GENTLEMEN,-

I beg to submit to you the following Report of the actions of this Association for the season 1884-85.

About the 30th of October last, I received a transfer of the books and property of the Association pertaining to the office of Secretary, and found the work very easy for the first month or so. With the exception of attending to correspondence in connection with the re-instatement of amateurs, nothing of importance happened.

Several new clubs have joined the Association, two from Montreal—the St. Charles Snow-Shoe Club and the Athletic Snow-Shoe Club—and one from Toronto—the Toronto Police Amateur Athletic Association.

I have noticed through the press that several new amateur athletic associations have been formed in Ontario. In several cases they have written to me for information, but in all cases, whether asked to or not, I have always sent copies of the Rules of the Association, By-Laws, &c., but have as yet received no applications wishing to join. I think as these Associations grow in age and experience, they will appreciate the advantages of being represented on the Executive Committee of this Association or at least will appreciate the disadvantages of being entirely unrepresented, while from the smaller individual clubs of Montreal and Toronto are annually

elected the officials of this Association. The championships of this Association are appreciated in New York and Ireland, and I think Canadians, especially those of Ontario, cannot afford any longer to allow the advantages of such an Association to be undervalued.

Towards the end of March last, both the Secretary and the Treasurer of the Association were suddenly called away to the North. West with their regiment. Whilst away, Mr. Lyman Dwight undertook to look after both offices and deserves the thanks of this Association for the creditable manner in which, at a moment's notice, he fulfilled the duties.

On the departure of Mr. Lambe from the country, Mr. Dwight was unanimously elected to his place on the Committee.

MINUTES OF SECOND ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE

Amateur Athletic Association of Canada

Held in Toronto, September 26th, 1885.

The Second Annual Meeting of the Association took place on the evening of the 26th September, 1885, in the Rossin House, Toronto, Ont., when were present the following officers and delegates:

There were also present, Messrs. James Pearson, Toronto Snow Shoe Club, (Toronto), President; Lieut. H. Brock, Queen's Own Rifles A. A. Association, (Toronto), Hon.-Sec.; and J. McLaren, Toronto Snow Shoe Club, (Toronto), Treasurer.

The President (Mr. James Pearson) occupied the chair, and after calling meeting to order, appointed Major Henshaw, Lyman Dwight and J. McLaren, Committee on Credentials.

Committee reported delegates present as above.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting were read and confirmed.

The Hon.-Secretary then read the Annual Report, which was received and adopted.

The Treasurer then read his Annual Report, which was also adopted.

Some discussion ensued as to Clubs in arrears, when the following resolution was moved by Mr. G. R. Starke, seconded by Major Henshaw

"That Clubs in arrears be notified, and if they do not wish to remain members of the Association, send in their resignations." Carried.

Moved by Major F. C. Henshaw, seconded by Lieut. Lee

"That the date of paying fees this year for Clubs in arrears be extended one month." Carried.

Some discussion took place with respect to alterations and amendments in the Laws of Athletics ruling broad jumping, putting shot, throwing hammer and 56 lbs. weight competitions.

After Messrs. Starke, Becket, Paton, Tibbs and McKenzie had expressed their views, it was moved by T. L. Paton, seconded by R. McKenzie

"That a Committee, consisting of the incoming President, 1st Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer be appointed to confer with the National Association of Amateur Athletes of America on proposed changes and report at next Annual Meeting." Carried.

Major Hamilton gave notice of motion re alterations in the By-Laws with reference to position of officers of Executive Committee, not appointed delegates, resolved to allow the matter to rest with the Committee already appointed to report on the changes in Laws of Athletics.

It was resolved that a "Record Book" be established for the Association, giving details of competitions from the organization of Association.

Mr. Starke asked permission for the Montreal Amateur Athletic Association to hold the annual cross country championship steeple-chase under the auspices of the Amateur Athletic Association of Canada, this year. Carried.
