Moncton despatches say that a big oil strike has been made at Alameda, Kent county, N. B., at 450 feet.


A Seattle despatch says: The steamer Garonne has arrived from Nones with 229 passengers and \$300,000 in gold.



Autumn Care of the Dairy Cow.

Mr. J. A. Ruddle, chief of the dairy division, Ottawa, says: "In the churning, washing and working of butter, considerable good sense and skill is required. The cream should be kept to such a temperature that it will churn in a reasonable length of time from forty-five to sixty minutes..."

One night, or even a few hours of cold rain, causes an enormous shrinkage of milk. Food, comfort and contentment are the prime factors in successful dairying, and it is not too much to say that comfort is the prime factor.

Autumn is a more critical period for a cow fresh in milk than winter. Cold rains and raw winds are fruitful causes of decreasing milk.

The proof of this theory was clearly demonstrated by the Minnesota State herd two years ago. Some changes were being made in the cow barn, which made it inconvenient to stable the cows for milking.

It may be asked what the cows did with the feed, since they were fed liberally during the winter. They were fed on a ration of alfalfa, timothy hay and a mixture of corn and clover.

From less than two acres, Mr. L. D. Robinson, of Berlin, has harvested 870 bushels of very fine potatoes. They were grown on an old strawberry patch with potato manure.

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They Objected to the Wrong Baby.

(From the Chicago News.) "Franciscus Van Wyck and his wife were a worthy Dutch couple who lived in a Pennsylvania town where I was temporarily engaged in some legal business," said Lawyer John M. Grimm.

"When the time came to return the Van Wyck baby to its anxious mother, great was the amazement in the Van Wyck household. It had been a boy, the hospital authorities sent back a girl."

"This is not my child," declared Mrs. Van Wyck, "for, if it is, you must induct me into a boy."

"The combined science of the hospital faculty declared the utter inability of the machine to accomplish any such result. A rigid investigation was instituted, at which I was professionally present."

"The Chicago theatres have been so thoroughly equipped with safeguards against fire that on Saturday, when fire broke out in the roof of the Great Northern building, the Great Northern theatre was emptied in one minute and forty-five seconds. This was accomplished without the least semblance of a panic among the 1,500 persons in the theatre."

"The boxes should be neat, strong and well padded. They should be kept in a clean place, and rinsed with cold water before using. They should be lined with heavy parchment paper of the best quality, which should, before using, be soaked in a strong lye solution containing formalin for twenty to twenty-four hours."

"The cow and the farm." Professor Curtis, at the recent dairy convention at Cedar Rapids, Ia., told why dairying maintains the fertility of the farm. He said: "In selling \$1,900 worth of wheat from an Iowa farm at present prices we sell it at about \$350 worth of fertility. In selling \$1,000 worth of corn we sell about \$220 worth of fertility—or constitute which would cost the farmer this amount of money to maintain the commercial fertility of the farm."

TAKE PLENTY OF SLEEP. Just now there is a great inclination on the part of our energetic women to overdo in the matter of work and amusement, so that the idea of taking the traditional "eight hours" sleep is scoffed at and many times the quota is reduced to six or even five hours each night.

Now, no woman can hope to retain her good looks, or even her health, if she persists in this course. A complete rest for seven or eight hours each night must be cultivated until it becomes a fixed habit, and if this cannot be obtained without an amount of denial of amusement, by all means give up the amusement, or a portion of it, for health's sake.

Have a regular hour for rising and retiring and adhere to it, unless when an occasional duty stands in the way. Inactivity is quite as often an acquired trouble as the direct result of ill health, although a continuance of sleeplessness will quickly produce all sorts of nervous troubles. Excitement of any kind just before retiring is productive of insomnia. Try to keep your mind free from intense thought of any nature during the evening, thereby exerting the brain to its highest tension, means hours of troubled sleep or actual wakefulness, one of which is as bad as the other.

Do not be dainty, and fringe your plate with bits of meat. Eat what you can and put any skin or bone on the edge of your plate in one little heap, which move down from the edge when you have finished. Do not crumple up your table napkin. If you are only a guest for the day do not fold it up, but if you are staying on, and in a quiet household, fold it up.

Do not use a separate plate for your bread or toast and butter, but use when having only boiled eggs, which require very careful cutting, by the use of a special knife, which is a small one with a curved blade, and a small crust of your bread, but leave the crust of bread on your plate. Do not eat it afterwards, as so many people do.
