He Calls Man Liar, Slanderer and Coward Who Said He Invested in Marconi Shares-Committee Tried to Mollify Him Without Success.

[Canadian Press Despatch]

LONDON, April 28 .- Winston Spencer Churchill, First Lord of the British Admiralty, gave the Parliamentary committee investigating the Marconi contracts recently made by the British Govern-ment a few hard raps during to-day's sitting. He plainly told his fellow-members of the House of Commons that he considered it an insult to be summoned before them to answer what he called "vague tittle-tattle.'

Ellis T. Powell, the editor of a financial paper in London, had stated to the committee that he had heard rumors, which he did not believe, to the effect that Mr. Churchill had had a "flutter" in Marconi shares.

Mr. Churchill was thereupon summoned before the committee and questioned. He replied :

"It is a most insulting charge and implies that I have been skulking in the background while my colleagues have come forward and explained their position. It is grave beyond words that a com-mittee of my fellow-members of the House of Commons should have thought it right to lend their sanction to the putting of such ques-

Churchill proceeded: "I have had no dealings, directly or indirectly nor any invest-ment or interest of any kind in Marconi affairs in any country of the

inhabited globe. If anybody said so, that person is a liar and a slan-derer, and if anybody repeated such a statement and stated that he believed it to be false, the only difference between him and a liar is that he is a coward as well.'

The members of the committee tried to mollify Mr. Churchill, out he rejected their excuses and indignantly left the room.
