London, Sept. 20. Mortgages has succeeded in relieving Pampeluna.

MORE RAILWAY MURDERS. There was a collision on the Allegheny Valley Railroad yesterday, in which a mail train was wrecked, four lives lost, and several persons injured.

DEATH CAUSED BY A COW. An engine and five cars of a special train on the Toronto, Grey & Bruce Railroad were overturned yesterday by running over a cow, and the fireman was instantly killed.

An Asphalt Law suit. The asphalt sidewalks at present being laid in Prince William street and other streets of the city, it is said, are likely to get the contractor into trouble.

Mr. D. W. Bailey, of W. Bailey & Co., Kilby street, Boston, has been in the city for a day or two looking round, claiming the pavement being laid by Mr. Magee is an infringement on his patent, and will contest the matter legally.

Mr. Bailey wishes to contest the question, the best way will be to bring a suit for damages or royalty. We hope that no judge can be found to inflict the injunctive substance on the city in a case of this kind.


