

ready more bad tea has been imported this season than in any other similar period in a century. In fact, it is stated that already there has been more bad tea sent to Canada this season than she can dispose of, even if she prefers bad tea to good.

Ping Suey tea forms about 9 per cent. of the total importation of tea to this country in an average year.

In a general way Ping Suey teas may be said to be gunpowder teas, but all gunpowder teas are not Ping Suey and all Ping Suey teas are not adulterated.

The blame for the importation of adulterated teas lies on the Chinese.

The following frank confession of adulteration, with a cheerful hint as to its nature and mode of detection, as well as a suggestion for a remedy for the fraud, was published in an English paper of Shanghaf which arrived recently:

Chinese merchants, in their greed for gain, unscrupulously use a paste compound of coal dust, glue, sand and gypsum, which is mixed with the true article and then sold to consumers. To cover their frauds they use various names for various brands and bearing names of hongs which it would be difficult to detect. This has been going on foremany years.

As a matter of fact, only about 100,000 cheats should be on the marketthis year, yet the quantity appears to be just as great as in the flourishing seasons of former years.
