The Constitution of the Canadian Society of Christian Unity was adopted at the first annual meeting of the Society held in the Guild Hall, Toronto, on the afternoon of Nov. 10th, 1898. The objects and methods of the Society are sufficiently set forth in the Constitution, and in support of them we ask the cordial co-operation and sympathy of Christian people. Those whose eye this statement meets are invited to give the matter sincere consideration and, if they approve of the society, to become members by sending in their names with the fee to the Secretary, Rev. F. C. C. Heathcote, 24 Austin Avenue, Toronto.

society of Christian people who believe that the present divided state of Christendom is not in accordance with the mind of our Lord as revealed in Holy Scripture. The object of the Society is to promote the cause of unity by means of common prayer, mutual discussion of the many grave questions that surround so great a subject, and the education of the public mind, by means of public meetings, lectures and addresses, and the public press.

II.

All persons who sympathize with the objects of the C.S.C.U. are eligible for membership and may become members by sending in their names to the Secretary, together with an annual fee of 25 cents.

III.

The Governing Body of the C.S.C.U. shall consist of a Council of twelve members elected annually by ballot, without nomination. A majority of the ballots cast shall be necessary to election. Five members of the council shall form a quorum.

There shall be an annual meeting of the C.S. C.U. The date, place and programme of this meeting shall be arranged by the Council.

VI.

Local Centres of the C.S.C.U. may be formed with the sanction of the Council. Each Local Centre shall endeavor to organize itself upon the model of the Parent Society, and shall be entitled to representation at the Annual Meeting.

VII

The Constitution shall be subject to an amendment, only at the Annual Meeting.

Notice of amendments shall be given to the Council at least one month before the Annual Meeting. A majority of two-thirds of the members present shall be required for the adoption of any amendment. A copy of suggested amendments shall be printed with the notice of the Annual Meeting and sent to the members.
