



The Rev. W. DAWES, Secretary of the Society, read the Report for the past year. It was then

That the Report just read be received and adopted, and printed under the direction of the Central Board.

2nd. Moved by the Rev. C. L. F. HAENSEL, seconded by Lt. Col. ORD, R.E., and Resolved,

That this Meeting desires to express its devout thankfulness to the Giver of all grace for whatever of success was vouchsafed to the labours of the Society during the past year.

3rd. Moved by the Rev. S. S. Wood, seconded by J. B. Forsyth, Esq., and

Resolved,

That this Meeting regards the large accession to our numbers, by the immigration of this year, as a call, under the Providence of God, to renewed exertion on the part of the Church Society.

4th. Moved by Rev. E. W. SEWELL, seconded by H. S. Scott, Esq., and

Resolved,
That this Meeting tenders an expression of its continued interest in the proceedings of the Sister Societies of the Dioceses of Nova Scotia, Toronto, Newfoundland, and Fredericton.

5th. Moved by T. TRIGGE, Esq., Treasurer of the Society, seconded by Rev. Jas. Jones, and Resolved,

That whereas several Members of this Society have left the Province to reside in England, who may nevertheless continue to feel an interest in its proceedings and prosperity, such members be requested to continue their contributions and

membership, and to recommend the cause of the Society to their families and friends; and further, that the Hou. George Pemberton be requested to receive subscriptions in England.

6th. Moved by Rev. E. C. PARKIN, seconded by Major LAWRENCE, Rifle

Brigade, and Resolved,

That the thanks of this Meeting be given to His Excellency the Governor General for his kindness in consenting to become the patron of the Society, and that the Lord Bishop of the Diocese be respectfully requested to convey the

same to His Excellency.
7th. Moved by Rev. J. Torrance, seconded by C. N. Montizambert,

and Resolved.

That the following gentlemen be the Vice Presidents of the Society, (see list, page 3.) and that the following gentlemen do compose the Central Board for the ensuing year, (see list, page 4.)
8th. Moved by Rev. Official Mackie, seconded by Rev. R. Anderson,

and Resolved,

That the thanks of this Meeting be given to the Officers of the Society for their

efficient services during the past year.

9th. Moved by H. JESSOFF, Esq., seconded by Rev. W. King, and Resolved, That in Article ix. of the General By-Laws of the Society, the words from "The Board shall meet," to "the Annual Meeting," both included, be struck

out, and that the following be substituted in their place:—
"The Board shall meet three times a year, alternately at Quebec and Montreal, on the Wednesday nearest to the 15th May and 10th October; and on the Friday next after the Annual Meeting. In the event of its being found necessary to hold a special meeting of the Board during the winter months of any year, such meeting shall be taken to count as one of the meetings held alternately in the two cities."

10th. Moved by Hon. A. W. Gochran, Chairman of the Lay Committee,

seconded by H. Gowen, Esq., and Resolved,
That the xiii. Article of the Bye-Laws relating to the Lay Committee be altered and amended by omitting all the words in the first line and to the word "Society" inclusive in the second line, and inserting the following words "This Committee shall consist of the members appointed before the Incorporation of the Society, and of such other members, not exceeding twenty-five in the whole, as may be appointed from time to time by the Central Board, at any of their stated or special meetings."

That so much of the 4th Article of the Constitution, Rules, and Regulations of the Lay Committee as requires the presence of five members of the Committee at meetings be repealed, and that three members shall in future constitute a

quorum for business at the meetings of the Committee.

That special meetings of the Lay Committee may be held by the members thereof residing in the Montreal District, for matters within the competence of the Committee arising within that District, such meetings to be called and the proceedings thereof to be conducted in the manner provided by the By-Lawa of the Society and by the Constitutions, Rules, and Regulations of the Lay-Committee as now amended.

That at such meetings a Chairman shall be elected for the occasion; the meetings so held shall be deemed to be valid meetings of the Lay Committee for all matters above mentioned, and the proceedings thereof shall be subject to the sanction of the Bishop of the Diocese, and shall be reported to the Central Board at their stated meetings. But it shall not be competent for such meetings to alter, in any manner, the Constitution, Rules, and Regulations of the Lay Committee.

The Meeting was closed with the Apostolical Benediction.

GENERAL BY-LAWS

CORPORATION

OF THE

Church Society of the Diocese of Quebec.

ARTICLE I.

THE objects of the Society shall be comprehended in the following distinct departments of Christian exertion, viz:

First-Missionary labour, including the creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen—towards making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the widows and orphans of the Clergy.

Second—Education, Day and Sunday Schools.

Third - Assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be under preparation for the ministry of the Gospel.

Fourth.-Circulation of the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the Central Board, hereinafter to be provided for.

Fifth-Aid towards the erection of Churches, &c., Parsonage Houses, and the management of all matters relating to the endowment of the same.

ARTICLE II.

His Excellency the Governor General, if a member of the Church of England. shall be requested to become the Patron of the Society.

ARTICLE III.

The President of the Society shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, or Bishop administering the Diocese—and the Vice Presidents shall consist of the Chairmen of the different District Associations, hereinafter provided for, and such other persons as shall be nominated at the General Annual Meeting of the Society.

ARTICLE IV.

The Treasurer or Joint Treasurers, the Secretary, Auditors and other necessary Officers of the Society, shall be appointed by the Central Board. The Secretary shall be allowed a salary and travelling expenses, under the direction of the Central Board, and may appoint an Assistant Secretary, subject to the approval of the Central Board, provided that such appointment shall entail no additional burden upon the Society. The appointments of Treasurer and Secretary shall not be for any specified period, but they may be removed at the pleasure of the Central Board.

ARTICLE V.

The Treasurer or Joint Treasurers shall collect ail subscriptions, donations, rents, issues, and profits, payable to the Society, for which purpose a paid Collector or Collectors, may be employed. Such monies shall be deposited in the Bank of Quebec, and Bank of Montreal, and an account shall be opened in such Banks, in the name of the Society.

No money shall be paid without the authority of a resolution of the Central Board, certified by the Secretary, and upon checks signed by the Secretary, and countersigned by the Treasurer, expressing the name of the person to whom, and the purpose for which, the money is to be paid.

The Treasurer or Treasurers shall also have the custody of all deeds, bonds,

and other property of the Society, and shall submit his or their accounts at the stated periodical meetings of the Central Board.

ARTICLE VI.

The Secretary shall keep the Minutes of all the proceedings of the Society, as well as of the Central Board, and shall have the custody of, and be accountable for, the safe keeping of the same, and he shall be subject to the direction and control of the Central Board in all his duties and proceedings.

ARTICLE VII.

The Society shall meet annually on the first Wednesday in July, alternately at Montreal and Quebec, whereof not less than fifteen days notice shall be given at Montreal and Quebec, whereof not less than fitteen days notice shall be given by the Secretary, in at least one of the leading Newspapers in Quebec and Montreal. A Special Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the President, or in his absence from the Diocese, by two of the Vice Presidents and four other members of the Society, by a written order to the Secretary, who shall notify the same in the manner hereinbefore provided in respect of the Annual Meetings. Such Special Meetings shall be held at such places as the President shall fix, if called by his order; or otherwise at the place where the next stated meeting of the Central Board is to be held.

ARTICLE VIII.

Persons subscribing 25s. per annum, or giving a contribution once for all of £12 10s. shall be capable of being elected Members of the Corporation, (in the latter case for life) at any meeting of the Society or of the Central Board.

Contributors may limit and direct any portion, not exceeding one half of their contributions, to be applied to special objects within the designs and purposes

Lists of the persons so subscribing or contributing, shall be furnished by the Treasurers of the District Associations, or by the Treasurer or Treasurers of the Society where there shall be no District Association, to the Secretary of the Society, to be laid before the next meeting of the Society or of the Central Board at which an election may take place.

ARTICLE IX.

Of the Central Board.

There shall be a Central Board for the management of the general business of the Society, consisting of the President, the Vice Presidents, and the other Officers of the Society, and a Committee of not less than twelve Clergymen, and not less than twelve Laymen, who shall be chosen annually at the General Mactine of the Society for Meeting of the Society, from among the Members of the Corporation.

The Boardshall meet three times a year, alternately at Quebec and Montreal, on the Wednesday nearest to the 15th May, and 10th October, and on the Friday next after the Annual Meeting. In the event of its being found necessary to hold a special meeting of the Board during the winter months, such meeting shall be taken to count as one of the Meetings held alternately between the two cities. The first Meeting thereof shall be held on the 23d day of October, in the present year, at Quebea. Special Meetings may be called by the President, or, in his absence from the Diocese, by two of the Vice Presidents, and four Members of the Board: and not less than seven Members present at any meeting shall form a quorum. When a sufficient number of members to form a quorum shall form a quorum. When a sufficient number of members to form a quorum shall not assemble on the regular day of the meeting, the members present shall not assemble on the regular day of the meeting, the members present shall have power to adjourn to another day, and so on tettes quoties, until a quorum shall be found; and business shall and may then be proceeded in.

votes, shall have a double or casting vote.

The Central Board shall have authority to make such rules as may be necessary for the Government of its own affairs, provided that none of them be contrary to, or inconsistent with, the spirit of the Constitution or By-Laws of the Society.

ARTICLE X.

Of District Associations.

In connexion and correspondence with the Central Board, there shall be formed District Associations (except in the cities of Quebec and Montreal, and the Ballieues thereof) to be composed of the Clergy, and all other Members of the Society resident within the bounds of such Districts,—a contribution of 5s. per annum, constituting membership of such District Associations. The District Associations (except as hereinbefore excepted) shall continue as herefore settled by the Central Board of the Society, before its Incorporation, until otherwise hereafter determined by the Central Board. The senior Clergyman holding a Pastoral Charge within such bounds shall be a senior Clergyman folding a Pastoral Charge within such bounds shall be a senior Clergyman holding a Pastoral Charge within such bounds shall be, ex officio, Chairman of such Association—they may have a Secretary and Treasurer, and shall meet at such places as they may themselves determine; at one of which meetings the officers shall be appointed and a report of the proceedings of the year read. The District Associations shall have authority to make rules for the government of their contractions. of their own affairs, provided such rules be not contrary to, or inconsistent with, the Constitution or By-Laws of the Society. They shall report annually to the Central Board, at least one month before the Annual General Meeting of the Society, (and at such other times as the Secretary, on behalf of the Board, shall require) a statement of their proceeding, and a detailed account of all the monies

received and expended by them during the year.

It is nevertheless provided that the Chairmen of the District Associations of Quebec and Montreal heretofore existing, shall continue to be Vice Presidents of the Society during the current year until the Annual Meeting in July next.

ARTICLE XI.

Of the Sub-Committees of the Society.

For the more effectually carrying out the designs of this Society, the Clergymen and Church Wardens in every Parish and Missionary Station, and the Ministers and Wardens of every Chapelry within the Diocese, shall be a Sub-Committee of the Society, in correspondence with the District Association, within whose bounds such Parish or Missionary Station is situated, or in the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, with the Central Board, through the Secretary of the Society. This Committee shall meet as often, and at such periods, as they themselves shall decide to be most convenient, inviting the co-operation of all the Parishioners, in their deliberations and designs. They shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavour, by every means in their power, to augment the resources of the Society. One sermon at least shall be preached during the year within the limits of each Parish, Station, or Chapelry, on such Sunday as the Bishop shall appoint, in favour of some one or more of the objects of the Society; and a collection shall then be taken up in aid thereof, the proceeds of which shall forthwith be remitted to the Treasurer or Treasurers of the Society; any Parish, Station, or Chapelry, in which such sermon shall not have been preached, shall not be considered entitled to any grant or benefit from the Society, until a sermon shall have been so preached.

All other monies raised by such Sub-Committees, shall be remitted to the Treasurer of the District Association; or to the Treasurer or Treasurers of the Society where such monies shall have been raised within the cities and Banlieues of Quebec and Montreal.

ARTICLE XII.

One-half of all the monies paid into the hands of the Treasurers of the District Associations, respectively, and not specially appropriated by the contributors, shall be transmitted to the Treasurer of the Society, to be at the disposal of the Central Board, and the remaining half of all such collections shall, when required, be expended within the Parish or District in which they have been made, for such objects only as are specified in the Constitution of this Society—the allotment to be made by the Committee of the District Association. All monies remaining unappropriated at the General Annual meeting of the District Association, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Treasurer or Treasurers of the Society to be at the disposal of the Central Board; it being understood that nothing contained in this Article shall interfere with any existing arrangement or agreement between any Clergyman and his flock.

ARTICLE XIII.

Of the Lay Committee of the Church Society.

This Committee shall consist of the Members appointed before the Incorporation of the Society and of such other members, not exceeding twenty-five in the whole, as may be appointed from time to time by the Central Board at any of their stated or special meetings; and shall be governed by the Constitution, Rules and regulations, adopted and in force before that period, until the same shall be altered by the Committee or by the Society at the General Meeting.

The proceedings of the Lay Committee shall be subject to the sanction of the Bishop of the Diocese. The clerical and other members of the Central Board may attend at any of the General Meetings of the Committee, and may propose and discuss matters therein, but shall have no vote; and the Committee shall report their proceedings to the Central Board at their stated meetings. The objects of this Committee shall be:

First—The placing the clergymen, now resident and doing duty in the Province, upon a just footing as regards the sufficiency and permanency of their incomes.

Secondly—The providing for a permanent and adequate support of an increased uumber of Clergymen, so that, with the least possible delay, the members of the Church in every portion of the Diocese, may have the means of access to a

Church within a practicable distance.

Thirdly—The building in every place where it may be required a Church of stone or brick, upon a well considered plar, as to dimensions, external form, and internal arrangement, keeping in view the probability of its requiring en-

Fourthly—The building, in a good situation, convenient to the Church, a comfortable Parsonage of brick or stone, upon an uniform plan, which should be carefully considered, with reference to size and internal arrangement, and should admit of additions being made, with the sanction of the Bishop

Fifthly—The insuring such Churches or Parsonages against losses by fire.
Sixthly—The procuring an adequate and permanent support for all the Institutions, authorities, and functionaries, suitable and appertaining to the Establishment of the Church of England in this Diocese.

Seventhly—The investing all life subscriptions (unless so far as the application of these may be otherwise limited by the contributors) in a permanent and accumulating Fund, of which the interest only shall be applied to the general purposes of the Society.

Eighthly—The encouraging the formation of a local Endowment Fund, at every station or place having a Church or Clergyman, by special contributions, or by setting apart a portion of the Pew rents, to form an accumulating fund until the net income shall in each case amount to £50 per annum; for the more effectual promotion of which object the Society will engage, whenever such fund shall be formed and shall amount to £100, invested in Bank stock, or other public securities, to add thereto an amount not exceeding £100; provided always, that such investment shall stand in the name of the President of the Society.

ARTICLE XIV.

All meetings of the Society and of the Committees shall be opened and closed with the Prayers used by the two Societies in England, adapted to our situation,

under the direction of the Bishop.

No alteration or amendment in the Constitution or By Laws of the Society shall be made, unless such alteration or amendment shall first be communicated to the Secretary, to be submitted for examination and consideration to a Special Meeting of the Society, at least one month before a General Annual Meeting, and adopted at such General Annual Meeting. Provided that the rejection or adoption of any such alteration or amendment, by such Special Meeting, shall in no wise bind or restrain the General Annual Meeting, in considering and disposing of the same.

ARTICLE XV.

Whereas some members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great Spiritual wants of their own neighbourhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a Gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the contract of the contract the spread of the contract th of the Glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness; the Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, the Church Missionary Society, or the London Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews, whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen or the Jews.

Investments.

During the year an additional sum from the General fund of the Society, of £465 10s. has been invested in Quebec and Montreal Bank Stock—making the whole sum now invested in these securities for the general objects of the Society, £1050. A further sum of £225 has been invested in Montreal Bank Stock, for the clergy Widows and Orphans' fund. And also £63 5s. 7d. in the Provident and Savings Bank. These amounts consist of the collections made in the several churches and missionary stations of the Diocese after sermons preached in accordance with a standing rule of the Central Board, and by virtue of a circular letter issued by the Lord Bishop, together with a life subscription of £12 10s., so applied by the donor. The whole sum now vested, on behalf of widows and orphans is £565 15s. 7d. The Nicolet Parochial endowment fund now amounts to £250 in Quebec Bank Stock, with a small additional sum in hand to the credit of the fund, of £3 19s. 6d.

Patronage.

We have much satisfaction in stating that His Excellency the Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, the Governor General, has consented to be Patron of the Society.

Widows' and Orphans' (Clergy) Fund.

This interesting and important object of the Society has engaged the earnest attention of the Central Board during the past year. After maturely considering certain plans which had been proposed, of Life Insurance, and of other profitable modes for investment of the sums that shall be raised for this purpose; and finding the whole subject surrounded with many difficulties, arising from the condition of the diocese and the small resources of the clergy, inadequate to allow them to pay a premium of Insurance, or even to admit of their giving a special Annual Subscription for that object, it has been decided, for the present, to invest the amount received in Montreal Bank Stock, and to employ the interest accruing therefrom towards the relief of existing cases, which call for aid.

Education.

The subject of Education, in Day and Sunday Schools, has also received attention during the past year. A Sub-Committee of the Board was appointed in October, to enquire into the state of Education in the Diocese, and to suggest in what way the Society could (to use the words of the 4th Resolution of the last Annual Meeting) provide for the suitable Education of the poorer members of the church. As a preliminary measure, the Committee proposed a series of questions, which were transmitted to the clergy of the Diocese by His Lordship the Bishop, to elicit from them the actual state of education in both Day and Sunday Schools in their res-

pective localities, with the difficulties that existed in improving it; and to have the benefit of their opinion, how far additional or differently constituted Schools were needed. The information received is, on the whole, not so full or definite as could have been desired, but still much that is valuable has been obtained; by means of which it is hoped that something may be done, conducive to the educational interests and the further religious instruction of the youth of the Diocese.

In July last, the Rev. A. W. Mountain was appointed by the Bishop Travelling Missionary for the District of Quebec, and proceeded to take charge of the Quarantine Station at Grosse Isle. Besides performing the important ministerial duties which devolved on him at the Island, he occasionally travelled to settlements in the vicinity, devoid of the regular ministrations of the Church, where he officiated. His journal is in the office of the Society. He retired in October last, his services being otherwise required by the Bishop. In May, His Lordship appointed the Rev. C. Forest Travelling Missionary, who proceeded to Grosse Isle. And when we consider the scenes of misery that have been there witnessed during this summer, we cannot but be thankful that the Society has been privileged to supply a little help, by its Missionary, to alleviate the sorrows of some of the afflicted, to tell of a Saviour's love, and direct the prayer of faith of many a dying stranger, and to perform the last rite of christian burial, where, but for his presence, the dust must have been returned to the earth, without a solemn word to soothe the heart and raise the soul to God, of the surviving and sorrowing friend.

But the ministerial duties required at Grosse Isle exceeding altogether the power of any one clergyman to fulfil, other clergymen from the city and neighbourhood of Quebec have proceeded there, from time to time, to take part in the them.

But it is with much satisfaction that we announce, that there is a probability of the settlement, at no distant day, of two Travelling Missionaries in that District. One of the congregations in Montreal has exemplarily charged itself with providing wholly for the second Missionary, to visit the numerous destitute parts of that section of the Diocese.

By-Laws.

It is proposed that certain alterations shall be made in the constitution of the Lay Committee, with a view of facilitating its operations, and rendering it more effective towards the fulfilment of the important duties with which it is charged. In the 13th Article of the General By-Laws may be seen, in detail, their functions. They are entrusted mainly with the management of the temporalities of the Church, both for the time present, and prospectively. With a view of enabling the Lay Committee the better to carry out the important purposes of its formation, the Lord Bishop, at the instance of the Central Board, propounded to the Clergy of the Diocese a series of questions, by circular, in February last, with the object of putting the Committee in possession of the actual state of the Parishes and Missions in the Diocese, and of shewing what is needed for the more complete establishment of the Church. Although we have, in this case also, to express our regret that these enquiries have not been more fully answered, and a greater amount of information obtained, the returns will yet furnish the Committee with some valuable Church Statistics; a copy of which, when duly classified, will be preserved in a tabular form, in the office of the Society, for facility of reference by any member.

The lands belonging to the Society are under the management of the Lay Committee, who, with the valuable assistance of the Sub Committees of the Society, in the vicinities in which the lands are severally situated, will, it is trusted, be enabled to render them available for the interests of the Church. A list and description of the lands will be kept in the Society's Office.

Assistant Becretary and Travelling Agent.

It will have been perceived, that an alteration has taken place in the office of Assistant Secretary. The Rev. D. B. Parnther, who had held the office almost from the commencement of the Society, and who had kindly fulfilled its duties, so far as his other important avocations admitted, - for which he received but a small allowance from the Society,—having taken his departure for England in October last, it was considered desirable, owing to the increased and increasing duties of the office, to engage the services of a gentleman, who could devote his whole time and attention to the fulfilment of its various duties, and to the promotion of the interests of the Society, in every way in his power. The appointment of Lieut. Lloyd, R. N., our present able and zealous Assistant Secretary, was then made, in conformity with the provisions contained in the 11th Article of the By-Laws, and approved by the Central Board, who granted an increased allowance for his stipend. With the duties of Assistant Secretary are combined those of Travelling Agent for the Society. In the latter capacity, he will, if it please God, usually attend at the annual meetings of the District Associations, and occasionally at the stated meetings of the District Committees; and will be found ready at all times to lend his aid at Parochial Meetings, when it is thought his presence, statements, and efforts, can materially promote the interests of the Society.. In calling, however, for his services, it will be doubtless kindly remembered by the clergy and other friends of the Society what are his duties, in the office in Montreal, and also as charged with the care and direction of the Book Depository.

Depositorn.

The Depository is, for the present, at the office of the Society, No. 57, Champ-de-Mars Street, Montreal, under the direction of the Assistant Secretary. There is a good assortment of Common Prayer Books, and a large number of Tracts. The miscellaneous books now on hand are chiefly designed for specimens.

The Clergy wanting, for their own private Libraries, standard Theological works, or Parochial or Sunday School lending Libraries, will find some facilities rendered them, on visiting the Depository.

It ought to be mentioned, in connection with the Depository, that in a private letter received from the Secretary of the Church Missionary Society, addressed to our Assistant Secretary, he states—
"Any arrangement that you may wish to make, for obtaining a regular supply of our publications, the Secretaries here will be most ready to carry out."

District Associations.

During the past year, an alteration has been made in the distribution of the Diocese into Districts.

Much inconvenience was found in the working of some of the District Branches, owing to their territorial extent, and the consequent distance at which some of the Clergy resided from the usual places of the meetings of the Committees. To remedy this, three of the Districts have each been divided into two parts, thus making in all eleven Districts, which are as follow:—

That this may be soon attained, the subject is again commended to the early and kind attention of the officers of the District Associations.

The Minister, in officially communicating this information, says—"We have lodged in the Savings Bank, ready to be paid, when required, into the hands of your Treasurer, £135, being £125 for one year's stipend for the Missionary, and £10 given as a donation towards the purchase of a horse for his use. I must add that one kind friend has given a sleigh, and another a new saddle and bridle.

He adds, "The sum of £12 has been placed in my hands bysome friends of Israel's descendants, to be paid to the London Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews, for the benefit of the Institution at Liverpool. Also, £1 for the Church Missionary Society, and £1 for the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts."

No Missionary having yet been appointed by the Bishop, to derive his maintenance from this source, from the difficulty of finding a suitable clergyman to undertake it, the first year's stipend has been placed, as mentioned in the above extract, at the suggestion of the Treasurer of the Church Society, that it may receive interest.

The sums paid to our Treasurer, on behalf of certain Home Societies, have been received, and will be remitted, in conformity with the 15th Article of the General By-Laws of this Society.

It will be perceived that no collection was made in Christ Church on Quinquagesima Sunday, for the Society, as on former years. This arose from the large amount which the congregation has been engaged in paying to the Minister of St. Anne's Chapel, connected with the Parish Church, and which was partly met by a collection made in the Church, soon after Quinquagesima Sunday.* On this account, with the sanction of the Bishop, the Quinquagesima Ser-

J Jones succeeded in obtaining an amount sufficient to erect and endow a Church in Farnham West, in addition to what has been expended in the purchase of the Glebe for Stanbridge.

The sum of £15 has been raised in the Mission of Rev. G. Milne towards the completion of the Church at New Carlisle, and the same amount as reported last year, £39 0s. 6d., towards the support of the Clergyman.

We have now brought our statement for the past year ... a close, and on a review of what has been done, although there are some evidences of a continued inattention to the claims of the Society on the part of certain Parishes and Missions in the Diocese, and of a diminished interest in the great and good work before us, on the part of others, yet it is believed that the account now rendered will prove on the whole satisfactory. By a comparison of the income of the Society and the District Branches now reported, with the increase for the year ending July 1846, it will be seen that there is an increase this year of £211 17 5.

But there is one feature in this report, which may have been observed, as it proceeded—the absence of any allusion to grants of lands toward the endowment of Parishes. From the comparatively small value of land at the present time, and the abundant evidence we possess of great ultimate advantages resulting to the Church from the possession of landed estate, it is a matter both of surprise and regret that we have to record so few donations of land. Were the subject fully explained, and the prospective benefits to the

Church made known to those of our people who are proprietors of land, that by the gift of a poruen of land, of but little present value to them, they may be perpetuating the ministrations of the Church, and laying up in store blessings for generations to come, they would not surely withhold the gift. How small a thing it doubtless appeared in the eyes of our forefathers, to set apart a little, perhaps forest, land for the services of the Church; but for how many ages has that small gift caused the Church-going Bell to sound, and the hamlet to smile when a Sabbath appeared. We would fain urge upon all, to emulate in this particular, in this young land of our adoption, the deeds of our fathers. Did many contribute but a few acres, the aggregate might amount to an endowment, and under God, would prove a perpetual blessing to the land.

But we would conclude, as we began, by commending to the grateful consideration of all who long to be instrumental in advancing the Redeemer's cause on earth, that there are promises—Divine promises, rich and abundant,—that cannot fail, and that may well encourage activity and energy in the sacred cause. May the Spirit from on High be poured out upon our Church and land! then shall we not be barren or unfruitful in the work of the Lord. May He smile upon the labours of this Society, then shall we see an abundant increase.

CONSTITUTION, RULES AND REGULATIONS

OF THE

Lay Committee of the Church Society.

1. The Lay Committee shall consist for the present of twenty-five Members, and all vacancies in the existing number of Members shall be filled up, and all additional appointments, if any shall be hereafter required, shall be made by the Central Board at any of their Stated or Special Meetings.

2. The Officers of the Committee shall be a Chairman and Secretary, to be chosen by the Committee at any Ordinary or

Special Meeting.

- 3. Ordinary Meetings of the Committee shall be held quarterly, on the 14th day of the months of January, April, July, and October, not being a Sunday, such Meetings to be summoned by a notice to be inserted in one of the leading Newspapers of Quebec and Montreal, four times during fifteen days before the period of such Meeting. Special Meetings to be called by the Chairman, as occasion may require, or upon the request of any three of the Committee, and two days notice of such Meeting, and of the objects thereof, to be given by the Secretary in writing to such of the Members as it may be practicable to summon to the place of meeting.
 - 4. No act shall be valid or effectual at such Meetings unless at

least five Members be present; in the absence of the Chairman of the Committee the Members present shall name a Chairman of the Meeting.

- 5. All questions shall be determined by a majority of votes of those present, and in case of an equality, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
- 6. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order at the meetings and in the proceedings of the Committee, and of the Secretary to take minutes of all proceedings, votes and orders, to preserve and record the same in a book to be kept for the purpose, to carry into effect the General Rules or Special votes of the Committee, so far as depends on his office, to carry on the correspondence of the Committee, under the direction of the Chairman, and to have charge of all letters, papers and documents whatsoever, belonging to the Committee, or concerning its affairs.

The Secretary, if a member of the Committee, shall be entitled to a vote at all meetings.

The Minutes of the proceedings of the Committee, at each meeting, shall be read over and signed by the Chairman before adjournment.
