"How about the French-Canadians? Are they loyal to the crown?"

"Intensely so," replied this English Canadian Lieutenant-governor. "We are, if anything, more loyal to the crown than the Anglo-Canadians. Their loyalty is the strength of our Empire. The English-Canadians have a sentimental feeling towards Great Britain, while the French is based on conviction. The French are based on the conviction that their interests are founded upon such a union. This has always been the case. I do not think it was ever a time when the French-Canadian people were persuaded to have gone against the crown. Had a rebellion occurred in recent years—I mean, for instance, 1837—there would have been no doubt as to the result."
