At all Vestry Meetings the Priest or Deacon in charge shall preside, and in his absence the Curate-Assistant, or in the absence of both, such member of the Vestry as the majority, duly qualified to vote and present at such Vestry, shall name; and the Vestry Clerk, or in case there be no Vestry Clerk, then such person as the Chairman shall name, shall be Secretary of such Vestry Meeting; and the proceedings of such Vestry Meeting shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and preserved in the custody of the Churchwardens.—*Carried.*

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by Canon Bedford Jones, the adoption of Clause 4, as follows :

## IV.—ANNUAL VESTRY TO APPOINT CHURCHWARDENS AND REGULATE THE TEMPORALITIES.

An Annual Vestry shall be held on Easter Monday, after notice thereof given during Divine Service on Easter Sunday, for the purpose of appointing Churchwardens and regulating the charges and rents on all pews and sittings for the ensuing year, and for the transaction of other business connected with the temporalities of the Church.

*Provided*, that in case there should be more churches than one in the Parish or Mission, Vestry Meetings may be held for such churches at any time during the Easter Week, notice thereof having been given on a previous Sunday.

Moved in amendment by Dr. Wilson, seconded by the Rev. Bousfield,

That after the words "purpose of" in line 2, be added the words "receiving the audited accounts of the Vestry, and subsequently of."—*Carried.*

The Clause as amended was then put and carried.

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by R. V. Rogers, the adoption of Clause 5, as follows :

## V.—SPECIAL VESTRY MEETINGS MAY BE CALLED.

It shall be in the power of the clergyman in charge to call a Special Vestry Meeting whenever he shall think proper to do so, giving notice thereof on the two previous Sundays during Divine Service; and also specifying the business for which such Vestry Meeting is called. And it shall moreover be his duty to call such meeting upon application made to him in writing by at least six members of the Vestry aforesaid; and in case upon such written application being made as

aforesaid, such clergyman shall refuse or neglect to call such meeting or to give such notice, then one week after such demand made, it shall be in the power of said six members to call the same by notice to be affixed to the main-entrance Church doors, at least one week previous to such intended meeting.

Moved in amendment by Canon Bedford Jones, seconded by Jas. Reynolds, Esq.,

That instead of "on the two previous Sundays," the Clause read "on one previous Sunday."—*Lost*.

Moved in amendment by the Rev. R. S. Forneri, seconded by the Rev. R. Lewis,

That after the word "six" be inserted the words "male members of such Vestry aforesaid, of whom at least three shall be communicants."—*Lost*.

The Clause as first moved was then put and carried.

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by Canon Bedford Jones, the adoption of Clause 6, as follows :

#### VI.—BUSINESS WHICH MAY BE TRANSACTED.

It shall be in the power of the members of Vestry, at such Vestry Meetings as aforesaid, to pass resolutions or to make by-laws for the regulation of their proceedings and for the management of the *Temporalities* of the Church, Parish or Mission to which they belong, and to alter and repeal the same.—*Carried*.

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by Canon Bedford Jones, the adoption of Clause 7, as follows :

#### VII.—CERTAIN FEES TO BE REGULATED BY VESTRY.

The fees for certificates from the Parish Register shall be *fifty cents* for each such certificate; and the charges payable for burial plots and on breaking the ground in cemeteries and churchyards for the purpose of burying the dead, and all matters of like nature therewith connected, shall be regulated by the Vestry of the Church to which the cemetery or churchyard belongs.—*Carried*.

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by Canon Bedford Jones, the adoption of Clause 8, as follows :

#### VIII.—NOMINATION AND ELECTION AND QUALIFICATION OF CHURCHWARDENS.

1. At the Annual Vestry Meeting on Easter Monday one Churchwarden shall be nominated by the clergyman in charge of the Rectory, Parish or Mission to which the said Church belongs, and the other shall be elected by a majority of those present and entitled to vote at such Vestry Meetings as aforesaid. In case the clergyman, if present at such Vestry Meeting, declining or neglecting to nominate a Churchwarden, or in case of said clergyman being absent from such Vestry and neglecting by writing under his hand to appoint a Churchwarden, then both the Churchwardens for the current year shall be elected by the members of the Vestry present; and in case the members of such Vestry shall neglect at such Vestry Meeting to elect a Churchwarden, then both such Churchwardens for the current year shall be nominated by the clergyman.

2. No person shall be eligible to the office of Churchwarden, except a member of such Vestry and a duly qualified voter; and the Churchwardens when appointed

shall hold their nomination or election in case of deprivation of residence to ten days, or of incarceration, either or both of which shall be within one month by the clergyman or Churchwarden, in aforesaid.

In case of one or both of the Churchwardens declining to accept office, or in case of deprivation of office, resignation in writing to the clergyman, or change of residence to ten or more miles from the Church of which he was chosen Churchwarden, or of incapacity to act, or being convicted of any crime, or of the death of either or both of said Churchwardens, a Vestry Meeting shall be thereupon called within one month in the manner provided for in this Canon, for the nomination by the clergyman or for the election by the said Vestry as the case may be, of a new Churchwarden, in place of the one whose office was vacated from any of the causes aforesaid.

No person shall be eligible to the office of Churchwarden except a member of such Vestry and a duly qualified voter; and the Churchwardens shall hold their office for one year from the time of their appointment or until the nomination or election of their successors.—*Carried.*

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by Canon Bedford Jones,

The adoption of sub-section 3 of clause 8, as follows: 3. In case of one or both of the Churchwardens declining to accept office, or in case of deprivation of office, resignation in writing to the clergyman, or change of residence to ten or more miles from the Church of which he was chosen Churchwarden, or of incapacity to act, or being convicted of any crime, or ceasing to be a member of the Church of England, or of the Church or congregation for which he has been elected, or of the death of either or both of said Churchwardens, a Vestry Meeting shall be thereupon called within one month in the manner provided for in this Canon, for the nomination by the clergyman, or for the election by the Vestry as the case may be, of a new Churchwarden, in place of the one whose office was vacated from any of the causes aforesaid.—*Carried.*

The whole clause as amended was then put and carried.

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by Canon Bedford Jones, the adoption of Clause 9, as follows:

IX.—CHURCHWARDENS TO LEASE AND RENT PEWS AND SITTINGS.

It shall be lawful for the Churchwardens, in Churches other than Free Churches, from time to time to lease and rent pews and sittings in Churches where such pews and sittings are not held in freehold, upon such terms as may be settled and appointed at Vestry Meetings to be holden for that purpose as provided; and all pews and sittings so leased and assessed in respect shall be subject to such annual rent and other dues as may from time to time be rated and assessed in respect thereof at such Vestry Meetings.—*Carried.*

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by Canon Bedford Jones, the adoption of clause 10, as follows:

X.—SALE OF PEWS FORBIDDEN.

From and after the passing of this Canon no sales of Pews by the Churchwardens shall take place in any Church in this Diocese.—*Carried.*

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by Canon Bedford Jones, the adoption of clause 11, as follows:

## XI—CHURCHWARDENS SHALL ACCOUNT TO VESTRY.

All Churchwardens shall yearly render in writing a just, true and perfect account at the Annual Vestry Meeting on Easter Monday, or at an adjourned meeting to be held within a fortnight after the said Annual Meeting, fairly entered in a book or books to be kept for that purpose, signed by the said Churchwardens (which book or books shall be the property of the Vestry) of all sums of money by them received and of all sums rated or assessed by the Vestry and remaining unpaid, or otherwise due and not received, and also of all goods, chattels and other property of such Church or Parish in their possession as such Churchwardens, and of all money paid by such Churchwardens so accounting, and of all other things concerning their said office; which said account and book or books shall have been referred to two or more auditors appointed by the Annual Vestry Meeting. In case of the appointment of a new Churchwarden or Churchwardens, the Churchwardens then retiring from office shall pay and deliver over unto such succeeding Churchwardens the book or books and all sums of money, goods, chattels and other things being the property of the Church, which shall be in their possession; and the said book or books shall be carefully preserved by such Churchwardens, and they shall and are hereby required to permit any member of such Vestry as aforesaid to inspect the same at all reasonable times. In case such Churchwardens shall make default in yielding such account as aforesaid or in delivering over such money, goods, or other things, as aforesaid, it shall be in the power of the succeeding Churchwardens to proceed against them at law for such default, or to file a bill in Equity for discovery and relief; and in case of the re-appointment of the same Churchwardens, then such account, as aforesaid, shall in like manner as is aforesaid, be made and rendered before an adjourned meeting of such Vestry, fourteen days after such re-appointment.

Moved in amendment by R. T. Walkem, Esq., seconded by C. F. Gildersleeve, Esq.,

That the words "proceed against them at law for such default or to file a bill in Equity for discovery and relief" be struck out and the following substituted:—"Take measures to procure such account or to recover such money or property"; and that the words "the duty" be substituted for the words "in the power" in the sixth line from the end.—*Carried.*

Dr. Wilson moved, seconded by the Rev. E. P. Crawford,

To add the word "Easter" after the word "Annual" in line 2, and to leave out the words "on Easter Monday, or at an adjourned meeting to be held within a fortnight after the said Annual Meeting." in lines 2 and 3.—*Carried.*

The whole clause as amended was then put and carried.

Archdeacon Lauder moved, seconded by Canon Bedford Jones, the adoption of clause 12, as follows:

## XII.—THE CHURCHWARDENS TO BE A CORPORATION, AND THEIR RELATION TO CHURCHES AND BURYING GROUNDS.

The Churchwardens being a Corporation, shall represent the interests of such Church and the members thereof, and shall and may in such corporate name sue and be sued, answer and be answered unto in all manner of suits and actions whatever, and may prosecute indictments, presentments and other criminal proceedings for and in respect of such churches, churchyards and burying grounds attached or belonging thereto respectively, and all matters and things appertaining thereto; and the Churchwardens, as such Corporation, shall, if required, make and execute leases to pewholders and grant certificates to those who shall have remain-

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sittings. And, for the purpose of this Canon, every clergyman licensed by the Bishop to any sole charge shall be deemed to be the Clergyman or Parson of all Churches in the district specified in his license, and the Clergyman so licensed shall at all times have access to and quiet possession of the Church or Churches in the said district specified, which district shall be called his Parish or Mission. And it shall not be lawful for any Churchwarden or Churchwardens to permit the Church or Churches in the said Parish or Mission to be used for Divine Service, or the churchyard or burial-ground to be used for the purposes of interment, without the consent of the Clergyman so licensed by the Bishop.

Moved in amendment by the Rev. E. A. W. Hanington,  
seconded by the Rev. G. J. Low,

That all the words down to the words "for the purpose" be struck out, and that the word "any" be substituted for the words "the said" in the third line from the bottom of the clause.

Moved in amendment to the amendment by the Rev. T. Bousfield, seconded by Dr. Wilson,

To leave out all of clause 12 to "And" in the fourth line from the bottom; to leave out "the said" in the next line and insert "any"; to leave out all after the words "consent of" in the last line and insert "the Bishop or of the Clergyman appointed by him."—*Carried.*

The clause as amended was then put and carried.

Archdeacon Lauder moved the adoption of clause 13, as follows:

#### XIII.—APPOINTMENT OF SUBORDINATES.

The Organist, the Vestry Clerk, the Sexton and other subordinate servants of the Church, shall be nominated and appointed by the Churchwardens for the time being, and their salary and wages shall be brought into the general account, to be rendered as aforesaid by such Churchwardens.

Moved in amendment by the Rev. Canon Bedford Jones,  
seconded by the Rev. J. Carroll,

That after the word "Churchwardens" be inserted the words "and the clergyman in charge."—*Withdrawn.*

The Rev. W. B. Carey moved, seconded by the Rev. J. J. Bogert,

That after the word "Organist" be inserted the words "shall be appointed by the Churchwardens with the concurrence of the Clergyman."—*Carried.*

The clause as amended was then put and carried.

#### GREETING FROM BISHOP AND SYNOD OF HURON.

The following telegram was received by the Bishop and announced to the Synod:

The Rev. R. S. Forneri moved, seconded by the Rev. J. W. Burke,

That the following be inserted after clause 2 as an additional clause:

III.—PROVISIONAL VESTRY.

Should a congregation newly formed desire to organize a Vestry without delay, a meeting of said congregation shall be held for this purpose after notice thereof has been given during Divine Service on the previous Sunday; and the members of such Vestry shall consist of those who shall make the declaration required in the next preceding section as to age and Church membership, and shall also declare their intention to worship habitually in such congregation. The Vestry so constituted shall be a lawful Vestry for all the purposes mentioned in this Canon for not longer than one year from the date of its formation.—*Carried.*

5. By Rev. R. Lewis,

That in all cases where Commutation (or other funds) are in future invested in mortgages, all interest received above six per cent. shall for the present, be invested as a sinking fund, to meet any losses that may arise.

6. By Canon Bedford Jones,

That he will call the serious attention of the Synod to the general disregard of Canons IX., XI., XIII., XVII., and XVIII.; that this disregard is detrimental to the well-being of the Church; and will make a motion relative thereto.

7. By Rev. H. Pollard,

That whereas it is desirable for the better provision for the ministration of the Church in the Diocese of Ontario that there be a systematic and permanent plan for the payment of the stipends of Missionaries; therefore,

*Be it resolved*, That in the opinion of the Synod all contributions towards the stipends of Missionaries from the various Parishes which receive grants from the Mission Board, shall be sent to the Treasurer of the Synod, and that such Funds together with such grants, shall be paid to the Missionary through a Committee of Synod; also, that a Committee be appointed to draw up a Canon founded upon the resolution, or to make such alterations in existing Canons as may be necessary.

A Canon for the administration of the Sustentation Fund.

## 12. By Rev. W. B. Carey,

That the meetings of all Committees of this Synod, excepting the Divinity Students' Fund Committee, be open to members of the Synod.

## 12. By Rev. S. Tighe,

1. That the Standing Committees of the Synod shall consist of an even number of Clerical and Lay members of the Synod, one third both Clerical and Lay of each committee to be appointed by the Bishop; the remaining number of the Clerical members by the Clergy and of the Lay by the Laity.

2. That a book be provided in which an entry of all mortgages and securities held or bought at any time by the Synod shall be made; said entry to state what the nature of the security is, what the amount paid for it, what its face value, at what date it was purchased, what interest it bears, when and where said interest is paid, to what fund it belongs; if sold, matured or transferred an entry to be made of the fact; for how much sold; whether the capital realized from it was the full original value or otherwise; whether the increased capital has been applied as such; in what place and by whom is said security kept; if transferred to what fund transferred, and why sold or transferred. Said entries to be verified by the committees to which securities belong; and said book so kept shall be open to inspection by any member of the Synod at all reasonable times in the Secretary's office.

## 13. By Rev. R. Lewis,

1. That the Treasurer of Synod be instructed that the Secretary has no power to draw capital out of bank without an order from the chairman of the Investment Committee, and it shall be the duty of the chairman to keep an account of all orders given by him, the date, the amount, the fund to which it belonged, and how said sums were re-invested, and report the same to Synod, and to furnish auditors with a detailed statement when required; and the investment committee shall in future be appointed by Synod.

2. That a committee of seven members be appointed by Synod to examine the mortgages belonging to the Sustentation and Episcopal Funds, and if possible report to this session of Synod.

3. There shall be two auditors appointed annually by Synod, one clergyman and one layman, whose duty it shall be to examine all Synod accounts and report thereon annually to Synod. They shall require vouchers for all sums spent. They shall examine all securities held by Synod, and in the case of mortgages, shall compare the amount endorsed on them with Secretary's account. And it shall be the duty of the chairman of the Investment Committee to furnish the auditors annually with a correct list of all securities held by Synod and with a detailed statement shewing what securities have been paid in during the year and

how re-invested. They shall examine all accounts and report any that are overdrawn; shall compare collections made with credits given—and shall compare the interest credited on account of debentures, mortgages, stock, &c., with the interest said securities should have yielded, and report thereon.

4. That in future no sums shall be placed on list of collections in Secretary's books, or in Journal of Synod, but those that have been actually paid; and that the clergy be requested to forward to the auditors annually on the 1st of April a correct list of all collections forwarded to the Secretary during the year; and it shall be the duty of the auditors to make a correct list of the same and compare it with the sums credited by the Clerical Secretary, and report thereon to Synod.

5. That in future the bank authorities be requested to keep separate accounts for each Rectory.

6. That a committee be appointed by Synod to inquire the amount realized by sale of lands in each Rectory, and whether the capital has decreased and the cause, and report to Synod.

7. That a committee of seven members be appointed by Synod, to manage the Sustentation Fund.

#### 14. By A. J. Matheson,

1. That the auditors be instructed to have a statement prepared, showing the total amount of interest received on account of each Rectory, or endowed Parish, since the Rectory Expense Account commenced to accrue; and that the expense account be charged to the different interest accounts of the Rectories in proportion to the total amount of interest received.

That hereafter no monies shall be paid on account of interest to those entitled to receive the same, greater than the amount actually received during the current year; unless there shall be a credit balance from the previous year. 1. That the serious attention of the Synod is required to be given to the increasing indebtedness of the Assessment Fund, and to the large sum by which the bank account is overdrawn, and the Synod is invited to find a remedy.

That this Synod recommends to the clergy and laity of the Diocese the immediate preparing of strong protests against any change in the laws affecting the Table of Affinity as ratified by the Provincial Synod. The Synod earnestly hopes that the members of the Church of England, both male and female, in this Diocese, will unanimously declare their conviction that the change in the law permitting marriage with a deceased wife's sister (or a divorced wife's sister) is contrary to the best social and moral interests of this country.

### *Auditors' Report for 1879 and 1880.*

TO THE INCORPORATED SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF ONTARIO.

We, the Auditors appointed at the last session of the Synod, have the honour to present the following Report respecting the accounts of the Synod for the financial year ending the 30th April, 1880.

Our audit was partially made in the month of November last, and was completed at the close of the year.

We have, as in former years, employed an accountant to assist in the examination of the accounts and the preparation of the necessary statements, but we have personally checked each item so as to assure ourselves as far as possible of the correctness of our Report.

Some of the changes recommended by us in former years and by the Committee on the Auditors' Report at last session of Synod have been made in the mode of keeping the accounts.

A ledger account has been opened for each security, the principal and interest accounts have been separated, and the moneys received on securities have been credited, not as heretofore to the general capital or interest account, where it was difficult to trace them, but to the particular accounts of the securities on which they have been received.

At the close of the year the balance at the credit of the interest account of each security was transferred to the general interest account of the fund to which the security belonged.

Under this system it can be ascertained at a glance how much capital is due on each security, and what payments have been made on interest account.

A cash blotter was opened on the first of September last. In this book all moneys received and deposited, or paid out, are supposed to be entered at the time of such receipt, deposit or payment, and from these entries the cash should be posted into the several cash books belonging to the different funds.

We have observed some discrepancies between the cash blotter, or day book

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and the cash books, from which we infer that the former has not been kept as we think it should have been. There are some entries in the blotter which we are not posted into in the cash book, and some in the cash book which are not entered in the blotter, and between some entries which appear in both and which should agree, there are differences, of small amount certainly, but important in view of the necessity for keeping the accounts accurately. We are led to conclude from these discrepancies that the cash books have not in all cases been posted from the blotter.

It would be useless and indeed impossible in this report to note the discrepancies to which we have referred. In those cases in which they led to clearly established errors, we have had those errors corrected, but there is one case which materially affects the Clerical Secretary's cash balance, and which we think should be particularly stated.

There is in the blotter under date of the 5th January, 1880, an entry of a deposit in the Bank of Montreal to the credit of the Mission fund of \$120.00, and another to the credit of the Rectory Lands fund of \$2,904.50. In the cash book of the Mission Fund we do not find an entry of the deposit of \$120.00, nor does the Bank credit it. In the cash book of the Rectory Lands fund the deposit is entered as \$2,312.50, which agrees with the Bank book. The Clerical Secretary claims that he deposited the amounts mentioned in his blotter, but the entries in his cash books of the deposits have evidently been taken from the bank book instead of the blotter and are opposed to his contention. The Bank declines to admit any responsibility for more than the amount entered in the Bank book and in the account as finally closed the Secretary is not credited with the disputed items.

The books shew that moneys received are not promptly deposited in the Bank. This irregularity has led to some trouble and confusion and to the creation of cash balances at the close of the year in favour of and against the Clerical Secretary.

These balances should not exist but they have been continued from year to year and now enter into all the statements except those of the Prayer Book and Clergy Trust Funds. In our last report we stated that there was an ultimate cash balance in the Secretary's favour on the 30th April, 1879, of \$1,672.24, and we expressed our belief that this balance arose from the omission to credit moneys received as against the entries made of deposits in the bank.

This balance was reduced by \$95 omissions discovered before the statements were printed and which were charged to the Secretary, leaving the cash balance in his favour in the accounts as finally closed, \$1,577.54.

We find this year that our suggestion has been verified, and that some further moneys which had been received on mortgages in former years had not been credited. The Clerical Secretary has debited himself with these moneys, which amount to the sum of \$1,170.00, and his former credit balance is therefore reduced from that source by that sum.

As a matter of fact, however, the credit balance has during the past year become a debit balance, for the books shew the following cash balances:

The result is an ultimate cash balance against the Clerical Secretary of \$1,102 29, which is caused by the entry above referred to of \$1,170 00, and by the fact that the Secretary appears by the books to have received during the past year an amount considerably exceeding what he has deposited in the bank. This debit balance represents money in the Clerical Secretary's hands.

The entries in the books show that the interest on many of the debentures which accrued due on the 1st July last was not credited until the month of September, though one at least of the debentures which matured on the same date is credited in July. We have not received any explanation of this circumstance. The interest on debentures should, we think, be collected and credited immediately after it becomes due.

Very many of the cheques issued have not been signed by the Bishop. We have noticed this irregularity in our former reports, but it has increased during the past year. The Clerical Secretary informs us that the signature of the Bishop to the cheques cannot be conveniently procured, and that for this reason the cheques are issued without it.

The payments in connection with the various funds were all vouched by cheques. The Mission Fund is still largely overdrawn, but the debit balance has been materially reduced during the past year.

We may here state that on examining the securities in the joint custody of the Secretary and Treasurer we found that the following debentures had been taken from the securities of the Sustentation Fund, and had been deposited with the Bank of Montreal as a security for the Mission Fund overdraft :

The Manager of the Bank gave us a certificate that these debentures were held by the bank as collateral security for the overdrafts of the Mission Fund. The circumstances under which this transfer was made will, no doubt, be explained in the report of the Mission Board.

The interest of the Episcopal Fund is still considerable overdrawn, though there has been a slight reduction in the debit balance since the date of our last report.

This fund has been charged only with that part of the expenses which represent the Clerical Secretary's salary. We do not see why this should be, as the Rectory lands and other funds bear their share of all expenses.

We have had a statement of the expenses prepared in detail, showing the amount charged to each fund. This statement is satisfactory in proving that the business of the Synod is transacted at an exceedingly small cost. The whole expenses for the year, including the Clerical Secretary and Treasurer's salaries, printing, &c., amounted to the sum of \$2,651.04. The expenses have all been brought into the Assessment account.

We have again to call attention to two important matters in connection with the Rectory Lands Fund.

The first is the necessity for disposing of the balance at the debit of the expense account of that fund. This should be done at the present session of the Synod. The other is the necessity for keeping separate cash accounts for each Rectory or endowed parish. The Secretary in last year's statement of the capital accounts of the Rectories represented certain cash balances as existing in connection with each. We cannot certify to the correctness of these balances, nor of those issued this year, as they were arrived at by balancing the old ledger accounts of each Rectory, and assuming that the difference represented cash. The balances thus arrived at do not on being brought together agree with the general cash balance, there being a difference of \$184.39. How this difference is caused it is impossible to ascertain without much labour, as it may have arisen many years ago. It would be well at once to open separate cash accounts for each Rectory, and while doing so to ascertain how the discrepancy is caused, and have it corrected.

This year the stock of the Diocesan depository has been taken, and we suggest that it should be taken every year, in order to ascertain what the depository gains or loses.

A difficulty has arisen in the Clergy Trust Account in connection with some of the mortgage securities belonging to that fund. The Treasurer is understood to keep the general accounts of that fund, and the Clerical Secretary the mortgage accounts. The payments on the mortgages have been made to the Clerical Secretary, who hands over the money to the Treasurer.

The Treasurer disclaims responsibility for the correctness of the mortgage account, stating that he has not the custody of those securities and merely credits what he receives. The Secretary produced to us a book, recently opened, which purports to contain ledger accounts of the clergy trust mortgages. This book does not, however, contain all the mortgages, and has not been regularly kept, and its present form is of no use.

One of the results of this confusion of accounts is that although the Treasurer, in his returns dated 30th April, 1880, states that part of the capital of the Clergy Trust Fund consists of \$508.69 Warwick mortgages, the mortgages have, in fact, been all paid, and have been given up by the Secretary. This matter was, we understand, before the Clergy Trust Committee at last meeting.

It appears to us that all the accounts and securities of this fund should be kept by the Treasurer.

We examined the securities of the various funds in the joint possession of the Treasurer and Clerical Secretary twice during the past year, once in November last and once at the close of the year. Those transferable by delivery we found to be in such possession with the exception of the debentures belonging to the Sustentation Fund which were pledged to the Bank of Montreal, for which the Bank Manager's voucher was produced.

The other securities in such joint possession were also correct, with the exception of the following, which were not produced or accounted for:

✓ Certificate of 2 shares of Dominion Stock belonging to the Shannonville Endowment, amounting to \$200.00.

Deposit receipt of \$250, belonging to Ameliasburgh Endowment.

We have examined the mortgages belonging to the various funds which are in the custody of the Clerical Secretary. They were all produced with the exception of those in suit (for which the Solicitor's receipt was given us,) and the following:

The Warwick mortgages.

George Thompson's mortgage belonging to the Matilda Rectory.

William Adams' mortgage belonging to the Ameliasburgh Endowment Fund.

Patrick Kelly's mortgage belonging to the Episcopal Fund.

The Clerical Secretary informs us that he never had possession of Kelly's mortgage; that some time ago at the request of a member of the Synod in Trenton, he sent him a mortgage prepared by the Chancellor, with a receipt for \$50, to enable him to collect the first payment and have the mortgage executed, and that although he has received a payment of interest on the mortgage, he has not received the instalment of \$50, or the mortgage itself. The Secretary desired us to make this statement so as to have the matter brought up and settled.

A statement of all the securities and the accounts accompanies our report. These statements have been so prepared as to give full information and be easily understood.

The Bank balance of the Mission Fund agrees with that of the Secretary, except in so far as a difference is caused by outstanding cheques, and by a charge of \$50, which the bank has made for payment of a cheque which the Secretary alleges he did not issue. This matter should be adjusted at once.

The Bank has also credited a sum of \$90 belonging to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund to the Rectory Land account. This credit causes a difference in both funds between the Secretary's and the bank's balances. In other respects the balances agreed allowing for outstanding cheques.

The Treasurer has, under authority of a resolution passed at last Synod, drawn his allowance for the past year.

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ing itself through the rural settlements in the great country that is raising up here. This is becoming more and more our position. Members of our Church from your Diocese and the other Dioceses of the Provinces of Canada are to be found scattered in all directions over the face of the country. In many large districts there is no minister of our Church to afford them the means of grace.

The Presbyterian Church of Canada guarantees \$700 to unmarried ministers, and \$900 to married ministers. It supplies the main portion of salary for over 20 ministers in this country, and the general interest shown by that body is great. I believe the students of Knox College alone support a missionary here.

The Wesleyan body of Canada is mainly supporting over 20 ministers here.

We are not receiving from the whole Church of Canada help sufficient to maintain a single missionary.

May I earnestly beg of the Synod of Ontario to guarantee us, for a few years, at least \$300 to our Mission Fund. We get no new grant from England exceeding \$486 a year, and we have only one grant now in the Province of Manitoba exceeding that sum. One or two clergymen have allowances in addition on past considerations. This throws a great deal on the small Mission Fund we raise ourselves and places us at a great disadvantage with other bodies who are able to work near districts with Missionaries having a salary fully guaranteed from outside.

Then we are in a very peculiar position as a colony. Most colonies have grown so slowly that before they have been of any size there has been some city of importance that could help. Here there has sprung up within, I may say, two years an enormous area covered with a spare population, while every Parish and settlement in the Diocese has only temporary buildings, with one exception, from which, however, we cannot, on account of its general poverty, look for help.

Winnipeg lies in four parishes. Every one of these has only, what I may call a temporary church. There is not a single parish that is not burdened with its own needs.

I feel words cannot add to the impressive eloquence of the simple facts I have put before you. I will only say that there is a country rising up here that will pay any effort.

The inaction of the Church of Canada, if continued, threatens to lead to disastrous results to our Church that I am sure the day is not distant when the Church of Canada will wonder at its own want of foresight.

I am aware of your own mission difficulties and calls, but I believe that if a committee were appointed by the Synod, there might be a special effort that would not interfere with your own schemes. May I further ask the Synod to pass a resolution requesting its representatives to see that this question receives the attention of the Provincial Synod. I do not hesitate to say that it is one that seriously concerns the duty and honor of the Church of Canada.

I have been assured on all hands of a most kind welcome if I were to visit Canada to plead for our work. But neither the clergy nor I can do this conveniently.

This credit balance is highly satisfactory: but in view of the fact that the average annual receipts from the Diocese do not exceed \$8,000, the Board do not feel at liberty to make this passing improvement a factor in their calculations for the future. This caution was the more necessary, seeing no aid toward defraying of our expenses can be had from the Assessment Fund—that Fund being at this moment, *in debt* to the extent of \$1,613.08.

In this connexion your Board deem it to be a duty to state that its insufficiency of funds to meet the just expectations of the Missionary clergy, arises from the default of many Missions in not making the canonically ordered collections. This year 10 Parishes have made no returns for Whitsunday: 8 have passed by Advent in silence: and 28 have, as yet, sent in no Parochial collections.

SUSTENTATION FUND.

This Fund is now confessedly under the management of the Mission Board, its interest available for Mission purposes. The Secretary reports the capital to be \$31,785.30. The outlay of its interest is thus stated :

The Board are further bound to report to the Synod that the Bank of Montreal refused to cash the Mission Fund cheques, the Bishop was obliged to pledge securities of the Sustentation Fund as security for the overdrawn account.

NEW SCHEME FOR THE APPORTIONMENT OF MISSION MONIES.

It may be in place here to state that the Committee, appointed Sept. 3, 1877, to consider and submit to the Board some "better and more satisfactory scheme for distributing money to the various Missions," or Missionaries, reported in December substantially as follows:—

That classification at intervals of \$50 be done away, and that grants be based on the ascertained merits of individual Missions.

That, as a general rule, the grants continue for *three* years, instead of one year, as at present.

That nevertheless, the Board have power to entertain applications for grants, and to alter or suspend grants—for just cause—at any time.

Being opposed by the advocates of a counter scheme, viz.:—that of classification and payment by *seniority*, the Committee was enlarged, and the Report was laid back for reconsideration. No Report on the subject was forthcoming at the next meeting. Since then, however, the following Report has been sent to the Board, its discussion and adoption, however, being reserved for the next synod:

Provided always—that Clergymen serving in the Diocese under any one or more of the following conditions, shall in no case, so long as they remain in such condition, be entitled to receive aid, viz. : Those, 1st. who are assistant Curates only of Parishes ; or 2nd. Whose public ministrations on the Lord's Day are confined exclusively to one Church or congregation ; or 3rd. Whose Parishes, whether consisting of one congregation or more, are, on sufficient evidence, considered by the Mission Board as able to pay a salary, (including proceeds, if any, of *endowment*, land, or other property), of \$800 per annum ; or 4th, whose Parishes do not guarantee towards Clergyman's stipend at least \$300 per annum, or if guaranteeing, have not paid the same in full previously to 30th June.

Two suggestions by Conveners—one, on the great need of church ministrations in certain sections of Hastings ; the other, on the pressing importance of immediately opening a new mission in the centre of Leeds, with headquarters at Farmersville, will be submitted to the Board at its next session.

It must also be stated that in view of the discrepancies existing between the " tabular sheet" and the audited accounts, and to prevent their recurrence, the Board has passed the following resolution, of which it asks the Synod's endorsement, viz. :

" That no monies received after the 30th April be acknowledged in the tabular statement in the Journal of Synod for the expired year ; and that all such monies be acknowledged in a supplementary tabular statement to be published in the Journal of the current year."

In concluding their report the Board would say that all hope of increasing the grants, from time to time made, must depend on the hearty co-operation and systematic working of the Clergy on behalf of the Mission Fund.

Every case of default, every evasion of the full discharge of duty, is just so much money taken out of the pockets of our Missionaries, already most inadequately paid.

The Board would also urge the importance of *promptness and punctuality* in making the returns. This year, for the first time since we have been a diocese, nearly all the collections were in before our May meeting.

This is a hopeful change. If the spirit which has induced it be fostered and allowed full play, the time is close at hand when the long cherished desires of our Missionaries will be realized, and worthier acknowledgment be made to them for their patient and arduous labors in the interests of the Church.

**Memorial of Trinity Church, Frankford.**

*To the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Ontario, the Clergy and Lay Delegates in Synod Assembled :*

We, the undersigned, being the Churchwardens and members of the Church and congregation of the Church of the Holy Trinity, Frankford, in the Township of Sidney, most respectfully beg to represent that the action of the Synod, carried at its last session in the year 1879, in reference to the Frankford Endowment, is touched in such form as to be inexplicable to us, thereby rendering it impossible for us to carry out the wishes and intentions of the Synod in the premises.

And whereas the Report of the Committee in this case appointed, and to be

found on page 1,611 of the Journal of Synod, is based on the assumption that this endowment was not given upon any definite or specific trust, your memorialists respectfully ask for the appointment of a new Committee, for the purpose of receiving evidence documentary and otherwise, to show that the Frankford Endowment was given upon specific trust, and that therefore the Report of the Committee of 1879 in this case appointed was based upon error and should be changed. Your memorialists would also beg to say that, all opposition having been withdrawn on the part of the Incumbent of St. John's Church, Stirling, it is only necessary to correct the error above referred to, in order to bring about an amicable adjustment of the difficulties that have for so long divided the congregations of Frankford and Stirling. Your memorialists would, therefore, pray that a Committee be now appointed to hear the evidence to be submitted, and to report thereon to the present Synod. All of which is respectfully submitted.

The Board would most thankfully acknowledge that the interest in the Church's Missionary work outside our Diocese seems to be increasing. Contributions have been sent in during the year from 48 Parishes as against 23 of the previous year. This very gratifying fact is no doubt largely owing to the observance of the Day of Intercession, in response to the Bishop's Pastoral Appeal, and the funds derived from that day's offerings.

The Board has further pleasure in reporting that the subscriptions to the Indian Homes have increased from \$130.44 in 1878-79 to \$231.08 in 1879-80, the following nine Parishes having sent contributions:—St. John's and St. Alban's, Ottawa; St. James', Kingston; St. ———, Smith's Falls; St. John's, Portsmouth; Trinity Church, and St. Peter's, Brockville; St. John's, Prescott, and St. ———, Pembroke.

Contributions for the Rev. J. B. Good, Missionary in British Columbia, and for the Society for promoting Christianity among the Jews, have been received and duly forwarded.

The Board would respectfully appeal to their Clerical and Lay Brethren throughout the Diocese, who have not yet found themselves able to take a share in this truly Christian work, to try and make some beginning, however small. With no desire to encroach on the means available for the Church's necessities at home, they feel satisfied that interest promoted in behalf of the propagation of the Gospel abroad, the sympathy looked for our brethren, still sunk in the darkness of superstition and cruelty, some effort, however feeble, made to send the light of God's Truth amongst them, must re-act most beneficially on ourselves. Men will be more ready to help this great cause, and Church machinery in their own Diocese, which they know to be blessed and prospering all over the world. Our people are for the most part but very imperfectly acquainted with the splendid Missionary operations of the Church of England—their own Church,—and of the sister Church in the States,—

and the success vouchsafed to their zeal and liberality. The Board would suggest the circulation of the interesting and inexpensive publications and papers of the Society for Propagating the Gospel, and of the Church Missionary Society, which would be effected by a little parochial organization, and also the holding of at least one meeting annually in every Parish in which the Church's Missionary work, or some part of it, should be described, and made the subject of special prayer to God.

Your Board would, finally, request that among the collections in the Diocese of Ontario as printed in the Journal of Synod, a column be devoted to the collections or donations in the various Parishes on behalf of Foreign Missions. At present the amounts contributed to the Bishopric Fund of Algoma alone appears, and it is desirable that in the "Grand Total" of extra-parochial moneys all that is given by each Parish should be placed on record together.

Communication from Rector of Kingston.

SIR,—I am directed by the Rector of Kingston to call your attention to the fact that over \$6,000 of money, belonging to the Rectory of Kingston, was retained by the Synod in the Bank of Montreal without being invested or placed at interest, for the space of two years or thereabouts; and that in consequence of this and the large credits, the Bank allowed the *Mission Fund* to be overdrawn without paying interest on the over-drafts.

The Rector of Kingston claims that he is entitled to be paid legal interest upon the capital sum belonging to his Rectory lying uninvested and virtually used by the Synod for the purpose of getting credit for the over-drafts on the Mission Fund account.

### Canon on Vestries.

Pursuant to 39 Vic., c. 109, Statutes of Ontario, the Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario enacts as follows:

#### I. WHO SHALL BE MEMBERS OF VESTRIES.

(Rented Churches.)

1. All Members of the Church of England, male and female, being pewholders holding sittings and paying therefor such sums as the Vestry may determine

shall form a Vestry for the purposes in this Canon mentioned and declared; provided always, that no person shall be allowed to vote at any Vestry meeting who shall not be of the full age of twenty-one years; provided also, that any person before voting shall, if required by any member of the Vestry, declare in writing at the meeting, in a book to be kept for that purpose, that he is a member of the Church of England and of no other religious body, and that he has held a pew or sitting in the Church of which the Vestry is held for six months previously, and that he has paid all arrears of rent or dues that may have been rated or assessed by the Vestry on his pew or sitting.

2. In case of a Church having been destroyed by fire, or otherwise rendered unfit for the holding of Divine Service, and the congregation of which Church assemble for worship in some temporary place, the Vestry of the said Church shall be constituted under the clause regulating the Vestries of *Free Churches* during such occupancy.

#### II. WHO SHALL BE MEMBERS OF VESTRIES.

(*Free Churches.*)

In Churches in which all the pews and sittings are free there shall be a Vestry for the purposes of this Canon mentioned and declared, and the members thereof shall be of the full age of twenty-one years; and each such member shall declare himself in writing at the meeting, in a book to be kept for the purpose, to be a member of the Church of England and of no other religious body, and to be habitually attending public worship in the said church of which the Vestry is held for the space of six months previous to the meeting of the Vestry.

#### III. PROVISIONAL VESTRY.

Should a congregation newly formed desire to organize a Vestry without delay, a meeting of the said congregation shall be held for this purpose after notice thereof has been given during Divine Service on the previous Sunday; and the members of such Vestry shall consist of those who shall make the declaration required in the next preceding section as to age and Church membership; and shall also declare their intention to worship habitually in such congregation. The Vestry so constituted shall be a lawful Vestry for all the purposes mentioned in this Canon for not longer than one year from the date of its formation.

#### IV.—CHAIRMAN AND SECRETARY OF VESTRY MEETING.

At all Vestry Meetings the Priest or Deacon in charge shall preside, and in his absence the Curate-Assistant, or in the absence of both, such member of the Vestry as the majority, duly qualified to vote and present at such Vestry, shall name; and the Vestry Clerk, or in case there be no Vestry Clerk, then such person as the Chairman shall name, shall be Secretary of such Vestry Meeting; and the proceedings of such Vestry Meeting shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose and preserved in the custody of the Churchwardens.

#### V.—ANNUAL VESTRY TO APPOINT CHURCHWARDENS AND REGULATE THE TEMPORALITIES.

An Annual Vestry shall be held on Easter Monday, after notice thereof given

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during Divine Service on Easter Sunday, for the purpose of receiving the audited accounts of the Vestry, and subsequently of appointing Churchwardens and regulating the charges and rents on all pews and sittings for the ensuing year, and for the transaction of other business connected with the *Temporalities* of the Church; provided, that in case there should be more churches than one in the Parish or Mission, Vestry Meetings may be held for such churches at any time during the Easter Week, notice thereof having been given on a previous Sunday.

#### VI.—SPECIAL VESTRY MEETINGS MAY BE CALLED.

It shall be in the power of the clergyman in charge to call a Special Vestry Meeting whenever he shall think proper to do so, giving notice thereof on the two previous Sundays during Divine Service; and also specifying the business for which such Vestry Meeting is called. And it shall moreover be his duty to call such meeting upon application made to him in writing by at least six members of such Vestry aforesaid; and in case upon such written application being made as aforesaid, such clergyman shall refuse or neglect to call such meeting or to give such notice, then one week after such demand made, it shall be in the power of said six members to call the same by notice to be affixed to the main-entrance Church doors, at least one week previous to such intended meeting.

#### VII.—BUSINESS WHICH MAY BE TRANSACTED.

It shall be in the power of the members of Vestry, at such Vestry Meetings as aforesaid, to pass resolutions or to make by-laws for the regulation of their proceedings and for the management of the *Temporalities* of the Church, Parish or Mission to which they belong, and to alter and repeal the same.

#### VIII.—CERTAIN FEES TO BE REGULATED BY VESTRY.

The fees for certificates from the Parish Register shall be *fifty cents* for each such certificate; and the charges payable for burial plots and on breaking the ground in cemeteries and churchyards for the purpose of burying the dead, and all matters of like nature therewith connected, shall be regulated by the Vestry of the Church to which the cemetery or churchyard belongs.

#### X.—NOMINATION AND ELECTION AND QUALIFICATION OF CHURCHWARDENS.

1. At the Annual Easter Vestry Meeting, or any adjournment thereof, after the accounts of the past year have been audited and reported upon, one Churchwarden shall be nominated by the clergyman in charge of the Rectory, Parish or Mission to which the said Church belongs, and the other shall be elected by a majority of those present and entitled to vote at such Vestry Meetings as aforesaid. In case the clergyman, if present at such Vestry Meeting, declining or neglecting to nominate a Churchwarden, or in case of said clergyman being absent from such Vestry and neglecting by writing under his hand to appoint a Churchwarden, then both the Churchwardens for the current year shall be elected by the members of the Vestry present; and in case the members of such Vestry shall neglect at such Vestry Meeting to elect a Churchwarden, then both such Churchwardens for the current year shall be nominated by the clergyman.

2. No person shall be eligible to the office of Churchwarden, except a member of such Vestry and a duly-qualified voter; and the Churchwardens shall hold their office for one year from the time of their appointment or until the nomination or election of their successors.

3. In case of one or both of the Churchwardens declining to accept office, or in case of deprivation of office, resignation in writing to the clergyman, or change of residence to ten or more miles from the Church of which he was chosen Churchwarden, or of incapacity to act, or being convicted of any crime, or ceasing to be a member of the Church of England, or of the Church or congregation for which he has been elected, or of the death of either or both of said Churchwardens, a Vestry Meeting shall be thereupon called within one month in the manner provided for in this Canon, for the nomination by the clergyman or for the election by the said Vestry as the case may be, of a new Churchwarden, in place of the one whose office was vacated from any of the causes aforesaid.

#### X.—CHURCHWARDENS TO LEASE AND RENT PEWS AND SITTINGS.

It shall be lawful for the Churchwardens, in Churches other than Free Churches from time to time to lease and rent pews and sittings in Churches where such pews and sittings are not held in freehold, upon such terms as may be settled and appointed at Vestry Meetings to be holden for that purpose as provided; and all pews and sittings shall be subject to such annual rent and other dues as may from time to time be rated and assessed in respect thereof at such Vestry Meetings.

#### XI.—SALE OF PEWS FORBIDDEN.

From and after the passing of this Canon no sales of Pews by the Churchwardens shall take place in any Church in this Diocese.

#### XII.—CHURCHWARDENS SHALL ACCOUNT TO VESTRY.

All Churchwardens shall yearly render in writing a just, true and perfect account at the Annual Easter Vestry Meeting, fairly entered in a book or books to be kept for that purpose, signed by the said Churchwardens (which book or books shall be the property of the Vestry) of all sums of money by them received and of all sums rated or assessed by the Vestry and remaining unpaid, or otherwise due and not received, and also of all goods, chattels and other property of such Church or Parish in their possession as such Churchwardens, and of all money paid by such Churchwardens so accounting, and of all other things concerning their said office; which said account and book or books shall have been referred to two or more auditors appointed by the Annual Vestry Meeting. In case of the appointment of a new Churchwarden or Churchwardens, the Churchwardens then retiring from office shall pay and deliver over unto succeeding Churchwardens the book or books and all sums of money, goods, chattels and other things being the property of the Church, which shall be in their possession; and the said book or books shall be carefully preserved by such Churchwardens, and they shall and are hereby required to permit any member of such Vestry as aforesaid to inspect the same at all reasonable times. In case such Churchwardens shall make default in yielding such account as aforesaid or

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delivering over such money, goods, or other things, as aforesaid, it shall be the duty of the succeeding Churchwardens to take measures to procure such account, or to recover such moneys or property; and in case of the appointment of the same Churchwardens, then such account, as aforesaid, shall in like manner as is aforesaid, be made and rendered before an adjourned meeting of such Vestry, fourteen days after such re-appointment.

XIII.—THE CHURCHWARDENS' RELATION TO CHURCHES AND BURYING GROUNDS.


It shall not be lawful for any Churchwarden or Churchwardens to permit the Church or Churches in any Parish or Mission to be used for Divine Service, or the churchyard or burial-ground to be used for the purposes of interment, without the consent of the Bishop or of the Clergyman appointed by him.

XIV.—APPOINTMENT OF SUBORDINATES.

The Organist shall be appointed by the Churchwardens with the concurrence of the Clergyman; the Vestry Clerk, the Sexton, and other subordinate servants of the Church, shall be nominated and appointed by the Churchwardens for the time being; and their salary and wages shall be brought into the general account to be rendered as aforesaid by such Churchwardens.

XV.—PROVISIONS OF CERTAIN ACTS REPEALED.

The provisions of the Church Temporalities Act, and of all other Acts passed subsequently thereto, are hereby repealed, so far as the same are inconsistent with the provisions of this Canon.

It has been shewn to the satisfaction of our Committee that there has been paid on behalf of St. Peter's Church, Brockville, a sum of \$15 in addition to the \$30 which the assessment of that Church was fixed last year. Your Committee recommend that that amount be allowed as part of the current year's assessment.

Errors occurred in the printing of some of the figures in the table of assessments of last year; three of these have been ascertained by your Committee. They are: Merrickville and Burritt's Rapids \$15.50, which should have been \$10.50; Prescott \$10.00, which should have been \$18.00; and Pakenham \$15.50, which should have been \$10.50.

Your Committee regret to learn that there has been one instance in which the default of payment may be attributed to the advice of the Clergyman; they hope that this is a single instance, and that its repetition will meet with action upon the part of the Synod.

Your Committee consider that they cannot too strongly urge the necessity of taking steps to collect the arrears of assessments due for at least the five years last past, and to that end recommend that Parishes in default for any amount which has accrued due within that term be called upon by letter from the Clerical Secretary to pay the amount at once. They would further suggest that to simplify the question of the settlement of arrears, a book should hereafter be kept by the Clerical Secretary, so ruled as to show in each year the amount due by each Parish in default.

It is further recommended that Parishes which may, from their circumstances, be unable to pay the full amount of arrears, should further be called upon to make representations in relation thereto, which shall be laid before your Committee, to the end that they may consider the same and make such recommendations in relation to the several cases as the evidence may justify; and likewise that for the purpose of considering any such representations your Committee should be convened simultaneously with the other Committees of Synod.

The Committee appointed to consider the question of not permitting a Clergyman to sit or vote unless the assessment of his Parish is paid having reported that the Synod has power to make such an enactment, your Committee respectfully recommend that the necessary legislation to carry out that provision be had, but that it shall only apply to the assessment or assessments for the time during which the Clergyman has been in charge of the Parish or Mission, and shall not apply to an assessment heretofore in arrears.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE.

*To the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario:*

The Committee appointed at the last Session of Synod to frame and submit to you a Canon embodying the suggestions contained in the second clause of the report of the Committee on the Mode of Keeping Accounts and Auditing, and to report the same at the next Session of Synod, have the honor to present for your consideration the draft Canon annexed hereto.

PROPOSED CANON RESPECTING THE APPOINTMENT OF HONORARY AND FINANCIAL SECRETARIES.

There shall be two Honorary Secretaries of the Synod to be chosen from the members thereof, one, a Clergyman, who shall be elected by the Clergy, the other a Layman, who shall be elected by the lay representatives; and there shall be a Financial Secretary, who shall be elected by the Synod. The Honorary Secretaries and the Financial Secretary shall be elected on the first business day of the regular meetings of Synod, at the usual time for the election of officers, and shall hold office until the election of their successors.

It shall be the duty of the Honorary Secretaries to keep regular minutes of all proceedings of the Synod, and record the same in a book provided for that purpose, to attest the Public Acts of the Synod, and to receive, arrange and superintend the printing of notices of motion for the Synod. They shall be *ex-officio* members of all standing Committees.

The Financial Secretary shall be paid a salary of \_\_\_\_\_ annuum, payable quarterly, and he shall receive no other remuneration in respect of his duties as such Financial Secretary.

The Financial Secretary shall perform the following duties:

1. He shall take charge of the minutes of the Synod and of the memoranda, notices of motion and other documents, and shall superintend the printing of the Journal of Synod, which shall be issued within two months from the close of each Session, and shall attend to all the business of the Synod under the direction of the Executive Committee.

2. He shall receive all moneys payable to the Synod, and shall record such receipt and deposit such moneys in such manner as may from time to time be prescribed by the Executive Committee or the Canons of the Synod.

3. He shall attend the meetings of the various Committees at which any questions of finance are involved, and shall at such meetings furnish detailed statements of the receipts and disbursements of the funds subject to the control of such Committee since the preceding meeting thereof, which statement shall be attached to the report of such Committee submitted to the Executive Committee, and he shall also furnish to the Executive Committee at each meeting a general statement of the receipts and disbursements of each of the funds since the last meeting thereof.

4. He shall, on the first business day of each Synod, unless it be a special meeting thereof, submit a statement in detail to be verified by the Auditors showing the condition of all securities on the day of the closing of the preceding financial year, the amounts paid thereon during such year, distinguishing principal from interest, the interest in arrear thereon, the rate of interest which each security bears, and the amounts, if any, which remain uninvested.

5. He shall have the custody of the mortgages belonging to the Synod, and shall take care that the interest thereon and on other securities is promptly paid, shall notify the persons who owe money of any default, and shall report all defaulters to the proper Committees and ask instructions.

6. He shall keep such books of accounts, and in such manner, as may be prescribed by the Executive Committee, and shall perform such other work as they may require him to do.

7. He shall obey and conform to the Canons and resolutions of the Synod in all matters which affect his duties.

8. He shall carefully preserve all papers, books, documents and vouchers belonging to the Synod.

Subject to such regulations as may be prescribed by the Executive Committee the Financial Secretary shall, before he enters upon his duties, give to the Synod security to be approved of by the Executive Committee for the due performance thereof, and for the safe custody and proper disposition of all moneys which may come to his hands as Financial Secretary, and such security shall be examined into every year by the Executive Committee.


The Executive Committee shall have authority to provide office accommodation for the Secretary and for the transaction of the business of the Synod.

The same Committee shall, before the Financial Secretary enters upon the performance of his duties, and thereafter from time to time, frame regulations respecting the mode in which the books shall be kept, the money deposited, the hours at which the Financial Secretary shall attend his office, and the performance of his duties generally.

The Executive Committee shall have power, in the event of any emergency occurring which requires such action, to suspend the Financial Secretary from the duties of his office and to appoint some person to act in his stead until the ensuing meeting of Synod, when the fact of such suspension and the reasons therefor shall be reported before the Synod; and the same Committee shall have power in the event of

the death of the Financial Secretary to appoint some person to fill the vacancy until the ensuing meeting of Synod.

The tenth section of the Constitution and all other Canons inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.


