Green sold his interest in the firm Willard dreen who was the part of Mr. Jones until his death years. | Judge Jones influence during his life was keenly felt in the gadance of other business besides his own. <br> At one time he served on the advisory board of the Lumbermen's Mutual Insurance Co. of Chicago and was a past president of the Michigan Lumber Dealers' Association, At the time of his death he was vice-president of the Big Rapids Building and Loan Association, and was a director in the Citiz is State Bank. <br> Judge Jones first married in 1881 , his-wife being a daughter of his former partuer, John T. Cook. They were wed at Morley. For 20 years they resided in Big Rapids and durthis time Mrs. Jones took an active interest in the alfairs of the Episcopal church. She died after an ex tended illness in 1908. In 1912 he married Miss Mary M. Zimmerman of Toronto, Ont., who survives him. Mr. and Mrs. Jones were always active in the Presbyterian church and coniributed generously to its sup. port. Their home on South Stewart street is one of the substantial residents of the city. Mr. Jones was a member of the Masonic fraternity since 1868. He was a member of "Strict Observance" No. 27, and the Royal Arch chapter No. 2 at Hamil ton, Ontario. <br> In the death of W. T. Iones the Big Rapids region has lost a real man. Through a long career he has built himself into this community, and his name is synonymous with excellent judgement and human kindness. His character and disposition hest found expression in his work as probate judde. Throughout that time he exerted himself unceasingly to lightening the business burdens which death had brought. Many a wigow owes her continued residence in the family home to Judge Jones' appeals to creditors; many a boy and sirl owes to him the chance for a favorable start in life. Being without children, he adopted the children of Mecosta county as his own. In haudling delinquents he put into effect here methods similar to those which have since becone the approved standards of procedure all over the country. He had great patience with human weahuess and an untring advocate of giving one more chance. <br> He was not an ostentation man. His life ran deep. Throughout his utive career he had unusual discernment and keen judgement. He was sensible and practical always. in matters of public interest he was always consulted.
