Barker.—We observe harvest commenced on Tuesday in a field near the new Bridwel of Don, belonging to Mr. James Nicol. This is the first grain croptrom the field in question. The soil was originally partly clay and partly moss, which were thoroughly amalgamated, and having been well manured the crop has been thus early and abundant. Barley harvest commenced in Rathen on Monday norming in a small patch attached to the School-house. This, though the first cut down, will be specifiely followed by others in the parish where the crips in general were never known to look better. Mr. Sutgeriand, bookseller-here, commenced barley harvest yesterday on a field near the Firhillwell. The crop is rich and loxariant, and the grain of the very finest quality.—Aburdeen herald.




