulgate or teach any doctrine or practice contrary to those held and practised by the said Methodist Church of Canada.

To allow a

(4) And upon further trust in case a school room shall be erected or provided upon the
said

said parcel or tract of land, or any part thereof as aforesaid, or if there shall be no separate school room, and it shall by the said Board of Trustees be thought necessary or expedient to hold and teach a Sunday school, or other school, to be held and conducted from time to time in the said school room, or if it shall be thought necessary or expedient as aforesaid, in the said church; but if in the said church, then only at such hours and times as shall not interfere with the public worship of Almighty God therein, and in all cases, whether in the said church or not, under such government, orders and regulations as the General Conference of the said Methodist Church of Canada have directed or appointed, or shall from time to time hereafter direct or appoint; and also subject always to the provisos hereinbefore contained respecting doctrines.

To alter or
repair.

(5) It shall be lawful for the said Board of Trustees when and so often as they shall deem the same necessary or expedient, to take down and remove the said church, vestry room, school room, dwelling house, offices, conveniences or appurtenances to the said church belonging or appertaining, or all or any of them, or any part or parts thereof respectively, for the purpose of rebuilding the said church, or for the purpose of building or rebuilding any other vestry room, school room, dwelling house, offices, or conveniences, or enlarging or altering the same respectively, or all or any of them, so as to render the premises better adapted to and for the due accomplishment of the trusts, intents and purposes intended.

To mortgage.

(6) It shall and may be lawful to and for the said Board of Trustees to mortgage, and

for that purpose to appoint, convey and assure in fee, or for any term or terms of years, the said parcel or tract of land, church, hereditaments and premises, or any part or parts thereof respectively, to any person or persons whomsoever, for securing such sum of money as may be necessary for the due execution and performance of the trusts and purposes herein mentioned, or any of them, according to the true intent and meaning thereof; nevertheless no mortgage, or any disposition whatsoever by way of mortgage, shall at any time be made of the said trust premises or any part thereof, unless such mortgage shall amount to and cover the whole debt which at the time of the execution of such mortgage shall be due or owing, either legally or equitably, in respect to or on account of the said trust premises, or from the said Board of Trustees, for or on account of the said trust premises or some part thereof respectively, excepting only such debt as may then be accruing for and on account of the ordinary current expenses of the said church and premises; but it shall not be incumbent upon any mortgagee or any intended mortgagee of the said trust premises or any part thereof, to inquire into the necessity, expediency or propriety of any mortgage which shall be made, or proposed to be made, or whether the same is made or intended to be made for the whole amount of the debt which shall be so due and owing as aforesaid; nor shall anything herein contained, or which may be contained in any such mortgage, extend or be construed to extend, unless where the contrary shall, with the full knowledge and consent of the said Board of Trustees be therein actually expressed, to hinder, prevent or make unlawful the taking down, removing, enlarging or altering the said building

building and premises or any of them respectively, as hereinbefore mentioned and provided for in that behalf, nor in any manner to hinder, prevent or interfere with the due execution of the trusts or purposes herein mentioned or any of them, so long as such mortgagee, his or her heirs, executors, administrators or assigns shall not be in the actual possession as such mortgagee of the hereditaments comprised in such mortgage, anything herein contained to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

(7) And upon further trust from time to time, and at all times hereafter, to let the pews and seats in the said church at a reasonable rent (reserving as many free seats as may be thought necessary), and if there shall be any such dwelling house, school room or other building, or any of them, erected and built as aforesaid, then to let the same or any of them (other than such as may have been erected for or appropriated to the use and occupancy of the minister duly appointed to the station or circuit in which the same shall be situated), at a reasonable rent; and also if there shall be a burial ground, to let or sell graves or parcels of land for family use, for interment, at reasonable rents and prices, and to collect, get in and receive the rents, profits and income to arise therefrom in any manner (excepting moneys which may arise from time to time from collections or subscriptions duly made therein according to the rules and discipline and general usage of the said Methodist Church, for other purposes than for the immediate purposes of the said trust estate), as and when the same shall from time to time become due and payable, but not (excepting as to moneys received

ceived from time to time for graves) by way of anticipation further than for the quarter or half year or year, as may be thought most expedient; provided always, that when and so often as such dwelling house as may have been erected for the express use of the minister of the circuit or station shall not be required for the use of such minister on account of his being unmarried or otherwise, it shall and may be lawful for the said Board of Trustees to let the same, and appropriate the rent arising therefrom towards paying and satisfying the board and lodging of such minister, or towards paying the rent for a more suitable and convenient residence for such minister.

How rents and profits to be applied, &c.

(8) And it is hereby declared that the said Board of Trustees shall stand and be possessed of the money arising from the said rents, profits and income (except as aforesaid) upon trust thereout, to pay in the first place such duties, taxes, rates and other outgoings (if any) as from time to time shall be lawfully payable in respect of the said premises, or any part or parcel thereof, and also the cost, charges and expenses of insuring and keeping insured the said trust premises against loss or damage by fire, in such sum or sums as the said Board of Trustees shall from time to time think proper or expedient, and in repairing and keeping the said trust premises in good repair and condition, and likewise the interest of all principal moneys borrowed and then due and owing on security of the said trust premises, or of any part or parts thereof, and then to return to and reimburse themselves respectively, all costs, charges and expenses lawfully incurred and paid by them in or about the due execution of the said trusts; and in the next place

to

to pay thereout and discharge the necessary costs, charges and expenses from time to time incurred in cleansing, warming, lighting and attending to the said church and premises, and generally to liquidate any debt, costs, charges, incumbrances and expenses at any time lawfully incurred under or occasioned by the due execution of the said trusts or any of them, and not included in any of the provisions aforesaid.

How to apply surplus.

(9) And upon further trust from time to time, to pay and apply any surplus money remaining, after the due payment of all such lawful debts, costs, charges, incumbrances and expenses as aforesaid (but according to and in conformity to the rules and discipline of the said Methodist Church), for or toward the support of the minister for the time being appointed by the said Annual Conference or otherwise as aforesaid, either in the circuit in which the said church shall for the time being be situated, or in that and some other circuit, or in some other circuit only; or for or towards the purpose of assisting or increasing the funds of any other church, or in building any new church for the use of the said Methodist Church, and which shall be settled upon such or similar trusts, ends, intents and purposes as are herein mentioned: or in subscribing or giving to any of the general funds, objects or charities of the said Methodist Church; or for or towards all or any of the purposes, objects, funds or charities hereinbefore mentioned, in such manner as the said Board of Trustees shall from time to time think necessary; and it shall be lawful for the said Board of Trustees (although there shall not then be any such surplus money as aforesaid) from time to time to

subscribe or give such sum of money as they may think necessary, and may be conveniently spared from the funds of the said church, for or toward all or any of the purposes, objects, funds or charities aforesaid.

To appoint

(10) It shall be lawful for the said Board of Trustees at any meeting to be convened and held as is hereinafter mentioned, from time to time and at all times hereafter, at their discretion, from the members of the Board or otherwise, to appoint any person of good reputation to be a Steward of the said church, and at their will and pleasure to remove and to dismiss such Steward; and the duty of the said steward shall be to see and attend to the orderly conducting of the secular business and affairs of the said church, under the direction and superintendence of the Board of Trustees; and also in like manner to appoint any proper person to be a Treasurer of the funds of the said church and premises, and at their will and pleasure to remove such Treasurer, and also to appoint a Secretary, and at their pleasure to remove such Secretary; and the said Board of Trustees may appoint the same person to fill any two or all the said offices.

Shall keep a

(11) And it is hereby declared, that the said Board of Trustees shall themselves, or by their Steward, Secretary or Treasurer, keep a Book of Accounts, in which from time to time shall be plainly, legibly and regularly entered an account of every receipt and disbursement by him received or made, and also of all debts and credits due to or owing from or in respect of the said trust premises or any part thereof, and also of all other documents, articles, matters and things necessary for the due and full explanation and understanding of the same Book or

Books

Books of Accounts ; and shall also in like manner keep a book in which from time to time shall be plainly, legibly and regularly entered minutes of all meetings of the said Board of Trustees from time to time held, and of the resolutions passed, and of all proceedings, acts and business had, taken and done thereat, and also of all documents, articles, matters and things necessary for the due and full explanation and understanding of the said minutes and things done in and about the execution of the said trusts, and shall and will from time to time, and at all reasonable times hereafter, upon the request of the Superintendent Minister for the time being of the Circuit in which the said church shall for the time being be situated, produce and show forth to him and to every person whom he shall desire to see the same, all and every such Book of Accounts, and minutes, documents, articles, matters and things, and permit and suffer copies and abstracts of or extracts from them or any of them to be made by the said Superintendent Minister or any person whom he may desire to make the same ; and the said Book of Accounts, and minutes, and all documents, matters and things relating to the said trust premises shall, at least once in the year, and oftener if the said Superintendent shall at any time desire, and shall give notice thereof in manner hereinafter mentioned, be regularly upon a day to be appointed by the said Superintendent for the time being, or with his concurrence, examined and audited by the Superintendent and the Recording Steward for the time being of the Circuit in which the said church shall for the time being be situated, at a meeting convened for that purpose ; and of every such meeting seven days' notice in writing, specifying the time, place

place and purpose of such meeting, shall be given under the direction of the said Superintendent for the time being by any one or more of them the said Trustees, to each and every of the other of them the members of said Board of Trustees and Recording Steward for the time being, and either personally served upon him and them respectively, or left for or sent by post to him and them at his and their most usual place and places of abode or business; and in order to facilitate the auditing of the said accounts, minutes, documents, articles, matters and things, it shall be lawful for the said Superintendent and Recording Steward for the time being as aforesaid, or either or any of them, to appoint in writing a deputy to act therein for him as aforesaid, and for that purpose, any one or more of them may be the deputy or deputies of the other or others of them the said Superintendent and Recording Steward; the signatures of all of them, the auditors, deputies and deputy, or the aggregate majority of them, written in the said Book or Books of Account and minutes respectively, shall be sufficient evidence that all the matters and things relating to the said trust premises which were up to that time included in the said books, accounts, minutes and documents, matters and things, were duly examined, audited, and approved of, unless and except so far as the contrary shall be therein by them or by the aggregate majority of them, in writing expressed.

How special meeting called.
What business requires special meeting.

(12) Every meeting for the purpose of taking into consideration the propriety of making any alteration, or of any addition to, or mortgage or sale of the said Church and premises, or of any part thereof, or for contracting any debt upon, for, or on account thereof (other than for the

the

the ordinary current expenses thereof), or for letting any such house or school room as aforesaid, or for fixing the rents or prices, or making or altering rules to ascertain the rents or prices of graves, pews and seats as aforesaid or for appropriating the funds of the said Church (otherwise than for the due payment of the ordinary current expenses thereof), or for bringing or defending any action or actions respecting the said trust estate and premises, or any part thereof, or any matter relating thereto, shall be taken to be a special meeting, and of every such meeting seven days' notice in writing, specifying the time, place and purpose of such meeting, and signed by at least either two of the members of said Board of Trustees or by the Superintendent Minister for the time being, shall be given to the others of them the members of said Board of Trustees, and either personally served upon him and them, or left for or sent by the post to him and them respectively, at his and their most usual place or places of abode or business; and for the purpose of transacting their ordinary business relating to the said Church and premises, or for any other purpose relating to trusts thereof (except when seven days's notice is required as hereinbefore mentioned), a meeting of the said Board of Trustees for the time being of these presents may be held so soon as the same can be convened by notice in writing, specifying the time and place of such meeting, given and signed by at least either two members of the said Board of Trustees or by the said Superintendent for the time being, and either personally served upon, or left for, or sent by the post as aforesaid, to the other and others of them respectively, at his and their most usual place or places of abode or business; provided

provided always that no meeting held under or by virtue of these presents shall be invalid, or the resolutions thereof void or impeached, by reason that any such notice as aforesaid may not or shall not have reached any member of said Board of Trustees who at the time of any such meeting happens to be out of the Province, or who or whose place or places of abode or business shall not be known to and cannot reasonably be found or discovered by the person or persons who is and are respectively as aforesaid authorized to give any such notice or notices as aforesaid, or by reason of the same not being duly delivered through the Post.

What acts good

(13) If any meeting of the said Board of Trustees the votes of the members of said Board present, or the votes of a majority of them, shall decide any question or matter proposed at such meeting, and respecting which such votes shall be given; and in case the votes shall be equally divided, then the Chairman of such meeting shall give the casting vote; and whenever it shall be thought necessary to do anything herein authorized to be done, the necessity of doing the same shall likewise be decided by the members of the Board or Corporation present and entitled to vote upon the question, or by the majority of them, and if there shall be an even division, then by such casting vote as aforesaid; and all acts and deeds done and executed in pursuance of any such decision as aforesaid, at any such meeting as aforesaid, shall be good, valid and binding on all persons entitled to vote at the meeting who may be absent, or who being present may be in the minority, and on all other persons interested; but no person (unless where the contrary is herein expressly mentioned) shall be allowed to

vote

vote in more than one capacity at the same time, or on the same question, although holding more than one office at the same time in the said Methodist Church, or in the same meeting.

Who to be
Chairman.

(14) The superintendent minister for the time being of the circuit in which the said church shall be situated, or his deputy appointed in writing under his hand, shall be the chairman thereof, and shall preside at all meetings of said Board of Trustees; but in case the said superintendent minister for the time being or his deputy as aforesaid shall attend, but shall refuse to act as Chairman at any such meeting as aforesaid, or if the said superintendent minister shall not attend at any such meeting, and shall neglect to appoint a deputy as aforesaid, then and in every such case it shall be lawful for the members of said Board of Trustees, or for a majority of them, to elect and choose from among themselves a Chairman to preside at any such meeting as aforesaid; and any meeting so held, upon any such neglect or refusal of the said superintendent minister or his deputy aforesaid, shall be as valid and effectual as if the said superintendent or his deputy as aforesaid had been the Chairman thereof and had presided thereat.

(15) It shall be lawful for the said Board of Trustees, with the consent of the Annual Conference, such consent to be testified in writing under the hand of the President for the time being of the said Annual Conference, at any time hereafter to sell and dispose of any tract of land, church, hereditaments and premises held by them, or of such part of the same respecting which such consent shall be given, either by public sale or private contract, and together or in parcels, and either at one and the

same time, or at different times, for the best price or prices in money that can reasonably be obtained for the same, and well and effectually to convey the same so sold to the purchaser thereof, his heirs and assigns, or as he may direct and appoint; and the premises so sold and conveyed and assured as aforesaid, shall thenceforth be held by the purchaser thereof, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, freed and discharged from the trusts hereby declared, and every of them; and the said Board of Trustees shall apply the money which shall arise from any such sale as aforesaid, so far as the same will extend, to the discharge of all the incumbrances, liabilities and responsibilities, whether personal or otherwise, lawfully contracted; and subject thereto either for or towards promoting the preaching of the Gospel in the said Methodist Church in the Circuit in which the said church shall be situated, or for the purpose of procuring a larger and more conveniently situated parcel of land and church and premises, in place of the said parcel of land, church and premises so sold or disposed of, to be settled upon the same trusts and to and for the same ends, interests and purposes, and with the same powers, provisos and declarations as are herein expressed and contained, or such of them as shall be then subsisting or capable of taking effect.

When property may be sold without such consent.

(16) If at any time hereafter the income arising from the said parcel of land, church and premises, held by any Board of Trustees, shall be inadequate to meet and discharge the interest of moneys borrowed and then due and owing on account of the said trust premises, and the various current expenses attending the due execution of the trusts, and if the Board of Trustees

Trustees shall desire to retire and be discharged from the burden and execution of the said trusts; and if no such proper persons, as are hereafter mentioned and described, can be found to take upon themselves the burden and execution of the said trusts, with the responsibility and liability to be thereby incurred, in that case it shall be lawful for the said Board of Trustees as aforesaid of their own proper authority, and without any such consent of the Annual Conference as aforesaid, to sell and dispose of the said parcel of land, church and premises, or any part of the same, either by public sale or private contract, and either together or in parcels, and either at one and the same time or at different times, for the best price in money that can be obtained for the same; and well and effectually to convey and assure the same, with the hereditaments and appurtenances, to the purchaser thereof, his heirs and assigns, or as he may direct and appoint; and the premises so sold and conveyed and assured as last aforesaid, shall thenceforth be held and enjoyed by the purchaser, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, freed and absolutely discharged from the trusts hereby declared, and every of them; and all the money arising from every such sale shall be applied, as far as the same will extend, to the purposes and in the manner hereinbefore directed with respect to any sale made in pursuance of such consent of or by the said Annual Conference as aforesaid; but no sale shall be made, as herein last mentioned, unless the Board of Trustees shall give notice in writing to the said Annual Conference, or to the President thereof, on or before the first day of the then next annual meeting of the said Conference, of their intention to make such sale, and the reasons for the same, nor unless the

said Conference shall, for the space of six calendar months next after the said first day of their said annual meeting, refuse or neglect either to provide the said Board of Trustees with such pecuniary or other aid as shall enable them to bear the burden of the execution of the trusts imposed or (as the case may be) to find and provide another Board of Trustees who will take upon themselves the burden of the execution of the said trusts.

Receipt of Treasurer binding.

(17) A receipt of the Treasurer or other persons duly appointed for that purpose by the said Board of Trustees, shall, in all cases of payment to him, be a full discharge to the person or persons entitled to such receipt, his and their heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, for all moneys therein respectively, expressed to have been received.

Mortgagee or purchaser need not inquire as to necessity of mortgage or sale.

(18) It shall not be incumbent upon any mortgagee or purchaser of any parcel of land, church, and premises, or of any part thereof, from any such Board of Trustees to inquire into the necessity or propriety of any mortgage or disposition of the said parcel of land, church, and premises, or of any part thereof, made or proposed to be made by the said Board of Trustees, or whether any such notice as aforesaid was duly given, or was valid or sufficient, or whether any Treasurer was duly authorized to give receipts as aforesaid; nor shall it be incumbent upon any such mortgagee or purchaser, or for any other person, his heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, paying money to such Treasurer for the time being as aforesaid, or other persons duly authorized to see to the application to be accountable for the loss, misapplication

cation or non-application of such purchase or other money, or any part thereof, for which a receipt shall be so given as aforesaid.

Trustee not chargeable for involuntary loss.

(19) The said Board of Trustees shall not, nor shall any of them or their said officers or their or any of their heirs, executors, or administrators, or any of them, be chargeable or accountable for any involuntary loss suffered by him, them, or any of them, nor for more money than shall come to their respective hands, nor for injury done by others to the said trust premises or to any part thereof.

Vacancies, now created, how filled.

(20) When and so often as any one or more of the members of said Board of Trustees shall die, resign office as Trustee by and with the consent of a two-thirds vote of the said Board of Trustees, or withdraw from or cease to be a member or members of a Methodist Church or congregation, according to the rules and discipline of the said church, or shall remove to such a distance as shall in the opinion of the said Board of Trustees, expressed by a two-thirds vote of the entire Board of Trustees, render it inexpedient for him to remain in the said trust, the place of a Trustee so dying, resigning, withdrawing, ceasing to be a member of the said church or congregation, or removing as aforesaid, shall thereupon become vacant, subject, however, to the provisos next hereinafter set out, and shall be filled with a successor being a member of the said church or congregation, of the full age of twenty-one years, to be nominated and appointed as follows, that is to say, to be nominated by the Superintendent of the circuit as as Chairman of said Board, and thereupon appointed by said Board of Trustees if they shall think proper to appoint the person or persons so nominated, and in case of an equal
division

division of the votes the Chairman shall have a casting vote in such appointment; provided always, that no such consent as aforesaid shall be given while any vacancies remain unfilled, nor shall the Board of Trustees consent to the resignation of more than one Trustee by any one vote; provided, also that notwithstanding the withdrawal of a Trustee from his membership in the said church or congregation, his powers and liabilities as a Trustee shall not cease unless his place in the trust shall be declared vacant by a two-thirds vote of the remaining Trustees, which declaration it shall be in their power to make on their being convinced that he has withdrawn as aforesaid; but they shall not be required to make such declaration if such Trustee is otherwise a fit and proper person, and is willing to serve as a member of said Board of Trustees; provided that no prior vacancy remain then unfilled, and provided that not more than one vacancy shall be declared by any one vote; and if at any time it shall be deemed advisable to increase the number of said Board of Trustees to a number not exceeding twenty-one, then the person or persons whom it is desired to appoint as such new Trustee or Trustees, shall be nominated and appointed as is next hereinbefore provided for the filling of vacancies; and if it shall happen at any time that there shall be no surviving or remaining member of said Board of Trustees other than the Superintendent of the Circuit or Chairman, it shall and may be lawful for the Superintendent aforesaid to nominate and the Quarterly Official Meeting of the Circuit, if they approve of the person or persons so nominated, to appoint the requisite number of Trustees by the vote of the majority of the members of the said meeting then present, and in case of an equal division

aforesaid) cause or procure such legal representatives as aforesaid to be well and effectually released, or otherwise discharged of, from and against all and every such bonds, debts, covenants, notes, judgments, claims and demands as last aforesaid, and of and from every of them, and every part and parcel thereof respectively.

Where Trustee Boards do their business carefully as corporate bodies, and make their engagements and contracts in their corporate capacity, and when necessary under their corporate seals, no personal liability would be incurred by any member of the Board, and no indemnification would be required.

(10) When a deed of real property is made according to form (A) in the schedule hereto, or to the like effect and purports, to convey property to Trustees in trust for a church or congregation, in connection with the Methodist Church of Canada, to be held in trust according to the rules and usages of such Church of Canada, or is expressed to be made in pursuance of this Act, then such property shall be held subject to the trusts, provisions and directions in the last preceding section mentioned and the other provisions of this Act, applicable thereto, and such deed shall be construed as if such trusts, provisions and directions were made part of such deed ; unless it is otherwise expressly stated and declared in said deed.

(11) Any deed, or part of a deed, which fails to take effect by virtue of this Act, shall nevertheless be as effectual to bind the parties thereto, so far as the rules of law and equity will permit, as if this Act had not been.

(12) Every such deed, unless an exception be specially made therein, shall be held and construed to include all houses, outhouses, edifices, barns, stables, yards, gardens, orchards, trees, woods, hedges, fences, ditches, ways, waters, watercourses, lights, liberties, privileges, easements, profits, commodities, emoluments, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the land therein comprised, belonging or in anywise appertaining, or with the same demised, used, held, occupied, and enjoyed, or taken or known as part and parcel thereof; and if the same purports to convey an estate in fee, also the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and profits of the same land, and of every part and parcel thereof, and all the estate, right, title, interest, inheritance, use, trust, property, profit, possession, claim, and demand whatsoever, both at law and in equity, of the grantor, in, to, out of or upon the same lands and every part and parcel thereof, with their and every of their appurtenances.

If to a conveyance by any Board of Trustees as herein mentioned is subscribed a signature purporting to be the signature of the President of such Annual Conference, the same shall be *prima facie* evidence in all courts that the same is the signature of the President of the said Annual Conference for the time being, and that the consent of the said Annual Conference to the sale and transfer of the property therein described

(14) Whenever within the bounds of a circuit there is more than one Board of Trustees holding property in trust for the Methodist Church of Canada, or any church or congregation in connection therewith, it shall be lawful for any two or more of such Boards to amalgamate and become one Board by the name of "The Trustees of the (*name, if any*) Methodist Church at (*the place where the trust property is situated, or where the church is situated for the benefit of the congregation worshipping in which the property is held in trust*); it shall be lawful for any Board of Trustees now existing, or hereafter constituted, whose corporate name differs from that last above indicated, to change its corporate name to that of "The Trustees of the (*name, if any*) Methodist Church at (*as last above*). The amalgamation of the said Board of Trustees, or the change of corporate name, shall be effected by the several Boards of Trustees, or the Board changing its corporate name, filing in the office of the Registrar of Deeds for the county in which the trust property is situated, a declaration in the form (C) in the schedule hereto, or to the like effect; and a minute of the same shall be entered in the Record Books or Record Book of such Boards or Board of Trustees; in case of amalgamation of several Boards of Trustees it shall only be necessary

Where the trusts attaching to any property purchased for a valuable consideration are substantially the trusts contained in section nine, no forfeiture shall be occasioned by reason of the Board of Trustees holding the same having failed to comply with any of the trusts, provisions or directions of the deed creating such trusts, or by reason of any such Board failing to comply with the trusts, provisions or directions in this Act contained or required by the discipline, rules or usages of the said Methodist Church, whether the same relate to the Constitution of the Boards of Trustees, the management of the property held in trust, or otherwise ;

otherwise; provided always that it shall be lawful for the President of the said Annual Conference in his name of office to institute proceedings against any Board of Trustees to enforce performance of, or compliance with, the trusts, provisions and directions herein contained, by or on the part of any such Board of Trustees to be performed or complied with.

Any real or personal property, or sums of money heretofore, or which may hereafter be devised or bequeathed in aid of any of the connexional funds of the Conference or church first in this section mentioned, shall be vested in and payable to the said Annual Conference of New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, whose duty it shall be to order the disposal and appropriation of the same, so as at all times to give full effect to trusts imposed by the testator.

Nicholson, 125 Granville street, and the general usage and practice of the societies belonging to the said church, and such rules and regulations as may from time to time be made or adopted by the said General Conference,
