At the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Twenty Eighth Day of May, Anno Domini 1765, in the Fifth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by several Prorogations until the Tenth Day of October Anno Domini 1769, in the Ninth Year of His said Majesty's Reign, being the Eighth Session of the Fourth GENERAL ASSEMBLY convened in the faid Province.

### CAP. I.

An Act for establishing and regulating Ferries.

HEREAS it bath been represented that the Establish-W ment of Ferries in many Parts of this Province, would be of Preamble. great Utility and render the Communication to several Places more easy and expeditious, Be it enacted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, That from and after the Publication of this Act, His Majesty's Justices in their General or Special Sessions of Ferries shall be es the Peace for each County, shall be and they are hereby authorized and impowered to establish such Ferries over Rivers, Bays or
Creeks, within their respective Counties, as may be by them
the Justices in Sythought necessary; and to agree with and grant Licenses to such func. Persons as they shall judge meet as Ferrymen, under such Rules and Regulations as they, from Time to Time, shall judge most for the Good of the Public: And any Person or Persons who shall agree and accept of the office or Place of Ferryman, and after such Agreement and Acceptance, shall refuse or neglect to comply with and observe the several Articles and Clauses contained in said Rules and Regulations, made as aforesaid, shall be fined by the Justices in their Sessions, in any Sum not exceeding Forry Shillings for every, Offence.

Penalty on Ferrymen, not observing the Regulations.

None but the Ferrymen shall carry over either Man or Beast, where Ferries shall be established. II. And be it further Enacted, That when any Ferry shall be established over any River, Bay or Creek as aforesaid, and any Person or Persons appointed and licensed to attend the same as aforesaid, that no Person or Persons whatsoever shall carry or ferry over such River, Bay or Creek, either Man or Beast, unless by Desire or Consent of the Ferrymen appointed and licensed as aforesaid, except the same be done Gratis.

Where Ferrymen shall not give due Attendance, any other Person may supply his Place until another be appointed.

III. Provided nevertheless, That if any Ferrymen, appointed asaforesaid, shall neglect or refuse to give due Attendance, purfuant to the Regulations made for that purpose, in every such Case any other Person or Persons may supply the Place of such Ferryman, till another be appointed and licensed as aforesaid, and receive Payment for the same, in the same manner at the proper Ferryman might do if present.

IV. And be it also Enacted, That this Act shall continue and remain in force, for and during the Term of four Years, from and after the Publication thereof, and until the End of the Session of the General Assembly then next following.

### CAP. II.

An Act to prevent, for a limited Time, the Exportation of Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal, and Peale, from this Province.

Preamble.

From the Publication of this Act until the 1st Day of May 1770, before any Wheat, &c. shall be laden on board any Ship, &c. the Master shall give Bond, conditioned that the same shall be carried to some other Port in the Province, and to produce a Certificate of the due landing thereof.

HERE AS the Exportation of Wheat, Rye, Barley, W Flour, Meal, and Pease, from this Province, has been the Occasion of great Scarcity, and has proved of great Detriment to His Majesty's Subjects within the same, Be it Enac-

ted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, That from and after the Publication of this Act, until the First Day of May One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy, before any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal, or Pease, shall be laden or put on board any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, the Master of such Ship, Vessel, or Boat, shall give Bond with one Surety, to the Naval Officer of the District, in double the Value of such Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal or Pease, intended to be shipped, with Condition that the same shall be carried to some other Port or Place within the Province, (the Dangers of the Seas excepted) and to produce a Certificate of the due landing thereof, within six Months, under the Hand and Seal of the Naval Officer of the District where the same shall be unladen or put on Shore.

Wheat, &c. may be carried from one Town to another &c. II. Provided, That nothing in this Act shall be construed to debar any Person carrying Wheat, or other Grain, in any Boat

Boat passing the Rivers from one Town to another, or to or from Mill, or for the necessary Provision of the Vessels Crew.

III. And be it Enacted, That if any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal, or Pease, (the Produce of this Province) shall be laden on board any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, before such Bond is given, the same shall be forfeited, and may be seized by any of seited, and may be His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, who are hereby impowered to feize the same.

Wheat, &c. laden on board any Ship &c. before Bond feized by any Justice of the Peaces

IV. And be it further Enacted, That for the Bond herein directed to be taken, and Certificate thereof, a Fee of One Shilling shall be paid; and for a Certificate of the landing of the Articles' Certificates. herein specified, a Fee of One Shilling shall be paid, and no more.

Fees for taking Bonds, and giving

V. And be it also Enacted, That the Forfeitures incurred by this Act, shall be recovered, on the Oath of one credible Wit- recovered in any mess, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record in this Province; Court of Record. and after deducting the Expences of Profecution, be divided One Moiety to His Majesty, for the Use of the Government of this Province, and the other Moiety to him or them who shall inform, seize or sue for the same.

VI. And be it also further Enasted, That where no Naval Offi- Where no Naval ser shall be resident, the Bond herein directed to be taken, and Officer shall be Certificates to be given of the same, and of the landing thereof, and Certificates to shall be by one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace of the Town be by a Justice of the Peace of the Town be by a Justice of or Place where the faid Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal, or the Peace. Pease, shall be loaded or landed.

# CAP. III.

An Act in further Amendment of an Act made in the 6. Geo. 3. c. 32 6th Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intitled An AEt concerning Bail.

KEREAS by an Ast made in the Eighth Year of His Preamble. W present Majesty's Reign, intitled An Act for altering, amending, and continuing an Act made in the fixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign; intitled "An Act concerning Bail," it is among other Things Enacted "That in all " Causes where the Sum sued for shall exceed Ten Pounds, the "Goods, Chattels, or Estate of no Person shall be attached, un-" less the Plaintiff, his Agent or Attorney, shall make and subscribe an Affidavit in Writing, that the Defendant is justly indebted to the Plaintiff in the Sum of Ten Pounds or up-" wards;"

Attachments may be made on Goods, &cc. upon the Plaintiff's filing an Affidavit that the Defendant is jultly indebted to him in the Sum of Three Pounds or upwards;

wards;" which Restriction is found to be very inconvenient; For remedy whereof, Be it enacted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, That from and after the Publication of this Act, the Provost Marshal or his Deputy, shall and may attach the Goods, Chattels, or Estate of any Debtor or Debtors, upon the Plaintiff, his Attorney or Agent, siling an Assidavit in the Clerk's Office of the Court, from whence such Writ of Attachment shall issue, that the Desendant is justly indebted to the Plantiff in the Sum of Three Pounds or upwards; which Attachment shall be made and levied in the same manner as is directed and prescribed to be done by the Act made in the Eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign above recited.

## CAP. IV.

An Att for further regulating the Market at Halifar

The Rates of the Stalls in the Market House regulated. Person who shall take a Stall in the Market House in Halisax, by the Year or Quarter, shall pay to the Keeper the Sum of Four Pounds per Annum, to be paid Quarterly; and those who shall take a Stall for a shorter Time, shall pay Nine Pence per Day; in lieu of the Rents now paid, any Law, Usuage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

Perfors from the Country, bringing to Halifan, any Neat Cattle, &c. may dispose thereof in any of the Streets &c. of the said Town, &c.

II. And be it also Enacted, That any Person or Persons, being resident Inhabitants of any Town or Place in this Province, (Halifax excepted) bringing from the Country into the Town of Halifax, any Number or Quantity of Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, or Poultry, alive or dead, Roots, Greens, and other Vegetables, shall have free Liberty, by themselves or Agents, to kill, sell and dispose of the same by Hand or otherwise, in the Streets or Lanes of the said Town, or in any House, Bulk or Stall in the same, at any Time whether within Market Hours or without; any Law, Usuage, or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

This Act not to affect the Laws against Forestallers and Regrators. III. Provided always, That all Acts or Clauses of Acts against Forestallers and Regrators, shall be as effectual and in as full force, as if this Act had not been made.

IV. And be it Enacted. That this Act shall continue and be in force for and during the Term of One Year, from the Publication thereof, and until the End of the Session of the General Assembly then next following.
