THE TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE MANAGERS OF

The Protestant Orphans' Home
AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

In presenting their 24th Annual Report, the Lady Managers of the PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY have again to record the continued prosperity which has accompanied their labours during the past year.

The average number of children in the "Home" throughout the year was 88; the present number is 104. Admitted since June, 1874, 44; boys—30, girls—14; removed by friends—22. One little boy died of hip disease; and one ran away who had only been in the "Home" twenty-four hours.

During the past year twenty-one children were apprenticed—13 boys and 8 girls. Most satisfactory accounts have been received of them (with the exception of one), their employers expressing themselves well pleased with the conduct of the little ones, saying they were a credit to the Institution in which they had been brought up.

Many pleasing letters have been received from the children, thanking the Managers for the kind homes which they had provided for them.

The general good health of the children during the past year, bears ample testimony (under God's blessing) to the skill of their kind physician, Dr. Ogden, to whom the Managers tender their grateful thanks, for his unremitting care and attention to the orphans.

Last summer, through the kind liberality of friends, the children enjoyed two excursions to the country, and a free trip

to the Island, through the kindness of the captain of the steamer "Bouquet."

At Christmas time, through the indefatigable exertions of Mr. Andrew Fleming, a well stocked larder was provided for them, and a beautiful Christmas-tree containing a gift for each little inmate, gladdened their hearts on Christmas eve.

It is the painful duty of the Managers to record the death of their Solicitor, Mr. M. R. Vankoughnet, who, for many years had given his services to the Institution.

The Committee unanimously requested Mr. Huson Murray to take the office, which he kindly consented to do.

Another long tried friend has been removed by death, and the Managers take this opportunity of expressing their sympathy with the widow of the late Mr. D'Arcy Boulton.

Various sums of money have been received during the year from different sources; of these may be mentioned the liberal donations from the L. O. Lodges throughout the Province—\$100 from Mr. Samuel Platt—two legacies of \$100 each, from the late Mr. Andrew Smith of Chinguacousy, and Mrs. Ann Wheeler of Toronto.

The Managers thankfully acknowledge the services so regularly given by the members of the Y. M. C. A., every Sabbath afternoon, to the children.

Thanks are also due to the city Press, for gratuitous insertions of the notices of this meeting, and of donations from time to time.

Thanks are also tendered to the various contributors of provisions, throughout the year.

The Managers taking into consideration the improved circumstances of the country, and the higher rate of wages, recommend that the fees for apprentices be advanced, an increase of one dollar each for the first three years, and of two dollars each for the last two years of their apprenticeship.

The Matron would draw attention to the work done in the "Home" during the year that is past; 549 articles of clothing having been cut out and made under her supervision, and 333

pairs of socks and stockings knitted by the girls, thus training them in habits of industry.

The teacher and others having charge of the children, continue to merit the approbation of the Committee.

In conclusion, the Managers humbly hope that the blessings granted in the past by the Giver of all good, may be continued in the future.

Attention is drawn to the Treasurer's Annual Financial Statement, which will be found, as usual, annexed.

Moved by the Rev. Mr. McDonald, seconded by Mr. McMurrich and Resolved:—"That the Report just read be adopted and printed."

Moved by Mr. McMurrich, seconded by Mr. Beardmore and Resolved: "That at this, the first annual meeting of the Orphans' Home since the removal of their Chaplain (His Lordship the Bishop of Niagara) to the City of Hamilton, the Lady-Managers desire to express their due appreciation of the interest always manifested by him in the business matters relating to the Institution, as well as in the spiritual welfare of the little orphans, during the thirteen years of his residence amongst them; and trust that in his new sphere of labours he will not be unmindful of their interests, and will still continue to act as their Chaplain. They also regret the departure of Mrs. Fuller from among them, who, as one of their managers, was always ready to assist them with her valuable services."

Moved by the Provost and seconded by Rev. A. Broughall:—"That the Managers, Officers and friends of the PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME cannot permit this, the first public opportunity which has presented itself, to pass by without recording their deep regret for the loss which they have sustained by the death of Matthew R. VanKoughnet, Esq., for so many years the warm friend and faithful Officer of this Home. And at the same time they would tender to his widow and family the expression of their christian sympathy with them under the painful bereavement with which they have been visited."
