1857.

The Annual Meeting of the Missionary Society of the PRIMITIVE METHODIST CHURCH, CANADA, was held in BRAMPTON, *Chinguacousy*, on Tuesday evening, April 21st, 1857; THOMAS FOSTER, Esq., of Tannagua, Schylkill, (*one of the Members of a Deputation from the Eastern States Primitive Methodist Conference,*) in the Chair. The Rev. WILLIAM LYLE, *President of the Conference*, gave out a Hymn, and engaged in Prayer. W. LAWSON, Esq., then read the REPORT for the past year, and the following Ministers advocated the claims of the Society:—

FOR THE YEAR ENDING APRIL 30th, 1857.

THE Missionary Committee of the Primitive Methodist Missionary Society feel happy in once more submitting to their *now* numerous friends the details of the Annual Report. These yearly reviews of men and things which a Report like this embraces, remind us of the ever changing scenes that are passing around, and naturally induce a train of reflection and comparison.

In perusing the lists of our Annual Subscribers, we find, in collating them with the lists of the last Report, that several names have disappeared, whilst many more fresh ones have filled up the chasms, and thus our roll is extended, and our numbers multiplied. Some of the former have been called to give an account of their stewardship; and the latter are incurring, with ourselves, high responsibilities. We believe, guided by the Infallible Word, that the cheerful support of a Society like this Heaven will regard with favour, if influenced by a pure motive, the offering laid upon the altar. Our new friends and old patrons and supporters will, we trust, realise satisfaction in the following statements; although we are not about to register the extraordinary, and announce what is wonderful, yet we thank God that the Society has done more than hold its ground, as a witness for the truth—as a breakwater, to resist the rolling wave of superstition and sin. The Society, as a beacon-light in the land, has summoned its friends, and pointed them to their work; and the work, in a qualified sense, has been done; and those beloved Agents of the Society, both Lay and Ministerial, have their reward. Animated with that ardour for souls which overrides the selfishness of humanity, and conscientiously attached to

that holy enterprise which has elevated the intellect and heart, in the past year no trials have discouraged, no difficulties have dismayed, no inducements have led to an abandonment of the work, nor a relaxing of effort on the margin of success. To some of our brethren there has been trial and sorrow of heart, and to the Committee occasional perplexity; but the Lord has been our "refuge and strength, and a very present help in trouble; therefore we will not fear."

As it is the duty of the Committee to lay a faithful statement of the operations of the Society before the subscribers, it will be necessary to present the shady side, as well as the sunny side. It is not by basking in the bright and beautiful that the graces of our souls are to be matured and established; but often by trials of faith, and perseverance under difficulties and disaster. The Society has had its reverses and successes during the year, which we are about to chronicle. We would first refer to Woodstock, which has for the present disappeared from our number of stations. Shortly after last Conference Brother Dean was appointed to this place; but at the first Quarterly Meeting of the Committee, in Toronto, he presented such an unfavorable statement of the Mission, especially the head of it, that the Committee decided to withdraw the services from the town for a season; and request the Blenheim Station to take up the country appointments. From recent circumstances, however, which have taken place, there is reason to hope that Woodstock will be recovered, and that God will give us many souls in that interesting town, where we have a church, around which a large population are fast gathering. We also intimate with regret that Orangeville has suffered a temporary check. The Missionary in charge there suddenly embraced doctrinal sentiments adverse to those of the Body, and it was necessary he should resign his connexion with the work. Brother Dean, who succeeded on the station, scarcely commenced his labours before he was broken down by affliction, and had to leave the place altogether. Before the Committee could get another labourer into that part of the vineyard several weeks elapsed, during which the congregations consequently suffered. In other parts of our Mission Field curtailment and expense was suffered in effecting changes, which were rendered necessary; but in those instances the Committee made the best arrange-

ments in its power ; and the Conferencee fully approved of the course taken in the circumstances of each case.

Having made these remarks of a general and cursory nature, we would now briefly advert to the particular aspects of each Mission Station under your Committee's direction. We scarcely think an elaborate argument for Missions, and extensive detail of their operations necessary in a Report like this. We suspect, that on obtaining this publication, our friends will most probably open to where they feel an immediate interest,—to scan, for instance- the list of names in their own locality, and especially the sums standing opposite them ; then, instead of the Preface or Introduction, the next move will be to the Balance Sheet ; and, if a Ministerial Brother, he will not forget to pitch upon the last page, to review the time and places for which he is set down as a Missionary Deputation, and to anticipate with an agreeable feeling, when, on visiting old or new places, Christian friends will welcome to their respective abodes ; and on the glorious theme of the Missionary enterprise he will revel in sympathy and pleasure. It is delightful to think that in Britain our Parent Society increases like a flock ; and that, with Evangelical Bodies in general, the advance is onwards. In Canada the hopes of the faithful are sanguine ; and, with the advance of agricultural and general commerce in this *incipient empire*, the Mission operations, so essential to the real interests of the Colony, increases in vitality and enlargement. And, by the grace of God, the Primitive Methodist Body occupies several outposts with acknowledged usefulness, in this vast portion of the field of the world. Then, in the first place, we refer to the REACH Station, for the purpose of saying that it has *reached* a self-sustaining attitude. This Circuit has now two Ministers, eleven Local Preachers, seven Class Leaders, three Chapels, eleven other Preaching Places, 190 Members, with an increase on the year of 15 ; another commodious Chapel in the centre of the Circuit has been commenced, and we trust that prosperity will wait upon the labours of our Reach Brethren ; and that their increasing *co-operation* with the Missionary Society will enable the Committee to take up an additional point of the uncultivated field, in lieu of the *agreeable loss* it has experienced in them becoming independent of Missionary assistance.

KINGSTON.—This important Station, we trust, is destined to advance, and exercise a stimulating example upon those Stations that have been detached from it. It has already effected much good as a Missionary centre of operations ; and although its numbers are stationary, yet peace reigns ;—the brethren faithfully labour ; and as now the principal efforts are directed upon the City, we are, with our beloved friends there, sanguine of an increase of souls the coming year.

PORLAND.—This Mission has prospered, and its membership is 202. The extent of country it embraces is considerable, and at many points much good has been realised, under the laborious efforts of the Brethren from time to time. Our venerable Brother John Lacey, with a young Colleague, is now on this Station, and all that devoted piety, with long experience conjoined, will be accomplished.

BATH ROAD.—This Station, in the vicinity of Kingston, has been lately formed into a separate Mission, and is now blessed with the labours of our much esteemed Brother W. Gledhill. On this Mission, a slight decrease on the year is reported ; but the Brethren are far from being dismayed. The population are favourable to the operations of the Primitive Methodist Missionaries, and the cause is established in the hearts of many in the neighborhood.

NAPANEE.—This Mission has fully sustained the expectations of the Committee. An increase of twenty-five members are reported, and the field over which the Mission extends, is well suited for the peculiar efforts which characterize Primitive Methodist Missions. The official friends and members entered heartily into the work of taking up preaching appointments, and success rewarded their simple and persevering toil. May the Brethren continue to labour on in the simplicity of the gospel, and they will see still greater things ; and thus encourage both the Committee and the Subscribers, to whom this Mission has already been a source of joy.

OSPREY AND ST. VINCENT.—There are not many parts of our Colony that require the support of our Society, and the labours of a Missionary, more than the townships embraced by this very extensive

Station. This Mission supplies the "*Bread of Life*" to many souls, which, but for this effort, would be, in a great measure, destitute of the life giving word. And it is satisfactory to report that the Mission succeeds: an addition of eighteen members has been received, with cheering prospects of future usefulness.

GUELPH.—This Mission, although stationary in numbers, has not receded; and if in the Town the interest has just been maintained, some new places have been taken up in the adjacent country. As our local Brethren here have the cause at heart, and labour earnestly to promote its prosperity, in the salvation of souls, we have confident anticipation that the Guelph Mission will eventually become self-supporting.

GALT.—This Station, the more effectually to advance its own interests, and that of Blenheim, in the neighborhood, has become united with the latter. Owing to the numerous removals, and other untoward circumstances, the work here has been almost stationary; but we trust that in this now united Mission, as there are many tried friends of the cause, their combined endeavours over a larger portion of the land will be prosperous, and that another year's toil will announce progress in the right direction.

ORANGEVILLE.—We have already adverted to the difficulties of this Mission during the year. At the late Conference, however, when its affairs were minutely investigated, evidence was forthcoming of its rising and overcoming its difficulties. A fresh arrangement of the preaching appointments,—a concentration of effort on fewer places, is likely to lead to the stability of the work, and greater results in the soul-saving enterprize.

PEEL AND WELLESLEY.—This extensive Mission has, we hope, recovered from the disasters of a former year, and peace and unity prevails. Seventeen has been reported as the increase. Could we muster the *Men and Means*, and we hope we shall, great enlargement might be made in the new townships bordering on the margins of the Peel and Wellesley Stations. The Brethren, in the true spirit of Christian enterprize, are not satisfied with what has been done; they are anxious for the regions beyond; and have repeatedly appealed to the Committee in reference to the unmissioned territory.

Many souls, in distant settlements, have no access to the means of grace,—others continue to pierce the primitive forests, and require overtaking by the footsteps of the Missionary. These are the cases on which we wish to *linger*, in drawing attention to the work committed to us. O that God may hear prayer! that speedily men and means may be forthcoming to meet these high places of the field.

LONDON.—This Mission, although it draws largely on the funds, yet its usefulness and success justifies the Committee and Conference in sustaining the expenditure. The increase has been fifty-four, and the laborious Brethren have taken up several new places, ranging at a considerable distance from London, in which God has blessed their labours in the conversion of many sinners. To the permanent stability of the Station, it is felt that a new Church, in which to worship, is an object of the utmost importance. The last Conference discussed the case at large, and decided that it should be built; and that the Body in Canada should be generally appealed to for help, as a special case. We hope when the Ministers, in conjunction with Mr. W. Lawson, shall be prepared to act, that the response for a Church in London, so vital to the interest of the Mission, will be general among Primitive Methodists.

BRANTFORD AND PARIS.—On this Station we have an increase of twenty-four, and the handsome new Church in Brantford has been opened under auspicious circumstances. We hope our indefatigable Brother in charge will now have the desire of his heart, in an enlarged congregation, and the salvation of many souls. Peace be within the walls, and prosperity within the palaces of Zion.

BRANT AND DURHAM.—This is rather a remote Station of our work in Canada, but one the prosperity of which has given encouragement to the supporters of Missions. The Station has realized an increase of twenty-seven souls; and could another Labourer be sent thither, many might be gathered into the fold of the Shepherd of Israel. It will depend on the augmentation of the Missionary treasury to accomplish this desirable consummation.

BOSANQUET.—This rather distant Mission, in the field we occupy, will also stimulate the friends of the Society. It has steadily progressed from its commencement, and now reports an increase of

twenty-eight members. Protracted services have been made a blessing on this Station, and persevering efforts have been crowned with success. Thus all on this Mission are hopeful for the current year.

WALSINGHAM.—This place, referred to in the last yearly Report as one to which the Hamilton Conference of 1856 was anxious to appoint a Missionary, has been commenced and prosecuted. The Missionary Secretary, Mr. Lawson, was deputed to visit Walsingham, and the arrangements he made were entered upon by Brother W. J. Dean. At the January quarter he reported ten members, and an income of £5 9s. 4d. At the last Conference eighteen members were reported, and £11 18s. was returned towards the Missionary's support. Could Brother Dean have laboured efficiently, probably the numerical and financial statements would have been greater; but his health, which was feeble at first, gradually gave way, and we regret to say, that the opinion became well founded that for the office of a Canadian Missionary he was totally unequal. His medical adviser recommended a return to England as the only chance of recovery. To this Mission, however, the Committee have obtained the appointment of an effective supply, and *hope* is in the ascendant in relation to Walsingham Mission.

It would be pleasing task to go on reporting other cases of commencement,—and others in advancing progress,—and to show, by the liberality of the Church, that the means of grace are equal to exigencies of the hundreds migrating to the “fields of the woods.” But for the present we must pause, and reiterate the appeal, and earnestly summon all our dear Friends to ponder deeply the solicitations of the Mission work. It would rejoice the hearts of the Committee to see the *youth* more powerfully and numerously engaged in urging on the march of victory;—particularly the Superintendents, teachers, and children of our Sabbath Schools. In Britain our Sabbath School Scholars continue to raise annually a large sum for the Australian Missions. And could not our Schools, led on by the teachers, accomplish much, if *now* fully organized. Something has been done already, but the effort should be general. Missionary cards are prepared, and may be had at the Mission Office, King Street, Toronto; and were the children addressed and simply direct-

ed, they would not fail in doing their part in Canada, as they do it in the Fatherland.

It affords the Committee pleasure to record the fact that, with the Primitive Methodist Bodies on this Continent, the Missionary power is strengthening ; and we feel an interest in the prosperity of the two Branches of the same people in the Eastern and Western States of the Union. At our Conference in Brampton, we received a Deputation from the Eastern States Conference, consisting of the Rev. C. Spurr, Wm. Donaldson, and Thomas Foster, Esqrs. The Services of these brethren were very effective, and the communications they made respecting the work of God were pleasing and encouraging.

CONCLUSION.

By a reference to the Balance Sheet, it will be seen that the annual income is in advance, with a balance on hand. The former consideration is cheering ; and as it respects the latter, it will be borne in mind, that the immediate liabilities of the Society are considerable, and before the funds can be replenished, the regular quarterly allowances will have absorbed the balance in question. Then there follows the important consideration of taking up new Mission ground, and responding with additional help to extend the work on those stations that are urging *this* with such importunity.

We would not omit gratefully to record the pecuniary help received, as usual, from the Parent Society ; and if it has not been able to send us fresh Missionaries, we thank God we have been enabled to raise up and send out five fresh men from amongst ourselves ; and we also, with equal feelings of gratitude to the "Father of Lights," register our thanks, that, after filling up the casualties occasioned by removals, deaths, &c., we have an increase of sixty souls on the Mission Stations.

But, in closing this Introduction, we would thank the numerous young friends and others, on behalf of the Society, for the good service rendered during the past year, by making such excellent use of the Missionary Collecting Books, in waiting upon the generous and Christian community, to receive their offerings made to God and religion ; and also to those brethren who have

travelled and advocated the claims of the Society. Suffer the Committee now to urge to a more powerful and sustained effort ; **AND NOW IS THE TIME !** Let there be no delay on each Station in organizing the Collectors, and directing them on their separate lines of action. Prior to the Annual Missionary Meetings, let the services be well and repeatedly advertised ;—let the Missionary Deputations be in *good time* at their respective appointments ;—let the membership give up the world for a brief season, to sustain the effort in person, with their families ;—let the Chapels and other places be *early* and well ventilated and *warmed*, for the accommodation of the assemblies ;—and every matter necessary to the well conducting of the Meeting planned carefully beforehand ; and all will be satisfied, the cause benefitted, and God honored. These little things, and others that might be enumerated, although small, are of some importance in the aggregate, towards a successful Missionary effort, in any given place.

And now, dear Friends, allow us to remind you of greater personal dedication to the service of the living and true God—the God of Missions. We require more holiness of heart and life, to be equal to the position assigned us by Divine Providence. There is a greater need of more earnest, importunate prayer in the Missionary Prayer Meetings, and in our families, and in our retirements, for God the Holy Ghost to come down, and baptize our entire work, that when we arrive at the final close, we may have to use the words of the blessed Jesus, “ Father, I have glorified thee on the earth ; I have finished the work thou hast given me to do.” Amen.
