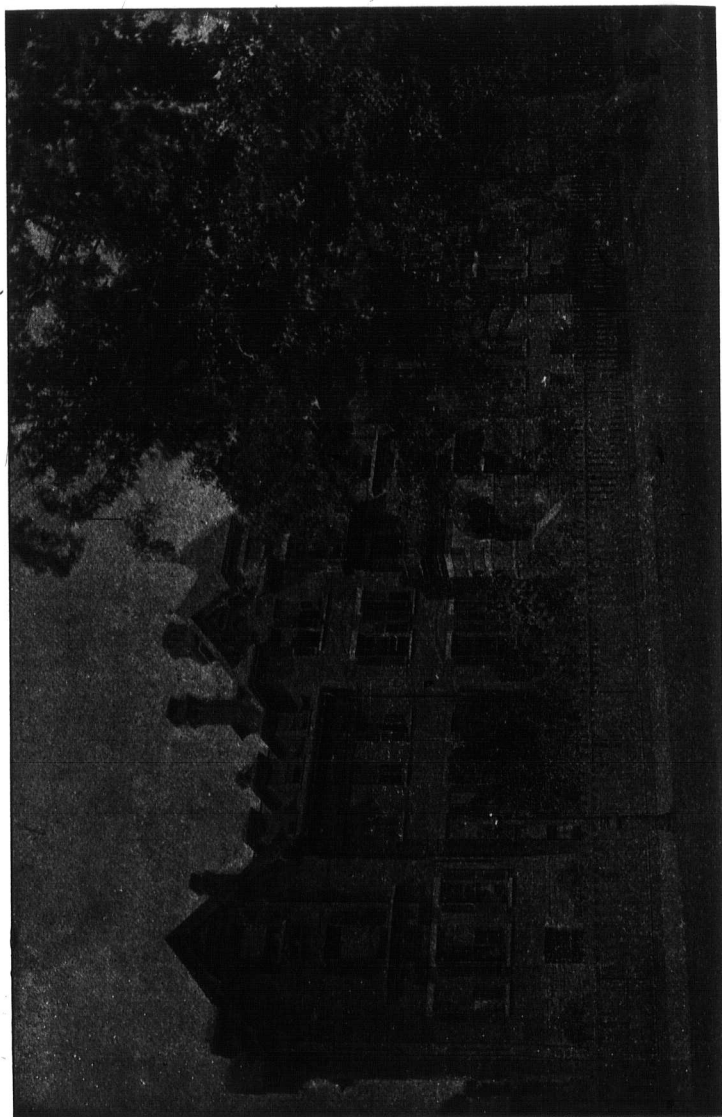

PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME.

The forty-fourth annual meeting of the Protestant Orphans' Home was held yesterday afternoon. The large hall was well filled with ladies who are interested in the benevolent work, and a number of gentlemen were also present. The chair was taken by Rev. Provost Welch. Rev. Canon Cayley opened the proceedings with prayer. On the platform were:—Rev. Dr. Mockridge, Dr. Hunter, Dr. Burt, Rev. Canon Cayley, Mr. Huson Murray, Q.C., and Mr. J. K. Macdonald. There were also over 200 little orphans seated in tiers one above the other, who by their bright faces and sweet voices did much to add to the pleasure of the afternoon. Letters were read from the following, expressing regret at their inability to be present:—Lieut.-Governor and Mrs. Kirkpatrick, the Mayor, Mrs. VanKoughnet and Mr. J. J. Kelso.

Owing to the absence of Major Leigh, who was attending the veteran celebration in the Queen's Park, Mrs. Leigh, the secretary, was obliged to read her own report. It was in every way most satisfactory. Among other information it contained the following statements of interest:—The number of children admitted during the year was 99—boys, 66; girls 33. Seventy-six of these were from the city. The number of children discharged was 110—boys, 64; girls, 46. Of these 73 were taken by relatives and 24 apprenticed. One death occurred during the year. The average number of children was 194 3-12, and the average number of inmates 207 4-12. The health of the children has been on the whole very good. A special arrangement has been made with the Western Hospital, whereby all cases of sickness except infectious diseases are to be treated for \$400 annually. The Managers' fee henceforth is to be \$2 per annum. The report also contained a highly complimentary reference to Miss Wheelwright, who for 28 years past has devoted her life to the interests of the children, and stated that an annuity of \$250 would be given her by the managers in recognition of her valuable services. The bequests of Mr. Robert Gilmour and Mr. Hart A. Massey were also recorded, and a word of thanks extended to those who during the past year have helped the home by their gifts and services. Deep regret was also expressed at the loss sustained by the home through the death of Dr. John McConnell.

The Treasurer's statement showed that the total receipts for the past year were \$12,402.54 and the total expenditure \$12,129.49, leaving a balance on hand of \$273.05. The report of the medical staff stated that at present the health of the inmates was good. It also spoke of the treatment of those cases of sickness which had arisen, and expressed a deep feeling of regret at the untimely death of Dr. John McConnell, a warm friend of the home. It spoke of the efficient manner in which the home is managed under its present officers.

The most pleasant feature of the afternoon was the presentation of an illuminated address to Miss Wheelwright, the retiring Matron of the home. It was read by Mrs. Leigh, the very kindly and efficient Secretary, and presented in a handsome oak frame.

A second address was also presented, accompanied by a silver teapot and fruit spoon, from the members of the staff.

Rev. Canon Cayley replied in a few brief remarks on behalf of Miss Wheelwright.

At the close of the proceedings refreshments were served and an inspection of the building made by those present.

THE FORTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME.

The Lady Managers have much pleasure in presenting their Annual Report to the public, containing the statistics of the Home.

Before entering on the subject of the children, they would like to say, that owing to an article having appeared in one of the papers, about the cost of maintenance not being the same in the reports to the City and the Government; the matter was fully explained by the Solicitor, Mr. Huson Murray, in the most satisfactory manner, and letters were received saying, "I am sure no one has any doubt that your books are all right," and "the City are perfectly satisfied with the statement."

Number of children admitted during the year, 99. Boys, 66; Girls, 33.

From the City, 76; other places, Edinburgh, 1; England, 4; Goodwood, 2; Clinton, 2; Connecticut, 2; Niagara, 1; Trenton, 1; not designated, 9.

By religious denomination:—Church of England, 58; Presbyterian, 2; Methodist, 12; Baptist, 2; Congregationalist, 4; Lutheran, 4; other Protestants, 17.

Number of children discharged, 110. Boys, 64; Girls, 46. Of these, there were taken by relatives, 73—boys, 42; girls 31. Apprenticed, 24—boys, 15; girls, 9. Died after measles, one boy aged five years. One boy, subject to fits, was sent to Orillia. Two boys were sent to the Shelter. One boy went away without leave. Three girls have gone to service. One boy and 4 little girls were adopted. Average number of children, 194 3-12; average of inmates, 207 4-12. A number of children had the measles in a mild form, otherwise the health of the inmates of the Home has been very good; a few cases only having been sent to the Sick Children's Hospital, the Isolation and the new Western Hospital.

A special arrangement has been made with the latter to take and treat all cases, except infectious ones, for the consideration of \$400 annually. The agreement to last for one year only, until the Managers see if it is satisfactory.

The Lady Managers cannot say how deeply they regret the loss to the Medical Board of the late Dr. John McConnell.

Dr. Price Brown, the Specialist, having examined the children, found that some of them were suffering from catarrhal symptoms, which were promptly attended to.

Having felt that the Rules 1 and 2, which stated that each member should be a subscriber of one pound (\$4.00) currency, annually to the funds, required altering, owing to different circumstances, the debt having now been paid off, the Board decided to amend the rules mentioned, and for the future, after the next Annual Meeting, the Manager's Fee will be two dollars, per annum.

After four years service in the Home, as boys' Superintendent and nurse, Sergeant-Major Wilton and wife were presented with a travelling clock, on returning to England.

Miss Kate Deacon was appointed assistant Matron in the month of October.

The Home was remembered by its ever kind friend, Mr. Robert Gilmour, leaving it \$500 in his will.

"The memory of the just is blessed."

An impressive funeral service was held by the Rev. Gilbert F. Davidson, at the Home, during the autumn, when the little boy died, after the measles. His father, fortunately, was able to be with him, which was a consolation to him.

The children's tears are always touching when they bid farewell to one of their number; but they are taught to look forward to the bright immortality of the future life beyond the grave.

It is very hard to speak of parting, especially with Miss Wheelwright, who has sent in her resignation as Matron of the Home. As an illuminated address is to be presented, at this meeting, which will be embodied in the report, the Lady Managers can only say how deeply they feel on the occasion; after a devoted life for nearly 28 years in the interests of children, they beg her acceptance of the use of her apartments in the Home and an annuity of \$250, as a small mark of their appreciation of her most valuable services.

By the will of one of their Advisory Board, Mr. Hart A. Massey, a bequest was left (conditionally) to the Home of \$5,000 among many munificent legacies.

Two dear little boys in the neighborhood, blessed with a kind father and mother of their own, held a small bazaar and sent two dollars to help buy Christmas presents, and to show their sympathy with the Orphans. The true spirit of philanthropy is plainly visible here.

The ladies withdrawing from the board are Miss Mills, Mrs. Hart A. Massey, and Mrs. Cayley, the latter who will be much regretted after 20 years of unflagging interest, and who would like to remain, but for the ever increasing demands upon her time, in Canon Cayley's large parish.

Shall we turn to rather a brighter page and offer the sincere thanks of the Managers to all the kind friends who have subscribed to the funds or helped the Home by gifts, such as are most acceptable from the butcher, the grocer, the baker, (Mrs. Carlyle especially, for her annual treat of ice cream,) and other tradespeople who are always so "ready to give and glad to distribute" to the support of the little ones. May a rich blessing rest upon them, for their true generosity.

In placing out 28 boys and girls, there have been some disappointments, but on the whole they are doing exceedingly well. They thrive in some localities, and the managers are not slow in finding out where to send them. People, in some parts, appear to be very successful in developing the better traits of character, and more generous altogether in their treatment of children.

The Lady Managers wish to express their most sincere thanks to Mr. Huson Murray, for his kind oversight of the business matters in connection with the Home.

To Miss Armstrong and the other teachers, and to all who help in the Sunday School they feel very grateful; also to Miss Johnson, who has given lessons in "Kitchen Gardening."

The children have enjoyed excursions to Hamilton, the Island, Victoria Park, Kew Beach, High Park, etc., through the kindness of the Steam Boat Companies and the Toronto Railway. They were also treated to a sleigh drive by Mrs. Burns, and an Electric drive by the Lady True Blues.

It only remains for the Lady Managers to express their devout thanks to The Heavenly Father for all the blessings of the past year, and their entire trust in His mercy for the time to come.

MEDICAL REPORT.

The members of the Medical Staff have to report that the health of the inmates of the Home is good at the present time. We have had the usual number of cases of mild and severe illnesses to treat during the past year. Of minor ailments there are always some which require attention from the physician on duty: such cases are attended to at the Home. Those of a severe nature, or requiring special nursing, are sent to the Toronto Western Hospital, where they are treated until well enough to be returned. This arrangement frees the house from the care of the serious cases, and helps the members of the Medical Staff in the efficient discharge of the duties pertaining to their office.

We would take this opportunity of expressing our deep feeling of regret at the untimely death of our former colleague, the late Dr. John McConnell, who was always a warm friend to the Home, and whose kindly presence is missed by all.

We again express our appreciation of the uniform courtesy towards the medical staff by Miss Wheelwright, during the many years of her faithful service to the Home. Also we would record our satisfaction at the efficient discharge of the duty by Miss Deacon during her shorter period of service.

We hope that the affairs of the Home will continue to prosper, and that the managers may be spared to promote its welfare in the future in the same efficient manner that they have always done in the past.
