Every.—Mr. Bourne and Mr. J. Galloway, the engineers, are on their return to England, and for the present the postal convention with Melenset Ali, for the transit of the India mails through Egypt and the rilroad across the desert between Cairo and Suez, is, at an end. It is understood that the British government has refused to ratify the postal agreement which was transmitted to England in December last, in consequence of Mehemet Ali refusing to give any guarantee that there should be no monopoly in the conveyance of merchandise and passengers through Egypt.—The transit of the India mails through Egypt, will be effected as heretofree, by the agency of the East India Company. The long expected alterations in the Egyptian Transit Company are finally to take place, and there is a prospect of its affairs being conducted in a more satisfactory manner. Artie Bey, the Prime Minister, will be the chief director of the company in Alexandria, and Baki Bey at Cairo; the principal managers under these two Beys heing Englishmen.—The fare is also to be reduced from £15 to £7 10s, for the transit from Alexandria to Suez, and vice versa.
