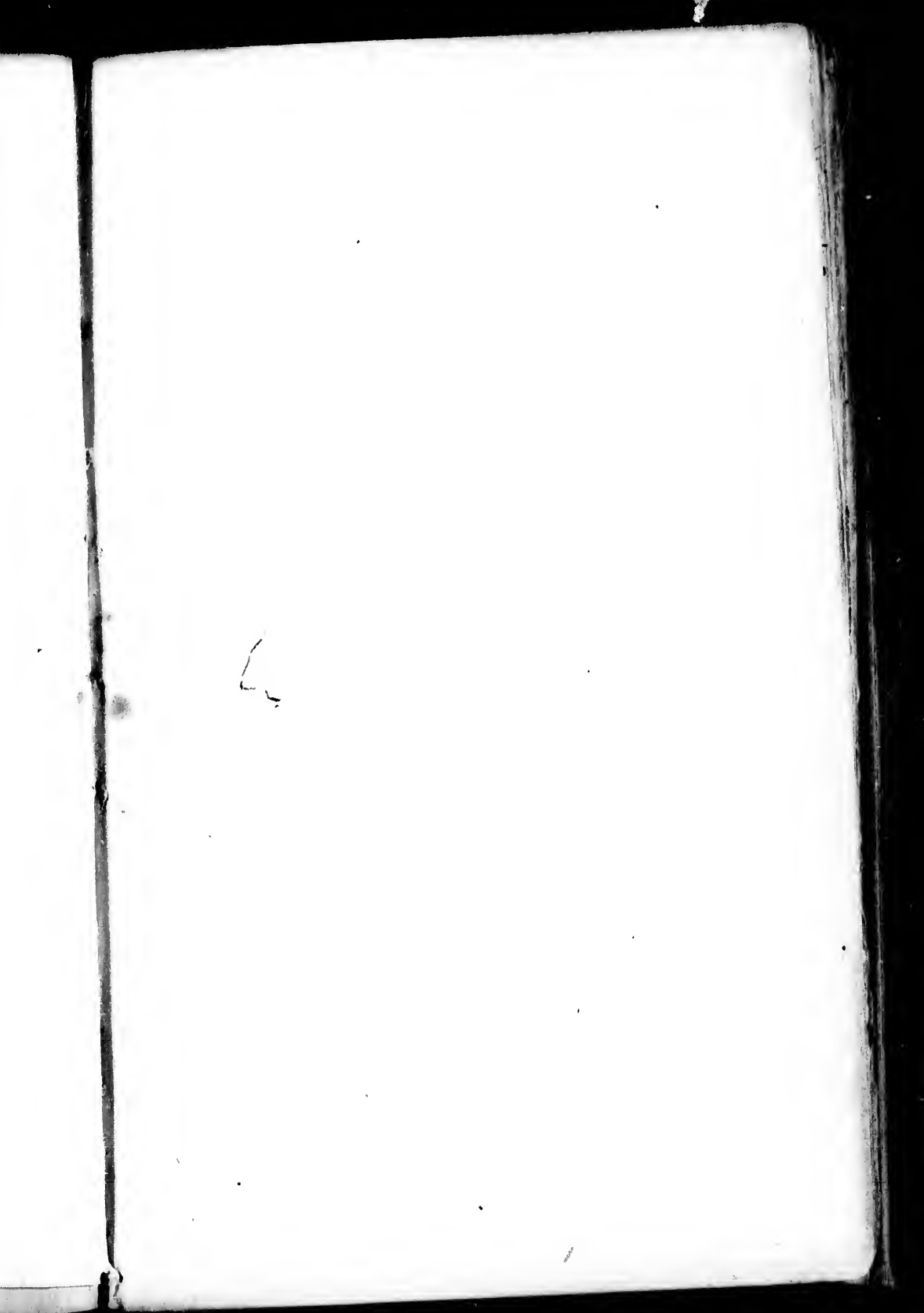
ADVERTISEMENT.

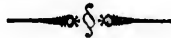
