

These interesting records are made up of emigrants, religious exiles, political rebels, serving men sold for a term of years, apprentices, children stolen, maidens pressed, and containing their ages, the localities where they formerly resided in England, the names of the ships in which they embarked, etc. There is also a good index of about 70 pages.
