On receiving the letter, a clerk of the agents took the top ticket (1,077) and sent it to Mr. Penistan. In a few days a dispatch came from Havana to the effect that ticket 1,077 had drawn the capital prize of \$500,000. Martinez & Co., telegraphed to Mr. Penistan that his ticket hal drawn the great prize. Mr. Penistan jumped for joy on hearing the news. Shapping the brother of his father-in-law, Thomas B. Whitney, on the shoulder, he exclaimed, 'If this is true, old fellow, I'll give you half of it. Then he insured his life, and in company with the brother of his father-in-law, came on to draw the money. They found that they would have to wait about a week until the Havana atsamer arrived with copies of the official drawing before the prize could be cashed.
