The annual Synod Service took place on Tuesday evening, 7th June, and was more than usually bright and well rendered. The attendance was somewhat better than in previous years.

On the following day the Bishop and Mrs. Sweatman held their usual reception to members of Synod and others. The School Games, in which the boys of the Toronto Church School joined, being held at the same time, attracted many people, and made the See House and its surroundings the scene of unwonted gaiety.

The 28th was also a red letter day, being the closing day of the School, when the boys of the Toronto Church School received their prizes, and the games' prizes of the united Schools were presented. The Bishop presided, and the Crypt was filled with a large assemblage of the boys' parents and friends. After the presentation of prizes the School Cadet Corps was inspected by Col. Galloway. The Junior Drill Class, in their picturesque uniform of blue coats and white trousers, were also present on parade, and marched past with the Cadet Corps. This was the first public appearance of the Corps, and they made a very creditable shewing.

A Confirmation Service was held in the Cathedral on 30th June, when twenty-four persons of our own congregation, with ten from St. Peter's, fourteen from St. Mary's, Dovercourt, six from the Church of the Messiah, two from St. Mary Magdalene's, and one from St. Stephen's, were confirmed. Very complete arrangements had been made by Canon Macnab for placing the candidates, which were rather upset by the arrival of a contingent of which he had had no notice, with the result that the Service could not be carried through with the dignified order and regularity which is characteristic of the Cathedral. There was a large congregation, the building being crowded to the doors.
