## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

## PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

## CONSTITUTION.

WE

KLOCK.

As Revised 5th May, 1881.

- 1. That this Association be called the "Province of Quebec Rifle Association," and shall have for its object the encouragement of rifle shooting in the Province.
- 2. Any person subscribing two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be a member thereof for the year in which such subscription shall be made.
- 3. A donation of twenty dollars in cash, at any one time, for that express purpose, or of a prize of not less value than forty dollars, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall make the donor eligible for election as a life member at next annual meeting of Council.
- 4. Any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps subscribing ten dollars or upwards, per annum, to the funds of the Association shall be considered as being in connection with it and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, for competition only, in proportion of one for every dollar so subscribed. The Association thus affiliating is to select from its members the persons to hold such memberships.
- 5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, named by the Council. (The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron.")

- 6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the annual business meeting of the Association.
- 7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents—one for each Brigade Major's Division—to be elected in the same manner as the President.
  - 8. There shall be a Council composed as follows, viz:
- 1st. Two members from each Brigade Major's Division, to be elected annually at the business meeting.
- 2nd. One representative member from each affiliated Association or Corps in this Province.
- 9. The President, Vice-Presidents, the District Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia and Brigade Majors of the Province of Quebec, shall be members "ex-officio" of the Council. Five members of Council shall form a quorum, and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies. All members of Council, excepting representatives of affiliated Associations, must be individual members of the Association.
- Associations they represent, and the names of delegates when changed shall be sent to the Secretary at least one month prior to the annual meeting.
- 11. The Council shall, at its first meeting, choose from its members a chairman.
- 12. There shall be a Secretary and a Treasurer, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.
- 13. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be an-

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nually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affiairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

- 14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any case altered or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.
- 15. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the Council, and the prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.
- 16. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.
- 17. An Annual Business Meeting of the members of the Association, for the election of Officers and Council, who shall assume office on first day of succeeding January, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the by-laws.
- a resolution duly passed at the annual business meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed, unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof shall have been given to the Secretary one month at least previous to the annual business meeting, at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments, and also to post them on the bulletin board at the opening of the annual matches.

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## BY-LAWS.

As Revised 5th May, 1881.

- 1. The Annual Business Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second day of the annual matches.
- 2. There shall be two ordinary meetings of Council, the first of which shall be held immediately after the annual business meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.
- 3. Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required, by any six members of the Council; notification being sent to each member of Council at least ten days previous to such meeting, and the requisition for the meeting and the notices to the members must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meetings.
- 4. The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, open to the inspection of all members of the Council, and published with the annual report.
- 5. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, to be chosen at their first meeting.
- 6. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.
- 7. All expenditure for current expenses, which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of a member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.
- 8. A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

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## THE EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

## PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

The standing of the Association shows this year such a decided improvement in many respects, that it is evident the changes introduced have been in accordance with the wishes of its members, and we hope by some further modifications, resulting from the experience of the past season, to produce still more improvement.

#### THANKS.

The thanks of the Association are due to all our supporters, and especially, to His Excellency the Governor-General, for his continued support, and the gift of his Silver and Bronze Medals, won by Staff-Sergt. Wynne, Royal Scots, and Pvt. D. Smith, Royal Scots respectively.

To His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor, for his Silver Medal, won by Sergt. Andrew Thompson, 8th Royal Rifles, and to all those friends who have continued to support us by their subscriptions and prizes in kind.

#### GRANTS.

The Dominion Government gave their usual Grant, and we are glad to say, the Provincial Government restored their Annual Grant to the extent of \$300.

#### MATCHES.

Our Matches were held during the second week of August as usual, and were arranged to finish in two days, with ten competitions. The number of competitors was fully fifty per cent. more than last year, the total being 1,534 Individuals and 36 Teams, the largest number in any single match was 155; our Affiliated Associations have increased to 17, and Individual Membership to 35.

The Matches ran very smoothly, but the general opinion seemed to be that the time (two days) was too limited, and competitors felt

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that such constant shooting was too much of a strain; they were, in fact, "on the go" the whole time: the staff, though increased, also felt overworked. The funds of the Association suffered likewise, as a good many entries for the Optional and Extra Series had to be returned for lack of time to fire the tickets. We are, therefore, of the opinion, that it would add very much to the comfort of all concerned, and perhaps to the scores, if at least half a day's time were added to the meeting.

The alteration in the value and number of the prizes, met with very general approval.

The abolition of sighting shots was a change, that of course affected the revenues, though it saved time.

The duties of Range Officers were efficiently performed by Lieut. Col. Mattice, and Captains Watt and Radiger.

The Association Cup was won by the 6th Fusiliers for a second time, and they now have become its owners.

The Aggregate Cup was won by the 43rd Battalion, of Ottawa, who hold it for the year.

The Dolan Cup was won by Capt. Aylmer, 54th Battalion, Melbourne.

The Stewart Cup was won by Sergt. Marks, 6th Fusiliers.

The Markers were brought from Ottawa again, and did their work well.

The usual Competitors' Meeting was held on the Ranges during the Matches, but there were no matters of any importance brought forward, nor any complaints.

#### AMMUNITION.

The Ammunition question was finally settled, by the Association procuring a supply of the special mark, prepared by the Dominion Government for the use of the Rifle Associations; but competitors were allowed to use any ammunition made at the D. C. factory.

#### RANGES.

The Ranges were not in as good order as usual; the spring floods had again very seriously injured both the butts and targets, but the Council did not feel warranted in asking the Militia Department to

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spend a large sum in repairs, nor in doing so themselves, as the tenure of the property is so very uncertain, in view of the proposed levee and railroad. The question of a permanent site is evidently becoming more and more serious.

#### PRESENTATION OF PRIZES.

The Public Presentation of Prizes, which had been proposed in previous years, was carried out on the last evening of the Matches. A Special Committee had the matter in charge, and the Victoria Rink was very tastefully arranged for the occasion. His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor, who was to have made the presentations, was unavoidably absent through sickness, and the duty in consequence was undertaken by the Officer Commanding the District, assisted by the City Members of Parliament and several ladies.

#### PROPERTY.

A list of the property is attached herewith.

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#### FINANCES.

The Treasurer's Statement shows a balance of \$320.76, and we have ammunition on hand valued at \$189.89, making a total of \$510.65, which is most satisfactory.

The subscriptions show an increase over last year, and should be still further increased the coming year, as any change of the Ranges will necessitate a considerable outlay.

The usual revenue from sighting shots, "which had been abolished," was not altogether made up by the saving in time and extra series entries.

#### D. C. R. A.

Our Association was well represented at the Ottawa Matches, and had the satisfaction of winning the "London Merchants Cup" in the Inter-Provincial Match. This is the fourth time. The Cup was exhibited in this City and then handed to the President of the Association, Sir A. P. Caron, in whose charge it remains for the year.

The mode of selecting our team seemed to give satisfaction to

those interested, and it might be well to continue the same system.

The 8th Royal Rifles of Quebec carried off the British Challenge Shield, which had been won in 1883 by the 6th Fusiliers. The Province thus holding it for two out of four years.

The free tickets to Ottawa given to the aggregate winners seem to give satisfaction.

Our members who attended the D.R.A. matches considered they were too crowded for time, like our own, and suggest an increase of a day.

It will thus appear that as far as the suggestions made in the last report were carried out, we have found them decided improvements, and it is only matter for regret that we cannot report any improvement in the care of our property, nor the care of our ranges.

Extract of Minutes of Meetings of Council and Executive Committee.

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

MONTREAL, May 26, 1886.

Lt.-Col. Martin in the chair. After some discussion it was Resolved: That an effort be made to obtain a renewal of the annual grant from the Provincial Government.

Montreal, 4th June, 1886.

Present: Lt.-Col. Van Straubenzie (in the chair). Lt.-Cols. Mattice, Fletcher, Martin and Fraser; Majors Bond and Mudge; Capt. Hood; Lieut. Whitman and the Secretary.

The Secretary reported on the progress made since last meeting and it was Resolved:—That a meeting of Council be called for Monday, 14th June, at 2 p.m., and that a Committee be appointed to interview the Provincial Treasurer re the Government grant.

#### MEETING OF COUNCIL.

MONTREAL, 14th June, 1886.

Present: Lt. Col. Van Straubenzie, (in the chair) Lt.-Cols. Martin, Fletcher, Mattice, Fraser, Harwood and Brosseau, Major Bond and the Secretary.

Resolved.—That the annual matches be held as usual during week commencing Tuesday, 10th August. That the prize list be limited to \$1,500. That if found necessary for the proper working of the matches \$100 shall be expended on repairs to the Butts. That refreshments be provided as usual. That the Executive Committee to draw up programme and carry out the matches shall be Lt.-Cols. Van Straubenzie, Martin, Fletcher, Fraser and Miller; Majors Bond and Mudge; Capts. Sims and Dunn: Lieut. Whitman and the Secretary.

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## EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Montreal, 25th June, 1886.

Lieut.-Col. Martin (in the chair). It was Resolved:—That a sketch of programme as presented showing a cash value of prizes of \$1,569—not including medals, cups, &c., and not to last longer than two days,—be adopted and printed at once.
