CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto ;

INCORPORATED BY THE STATUTE OF CANADA, 7 VICTORIA, CAP. 68,
FOR PROMOTING THE FOLLOWING OBJECTS :

FIRST—For the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Toronto, and for creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church in the said Diocese.

SECONDLY—For the encouragement of Education, and for the Support of Day-schools and Sunday-schools in the said Diocese, in conformity with the principles of the said Church.

THIRDLY—For granting assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the said Church, within the said Diocese.

FOURTHLY—For circulating in the said Diocese the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the said Church, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the central Board or Managing Committee of the said Association.

FIFTHLY—For obtaining and granting aid towards the erection, endowment, and maintenance of Churches, according to the establishment of the said Church, in the said Diocese; the erection and maintenance of Parsonage houses; the setting apart of Burial-grounds and Church-yards; the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the same establishment, and the management of all matters relating to such endowment.

I.

That before the Society shall enter upon any business at any of its meetings, the following Prayers shall be said :—

“ Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings, with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*”

"O GOD, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with Thy favour our Sovereign Queen VICTORIA, and so rule her heart, that she may in all things seek Thy honour and glory. Prosper with Thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the Clergy; the endeavours of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true religion in this Province, and the labours of those Missionaries who are promoting the same in foreign parts. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy glory, and the good of thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

"O MERCIFUL GOD, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner but rather that he should be converted and live, have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, infidels, and heretics, and also upon all those heathen nations upon which the light of Thy glorious Gospel hath not yet shone; especially the Indians of this continent. Bless the means used for their civilization and conversion, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word: and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. *Amen.*

"OUR FATHER, which art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil; for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

AND WHEN BUSINESS IS ENDED.

"ALMIGHTY GOD, Father of all mercies, we thine unworthy servants do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness, and loving kindness, to us and to all men: more particularly for the providential support by which this Society hath been enabled to spread abroad the knowledge of Thy sacred truth. But above all for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy blessed Son; for the means of grace and for the hope of glory, which Thou hast given us, in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost be all honour and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

"The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore. *Amen.*"

II.

That all those who are now, or who shall hereafter become members of the Association, and who shall subscribe Ten Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute as much as Five Pounds in one sum, shall be Associated Members of the Society, and shall be eligible to be Members of the Corporation.

III.

That every Incorporated Member subscribe not less than One Pound Five Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute not less than Twelve Pounds Ten Shillings in one sum, or land to the value of twenty-five Pounds; and that the Standing Committee be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation as Life Members, who shall have contributed through any of the Parochial Associations in connexion with the Society, in money, the sum of Twenty Pounds, or in land to the value of Thirty Pounds, for any of the following special purposes, viz. :—to be invested or held in trust for the Widows and Orphans' Fund; to

be invested or held in trust for the endowment of a Church or a Church-school; and that it shall be the duty of the Secretary at the meeting in the month of October, in each and every year, to make a return of those who have not paid up the 25s. for the year ending the 30th day of April previous, and that such names shall be erased from the list of Incorporated Members.

IV.

That the Corporation shall consist of the Bishop of Toronto for the time being, of the members appointed by the charter, and of so many of the other Associated Members of the Society as shall be elected by ballot Members of the Corporation, at the meetings to be from time to time holden on the days and at the place appointed by the By-laws of the Corporation, for its stated meetings. Provided always, that the whole number of members of the said Corporation, in addition to those who are made Members by the Statute, shall at no time exceed three hundred, and that the whole number of Members of the Corporation shall never be less than one hundred.

V.

That the Standing Committee of the Society, to be appointed as provided in one of the following By-laws, be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons, whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation, without reference to the limitation of numbers.

VI.

That the Lord Bishop of Toronto for the time being shall be President of the Society, and the Venerable the Archdeacons within the Diocese shall be Vice-Presidents.

VII.

That the Society shall, at their Meeting on the second Wednesday in June in each year, choose one or more Vice-President or Vice-Presidents in addition to the Archdeacons; one or more Treasurer or Treasurers: two or more Auditors; one Secretary, and such other officers, ministers and servants as shall be thought convenient to serve in the said offices for the year ensuing. Provided always, that no person not a member of the Society shall be eligible to any office.

VIII.

That the paid officers of the Society to be appointed by the foregoing rule, shall be a Secretary, and a subordinate officer to be selected by himself; that the former shall be in Holy Orders, uncharged with Parochial cure, and that he shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the Solicitor to the amount of £1000—himself in £500 and two sureties in £250 each. Also the Auditors.

IX.

That the Standing Committee shall propose to the Board at the General Meeting in October, a list of seven Members of the Society, to form the Tract and Book Committee for the year ensuing; that at that meeting any member be at liberty to propose another list of seven members of the Society, instead of that proposed by the Standing Committee; and that the election of the Tract and Book Committee take place at the General Meeting in November.

X.

That if it shall happen that any of the persons at any time chosen into any of the said offices shall die, or on any account be removed from such office at any time during the period for which he was elected or appointed to serve, in such case the President, or any one of the Vice-Presidents, shall convene a meeting, to be held at the usual place of meeting of the Society, at such time as shall be specified in the notice of such meeting; and that such members of the Corporation as shall be present at the meeting, or a majority of them, shall and may choose an officer or officers in

the room or place of such person or persons so dead or removed, as to them shall seem meet. Provided, that it shall not be necessary for any such meeting to be called for supplying a vacancy in the office of Vice-President: but the President may do so in his discretion.

XI.

That the Society shall and may, on the second Wednesday in every month, excepting the months of August and September, for ever hereafter, and oftener if occasion require, meet at the place heretofore used for the transaction of the business of the said Society, or such other place as may be hereafter appointed for that purpose; and that the President or Standing Committee have power to call a Special Meeting of the said Society at any time. In Lent, the meetings to be holden on Thursday instead of Wednesday.

XII.

That no act done in any meeting of the said Society shall be valid and effectual unless the President, or some one of the Vice-Presidents, shall be present at such Meeting.

XIII.

And with regard to all meetings of the Society, and to the making, altering, or repealing any By-laws, Rules or Regulations at such Meetings, it is to be specially noticed, that by the Act of the Legislature incorporating the Society, (7 Vic., ch. 68,) it is enacted that no act done in such Assembly or meeting of the Corporation shall be valid or effectual, unless six persons of the Corporation, at the least, shall be present, and the major part of them consenting thereto.

And further, that no Constitution, By-law, Rule or Regulation of the Society, nor any abrogation, repeal, change or alteration of the same, shall be passed, except notice of such intention shall have been given at the previous monthly meeting, and then it shall not be of any force or effect until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, or administering, the Diocese for the time being, by writing under his hand.

XIV.

That there shall be a Standing Committee (three of whom shall be a quorum) to prepare business for the Monthly Meetings of the Society.

That the President, Vice-Presidents, Rural Deans and Secretary, be *ex officio* members of the Standing Committee.

That the other members of the Standing Committee, not exceeding twenty in number, shall be elected by the Society out of its Incorporated Members residing in the City of Toronto and its vicinity, also of a Clerical and Lay Member from each of the several District Branch Associations in connexion with the Parent Society, to be elected annually by such Branch Association.

That of the non-official Members of the Standing Committee residing in the City of Toronto and its vicinity, the four who, having been on the Standing Committee for one entire year, have attended the fewest meetings of the Standing Committee during the twelve months ending on the first Wednesday in March, shall go out at the Annual Meeting in June; and if any doubt shall arise under this rule, which member of those who have attended the fewest meetings is to retire, then the one who have served the shortest time on the Committee shall be considered to have vacated his seat.

That the Standing Committee shall recommend to the Society at its Meeting in March in each year four Members to be elected in the place of the four retiring members, who shall not be eligible for the ensuing year.

That any member of the Society wishing to propose other candidates for election on the Standing Committee, be required to give in the names of such candidates to be proposed by him, at or before the Monthly Meeting in March.

XV.

That Minutes of all the proceedings of the Society be taken, and that at each meeting of the Society the minutes of the preceding meeting be read by the Secretary, and signed by the Chairman.

XVI.

That the accounts of the Society be closed on the thirtieth day of April in each year; and that the same be audited within one month from that date.

XVII.

That the Secretary conduct the correspondence of the Society, take minutes of the proceedings of the General Meetings and Committees, prepare the Annual Report of the Society, attend meetings of the Branches throughout the Diocese under the direction of the President, and take the general superintendence of the affairs and accounts of the Society in all its departments.

XVIII.

In connexion and correspondence with the Society, District Associations shall be established, comprising one or more Districts, (as shall be approved by the President,) the same to be composed of the Clergy resident within the bounds of the district, and all other Members who shall contribute in aid of the Society's Funds; the Archdeacon, or Senior Clergyman resident within its bounds, shall *ex officio* be Chairman or such District Branch Association, with whom shall be associated, as composing a Committee of Management, all clergymen in the District, and one or more Laymen from each congregation which observes the constitution, rules and regulations of the Society, and from none others; the lay members to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the District Branch.

A General Meeting of each Branch District Association shall be held in each year, at any time and place which may be agreed upon at a previous Quarterly Meeting of the Committee of Management; and Quarterly Meetings of the Committee of Management—not less than five to form a quorum—shall be held for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Branch Association.

In order the more fully to carry out the objects of the Society, each parish, in the person of its Clergyman and Churchwardens, shall be a Sub-Association, in correspondence, through its Chairman (the Clergyman,) with the District Branch Associations, and may be denominated, *the Parochial Committee of the Church Society*. The Committee shall meet so often, and at such periods, as they shall themselves decide to be most convenient, inviting the co-operation of all the Parishioners in their deliberations and designs. They shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavour by every means in their power to augment the resources of the Society. All moneys raised to be transmitted to the treasurer of the District Association.

The treasurer of each District Association shall transmit annually the full sum of £1 5s. for each duly recognised Clergyman, and also for each incorporated member within his district, and in case of life membership the full sum of £12 10s., together with one-fourth of all the moneys paid into his hands, to the Treasurer of the Society at Toronto, to be at the disposal of the Central Board, and the remaining three-fourths of such collections shall, when required, be expended within the Parish or District in which they have been made, for such objects only as are specified in the Constitution of the Society—the allotment to be made at the Quarterly Meetings of the District Branch Association. All moneys not required to be expended for local purposes, and remaining unappropriated at the General Annual Meeting of the District Associations, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Treasurer of the Society at Toronto.

The District Associations, through their respective Secretaries, shall communicate to the Secretary of the Parent Society at Toronto a minute Statement of all receipts and expenditures within the sphere of their operations, embodied in the form of a Report, one in each year, so soon as convenient after the General Annual meeting of such District Branch Associations.

XIX.

That four Sermons be preached annually in the several Churches, Chapels, and Stations in this Diocese, in aid of the funds of the Society, at such times as the Lord Bishop shall appoint; that of these collections the proceeds of one shall be for the benefit of the Widows and Orphans of Clergymen deceased; of another, for the

CONSTITUTION.

maintenance of Travelling or Resident Missionaries in this Diocese; of another, to aid the Theological Students; and that the proceeds of the fourth shall be appropriated to any other objects embraced within its Constitution, as the Society may from time to time direct.

XX.

That no application for a grant, loan, or other assistance, be entertained from any Rectory, Incumbency or Mission, in which there shall not have been established a "Parochial Committee" of this Society under the provisions of the article of the Constitution thereof, reporting to and in communication with the Parent Society, and in which all the requirements of said Constitution shall not have been complied with, unless upon the omission of such requirement a special written dispensation shall have been obtained within three months of the date thereof; and further, that accompanying such application there be a distinct accurate description of the object towards which aid is sought, together with a detailed account of the sum of money collected in the locality or elsewhere towards the same object, and how applied: Provided nevertheless, that it shall be at all times competent for the President to recommend to the Standing Committee any case which in his Lordship's opinion may require special consideration; and should the Standing Committee report favourably thereon, that the Society may in such case grant the assistance so sought, or any portion thereof; and further, that no application be entertained from the Widow or Orphan or the guardian of the Orphan of any deceased Clergyman of this Diocese who shall not have conformed to the provisions and requirements of a certain By-law, entitled a "By-law for the due administration and improving the Widows and Orphans' Fund of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto," and also of any amendments to the said By-law, which may be enacted from time to time according to the provisions of the Constitution of the said Society, unless upon the omission of any of the said requirements a special written dispensation had been granted by his Lordship the President, and forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months after the date thereof. Provided, nevertheless, that it shall be at all times competent for the President to recommend to the Standing Committee any case which in his Lordship's opinion may require special consideration, and should the Standing Committee report favourably thereon, that then the Society may grant such proportion of any annuity as to said Society may seem fit; and that it be the duty of the Secretary after each Annual Meeting of the Society, to notify to each Clergyman whether he have or have not complied with the requirements which would entitle his Widow and Orphans to a Pension.

XXI.

That the Charter and these By-laws do together form the Constitution of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, and that nothing which is contained in the Constitution of the Society established on the 28th day of April, 1842, or in any By-law, Rule, or Regulation, amending or altering the same, shall apply to, or be in force in respect to, the Incorporated Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, except such provisions thereof as are above continued in force.

EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

DIOCESE OF TORONTO.

PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING AT TORONTO, HELD ON
WEDNESDAY, JUNE 13TH, 1860.

In reviewing the proceedings of the society during the past year, your committee cannot but discern reasons for thankfulness and hope, in the midst of much to discourage.

It is well known to all that the pressure under which the commercial and agricultural interests of this province have long been labouring, have been hitherto but very inconsiderably relieved, and that at all events sufficient time has not as yet elapsed, to permit the fruit of returning prosperity to discover itself in the shape of increased ability and disposition to further the cause of charity and religion.

It must therefore under these circumstances be a matter of congratulation, that we are in a position to announce any increase of the income of the society, and there is little reason to doubt that when all the collections and subscriptions for the year shall have come in, the increase as compared with last year, will amount to at least £200; nor is the mere fact of this addition to the pecuniary resources of this society the sole ground of congratulation. The committee feel that they may fairly invite the society to rejoice with them on the mode in which that addition has been made; all the statistics, received from the district and parochial branches, show an increase of zeal and vigour in the

administration of the affairs of the society. The great increase is in the sum remitted from parochial branches, many sending more than the quarter prescribed by the rules of the society, and some forwarding the whole of the amount subscribed. This generous determination to postpone local interests to the general objects of the society, must be regarded as a very hopeful sign, and as an augury of far greater results hereafter, and your committee cannot refrain from observing that it has, as a general rule, been most signally exemplified in the case of the poorer districts.

They whose poverty may well have proved a strong temptation to restrict their charity within the limits of their own locality, have shewn themselves by no means the least mindful of the apostle's injunction, "look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others." The result has been that instead of £433 10s. Od. remitted from Parochial Branches during the previous year, we have this year received no less a sum than £828. We trust that this may prove an ample encouragement to all who have devoted their time and abilities to the service of the society, whether in the unobtrusive but laborious and self-denying office of collectors, or as officers of parochial and district associations.

We may also accept this improved condition of our finances as a satisfactory proof that the additional attention which has been given to the conduct of our annual meetings, has not been thrown away, and your committee would hope that all who are qualified to assist in such meetings, and more especially the lay members of our communion, will be stimulated hereby to renewed exertions to awaken and sustain the interest of the church at large in the good work which it is the duty of the society to prosecute. The amount derived from the quarterly collections is somewhat less than last year; but the number of stations at which collections have been taken up (and parishes which always contribute have yet to be heard from) is somewhat greater.

Your committee would therefore gladly impute the slight deficiency, not to any negligence or lukewarmness on the part of the clergy, but to the continued scarcity of the means of exercising liberality, among those to whom they had to address their appeals.

Your committee trust that under the good providence of God, we may be enabled in years to come, not only more adequately to discharge our immediate duties in respect of the spiritual destitution which unhappily exists within the limits of this diocese, but ultimately to extend our Christian charity to that wider field in which our beloved mother church has been so long and so successfully labouring.

Though, unhappily, we cannot at present render her any mate-

rial aid, we must not at all events withhold the expression of our cordial sympathy with her labours, whether in the eastern or western hemisphere.

In the west, we see her endowing and organising, and that chiefly through the munificence of one Christian lady, the Bishopric of Columbia, while in South Africa a vast missionary enterprise has been set on foot, by the united action of the two great English Universities. Bishops have also been consecrated for the new Sees of Warepor, New Zealand, Moreton Bay, and St. Helena.

The Society for the Diocese of Huron is prospering, and the number of the clergy greatly increased since the division, and your committee have every reason to believe that the bishopric in the east will be immediately established, when the same happy results may be expected.

The reports from the Dioceses of Quebec, Montreal, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland, are also encouraging.

Since the last annual meeting, an arrangement has been concluded for the division of the several funds of this society, as it originally existed, between the two Church Societies of the Dioceses of Toronto and Huron. The Bishops were enabled to avail themselves, in the conduct of this important business, of the high legal attainments, and of the mature judgment, of the late lamented Sir James Buchanan Macauley; and it would ill become us to forget that one of the latest labours of his valuable life was a work of love on behalf of this society, and of the general interests of the church; a work to which very few could have brought the like qualifications with himself, while his retirement from the high judicial position which he had so long adorned, pointed him out as the only person to whose experience and unimpeachable integrity we were to entrust a task of no ordinary difficulty.

We have also to deplore the loss of one who was from its commencement a prominent and zealous member of this society, and we are assured that many a year must pass ere the name of the Rev. D. E. Blake will cease to be held in affectionate remembrance by the Churchmen of this diocese; his memory must long be cherished as that of a sincere, consistent, and warm-hearted advocate of christian truth, whose practical good sense and sound views of ecclesiastical polity, led him to recognise in this society the legitimate organ for the diffusion and advancement of that truth within the diocese.

INCOME.

The income of the Parent Society, when the books were closed, exclusive of moneys received for various trusts and

EASTERN EPISCOPAL TRUST FUND.

The Rev. Mr. Stuart of Kingston submitted the following report of the committee entrusted with the management of the Trust Fund for the endowment of the Bishopric of Kingston:

The committee of the Eastern Episcopal Trust Fund beg leave to report that, being impressed with the deep importance to the prosperity of the church in this part of the Diocese of Toronto, that the fund for the endowment of the bishopric of Kingston should be completed with as little delay as possible, they have been directing their efforts during the year to the obtaining of further subscriptions, and the proper investment of the notes and moneys in the hands of their treasurer.

It will be seen by the following statement that cash and securities to the extent of \$35,595.82 are now in the treasurer's hands, a portion of which consists of mortgages taken in exchange for notes, and the committee are now earnestly engaged in carrying out the necessary arrangements for further investments.

In addition to this amount, interest estimated at \$16,000 has accrued upon the promissory notes and mortgages, and there are subscriptions not yet paid amounting to \$4,223.33, inclusive of the sum of £500 sterling promised by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

Were it not that a large deduction will have to be allowed on account of losses upon the promissory notes, the committee would be able to report that the minimum amount required had been made up. They have much satisfaction, however, in being able to state that they have succeeded beyond their expectations in forwarding the completion of the endowment, notwithstanding the great monetary depression during the last two years, and they trust that in a short time the Eastern Episcopal Trust Fund will have attained the object for which it was instituted.

The interest on the Investments on Mortgage is further secured by personal bonds with sureties.

These several investments yield an aggregate income of £14,598 0s. 5d., while the charges on the Fund for the current year are estimated at £14,300, leaving a surplus of income over expenditure of £298 0s. 5d., which is at the disposal of his Lordship the Bishop of the Diocese, under the By-Law of the Society in that behalf.

As the Committee have carried out the directions contained in the award between the Church Societies of the Dioceses of Toronto and Huron, since the last annual meeting of this Society, and have transferred to the latter Diocese their proportion of the Trust Fund, they consider the present a fitting occasion to give a brief resumé of the result of their operations since the trust was established.

The commutation was commenced in the year 1855, and completed in the early part of 1857, by which period, the sum paid to the clergy of our Church in Upper Canada, and received by them from the Church Society, amounted to £184,850 sterling, or £224,900 16s. 8d. currency, yielding an income of £13,954 per annum;—nearly £6000 a year less than the amount of the salaries which were charged upon the fund, and which the Society had covenanted to pay to the Clergy during their lives or incumbencies, on receiving from them their Commutation money—a deficiency which, at the time, it would have been impossible to supply, except by an encroachment upon the capital of the fund, had it not been for a liberal grant of £7,500 made by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel.

Since that period, both the capital and income of the fund have steadily increased, so that now, before the expiration of the fifth year from the acceptance of the Trust by the Society, and after having transferred to the Diocese of Huron their proportion of the fund, amounting to £66,551, there remains for this Diocese, as at present constituted, the above sum of £223,177 19s. 8d., yielding an income of £14,598 0s. 5d.; being a capital of only £1721 15s. 10d. less than the whole sum before the Commutation was closed, but affording a return of £644 per annum more than the interest at that time, an increase of upwards of 28 per cent.

on the original capital, in addition to the regular payment of the salaries of the Clergy, *half-yearly*, until last year, when their comfort was increased very much by these payments being made *quarterly*: and this has all been effected at an expense of less than £750, up to the commencement of this year.

The Committee append hereto the report of the Sub-Committee, whose duty it is to examine the securities of the Trust deposited in the Commercial Bank, and they have much satisfaction in stating that there is not a shilling of interest in arrear on any of their securities, and only £50 of principal on a debenture of a Township Municipality.

EXTRACTS FROM DISTRICT AND PAROCHIAL REPORTS.

HOME DISTRICT.

REPORT OF THE MANAGING COMMITTEE.

The Managing Committee are thankful to be able to report that the work of the Society has been carried on during the past year, in this District, with very satisfactory results; the total amount collected and reported to the committee being \$1942.13, an excess of \$427.75 above the total of the previous year.

The amount, however, at the disposal of the District Committee, viz., \$605.15, is less than that of last year by \$13.51, owing to many of the parochial branches having been compelled by urgent local wants to make requisition for the three-fourths allowed by the constitution.

The annual meetings in the several parishes and missions were well attended, and the interest in the objects of the Society appears to be steadily increasing among our people. The plan of appointing deputations of clergymen to attend meetings in different sections of the District was found to work well, and much valuable assistance was afforded by several influential laymen, who visited different parishes.

The labours of our missionary—the Rev. G. P. Viner—have been continued as indefatigably as formerly; but the committee regret that, at the close of his three years' engagement with the District in October next, he will probably be removed to another sphere of duty; when a new arrangement will probably be made by the bishop in regard to the section of country embraced in the present mission of the Rev. G. P. Viner, and the Rev. T. Taylor.

ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST'S, TORONTO.

Your secretary reports that, though the removal of the seat of government to Quebec deprived this branch of many members, who contributed to its funds last year, still the amount received is only \$7.50 less than last year; and if to this be added the sums received at the offertory collections for the several objects of the Society, \$114.81, the total contributed by the congregation of St. John's to the Society exceeds that of last year by 31 cents, viz., £60 1s. 11d. The amount of subscriptions collected by this branch has been thus apportioned: \$58, including subscriptions of six incorporated members, paid to Parent Society; \$48.75 to the Home District, for missionary purposes within the same;

and the balance, \$18.75, reserved for payment for reports and Sunday school purposes. When the circumstances of this congregation are taken into consideration, the church being entirely free, and therefore solely dependent on voluntary contributions, with a large sum to make up for local objects, your Secretary thinks your parochial branch has cause to be satisfied with the result of its operations during the past year.

ST. PAUL'S.

The arduous undertaking of erecting a new church, in which this congregation has been engaged, (during a period of unusual depression,) has prevented us from supporting the Society as liberally as we would otherwise have done.

The claims of the Society have, however, been duly brought before the congregation, particularly at the annual meeting, when they were fully and ably advocated by several laymen of distinguished ability.

The quarterly collections in aid of the leading objects of the Society have been regularly taken up after sermons preached for the occasion, and the results of these appeals, as well as those for subscriptions in aid of the missionary objects, prove that the efforts of the Society are duly appreciated by us; and inspire the hope that when the enterprise now in hand shall have been happily completed, and consequent liabilities lessened, the Church's claims for aid beyond our bounds will be more liberally responded to. It is nevertheless satisfactory to report that, for the current year, the contributions to the Parent Society and to the District Branch, have not fallen short of those for last year.

HOLY TRINITY.

Since the establishment of the Branch of the Church Society in this parish, in 1854, the subscriptions received through the offertory have risen from £33 in that year, to £47 in 1859, but this sum has been contributed by only sixty-six persons, out of a congregation of eight hundred souls. The committee confidently hope for a large increase this year, and by this means evince our interest in the missionary objects of the Church.

The amount collected was \$194; \$68 paid to the Parent Society.

SIMCOE DISTRICT.

Your Committee in making this its third annual report, have again to congratulate the county branch upon the success which in the providence of God, has attended its operations, and the

increased amount of income as shown in the treasurer's account. Two parochial branches have sent in their subscriptions in addition to those who made returns last year, while, in consequence of the disappointment felt from no Missionary having yet been obtained for the county, no collection has been made in one place returned last year. During the last week of January, and the first in February, parochial meetings were held in Penetanguishene, Craighurst, St. Paul's (Innisfil,) St. Peter's (Innisfil,) Tecumseth, Bradford, West Gwillimbury, Orillia, Oro, North Orillia, Bruce, Collingwood and Orangeville; some of the county clergy attended all the meetings. The Hon. J. H. Cameron also gave his very valuable assistance at many of the places, affording an increased interest to the proceedings. E. G. O'Brien, Esq., of Shanty Bay, also rendered very efficient assistance on several occasions as well as other lay gentlemen of the county.

The deputation was every where received with marked interest in the society's operations. The attendance at most was good, and some places very large. The plan adopted in the county of making collections at the several meetings, also of taking down the names of those who wished to become subscribers, was carried out with evident success. Not only in facilitating the after duties of collectors, but also in augmenting the number of contributors while the objects of the society were fresh in the minds of the various audiences.

Returns have been received from all the places where meetings were held, though it is to be regretted that in some instances they were much behind the time appointed, which has necessarily prevented this report from being presented at an earlier period. The amount paid to the county treasurer is \$580 80, being a very satisfactory increase over that of last year, and your committee had every reason to feel assured that if missionaries could be appointed to labour in the county, a still greater increase would immediately follow; as in all the places visited, the regret had to be met, that the first object of the county branch had been so long delayed, and in one place, where your secretary, in company with Hon. J. H. Cameron, and Rev. E. Morgan, proceeded for the purpose of holding a meeting, this disappointment was found to cast such a damp on the members of the Church, that they were forced to return without accomplishing their design. On this subject your committee have to report that every possible effort has been made during the past year to obtain increased ministerial services for the county; on several occasions these efforts seemed about to prove successful, when disappointment was again the issue. The committee cannot but enter deeply into the feeling on this subject so general throughout the county,

and pledges itself that all proper exertions will be continued to secure this most desirable object with as little delay as possible.

NIAGARA DISTRICT.

At a meeting of the above Association held in St. George's Church, St. Catharines, on Tuesday, March 6th, 1860, the following report was read and adopted:—

In presenting this their eighteenth annual report, your committee would desire to express their humble thanks to Almighty God, for the blessings vouchsafed to His Church within the bounds of this District Branch Association.

Your committee have much satisfaction in announcing that, although "the field already white to the harvest," has not yet been so amply supplied with labourers as it demands, a great and good work is by God's blessing going on, and that portion of our Lord's vineyard, which your committee have placed under the pastoral supervision of your Travelling Missionary, is being tilled in the most efficient manner. Your Missionary is not doing his work superficially, but to use his own impressive language, is "planting christianity deep in that soil, and watering it at regular intervals," trusting that God in his own time will be pleased to grant "the increase."

Again is it a cause of regret that the remaining portion of the former travelling mission still lies vacant; this is the more lamentable, when it is considered that the entire district, comprising the destitute portions of Lincoln, Welland and Haldimand calls upon us for aid, and demands that the same privileges which have been extended to one portion should be granted to the rest; that the scattered lambs of Christ's fold should be protected from the ravages of the "wolves," which during the absence of the regular pastor, enter in and "devour the sheep." Until your committee can have the happiness of reporting the exertions of a second, (which is so loudly called for) they thankfully present the report of the labours of your present missionary in his own words:—"As the annual meeting of the Society is at hand, it is my duty to give you a report of my labours for the past year as the missionary of that Society. I am unfeignedly thankful to be able to say that through the goodness of God in disposing the hearts of a few friends in England and this country, we have at last a really pretty little church erected which we can call our own. One acre of land was purchased, and conveyed to the Church Society of Toronto as a burial ground and site for a church, and upon this ground, within the incorporated village of

Welland, and about half a mile from the court house and jail our church is built. It was opened for public worship on the 17th July, and has been well filled on Sundays ever since. It is free, and as all the money received towards it was paid with that understanding, I trust it will remain so, and that I shall no longer hear people say they cannot come to church for they are too poor to pay pew-rent. The whole cost of the land, building, harmonium, and fencing, comes to about \$1000, and it can accommodate about 130 persons. Whenever the people here require a larger place of worship, I consider that this will do very well for week day services or a parochial school room. I am encouraged by the number attending this church, many coming a distance of four or five miles. The number of communicants is also increasing, which leads me to hope that the ministrations of the church in this place are not altogether in vain, and that the work of God's good Spirit is progressing inwardly. At Marshville we continue to worship in the wretched and dilapidated school-house, which is so uncomfortable that it is more likely to frighten people away than to draw them to the service, and yet it is crowded with a very attentive congregation. I am especially delighted with the number of children who come to the catechising which I have after the second lesson. Indeed many of the parents have expressed themselves more thankful for this part of the service than for the sermon. They are in great want of a church; I would set about begging for one were it not that an application is now before the Government, respecting the glebes of Wainfleet, upon which the church was to have been erected by the Rev. James Clarke, if death had not interfered, and we may be obliged to build upon the same lands to secure them. It is truly sad to think that land so solemnly conveyed to the Church by act of council for ever, and so long in the hands of the tenants of my predecessor, should be kept promised, or that the tenants of any party whatever should be encouraged to expect the right of purchasing the inheritance of their landlord! And this more especially where a church is greatly needed. At Port Colborne the small congregation continues to assemble in the stone school house, but here, I regret to say, since the opening of the meeting house for all denominations, in which some wished me to officiate and to which both a party in that place and the Bishop objected, the attendance has been smaller, about forty attend; a few seem to be in earnest, one has lately offered me a site for a church in a central position worth \$400 and \$200 in cash, if the building could be proceeded with, but he is almost the only one who can easily give any thing towards this object. A small class is here also catechised after the second lesson, for which the parents seem very thankful—happily the roads have been so much better

this year than the two former ones, that I have not missed more than one or two Sundays in keeping my appointments. I have also been, this winter, at night, visiting large families, too far from the Sunday School and Church for the purpose of catechising, and a good many hours have, I trust, been well employed in that way. I hope soon to begin lecturing on confirmation as a preparation for the Bishop's triennial tour, when I hope a large number will present themselves. Among the few removed from us by death, I may mention one, whose life and last end were so exemplary and edifying that they appear to be a precious legacy to the Church. For many years a communicant at Port Robinson, she had married and removed into this mission about twelve months previous to her death; and when she found that God was calling her hence, and that she had to leave a fond husband, a precious babe, and many earthly comforts, she was enabled by a faith such as we seldom witness to resign all into her Heavenly Father's hands: there was no regret, no pain, no grief at parting with the earth, on the contrary, her departure seemed like a triumphal entry into Paradise. She trusted in the sole merits of Christ, and that was enough; she often expressed a desire to see the minister of the Church, but I never went to see her without feeling that she was more an example for me than I could be to her—her heart appeared to be full with her treasure which was in Heaven, and with a most beautiful smile, she could say with St. Paul, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? Thanks be to God which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." While writing this the death of one of my neighbours whom I have been visiting for many months, was announced; she too has been graciously blessed with faith and hope in her Saviour's merits, and though at the commencement of her illness she found the struggle hard and severe, she was enabled to overcome the love of this present life and to rejoice in the brighter prospect before her.

Another interesting case, I must mention, it is that of a family in Moulton some fourteen miles in the marsh, which I visited last summer with the view of seeing a few other families in that quarter. After spending the evening in catechising the children, seven in number, I was informed that the mother, who was very ill in another room, and who had heard all that I had said to the children, was very anxious to be baptised. She was better prepared than I at first supposed, and being really very ill she was baptised. The whole family appeared most thankful that I had been sent to them just in time. The next morning I baptised three of the younger children, and others of the neighbourhood; the mother recovered for a while, and was forthcoming to the Lord's supper, when she was rather suddenly summoned, I

hope to a better table, even that in Abraham's bosom. I was called upon to go and bury her. I preached to a large assemblage of people, many of whom, I was told, had scarcely ever heard a Church Clergyman, and the good woman was buried in the unfenced and unconsecrated sand on the shore of Lake Erie, this being the only grave-yard in this vicinity! You will, I am sure, be pleased to know that among the seven children of this bereaved family was a youth of eighteen, whose intelligent enquiries and earnest piety, led me to notice more particularly, and after proper investigation on my part, and receiving a good report of the young man from all his neighbours, and though the only son of a father who has a farm to work, the latter has consented to let him devote himself to God, and he is now with me preparing for college.

A month ago I was requested by a man residing on the town lines between Humberstone and Crowland, five miles hence, to go and visit his family; I went and found that he was an Englishman who had been twenty years in this country, but had never had an opportunity to have his children baptised; he seemed, however, to have retained more of the religion of the church than many who come from dear old England. As the children were from ten to eighteen years of age, I thought it my duty to make them feel as if they were of themselves coming to holy baptism, and being very much pleased with their knowledge and apparent proper disposition, I, the other day, gathered a small number of friends, and went out there to baptise them, the whole congregation standing for the young people, and all answering for and with them, at the font. It was an imposing scene; the new clearing in the back woods, the small log houses of new German settlers all around, and the idea that at least one good English church family with proper respect for God's word and God's church, was living here, and would most likely be the seed of a future house of God in that locality, where bears and wolves abounded only a few years ago, could not but make the work in which we were engaged most interesting.

The amount received by me towards the free church in Wel-land, (the whole mission having to raise \$400 a year besides towards my support, and not including the sum realised at a bazaar,) was \$241.68; this includes the offertory to the 26th February, 1860, and the note of D. P. Brown, Esq., for \$100. The sacramental alms usually given to the poor come to \$11.14½. For the church society, including subscriptions and quarterly collections in the whole mission, \$32.16 was received and paid to the society. My ladies have just collected about \$15 towards a small bell. I verily believe that much more would have been collected if the times had not been so extremely hard.

48 baptisms have been performed since the first of January, 1859, and 5 burials.

It is a great pity that we have not more missionaries employed in these townships, I really believe that with a proper staff of sound and earnest clergy a congregation could be formed every four or five miles all through this part of the country; but they should have all the means necessary to work with. The work of church missions is impeded for want of means. What are two services every Lord's day in four townships with an area of nearly 400 square miles, and the whole thickly inhabited? Oh may "the Lord of the harvest send forth more labourers into his harvest."

The several parochial branches within the bounds of this district association report as follows :

Chippawa reports the same as last year viz., \$124 for general purposes and \$50 for the Widows and Orphans' Fund. This sum shews a falling off to a considerable amount when compared with some former years.

The committee of the Thorold parochial branch of the Diocesan Church Society, have much pleasure in reporting the collections in their parish for this year at \$169.20.

From the great depression pervading the country, from the entire cessation of expenditure on public works, to which Thorold has till this year been so much indebted, it was feared that the collections would fall far short of the usual amount. But such has not been the case, as they have considerably exceeded those of most years, and are only some forty-three dollars below the highest amount collected, which was last year, which included forty dollars contributed by the late excellent George Keefer, Esq., on his death bed.

The success that has attended the zealous labours of the collectors is to be attributed in a great measure (under God) to the excellent meetings held in the parish on behalf of the society, which were well attended, at which admirable addresses were delivered by the neighbouring clergy and others.

The committee of the parochial branch would strongly recommend the adoption by others of the practice which has been found to work very well in this parish for the last two years, of sending persons throughout the meetings with a book specially to take down the names of contributors just before the close of the meetings. This plan saves the collectors a great deal of trouble as

well as time, and turns the meetings to an immediate practical purpose by affording to those present an opportunity of contributing to God's service whilst their hearts are interested in the cause. But the committee would strongly recommend that the meetings throughout the district should in future be held in October, and all the collections be made before the beginning of December, as at that time the farmers have generally made market of their produce, and the proceeds thereof have been diffused through all classes of the community; whereas at this time of the year, the farmer's barns and granaries are empty, and there is very little money in circulation.

Being total amount collected within the parish for Church Society and missionary objects, and if to the above we again add the sum of \$142.60 collected within the same period for the Irish Society, we shall have a grand total of \$674.41, or £168 12s. 1d. raised in this parish for church objects (over and above its ordinary church obligations) in a year, too, of unprecedented depression.

NIAGARA.

The parish of Niagara reports that the sum collected amounts to \$120.63. The amount would have exceeded that of last year, had not a circumstance arisen in the parish, just at the time the parochial collections were being made, which called for a special collection to meet the salary of the organist, and which resulted in \$141 being raised. This affected the collections for the Church Society very considerably, but it was unavoidable.

In addition to this, the constant removals of subscribers from the parish, and the cost of erecting the parsonage, which is still felt by the parishioners, and will continue to be so until the whole debt is paid, must in the meantime materially affect the parochial subscriptions; the returns, however, are not yet completed.

Drummondville and Stamford within the parish of Chippawa report whole amount of subscriptions and donations for the year now closed \$68.50, made up as follows:

Also they report, in accordance with resolution of district branch, the whole amount collected for all Church purposes up to Easter, 1859, was \$518.30.

Thus the aggregate of the subscriptions for this year amounts to \$912.68.

The total amount of the parochial branches of the Niagara District for the past year is \$950.61, of which \$362.36 have been remitted to parent society.

GORE AND WELLINGTON DISTRICT.

The managing committee of the Gore and Wellington branch of the Church Society have the satisfaction of reporting that their labours during the past year have, under the blessing of God, been attended with a large amount of success. The missionaries engaged under their auspices have been labouring in their respective fields with great diligence, and are rapidly reaping the harvest which has long been ripe for the sickle.

The field of missionary labour appears to be widening to an extent which, while it is cheering to witness, at the same time awakens much anxiety on the part of the committee as to the means of supplying these increasing wants. With a view to meet this emergency, the committee during the early part of last year appointed a deputation to visit those townships in the northern section of the united districts, with a view of ascertaining whether the members of the Church of England resident there, might not be able to raise local subscriptions in aid of a travelling missionary, provided a missionary were sent. The deputation, consisting of the Rev. H. W. Stewart and Rev. Francis Tremayne, performed the duty in a most efficient and satisfactory manner, and presented a very able and interesting report. They were warmly welcomed by the settlers, and aided by them in the work of canvassing from house to house. The result of their canvass was that the townships of Maryborough and Peel have raised by local subscription the sum of \$300, or one-half the required salary for a missionary. They have given bonds for the payment of that sum, and your committee have intimated to

them that a similar amount will be granted to them by this Society, and that Maryborough and Pael shall be the first vacancy filled.

Similar efforts in Arthur, North Arthur, Mount Forest, and the township of Luther, were attended with similar success, and bonds have been entered into with your committee for the payment annually of upwards of \$300 towards the salary of the Rev. Mr. Houston, who is now labouring among them. This arrangement it is hoped will enable the committee at once to request the bishop of the diocese to appoint a missionary to the destitute townships of Maryborough and Peel. The collections for the year which is just expiring, your committee are happy to say, exceed those of the former year by a considerable sum: a fact which must be gratifying at a time when every one is feeling the pressure of the times, and when serious apprehensions were entertained that there would be a falling off. May we not regard this as an indication that the lesson which Divine Providence appears to have been teaching the people of this country at large, by the pecuniary crisis which has swept like a tornado over the whole land, has had a salutary effect; and that although their worldly substance may not have increased during the last twelve months, but in many cases may have materially diminished, yet their contributions to the sacred cause of missionary labour—the cause of Christ and of God—have not been lessened or withdrawn; but that amid much trial and difficulty the wants of those who are perishing for lack of knowledge have not been overlooked.

Twenty-three parishes have reported their collections for the past year. Among these Guelph has earned for itself the honourable distinction of standing at the head; the amount subscribed there being the largest among the parishes of this district association. Three new parochial associations have been formed during the last few weeks, namely, at Fergus, Waterdown, and Acton, making in all at the present time no less than thirty parochial associations in connexion with this district branch. The treasurer's statement will furnish the amounts received from each, as well as a comparative view of this and the preceding year.

The two associations in Hamilton, namely, Christ's Church and the Church of the Ascension, avail themselves of this opportunity to present their reports.

CHRIST'S CHURCH.

The total amounts collected this year is \$283.34, of which the sum of \$22 was appropriated to paying for reports, leaving for general purposes \$261.34. The quarterly collections amount to \$124.07, and special collections during the year to \$1250, in-

cluding a grant from the Ladies' Sewing Society of upwards of \$800. It is mainly owing to the exertions of the ladies also that the subscriptions of this parish have not fallen short of former years. They kindly undertook the not very agreeable task of going from house to house and soliciting from rich and poor such contributions as they were able to give. The best reward for such self-denying labours is the consciousness that they have been engaged in a good work, endeavouring to promote the cause of Christ and his church.

THE CHURCH OF THE ASCENSION.

The committee of the Church of the Ascension parochial association have to report as collected through annual subscriptions and donations, the sum of \$106.50; also for missionary purposes in the Gore and Wellington District, \$9; which, with the quarterly collections, \$81.39, makes a yearly total of \$196.89, raised by their church in aid of the Church Society's operations.

NEWCASTLE DISTRICT.

COBOURG.

This parochial branch have to congratulate themselves upon reaching this year the amount of collections usually obtained in times of ordinary prosperity, (£100 8s. 1d.)—of which was paid direct to the Parent Society £5, and one-fourth of the balance. In addition to this amount, it is proper to state that there has been transmitted to the Parent Society from this parish during the past year, special collections in its behalf amounting to £54 13s. 6d.

At the same time parochial church purposes have demanded a corresponding local expenditure. Constant repairs and improvements are called for; and during the past year a handsome stained window has been placed in the chancel at the cost of £106 5s.; and a contract has been entered into for the erection of tables containing the Lord's Prayer, Creed and Ten Commandments, to the extent of about £20 more, all of which has been raised by subscription.

PORT HOPE.

The committee have little to say, since none of the funds collected have been expended in the parish, but have all been transmitted direct to the Parent Society.

The benevolence of the ladies of this congregation has induced them to organize a society for home purposes; which by sales of

needle work, by the subscriptions of its members, and contributions of the well-disposed, is enabled to accomplish many of those objects carried out in other parishes by part of the funds of the local Church Society.

The collection at the last annual meeting was £6 10s. The proceeds of the regular collections amounting to £20 15s., have been duly transmitted to the Parent Society in Toronto.

PETERBOROUGH.

A meeting of the society was held in this place upon the 30th day of January last, which was well attended; a large number of the clergy were present, and the parishioners manifested an increased interest in the society's advancement. A committee of ladies has undertaken the work of collection, and there will be sent to the Parent Society the sum of £20, which the local committee has every reason to trust will be increased next year.

DARLINGTON.

The committee of this branch have nothing special to report. The annual meeting was much larger than at any former period, and evinced a very lively interest on behalf of the good cause, of which substantial evidence has since been given in the contributions of the congregation generally. Every effort is being made in the parish at the present time to reduce the debt of St. John's Church, Bowmanville, and with satisfactory success; but until this burden is removed the contributions to the Church Society cannot be reasonably expected to be as liberal as under other and more favourable circumstances. The amount subscribed for the present year is £15.

NEWCASTLE.

The ladies who kindly undertook the work of collecting lost no time in following up the warm advocacy of the cause of the society by the several speakers at the annual meeting; but very shortly afterwards made direct and personal appeals to every member of the Church in the neighbourhood. The result of their ready zeal was an increase of nearly £7 10s. over the subscription list of last year. The whole amount subscribed is £21 5s.

GRAFTON.

The amount raised by this parochial association is £25, of which the usual proportion will be remitted to the Parent Society. Besides this, five collections have been made during the year, amounting to £15 17s. 4d., which, added to the proceeds of the

annual subscriptions, increases the total to the sum of £40 17s. 4d. raised for the objects contemplated by the Society during the past year.

COLBORNE.

The collectors have been very energetic in their labours, and the amount raised is £22 10s., which is less than last year's collections by about £5. This decrease has been chiefly caused by a reluctance on the part of some of the people of Brighton to contribute to the funds of this association; as they are looking forward, at no very distant day, to enjoy the benefits, if not of a resident, at least of a travelling missionary.

The five collections taken up during the year amount to the sum of £7 17s. 3d., which, with the annual subscriptions above stated, will make the amount from this parish £30 7s. 3d. It will thus be seen that the whole amount raised for the Church Society within the mission of Grafton and Colborne during the past year is £71 4s. 7d.; which shews what might be done by general and united co-operation in the missionary cause.

CAVAN.

The annual meetings in this parish were honoured this year by the presence of a large number of the clergy, seven presbyters having advocated the cause of the society.

The following statement presents the amount subscribed by the Cavan parochial association for the current year:

This is an increase of £6 over last year, a fact which is exceedingly encouraging. The half of the amount received will be remitted to the Parent Society.

CARTWRIGHT.

The committee state that the subscriptions taken up at the usual annual meeting amounted to £10, which has since been increased by £2. The whole amount is to be sent to the Parent Society. The report concludes with the hope that the constitution of the Society will soon be so amended as to oblige every parish to send to the Parent Association all the money that may be collected in its name.

PERRYTOWN.

This parish, although a small rural one, evinces a commendable zeal in behalf of the society. The returns show the sum of

£18 15s. as the result of the exertions of the collectors; of this £11 17s. 6d. was contributed by the members of St. Paul's Church, and £6 12s. 7d. by those of St. John's, Elizabethville. The whole amount is to be sent to the Parent Society. This liberality on the part of a people who have to provide almost all the stipend of their clergyman is extremely praiseworthy.

MIDLAND DISTRICT.

We are not sufficiently alive to the benefits of *associated* action. We think and act rather in our individual capacity, practically forgetting that union is strength, and that any cause, however good in itself, will make but little progress, unless sustained by a vigorous and *united* effort.

NAPANEE.

"Your committee, for the first time, have given all the subscriptions raised for the Church Society (\$111 82) to be expended outside of the parish, as they feel that it is our duty, being now an old established parish, to do all we can to assist those more recently formed, or thrown more upon the voluntary contributions of the people. The amount devoted in this way we wish were more." How can we be sincere in our prayers, when we pray that His kingdom may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven, if we contribute not of our means, as well as of our prayers, to the furtherance of this work?

That they have to report the sum of £20 10s., exclusive of the annual subscription of the clergyman, £1 5s.

In accordance with the permission granted by the constitution of the Church Society, the committee of this parochial branch decided to appropriate three-fourths of the amount of collections, (exclusive of the clergyman's subscription as above stated) to the augmentation of the fund for the erection of St. John's Church, Stirling. The sum of £15 7s 6d has therefore been passed to the credit of said building fund. Your committee, however, would express the hope that the day will come when the constitution will recognise no local appropriations from the collections made on behalf of the Church Society, as it appears to partake somewhat of the nature of a fallacy, to say that a certain sum has been subscribed to the Church Society, when in reality three-fourths of that sum is returned to the parish and the people themselves for their local church purposes.

ROSLIN MISSION.

I have four different stations which I reserve for Sunday services, one at Roslin, where our church is, the second at Thomasburg, where we are erecting a church this summer 30 x 40, the third at Tweed, where steps have been taken to erect another church 30 x 50, to which five acres of land is to be attached as a

burying-ground, and for a parsonage house, the fourth is an orange hall, which will be given up as soon as the church at Tweed shall be so far finished as to render it comfortable for Divine service.

I have three weekly appointments at present, and some of our people twenty miles further back, are urging me very strongly to give them a weekly appointment, if I feel myself able to do so, I shall then have five week-day stations, together with four Sunday appointments. I know of no part of the diocese where we have greater need of another clergyman or two; every influence, every petty objection that can be framed and imposed upon our ill-informed members, is resorted to, in order to detach our people from the church of their forefathers. It is a matter of fact, that the church for some reason or other is not keeping pace with the spiritual wants of her people, and when she leaves them to themselves for a number of years, is it any wonder that when we come amongst them, we are met with salutations of the following kind:—"Oh sir, you are too late—the field has been occupied before you came. We have joined another church, we had to go, we wished to hear the gospel preached by some one." Now, dear sir, I fear there is some cause for these objections. It is a time for churchmen to be alive, the world around us is on the move to render our ranks weaker, and that often by unprincipled means. Since October last, I baptised nineteen children, had five marriages, and three burials. At a meeting held 16th February, we organised a branch of the Church Society here, and appointed young ladies to collect in behalf of the Church Society. The church being only newly started here, a great deal is to be done and that within ourselves, for this reason, a part of what was subscribed has not yet been paid in. I send you the whole of what has been collected, with the exception of the church at Roslin, which is not yet quite completed, and for this purpose we have retained the three-fourths of its subscriptions.

"If our borders" (as the annual report says) are "extending, and our population annually increasing," it is surely a season for the Church to wake up and enlarge her heart and to increase the measure of her missionary contributions. The body is made up of limbs and members—the Church is composed of individuals—let each individual then enquire what his duty as a member of the body is, and then diligently and prayerfully set himself to perform it. By heartily engaging in such work, we give proof of the vitality of our faith, and the sincerity of our love, for Him who so loved us that He sent His only begotten Son into the world, to redeem us from slavery and eternal misery.

GARDEN RIVER MISSION.

MY DEAR SIR,—If you are unacquainted with the obstacles which, previous to the opening of navigation, prevent the regular transmission of mails to this remote part of the country, you will be surprised to hear that your letter of March 29th, was only received a few days ago. I now seize the first opportunity to reply. And first I desire to return my sincere thanks to the Rev. Dr. MacMurray, and the children belonging to his Sunday school, for the sum of \$26.50 enclosed in your letter for the benefit of our mission.

I hope that a system of contribution for the spread of the everlasting gospel, will be introduced into every Sunday school where it is not yet introduced, and that all the members of our Church will be more and more deeply impressed with a sense of their

duty to contribute systematically and liberally according to their means, to the Church Society, so that its income may increase at least ten fold, and duly authorised ministers of Christ be sent forth into his vineyard. Then "the wild rness and the solitary place shall be glad for them, and the desert shall rejoice and blossom as the rose." The call for labourers in this part of the vineyard, both among the white people, and among the Indians is very urgent. The village of Sault Ste. Marie, which is becoming a place of great importance, and rapidly increasing in population, is much in want of a Clergyman. I hold services there occasionally, but I cannot do so often, consistently with the faithful discharge of my stipulated duties among the Indians who are here and in other parts of my mission.

On February 18th, I left home with my horse and cutter, and Chief Puhqwudgenene as my guide, to visit some Indians who were wintering at Goulais Bay on Lake Superior. We remained the first night at a house on the American side, about seven miles above the Sault. In answer to a question relative to the occupants of a solitary house on the Canadian side, a quarter of a mile distant, our hostess informed us that they were half breeds, the man belonged to our church, but his wife was a papist, that they were very poor and deeply afflicted in their family. Their eldest daughter, a young woman, became sick unto death last fall, or rather just as winter set in. She was very anxious to see a minister of the gospel, but the partly frozen state of the river rendered access to them impossible. She died, and her sorrowing parents were left alone, (except the rest of their children,) and unassisted to perform the last mournful offices of kindness to her mortal remains. Our hostess continued, "the eldest boy is now sick at the point of death, and will not probably live through night." I resolved at once, in spite of approaching darkness, a snow storm, and a very unsafe bridge of ice, owing to the strength and rapidity of the current underneath, to visit him. Chief Puhqwudgenene, with an axe in hand to stay the ice, led the way; we reached the opposite side in safety, and entering the house, I found the boy in a sitting posture, with his head resting on his hands, a most pitiable object, in the last stage of a rapid consumption. My heart was moved to its inmost depths. I read and talked with him as he was able to bear it, and finally prayed with him. We resumed our journey early next morning to Goulais Bay. At noon we drove to the shore, where my guide soon kindled a fire and made some tea; we were joined in our repast by an Indian and his wife, who had been somewhere to sell fish, and were returning to the bay with four dogs and two sleighs. Both the man and his wife were heathen, and as we were preparing to proceed on our journey,

the latter said to her husband so that I could hear, "I am very tired," so hoping to have some lengthened conversation with her on the subject of religion, I asked her to take a seat in my cutter. When I spoke to her of the love of Christ in dying for our sins, she seemed deeply interested, and said that she had never heard such news before, and that no minister had previously spoken to her on the subject of religion. She had several children, but all were unbaptised. I called at their house afterwards, and found her with her children, but her husband had gone out to fish. I read to them a portion of scripture, and instructed them in the truths of the gospel. I hope to visit them again shortly, and receive them into the Church of Christ.

Many of the Indians there are papists nominally, but they differ in nothing but the name scarcely from the heathen around them. Among the Indians in the bay, I found a very old man and his wife, who had been baptised by Dr. MacMurray, but had relapsed into a state bordering on heathenism. I regretted that I had not made the journey on foot, as there was no hay for the horse; I took some along with me and oats, but only sufficient for two days, and I wished to remain there over the Sabbath, for the sake of the Indians, and for the benefit of a party of surveyors belonging to our Church, who were surveying the land surrendered by the Indians last summer. It may not be altogether out of place here, to express a hope that such gentlemen as the surveyors alluded to, whose conduct among the Indians was most consistent and exemplary, will always be chosen for such purposes, if it will be profitable to them, as it will certainly be beneficial to the Indians. The sick boy before mentioned, was much changed in body and soul when I returned, and died the same night. I think we may indulge the fond hope that he is now numbered with the redeemed in heaven.

On March 9th, I visited Hilton and the Bruce Mines. The population at these places is upwards of a thousand. Many of them belong to our Church, and if we had a minister there I have no doubt that many others would join, from their eagerness to attend my services when I go there. I preached twice to very large congregations, and ministered the sacrament of baptism to eight children.

The Indians in the neighbourhood are in a most wretched and degraded state of ignorance and vice. Many of them are papists in name, but like the rest, heathen in reality. One poor woman, knowing that I could speak Ojibwa, but having no further knowledge of me, requested my services to assist her in procuring a small quantity of "Ishkootawaboo," fire water—whiskey, from the traders. She said she had nothing to give him in exchange then, but she would bring sugar as soon as she could make some.

She was then intoxicated, and a most disgusting appearance she presented, but she was not so far intoxicated however, as to be incapable of comprehending and feeling my answer to her request. She said "are you a minister?" Answering her in the affirmative, she said, "I am a very wicked woman; I once took religion, (was baptised by a popish priest,) but we have had no one for many years to teach us."

My letter, I fear, is already tediously long, so I will not say much in reference to the Indians here at Garden River. Many of them, I am happy to state, are walking worthy of their high vocation, and using all diligence to make their calling and election sure. Most of them have for three years contributed to the missionary cause; their last contribution in sugar, furs, and cash, amounted to twenty-seven dollars nearly. Hoping these facts will not prove uninteresting,

REV. MR. JACOBS' REPORT.

Manitowahning, Lake Huron, May 28th, 1860.

REV. AND DEAR SIR,—I have great pleasure in sending you the following extracts from my journal, which I hope you will find interesting:

July.—In the early part of this month an old Indian woman, a widow, died at this place. She had suffered a great deal for more than a year. Her husband was a chief. She led a consistent life, and shewed in her conduct that she loved the Lord. No one came more regularly to church than she. Her death was a peaceful and happy one.

Sept. 3rd.—This evening I went to see some of the Indians in the bush, who are now putting up their Indian corn. A great deal of this I found was destroyed by the late frosts. It is very seldom that there is a severe frost here this time of the fall. I am very much afraid that there will be a great scarcity of corn on the island the coming winter, and that consequently many of the people will be badly off. In the first tent that I went to, I found a woman boiling the unripe corn which was affected by the frost. She told me that she intended doing the same to all that did not ripen, and then putting it up, and that in this manner it kept tolerably well. She had in a corner of her tent a great heap of pumpkins and squashes.

Little Current, *Sept. 10th.*—The mission house at this place which had been left incomplete last fall, was finished a short time ago. It was built by one of the Indians.

Manitowahning, *Sept. 30th.*—Dr. O'Meara and his family left this afternoon, and will be in a few days at Collingwood. I had hoped that they would have stayed here another winter. The Doctor called the Indians together yesterday evening, and after singing and prayer, gave them his parting address. I trust that those who were present will remember the good and sound counsels which were given them, and that they will, through God's aid, act in accordance with them. After another hymn was sung, prayer was offered up, and then the people separated.

The Doctor is a great loss to this place: I shall miss him very much. He has been a great friend to the Indians; he was ever ready to assist them in their troubles, and to give them advice whenever they required or asked for it; and although the difficulties were many and great which often stood before him, yet he boldly and perseveringly did his duty. The Indians owe him a debt of gratitude for his translations of the New Testament, the Psalms, and the Book of Common Prayer into their own language.

Nov. 3rd.—As the Indians have all come back from their gardens, in the bush, to their houses in the village, I have begun to teach the children again. I rang the bell at a quarter past 2 P.M., and in a short time the children assembled together in one of my rooms. I teach the more advanced of them, and my sister who is staying with me at present teaches the rest. Those who are in my class read English and Indian, and spell and write. At a quarter past 4 the school closed. It is a pleasure to me to teach the children. As the government have withdrawn their school-master from this place, I have taken the work of teaching on myself; I saw that unless I taught them, they would very soon forget the little they had learnt at school.

Sunday, Nov. 6th.—The Sunday school this morning was very well attended. I heard all the children repeat the Lord's Prayer in Indian; I then read to them the gospel for the day, and asked them questions on it. I also shewed them some pictures of the persons and things mentioned in the Bible, making a few remarks on them at the same time. This part of the instruction they receive, they like particularly. The pictures I refer to are those which are published by the Christian Knowledge Society. Those that I have were, if am not mistaken, given to Dr. O'Meara some years ago by the society for the mission.

December 13th.—I am at present translating the book of Deuteronomy into the Ojibwa language. When Dr. O'Meara left this in October, he took with him Genesis and Exodus, which

we had translated, and he intended when he reached Montreal to get them printed there. Since that time I have been engaged in revising and correcting our translations of Leviticus and Numbers, I have just finished this part of the work.

December 23th.—About this time last year Dr. O'Meara gave a feast to the Indian children, who used to come to our evening school. I thought that I would this year give a feast to the parents, and to the young men and women. So I invited them and a few that reside at South Bay, all came to the house this evening, and I immediately seated them round the tables. Around the first table sat the Superintendent of Indian affairs, his son, the chiefs and myself. The room was quite full, all appeared to enjoy the dinner very much. One who sat near me said that he was only sorry the plum-pudding was not put down on the table just after we had all sat down, as he would have attacked that at once, and made his dinner on it. I do not think that the man ever tasted before such a good thing as a plum-pudding. When all had done eating, I spoke a few words. I then mentioned that the superintendent, the chiefs, and a few others would make speeches. Speeches were accordingly made, all of them were very good and appropriate. Every one seemed much pleased with the proceedings of the evening. At the close a hymn was sung, after which the benediction was pronounced.

Little Current, Jan'y 17th.—This evening I held a missionary meeting in the school house at this place; the attendance was very good. After a hymn had been sung, I offered up a prayer to God to bless the words which were about to be spoken. I then mentioned the object for which I had called the people together. After telling them about offerings, and how they could assist to spread the truth, I desired one of the principal Indians to go round, and ask the heads of families whether they wished to subscribe any thing, and how much they would give, if it was their desire to give something. Some promised to give two dollars in maple-sugar; some a dollar and a half, others a dollar, and a few a half a dollar. After another hymn had been sung, and prayer offered, the blessing was pronounced, and the meeting separated.

Manitowahing, Jan'y 25th.—This evening was held our annual missionary meeting. On account of the excessive cold and high wind, not very many attended. At first a hymn was sung; prayer was then offered, after which I gave a long address to those present. I mentioned the different ways of aiding missions. Some, I said, gave money and other things; others offered to go themselves into heathen lands and to preach to the people there. Many assisted with their prayers. I asked my

hearers to assist not only with their prayers, but also with their substance. Our Indian chief also said a few words. The greater number present promised to give some maple-sugar when the time for making sugar arrived. I told the people that I intended sending what I got from them to the Church Society of this Diocese, who gave me a salary.

April 2nd.—The Indians on the island have suffered greatly from the failure of their corn-crops last fall. Some have been without Indian corn now for several weeks; all that they have been eating lately is fish, which they obtain by spearing. Nor are the fish plentiful; in this bay a man that looks for trout all day sometimes only kills two. Other Indians live principally on rabbits. I went out this morning to see some sugar-camps. The nearest one is about two miles and a half away: the farthest that I saw is about eight miles from this place.

Little Current, *May 12th.*—I had this morning a conversation with an Indian, who arrived here lately from Sheshewahning, a village on the northern side of the island. He informed me that one of the Jesuit priests of Weguamekoong on one of his visits to their village, ordered all the Roman Catholic Indians there, who had copies of the Indian Church of England Prayer Book, to bring them to him, tore up some, and burnt up others. My informant is himself a Romanist; he says that he did not give up his Prayer Book, and obstinately refused to do so. Many of the Indians who live at the above mentioned place, asked us several years ago for copies of the Book of Common Prayer, and we gave them the books. I would not have believed the story that I have heard, if I had not known that the practice of burning Protestant books existed in other countries where Romanism held a despotic sway. What is said to have been done at Sheshewahning is quite in keeping with the doing of the Jesuits in other parts of the world. If the Indian of whom I am speaking has not told me the truth, I do not see what object he could have in giving the information he laid before me.

11th.—The last of the maple sugar, that was promised by the Indians here for their subscriptions, came in this morning. The whole comes to \$8.30. Robert Mills, Esq., the gentleman in charge of the Hudson's Bay Fort at Lacloche gave \$10.00 as his subscription; he also gave me \$10.00 for myself to reimburse me for what I have spent during the past twelve months in visiting Lacloche. What has been given at Lacloche and the Little Current I intend to send to the Colonial Church and School Society. The total amount of the subscriptions including what I have given myself, is \$19.30.

Manitowahning, *May 3rd.*—I have now received all the sugar which the Indians at this place intended to give to the Church

Society of the Diocese. What has been given by them and by others here amounts to \$24.70, in this sum is included my own subscription, which is \$5.00. I must not forget to mention here that two gentlemen who reside at this place each gave me some money for myself, besides what they gave for the Society. One gave me \$12.00, and the other \$2.50.

Praying that the great head of the Church may crown with success the efforts of the Society to spread the knowledge of the Saviour in this Diocese.

BY-LAWS

ADOPTED BY THE CHURCH SOCIETY, ON WEDNESDAY THE 11TH DAY OF JULY, 1860.

The Committee appointed to "report upon the Constitution, By-laws and General Management of the Society," report the following By-laws:

Be it enacted—That Article VII. of the Constitution read as follows:

That the Society shall hold a general meeting on the second Wednesday in June in each year, when they shall choose, &c.

That Article VIII. of the Constitution of the Society be hereby repealed, and the following adopted as said Article:

That the Secretary shall be either a clergyman or layman, at the discretion of the Society, and with such salary as the Society may from time to time appoint; and that he shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the Solicitor to the amount of £1000, himself in £500, and two sureties in £250 each. Also, the Auditors."

That Article XI. be hereby repealed, and the following adopted as said Article:

That the Society shall and may, on the second Wednesday in the months of February, May, August and November, for ever hereafter, and oftener, if occasion require, meet at the place heretofore used for the transaction of the business of the said Society, or such other place as may be hereafter appointed for that purpose; and that the President or standing committee have power to call a special meeting of the said Society at any time. In Lent the meetings to be holden on Thursday, instead of Wednesday. That the general meetings of the Society be held at 11 o'clock, A. M., instead of 3 o'clock, P. M., as heretofore.

That Article XIV. be repealed, and the following substituted as said Article:

That there shall be a Standing Committee (five of whom shall form a quorum) to prepare the business for the quarterly meetings of the Society.

That the President, Archdeacons, Rural Deans, and Secretary, be *ex officio* members of the Standing Committee; and that the committee shall further consist of ten members, to be elected by the Society at its annual meeting from its incorporated members;

and also of a clerical and lay member from each of the several district associations in connexion with the Parent Society, to be elected annually by each of such district associations.

That the Standing Committee shall meet at eleven o'clock on the days immediately preceding the quarterly or special meetings of the society, and at such other times as the said committee may deem expedient.

That Article XVII. be repealed, and the following adopted as said Article:

That the Secretary conduct the correspondence of the Society, take minutes of the proceedings of the general meetings and committees, and prepare the Annual Report of the Society, in connexion with the Standing Committee.

That Article XIX. be repealed, and the following adopted as said article:

That four sermons be preached annually, and collections made in every church, chapel, or station in which an established Sunday service is performed, provided that, in the case of stations where Sunday Service cannot be performed more than once in a month, it shall be discretionary with the clergyman serving such stations to omit the said collection, if he shall think proper.

That the collections be made for the objects specified on the days following, or not later than two Sundays subsequently:

1. For Missions, on the first Sunday after the Epiphany.
2. For Widows and Orphans' Fund, on Fourth Sunday in Lent.
3. For Missions, on the First Sunday after Trinity.
4. For Students in Theology, on the Fifteenth Sunday after Trinity.

That every lay delegate of the Synod of the Diocese shall be an incorporated member of the Church Society on the payment of the annual sum of five shillings, so long as he shall continue to be such delegate, and make such payment, notwithstanding any thing contained in clauses 2, 3, 4 and 5 of the constitution of said Society.

That any by-law that shall be passed by the Society relating to the Commutation or Clergy Trust Fund, the Mission Fund, or the Widows and Orphans' Fund, or in any way affecting the charges on or management of those funds, or either of them, shall be laid before the Synod of the Diocese at the first meeting of the Synod next after such by-law shall have been passed, and if at such meeting of the Synod any resolution shall be agreed to disapproving of such by-law, either in the whole or in part, and setting forth the reasons for such disapproval, the operation of such by-law shall be suspended as soon as such resolution and reasons are received by the Secretary of the Society, until the next quarterly meeting of the Society; and

unless at such next quarterly meeting such by-law be sustained by the vote of two-thirds of the members present at such meeting, such by-law, or the part thereof so disapproved of, shall cease and be of no effect. Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall prevent the members at such last mentioned meeting altering or amending the said by-law in accordance with the resolutions or reasons that shall be transmitted by the Synod.

That the Secretary of the Society shall transmit copies of any such by-laws as in the second section mentioned to the Secretaries of the Synod, as soon as the same are passed, with the view to the same being laid before the Executive Committee of the Synod, that a synopsis thereof may be stated with the other business prepared for the Synod.

An annual report of the state of the funds herein mentioned, made up to the close of the Society's fiscal year, shall be laid before the Synod on the first day of its meeting by the Secretary of the Society.

BY-LAW ON MISSION BOARD.

Whereas it is desirable for the better securing the ministrations of religion throughout the Diocese that there be a systematic plan for the payment of the stipends of missionaries, whether settled or travelling.

1. Be it enacted, that the Standing Committee of the Church Society be constituted and empowered to act as a Diocesan Board of Missions; and that a fund, to be called the Mission Fund, be under their control, to be administered as hereinafter provided.

2. That the said mission fund do consist of—

a. The annual surplus arising from the fund known as the Commutation Trust Fund, after the payment of all charges thereupon.

b. The moneys at the disposal of the Central Board, for the management of the Sustentation Fund.

c. All collections for missionary purposes, made in churches or stations throughout the diocese.

d. All subscriptions to the Church Society, not specially appropriated to any other object, with the exception of one-fourth to be applied to the general purposes of the Society.

e. All donations and legacies for missionary purposes, regard being had to the direction of the donor or testator.

3. That the Board of Missions shall, when provided with the necessary funds and guarantees, assume the payment of their stipends to the three following classes of missionaries:

- a. Travelling Missionaries—the minimum of whose stipend shall be £150 per annum, with £25 as outfit, at the commencement of their duties.
- b. Resident Clergymen, for whom the Parish provides a residence and guarantees to the Board of Missions £100 per annum, shall be entitled to receive from the Board, £150 per annum as stipend—and in the event of the Parish failing to make the payment of £100 to the Board of Missions, the clergyman shall be withdrawn.
- c. Clergymen of settled parishes now existing, where the congregation pay or secure to the Mission Board any annual sum, shall be entitled to draw that sum from the Board.

4. That all District Branches now employing a travelling missionary or missionaries shall be entitled to the maintenance of such missionary or missionaries, on transferring their funds to the Board of Missions, and on their continuing to contribute the necessary sums (including the funds so transferred) for his or their support, provided that such district branches recommend the same. But that in all other cases the requirements of the District Branches for missionaries be submitted by each locality to the Board of Missions, who will decide upon the order in which the said requirements are to be carried out according to their urgency and necessity; but that the appointment of all missionaries rests absolutely with the Bishop, and that no Clergyman shall be recognised by the Board, unless he shall have previously received his Lordship's License.

5. That the Board of Missions shall have power to make such rules and regulations to carry out this by-law as they may deem necessary.

The XVIII. article of the Constitution is amended so as to read thus:

In connexion and correspondence with the Society, District Associations shall be established, comprising one or more Districts, (as shall be approved by the President,) the same to be composed of the Clergy resident within the bounds of the district, and all other Members who shall contribute in aid of the Society's Funds; the Archdeacon, or Senior Clergyman resident within its bounds, shall *ex officio* be chairman of such District Branch Associations, with whom shall be associated, as composing a Committee of Management, all Clergymen in the Dis-

trict, and one or more Laymen from each congregation which observes the constitution, rules and regulations of the Society, and from none others; the lay members to be elected at the annual meeting of the District Branch.

A general meeting of the Branch District Association shall be held in each year, at any time and place which may be agreed upon at a previous Quarterly Meeting of the Committee of Management; and Quarterly Meetings of the Committee of Management—not less than five to form a quorum—shall be held for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Branch Association.

In order the more fully to carry out the objects of the Society, each parish, in the person of its Clergyman and Churchwardens, shall be a Sub-Association, in correspondence, through its Chairman, (the Clergyman,) with the District Branch Associations, and may be denominated *the Parochial Committee of the Church Society*. The Committee shall meet so often, and at such periods, as they shall themselves decide to be most convenient, inviting the co-operation of all the Parishioners in their deliberations and designs. They shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavour by every means in their power to augment the resources of the Society. All moneys raised to be transmitted to the Treasurer of the District Association, who shall, on or before the 30th April in each year, transmit the same to the Treasurer of the Society at Toronto, without any deduction.

The District Associations through their respective Secretaries, shall communicate to the Secretary of the Parent Society at Toronto a minute statement of all receipts and expenditures within the sphere of their operations, embodied in the form of a report, once in each year, so soon as convenient after the General Annual Meeting of such District Branch Associations.
