Owing to the heavy debt now resting upon the Diocese, and the important change made at our last session in the Constitution, by which it was hoped that larger financial results would be secured, a deep feeling of anxiety has naturally pervaded the whole Diocese as to the report which the Executive Committee, with all the returns of the year before it, might be able to submit to this Synod for its present consideration and future action.

That report, drawn up in the first instance by the extremely able and analytical pen of our esteemed Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. McWhinney, is now before us, and though the results are very far from what we had fondly hoped, yet I wish distinctly to say that after considering the extraordinary financial depression of the past year, the almost state of panic which has existed in the money market, together with the admitted unwillingness on the part of many to launch out into new and untried methods of raising assessments, the framers of the new Canon have no reason for discouragement, much less for despair. A unit of measurement was established by the last Synod which I believe will be of incalculable advantage to us all. Only now let us unitedly and loyally maintain that standard as fixed by law, and though undoubtedly, in the very nature of things, there will be difficulties in our path, abrasion here and tension there, yet if we go on with the courage of our own convictions, the goal we have set up before us will, with God's rich blessing, not only ere long be reached but eventually passed. That imposing lists of church membership may sometimes be found to fade into cloudland, and partake more of the nature of impalpable nebulae than of tangible bodies, will be readily admitted; but I submit that a canon which will make us face the difficult question of church membership, and decide in each parish who are, and who are not, our real members, merits, if it does not receive, our gratitude and respect.

Turning to the figures themselves we gather the following facts:

*First.*—The deficit for the year just ended, though we cannot but regret to see its presence at all, is greatly reduced from the terrible ratio of previous years. In proof of this I may draw your attention to a clause in the Executive Committee report in which the following statement is made:

"For the year ending April 30th, 1894, the Mission Fund Debt increased from \$4,605.71 to \$12,100.80, or \$7,495.09. Had the same rate of increase continued during the past year, the debt would have amounted to \$19,595.89. So that it may be said the amendments of last Synod have effected a saving of at least \$4,902.02."

By this we see that deficit of the year, instead of being \$7,495.09, its amount for 1894 is only \$2,593.07, placing the whole of our indebtedness at \$14,693.87. The waste has at least been checked, if it has not been removed, and let us earnestly pray and manfully

work for better and for brighter days when we shall only have to record the overflowings and not the deficiencies of the treasury of the Church—a period not intangible and remote, but rather accessible and assured, for thus saith the Lord: "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meet in My House, and prove Me now herewith saith the Lord of Hosts if I will not open you the windows of Heaven and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."

*Secondly.*—As regards the General Purpose Fund, the amount of subscriptions and Parochial Association collections received to the credit of the fund was \$5,096.10, as against \$4,639.61 for the previous year, showing a gratifying increase of \$456.49. When we consider the stringency of the times and the great falling away in funds generally, this increase is especially to be noted as a pledge of future prosperity and efficiency.

*Thirdly.*—That, while excluding the special collection for the *Mission Fund* in the year ending April 31st, the whole amount received was \$412.05 in excess of that year, the total receipts for this most important fund were only \$3,554.44.

No one, I think, who wishes the welfare of the Diocese can be gratified with such a return as this, and I humbly submit that instead of blaming this one or that, as guilty of grave dereliction in the premises, it were better to appoint an ample Committee, and arm it with all necessary powers to consider the whole question of the Mission Fund, and find out if possible the worm that feeds upon its damask cheek, and report the steps which in their judgment ought to be taken, to remove any prejudice that may unhappily exist, and to place it in a more sound and vigorous condition.

*Fourthly.*—That while the contributions of the Diocese on the basis of one dollar per family would have amounted to \$14,241.65, the amount actually received was only \$9,553.04, or about 67%. In this connection we cannot fail to notice the fact that the Deaneries of Waterloo and Norfolk have the credit of being the only counties which raised the full amount of their required contributions. We would like to assure them and their representatives here present that whatever the changes of the approaching future, this Diocese will never for one moment consent to their elimination from the body politic, but, on the contrary, will do all in its power to bind them more closely to its warm and grateful heart.

*Fifthly.*—The figures demonstrate a great truth, which I would like most strongly to emphasize, namely, the absolute capacity of this noble Diocese to support amply, and support continuously, all the missions of our Church. When we see what has been done by the earnest and concerted efforts of some of our clergy and laity, we are unable to understand why the same results might not have been attained in almost every other part of the Diocese, if only a

corresponding zeal and devotion had been evinced. I am quite free to admit that there are some places where, owing to various reasons, no such results could possibly have been secured. But when we see the gaping blanks which many parishes exhibit in the accurate and comprehensive report put forth by the Executive Committee, I think the Synod has a right to ask why greater zeal and loyalty have not been exhibited in these instances in obeying its commands, and in meeting the really humble and modest requirements of the vast Diocese at large.

In addressing you, the Laity of this most important and growing Diocese, forgive me if, in the urgency of the case, I use a vehemence which indifference may possibly condemn, but which the merits of a righteous cause can only endorse and sustain.

You are aware that we stand face to face with a debt of over \$17,000, which is crippling all our energies and threatening to assume still more alarming proportions. Driven by this circumstance to do something for the protection of our funds, we find ourselves thrown back upon a canon law, which we shrink from even mentioning, much more from putting into operation. (I mean a canon by which we shall be compelled to reduce the income of a large number of our clergy in order to bring down our expenditure to more humble proportions.)

I therefore now appeal to you, knowing, as you do, the devotion and self-sacrificing love of your clergy, how earnestly they labor, and with what fidelity and zeal they preach the gospel of redeeming love, doing all they can for your spiritual and eternal welfare,—knowing also how slender and inadequate the means of many of them are to meet even their ordinary expenses,—I ask you, as their firm and loyal friends, will you permit this reduction of which I speak? Will you, as knowing their real intrinsic worth, and as having yourselves the most ample means to meet their every reasonable want, will you, I say, permit these noble and self-denying men to suffer the pinchings of hunger, and endure all the miseries which the operation of this canon will inevitably entail? I foresee, I anticipate your reply. I hear you say unitedly, I hear you say with the vehemence of a great indignation,—No; a thousand times, No! What we can, we will do. We will advance to their help and make the present exigency the occasion of our sympathy and liberality. Of this I am persuaded, and therefore will leave to your loving care the removal of this heavy burthen which at present disturbs our peace, trusting that God will guide you into that timely liberality which is so much needed in the present hour.

#### THE INTEGRITY OF DIVINE SERVICE.

I would draw the attention of the Synod to the tendency in this restless age of ours to mutilate and shorten the services of the Book of Common Prayer, under the plausible and common pleas of moderni-

zation and the breathless celerity of the times. That under the Canons of the Provincial Synod, a certain amount of liberty is permitted in the shortened form of Morning and Evening Prayer, I fully admit; yet liberty is not licence, nor freedom immunity from law; I would therefore point out three particulars in which we should be most circumspect in our conduct of Divine Worship.

*First, as regards the reading of God's Holy Word.*

It seems to me that the Laity have an indefeasible right to hear the whole Word of God as appointed in the Lectionaries and formularies of the Church. It is theirs by an especial right—a concession obtained through the blood of martyrs and confessors at the time of the glorious Reformation. And never in the past did there exist more necessity than there does in the present that our Laity should hear the same Word of God; and know all the rich and precious truths by which God seeks to illuminate and to save the world. It is this blessed Word which made our forefathers unable to bear the fetters of bondage, or to grope in the shades of superstition when they were at liberty to revel in the sunlight of the truth. The age in which we live is one of intense secularism. The Bible is but indifferently studied in our common schools; in many homes family prayer is unknown, and therefore if the Church be indifferent to the reading of God's Holy Word, how are our people to be instructed in the faith once delivered to the saints? Remembering that the Church is built upon the foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the Chief Corner Stone, give, I say, to the Laity the precious inheritance of the saints—the Word of the living God. Give it to them, because all the forces of darkness, in the shape of rationalism, agnosticism, and destructive criticism, are marshalling their powers against this glorious citadel of the truth. Give it to them, because unto them is the word of this salvation sent. Give it unto them, because herein is the ineffable glory of the Father seen in the face of Jesus Christ our Lord.

*Secondly, in the rehearsal of the Creeds.*

I greatly believe in the rehearsal of the Creeds.

I believe it does us all good to state over and over again the faith in which we stand, and to recapitulate one by one all those grand doctrines which are able to make us Wise unto Salvation. In this age of ours, there is a tendency to abolish all creeds. Men say, "We can believe in Christ, and do believe in Him, but we want no creed." My own opinion is, that this sentiment is but the prelude to a blank, awful infidelity which wishes to be free from all restraint. One of the glories of our Church is, that she does insist on a clear definition of her faith, and requires not only that her ministers should subscribe to her creeds, but that her people should rehearse them. Let us be careful to

safeguard our people in the same way as to the great creed of Athanasius.

safeguard our people in this most important respect. And here let me say a word as to the "*Quicumque Vult*," commonly known as the great creed of Athanasius.

That much doubt exists as to the exact authorship of this Creed is well known. Many learned men believed it to have been composed by Athanasius, when he was at Rome, and offered by him to Pope Julius as a confession of his faith. This was the opinion of Baronius, Cardinal Bona, Petavius, Belarmine, Rivet, and many others, both of the Roman and reformed communions. It was afterwards assigned by Paschasius Quesnel to Vigilius Tapsensis, an African bishop, who lived at the time of the Arian persecution under the Vandals. Two other claimants have also appeared, Vincentius Lirinensis, and Hilary, Bishop of Arles, both of Gaul. From all that can be gathered, the following results have been obtained:—

*First.*—That the Creed arose in Gaul; it is essentially Gallican.

*Secondly.*—That it was written somewhere between the years A.D. 420 and 431: in other words, before the Council of Ephesus, the third general Council.

*Thirdly.*—That it was composed by either Vincentius Lirinensis or Hilary of Arles—perhaps by both, as these two were not only contemporaries but probably great friends.

The Creed is of great value in that it guards the two great doctrines of the ever blessed Trinity, and the Incarnation of our Lord from all the attacks and subtleties by which some would sweep them away. It has been in the past, and is now in the present, one of the great bulwarks of the Faith. The high opinion which the Church has of this Creed is evident from the fact that she orders it to be publicly read on all the grand festivals of the Church, such as Christmas, Easter, Whitsuntide, and Ascension.

The bitterness of some against this noble Creed is not created by the uncertainty of its authorship, but from what are called its damnatory clauses, which apparently rankle in the breasts of many, and lead them to seek its overthrow and expurgation from the Book of Common Prayer. I would, however, remind the Clergy that with this Creed the Church of England has come through all the storms and changes that have swept about her; fought out her greatest battles, and gained her greatest victories in the past.

"There is, however, among many in our day, a terrible tendency to reject the declarations of Holy Scripture regarding sin. They look upon sin simply as a moral disease, not as a condition of criminality involving guilt, penalty and wrath. The sinner is spoken of as a child whose relation to his father has become morally disturbed, but not as a rebel standing as a criminal before the bar of a righteous judge." Hence, sin in their eyes is only a disease which

needs a hospital, not a crime which needs the awful mystery of Christ death, and the out-pouring of His most precious blood to expiate its guilt and remove it forever away.

Bearing this in mind, be bold, I would say, in the declaration of a true faith, and be assured that the pathway of blessing is the pathway of obedience to God's most holy word. Popular as the doctrine of the non-eternity of punishment may be in the sight of many, endorsed as it may be by the names of the learned and the great, it is, I do not hesitate to affirm that it is, the old lie spoken first in the Garden of Eden by the great betrayer of man—"Ye shall not surely die." I would, therefore, most strongly recommend the reverent rehearsal of this sublime Creed, as most salutary and edifying to the whole body of the faith.

*Thirdly.—I think we should be most particular in rendering the services of our Church as ordained by law.*

We Bishops have been foolish enough to imagine that our permission was necessary to make legal any changes in the service, and if not our's, at least the authority of some competent Synod; but we ought to be wiser now, for we find that many Clergymen, and some even of the younger men, pass like a simoon through the rubrics, and leave not a wrack behind.

I only know one royal law, and that is to abide as strictly as possible to the text already given, and by doing so we shall best discharge our own duty, and fulfill the just claims of all our people to have the liturgy unimpaired.

#### THE MINISTRY OF HOLY SPIRIT.

I cannot too strongly urge upon you all the absolute necessity of knowing what the true nature of the Christian ministry is. In its true development it is pre-eminently one of power. It begins in power and triumphs through power. It is to this intimate and essential union between the Christian ministry and power, the Church must inevitably come back if she would put on her beautiful garments, and be all her Lord intended her to be.

Power was the great pre-requisite ordained by Christ Himself. "Tarry ye here," he said, "in Jerusalem until ye be endued with power from on high." Not a step were they to take, not a work were they to do, until clothed with power. Now, this power, to which our Lord directed them, was the mighty indwelling of God the Holy Ghost, and, therefore, the ministry of the Church of God is *first* the ministry of the Spirit, and then, as a result, the ministry of power.

Most justly has it been said that an earnest, learned and eloquent ministry is not necessarily a ministry of the Holy Spirit,—a ministry may be all this and fail. The ministry must be much more than all these. The ministry of which we speak is the ministry of God the Holy Ghost, and, therefore, will always be one of power.

If there is one blessing the Church needs to cry for, on behalf of its ministers and students, it is that the ministry of the most Holy Spirit may speedily be restored to its full power again.

In your great combat with the world, with the power of darkness and sin, the sense of your own weakness is apt to oppress and overpower you, but take courage in the thought that your ministry may be, and, by the grace of God, will be the ministry of power, and that the presence of the glorified Saviour on His throne is with you, as you are indwelt by the Divine, though unseen, presence of God the Holy Ghost.

#### THE DIVISION OF THE DIOCESE.

Since last we met in Synod, two important meetings have been held in Toronto in reference to the great subject of an increase in the Episcopate. A report has been drawn up which embodies ideas which may or may not be acceptable to you, but on which you will be asked to express an opinion during the present session of this Synod. I cannot myself, however, refrain from expressing my own conclusions that the present time is premature for so great and serious a change.

The fact that both the Dioceses of Toronto and Huron are at present somewhat financially embarrassed, and therefore could not bear any division of their funds, that the times are phenomenal for stringency and contraction, and that the whole question of the future of Algoma has as yet not been discussed upon the floor of the Provincial Synod, constitute grave and important reasons why we should hasten slowly before committing ourselves to so grave and important a measure. Should, however, all these considerations bulk but little compared with the supposed urgency of the case, I would humbly submit that it is to the north, and to the north alone, we should look as the place through which the line of delimitation should be drawn. The counties of Bruce and Grey, from their very position, seem to present the only area which we could well surrender as our contribution toward the formation of a new Diocese. A diocese comprising the large districts of Parry Sound and Muskoka, together with the counties of Simcoe, Dufferin, Grey, and Bruce, would be sufficiently large to occupy all the energies and time of any man, however vigorous, who might be appointed as its Bishop.

As regards the rectification of our present lines, which is of course a wholly different subject, I do not see that we are called upon to make any change whatever. If, in the future, any alteration in the limits of the Diocese shall be found necessary, it will be quite time enough then for those who are on the scene to decide their nature and extent; but for the present I can but think that the safest and most evident way is to confine ourselves to the two counties above named as our contribution toward the new Diocese.

## HURON COLLEGE.

That Huron College is now passing through deep waters, owing to various causes, I am free to admit. We have great anxieties, but I trust that through God's blessing all will be right at last. The Rev. Principal Miller is now leaving us, and his departure will be a loss to the Diocese at large. He has labored with great zeal, and with extraordinary ability, for the spiritual weal and welfare of the young men committed to his charge, whose love and gratitude he has deservedly earned. I wish to bear my testimony to the great fidelity with which he has always borne witness to the truth—for Christ, and Christ only, has been his incessant theme—to acknowledge the brilliant talents and diversified gifts he has always brought to bear on those masterly compositions with which he has not only delighted, but edified and instructed his hearers.

We shall all be more than pleased to hear of his future prosperity, and most cordially would I assure him in your name, and in the names of all those who live within the wide circuit of his influence, that wherever his future lot, in the guidance of God, may be cast, he will have our prayers, our sympathy, and profound respect.

As regards the College itself, I wish to make three statements for the quieting of all rumors that may disturb the minds of many.

*First.*—That the College, under no financial pressure, is going to be closed. With God's blessing, it will not only be kept open, but ere long rise safely from all its pecuniary embarrassments.

*Secondly.*—We think that the College is entitled to claim, and ought therefore heartily to receive, the cordial and liberal support of the whole Diocese.

*Thirdly.*—I sincerely trust that the effort which is now being put forth by Mrs. Boomer, the widow of the late Dean, in her accustomed energy and ability, will be met by the hearty and vigorous response which it most assuredly deserves. A college which has the education of all the candidates for the office of the Holy Ministry within the Diocese as its present and prospective work, ought surely to receive our substantial sympathy and aid.

## ECCLESIASTICAL PATRONAGE.

I need not here repeat the strong but necessary language with which a few years ago I condemned, before this Synod, the most objectionable practice of preaching "trial sermons." What I then said, I would iterate and reiterate, only adding that the practice cannot possibly be put down unless by the united action of all the clergy. So long as some of the clergy go and perform before wondering congregations, to solicit their sympathy and support, the evil will undoubtedly be maintained. My advice is, out of respect for your holy calling, please await the open door which God may set, and which no human power can possibly shut. I wish also to say that

#### HURON LAY WORKERS' ASSOCIATION.

I wish to call your attention to the fact that the annual gathering of the Huron Lay Workers' Association was held on Wednesday and Thursday, October 31st and November 1st, in the City of Brantford, last year. Mr. Dymond, who is the whole life of the institution, displayed his usual zeal and ability in working up interest in the cause, and in bringing together those anxious for the development of that great, but, at present, only nascent power: Lay co-operation and work.

The Rev. Mr. Downie, also with commendable zeal, had with his committee worked up the Sunday School cause so that the whole subject of its growth and expansion was by various speakers most ably and amply discussed.

The Convention was largely attended, and all the visitors most hospitably entertained by the loving friends in Brantford, who deserve our warmest thanks for their kindness and consideration.

The next Convention will be held, God willing, at Windsor, and I would bespeak a warm and enthusiastic attendance.

#### THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

I desire to record with gratitude and joy the growth of this most important and Christ-like organization. The Society has grown materially, and I trust in spiritual power, enlisting everywhere the sympathies and support of those so well calculated to do good and efficient work. #### OBITUARY NOTICES.

Since last we met in Synod, the Lord has been pleased to call to His eternal rest the following clerical members of our body:

*First.*—Our late honored and beloved brother, the Rev. Wm. Buchanan Rally; ordained deacon by the Rt. Rev. Dr. McLlrairie, Bishop of Ohio, Nov. 13th, 1853, at Delaware in that State; priest, by the same Bishop, Aug. 30th, 1854, at Cincinnati. He was licenced at Haysville, Nov. 6th, 1856, by the Right Rev. Dr. Strachan, Bishop of Toronto. From Haysville he removed to

Mitchell, from Mitchell to New Hamburg, and from New Hamburg to Tyrconnel. He was superannuated in July, 1871. He will long be remembered among us as a man of singular piety and devotion. His scholarly attainments, his wide experience of men and manners, his courteous and affectionate disposition, made him to be beloved by all who knew him. The memory of the just is blessed.

*Secondly.*—The Rev. Thomas Exmouth Sanders; born at Plymouth, England; ordained deacon by the late Bishop Cronyn, at St. Paul's Cathedral, London, June 19th, 1859; and priest, by the same Bishop and at the same place, Sept. 23rd, 1860. Served at Walkerton, Lucan, Tilsonburg, Norwich and Delhi. He was superannuated in 1881. ## Receiving Report of Executive Committee.

The annual report of the Executive Committee was presented, and printed copies distributed. The printed audited accounts were also placed in the hands of the members of the Synod.

The Executive Committee beg to present herewith their annual report, together with the printed audited accounts and tabulated statement of the collections and assessments received during the year from each congregation in the Diocese:—

## TOTAL FREE-WILL CONTRIBUTIONS AND ASSESSMENTS.

The total free-will contributions, fees and assessments for the year amount to \$21,165.47. This is \$231.64 less than 1894; \$283.36 less than 1893, and \$146.24 more than 1892.

Of this amount, \$12,037.89 was for Diocesan objects, being \$252.17 less than the previous year; and \$9,107.05 for other than Diocesan objects, being \$20.53 over the previous year.

## GENERAL PURPOSE FUND.

The amount of subscriptions and Parochial Association collections received, to the credit of this fund, was \$5,096.10, as against \$4,639.61 for the previous year, showing a gratifying increase of \$456.49.

The sum of \$553.00 was paid to Lay Readers, Indian interpreters and school teachers; \$16.91 for grants to Sunday schools; \$470.00 for special

THE MISSION FUND.

The collections for the year ending 30th April, 1894, to the credit of this fund, including the special collection (\$716.73) in December, 1893, towards the Maintenance and Mission Fund deficit, amounted to \$3,859.12. The subscriptions and collections for the year just closed were \$3,554.44, being \$304.68 less more, excluding same.

The collections made on Bishop's visits amount to \$101.41; Donations, \$216.38; Sunday School Lenten Offerings appropriated to the Mission Fund, \$28.35; Interest on Mission Fund Investments, \$197.74; Sustainment Fund, Investments, \$2,554.65; Interest transferred from Commutation Fund, less interest on overdraft, \$3,409.09, being \$732.64 less than in 1894, and \$3,414.53 less than in 1893, and \$3,746.17 less than the average amount transferred from this fund for the past ten years.

The sum of \$278.96 was received from the Women's Auxiliary Missionary Association towards the stipend of the Incumbent of Lion's Head, for which the thanks of the Synod are due.

\$15,059.24 was paid under the provisions of the Mission Fund Canon to clergymen in charge of parishes, and \$200 for outfit grants, leaving the Mission Fund overdrawn at the end of the year \$14,693.87, an increase of \$2,593.07 for the year just ended.

CONTRIBUTIONS FOR DIOCESAN OBJECTS.

At the last session of Synod an important change was made in the Constitution with regard to the contributions from each congregation for Diocesan objects. A contribution of not less than one dollar per family was required from each parish, the manner of raising the same being left to the parishes themselves, either as heretofore or as may by each of them be deemed most expedient.

The result of this legislation can only be judged by a comparison with previous years of the returns from the several parishes.

The returns show that in many parishes there has been a very large and gratifying increase over the previous year.

The Committee regret that in not a few parishes the required contribution has not been raised.

Your Committee, however, venture to express the hope that the experience gained as to the ability of every parish to contribute not less than one dollar per family for Diocesan objects,—79 of them in all parts of the Diocese, comprising city, town and rural congregations, having done so; and the experience also gained as to the best method of raising the required contribution, now left optional,—will result in much better returns for the current year.

The amount of the required contributions from the whole Diocese, on the basis of one dollar per family, was \$14,241.65; the amount actually received was \$9,533.04, or about 67%.

Had each parish raised the exact amount of its required contribution, the Mission Fund indebtedness would have been reduced to \$10,609.53.

The following congregations—79 in number—equalled or exceeded the amount required of them:—

To the Deaneries of Waterloo and Norfolk belong the credit of being the only Deaneries raising the full amount of their required contributions. The percentage that each Deanery raised is as follows:—

For the year ending April 30th, 1894, the Mission Fund Debt increased from \$4,605.71 to \$12,100.80, or \$7,495.09. Had the same rate of increase continued during the past year, the debt would have amounted to \$19,595.89. So that it may be said the amendments of last Synod have effected a saving of at least \$4,902.02.

The grants paid to Clergy for the year ending April 30th, 1895, amounted to \$15,059.24, and for the previous year to \$17,926.56; a difference of \$2,867.32.

The Committee are pleased to notice that both local co-operation and local self-support have been developed, and that the system of assessment by local assessors has worked satisfactorily; the assessments for clerical stipends having been increased in nearly every Rural Deanery.

They recommend that the Annual Missionary Meetings be held as far as possible in the months of October and November, before the roads become impassable in country districts, and when the people are better able to subscribe largely than at a later date.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE SYNOD.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

This Fund continues to meet all demands upon it, and has been able, notwithstanding the withdrawal of the grant from the General Purpose Fund, to carry \$500 to capital account, which now amounts to \$67,000.

The sum of \$1,173.61 was received from collections and subscriptions; donations, \$3; entrance fees and subscriptions, \$650; and interest on investments, \$3,504.81; \$5,140 was paid to widows and orphans of deceased clergymen.

One widow, Mrs. Rally, widow of the late Rev. W. B. Rally, has been placed upon the fund, and one widow, Mrs. Caulfield, widow of the late Canon Caulfield, died during the year.

COMMUTATION FUND.

There are at present twenty clergymen upon this fund, of whom four are commuted and sixteen superannuated clergymen; the Rev. W. B. Rally and the Rev. T. E. Sanders having died since last Synod.

SYNOD EXPENSE ACCOUNT.

The Synod assessments received amounted to \$788.50; charges on various funds for management, \$2,478.79; interest on General Purpose Investments, less interest on overdraft, \$128.93.

After payment of the various charges upon it, the Fund stood overdrawn, at the end of the year, \$2,813.74. At the end of the previous year it was overdrawn \$1,443.45; an increase of \$1,370.29.

CONSOLIDATED CAPITAL ACCOUNT.

The rate of interest earned for the year upon the consolidated capital account was 5.554785%.

This is somewhat lower than last year, caused chiefly by the payment, in July last, of \$80,000.00 of debentures, bearing 7% interest, and the lower rates of interest since current.

New loans on mortgages, to the amount of \$105,479.00, were made, and Building Society stock to the amount of \$30,729.30 purchased during the year.

The Committee begs to acknowledge the following additions to the capital account:—

**Trivitt Memorial Church, Exeter.**—\$2,000.00 received from the executrix of the estate of the late Thomas Trivitt, for an endowment for the Trivitt Memorial Church, Exeter, the proceeds therefrom to be applied to the keeping of said church always insured in a sum of not less than \$10,000.00, and also towards the keeping of the same well and sufficiently repaired at all times, and the remainder towards the maintenance and support of the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said church forever.

**Trinity Church, Zorra.**—\$467.08 received through the wardens, from the executors of the estate of the late Charles Armstrong; the interest thereon to be applied towards the payment of the Incumbent's stipend; and in case the said Trinity Church ceases to be a church, then said sum to be repaid to the next of kin.

Receiving Reports of Other Committees of Synod.

1. The Report of Committee on Sunday Schools:

In presenting their annual report, the Sunday School Committee desire to respectfully state that they have put forth their best efforts to provide and have on sale at the depository a carefully selected stock of the publications of the S. P. C. K. & R. T. Societies, suitable for Sunday School library and prize books. The large demand for and constant sale of these books in the Diocese show that their labor in this direction has not been in vain.

The Committee have taken great pains to keep constantly on hand a good supply of Prayer Books and the Hymnal Companion at suitable prices, and it is pleasing to state that the circulation of the Prayer Book from the depository in the Diocese during the last four years has been over 5,100 copies, and the Hymnal Companion over 5,000 copies.

Some time ago the Committee ordered from the Sunday School Institute, London, Eng., a selection of their admirable Lesson Helps on Old Testament History—the Gospels, the Acts of the Apostles, the Catechism, Prayer Book, and the Church's Seasons, together with Teachers' Admission Cards, Admission to Confirmation Cards, and Confirmation Memorial Cards. Up to this time, however, the Committee are sorry to state little or no use has been made of them by the Clergy and Sunday School workers, which is remarkable when the very great excellency of these publications is considered.

The Committee cannot help remarking that very little time is given to the consideration of Sunday School subjects during Synod week. This is greatly to be regretted, as the subject is of vital importance, and the Committee would strongly recommend setting apart one evening during Synod week for the consideration and discussion of Sunday School work. In some of the Dioceses of the American Church the first day of the Synod is devoted to this subject.

The Committee have obtained from the London (England) Sunday School Institute information, given in response to their circular of inquiry to the various Dioceses composing the great Anglican Church.

The circular of inquiry asked for information on subjects embracing S. S. statistics, plans and methods. While the circular was not responded to as largely as it ought to have been, considering its importance, still much useful information was obtained. This Diocese gave, perhaps, the fullest reply of any, and was alluded to by the Institute Committee in the following terms:—"On the whole, there seems to be an excellent Sunday School spirit in the Diocese (Huron). The possibilities of immense usefulness seem to be clearly apprehended. The Clergy recognize the importance of the work and give the best of their attention to render it efficient. And the Diocesan Committee take infinite pains to collect and disseminate information, and bring about the formation of new schools in unoccupied places."—(S. S. Magazine, May, 1892, p. 422.)

The Committee, desirous of learning from other and kindred sources anything that might be useful to our work, lately wrote to all the Bishops of our sister Church in the United States, asking for reports, plans and method of Sunday School work. From the kind replies—reports and papers received in answer to their request—much useful information has come into possession of the Committee.

In one of the best-worked and most flourishing Sunday Schools in the City of New York, no pupil is admitted unless his or her parents or guardians sign a card, stating that they will co-operate with the school authorities in securing their punctuality, diligence, and good behavior and attendance during the whole year, and attendance at the church. In many of the Sunday Schools, reports of the standing of the pupils are sent to the parents quarterly.

In every Diocese from which reports have been obtained, Sunday Schools are held even where the number of attendants would, in the nature of the case, be very small. That is, where the number of church families are few. Thus many schools have only an attendance of from five to fifteen pupils.

This plan of conducting Sunday Schools, with even a few pupils in attendance, is strongly commended by this Committee, and might, they feel sure, be followed in not a few places in this Diocese.

The missionary spirit is generally cultivated in the Sunday Schools of our sister Church. In many schools a Missionary Lesson is taught each month, and a collection taken up on that Sunday for missions.

Some of the Dioceses, especially the newer ones, have a Sunday School Superintendent appointed by the Bishop, whose duty is to open Sunday Schools in new places, and visit the older Sunday Schools when requested by the incumbent.

Following in part the admirable plan of our Sunday Schools in the U. S. A., your Committee would strongly recommend that a Missionary Lesson be taught at least once a quarter in all our Sunday Schools, and that the offerings of each School on that Sunday be devoted to missionary purposes.

The Committee would again affirm the very great importance of instructing our scholars on the lines so distinctly marked out by our Church, viz.:—The Bible, Prayer Book, and Catechism, and would respectfully suggest to the Ruri-decanal Chapters that they might arrange for an annual examination of all the Sunday Schools in their deaneries on these lines.

The Committee would respectfully suggest to His Lordship the Bishop the desirability of appointing Sunday School Superintendents members of the Ruri-decanal Chapters.

The Committee would recommend that Bible Classes be encouraged by every possible means. They should be regarded as an integral part of the School. This would do away with the idea that any one is "too old to attend Sunday School in the Church," is a sentiment of great hope.

The Sunday School of the Church of the Holy Apostles, Philadelphia, is an excellent example. The cause of its success is thorough work. Besides the forty ordinary Sunday School classes, there are twenty-one Bible Classes. From that School the young men and women have not withdrawn, but are in its Bible Classes training for future usefulness in the Church.

"What shall we do with unruly boys?" is a question which often puzzles Sunday School officials. Would it not be better, after every effort to reform has proved unavailing, to expel such, rather than allow them to remain, perhaps to the injury of others, if not of the whole school.

The Committee would respectfully suggest to His Lordship the Bishop that, wherever practicable, a children's service be held previous to confirmations. This would bring all the children out, and forcibly impress them with their baptismal obligations, and their position in the Church.

The Committee are glad to state that Annual Ruri-decanal and Sunday School Conventions are held generally throughout the Diocese, and are most successful.

The Committee take this opportunity of referring with thankfulness to the very successful Annual Diocesan Lay Helpers' and Sunday School Conventions, which have now become an important feature of Diocesan work, and they desire to gratefully acknowledge the very fraternal relations which exist between the Lay Helpers' Committee and their own.

## 2. The Report of the Committee on Temperance.

### Receiving Petitions and Memorials.

1. A memorial was presented from Mrs. H. A. Boomer, with reference to Huron College:

LONDON, ONT., 18th June, 1895.

To the Bishop and Members of the Synod:

MY LORD AND GENTLEMEN,—Although my knowledge of Synod rules and methods has been mainly gathered from a bird's-eye view from the gallery, or from a remote bench, within only tantalizing reach of an occasional voice, I have learnt enough to know that to obtain a speedy hearing for any subject, however

important, that subject must be presented at a very early stage of your proceedings, or it runs the risk of being crowded out altogether amidst the rush of business which precludes the closing of any Synod for a whole year to come. It is to bespeak this early hearing, and to implore your patient consideration of the crisis in the history which Huron College has reached, that I now venture, most respectfully, to memorialize you. If a matter of such vital importance to the Diocese of Huron be not effectively dealt with *now*, if it should, through any misconception of the gravity of the situation, be shelved for another year, its epitaph may as well be written to-day.

It is because I believe that there does exist this misconception as to the nature of its place and work, that I lay aside all diffidence and womanly scruples, and raise my feeble voice to implore you no longer to delay to face the responsibility of either providing a way for its maintenance, or else of showing sufficient reason for permitting to be starved out of existence, a College which is a monument to the past, as the accomplishment of the long-cherished desire of the heart of Dr. Cronyn, the first Bishop of Huron, was indebted to the patient and continued exertions of Dr. Hellmuth, its second Bishop, and which, not only within these walls, but in a letter to his Clergy, introductory to the plea which His Lordship gave me so cordially his permission to write, has been earnestly commended to you by the present Bishop of the Diocese.

Gentlemen, had the response to that appeal been more generally encouraging from those to whom it was *individually* addressed, I might not have had the courage to venture upon the expedient of appealing to you *collectively* now; but, as I am assured that many are awaiting the action to be taken at this Synod before responding to my plea, I trust that, even if my doing so may provoke your criticism, it may not be without its reward. Donations to the amount of some \$350 have been generously sent to me mainly from individuals. Two parishes only (that of Galt, and the Memorial Church, London) have responded to the Bishop's request to aid Huron College, and but two of the Alumni (but they have done so with marked liberality) have, so far, forwarded contributions. It has been said that the eighty different parishes under the charge of Huron College men should represent eighty different centres, from which should emanate hope and help for their Alma Mater; also that, as in Huron Diocese there are 280 stations, if

The more the Diocese helps Huron College, the more surely will its influence and its usefulness be widened and developed. May we not believe that there are, in the 280 stations of our Diocese, men and women who would respond to an appeal on behalf of Huron College, if only its claims were earnestly, conscientiously and systematically brought before them?

That some such scale may be adopted, that some systematic plan for the supply of the growing needs of Huron College may be formulated by the Synod of 1895, is that for which your petitioner prays.

At the present moment we are giving special attention to the question of County Industrial Houses for the destitute poor, and we are asking that every County in the Province shall either erect independently or unite with an adjoining County in establishing a Poor House or Work House.

We have been endeavoring for several years to awaken public interest in this important question, and we are glad to see that in a number of the Counties there seems to be a move in the right direction. In the County of Huron a farm has been purchased, and the building is well under way.

In each of the counties of Bruce and Perth, I understand a committee has been appointed to make enquiries, and to report to the Council. We would like to see Essex and Kent fall into line.

We are also interested in the question of the Reformatory for Young Men, which the Dominion Government are proposing to locate at Alexandria, Glengarry County. We are asking that commissioners be appointed to enquire into the working of the best Reformatories of other Countries, and to mature a scheme for the organization of the proposed Reformatory before the Government is committed to any definite policy with regard to the same.

If you find that you can aid our cause in any way we will be very thankful.

Receiving Notices of Motion.

1. By Mr. Chas. Jenkins :

That a committee be appointed to consider the advisability and expediency of petitioning the General Synod to take measures for bringing before the next Pan Anglican Conference the question of a revision and expansion of the ordinal for Deacons (the Bishop to be chairman), and if the Committee approve of such action, then to draft such petition and report at next meeting of Synod.

2. By Mr. W. J. Imlach :

That His Lordship be requested to annually appoint a committee of this Synod, on the question of Religious Instruction in the Public Schools of the country, with power to co-operate with similar committees of other Diocesan Synods or other religious bodies moving in the same direction, and to report from time to time to this Synod.

3. By Rev. Robt. Sims :

That the Bishop be respectfully requested to appoint a committee to draft a resolution expressing the desire of this Synod to record its gratitude to Almighty God for the success vouchsafed to the Reformers in Spain and Portugal in carrying on their work, and thankfully welcomes the consecration of a Bishop for the Spanish Reformed Church ; and desires to express heartfelt sympathy with His Grace the Archbishop of Dublin and the two other bishops that were associated with him in the administration of that sacred rite, and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Archbishop of Dublin.

4. By Rev. G. B. Sage :

Whereas the Institute Leaflets for Church Sunday Schools, issued by the Inter-Diocesan Sunday School Committee, and claiming the authority of the Provincial Synod, did, on the 17th day of February last, set forth doctrine contrary to the plain statements of the Prayer Book : Be it resolved, that this Synod condemns the false teaching of that leaflet and refers the matter to the Provincial Synod for such necessary action as that body may in its wisdom direct.

## 5. By Rev. Dr. Beaumont :

(a) That, in view of the momentous issues involved in the question of Separate Schools in Manitoba, this Synod of the Diocese of Huron, in session assembled, hereby expresses its cordial sympathy with the people of Manitoba under the circumstances in which they are now placed by the attempt made to force upon them that system of Separate Schools which, by the unanimous voice of the people and the enactments of the Legislature, has been condemned, and trusts that both the people and the Legislature will remain firm in the stand they have so decidedly taken.

(b) That any action taken by the Dominion Government, of a coercive nature, to secure the restoration of the Separate Schools will be regarded by this Synod as an invasion of the Provincial rights of Manitoba and an unconstitutional interference in a matter rightly coming within the sphere of Provincial legislation.

(c) That the system of Separate Schools in general is highly objectionable, and positively pernicious, inasmuch as it fosters party feuds, hinders the unification of the different elements of society, and constitutes a permanent barrier to the prosperity and peace of this highly-favored and rapidly-advancing Dominion of Canada.

## 6. By Judge Ermatinger :

That the hearty greeting of this Synod be extended to the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Canada, now in session in this city, and that the Synod desires to express its admiration of the noble efforts and generous and self-sacrificing spirit shown by the Presbyterians of the Dominion in their missionary efforts : And that the Bishop be requested to name a committee to present this resolution to the General Assembly.

## 7. By Rev. Canon Young :

That, in the opinion of this Synod, the proportion of expenses of management of the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society, to the total disposable income, is altogether too large.

### Receiving Reports of Committees.

3. The report of the Huron Anglican Lay Workers' Association:—

*To the Synod of Huron :*

London, June 18, 1895.

The Committee of Management of the Huron Anglican Lay Workers' Association beg leave to report as follows :

The Committee desire particularly to call the attention of the Synod to the good influence the Association has exercised in bringing together for encouragement and information, as well as for agreeable social intercourse, representatives of the whole body of church workers in the Diocese.

This could only have been effected by the cordial and brotherly co-operation of the Synod Committee on Sunday Schools, in which most important department of church work so many devoted women as well as men are engaged. Some of the ablest as well as most interesting papers and addresses presented to the annual conventions, of which four have now been held, have related to Sunday School methods and management.

Most valuable assistance has also been rendered by co-laborers in other dioceses, both men and women, some of whose contributions have been distinguished by great ability and a wide grasp of the important questions they have discussed.

The Committee earnestly bespeak the kind assistance of both clergy and laity in the endeavor to maintain, under the Divine blessing, the spirit and usefulness of these conventions. They venture to suggest that by a little local effort difficulties in attending the meetings from parishes at a distance might be overcome. Where the expenses of a delegation would fall heavily if borne by one or two they would be quite inappreciable if the cost were covered by the small contributions of the many. The pleasant duty of extending hospitality to all comers is gladly discharged on these occasions by local friends.

The convention for the coming year will, by the invitation of the Rector and hearty support of the large church population of the southern and south-western portions of the Diocese will, it is anticipated, secure a very large attendance. The latter fact, however, has been felt to entitle our brethren in the west to special consideration.

The Committee are glad to observe that a local Lay Helpers' Association has been formed in the See City of London, and to learn that it is doing a good and aggressive work. The existence of such associations in strong centres of church life and activity has been found of the highest value in the United States.

Not a few new congregations have been formed there by lay agency, and many old forsaken churches have been re-opened and filled by the ministrations of laymen employed until the time has come for regularly-appointed clerical and pastoral oversight.

In some dioceses in the United States the direct supervision of lay effort is undertaken and directed by an archdeacon or other high dignity of the church, always subject, of course, to the general approval of the Bishop.

The question of parochial organization is one of no little importance, and the Committee of Management invite the particular attention of the Synod to the information given on this point in the report of the Association for 1894.

Organizations certainly abound, but organization with a view to an economy of time and effort locally and to some uniformity in the general methods adopted by different parishes, is certainly not superabundant. Great liberty of action in this regard is, however, an essential to all successful voluntary efforts.

The total expenditure of the Association for the past year, chargeable to Synod funds, amounts to \$59.63.

In conclusion, the Committee respectfully appeal to the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese for their continued help; especially would they welcome advice as to the topics to be debated at the conventions, or in respect of any other means by which the objects of the Association may be advanced.

The Committee on the Extension of the Episcopate beg to report that they met in joint conference with the representatives of the Synods of Toronto, Niagara, and Algoma, in February and March last, and that the joint conference agreed upon the following report, which is herewith presented :—

- 1. That no more rearrangement of boundaries of existing Dioceses would meet the necessities of the Church in regard to Episcopal supervision.
- 2. That a new diocese be constituted as speedily as possible, consisting of the counties of Grey, Bruce, Dufferin, Simcoe, and N. Wellington.
- 3. That Waterloo, Brant and Norfolk be detached from Huron and attached to Niagara.
- 4. That the present Episcopal endowments remain intact, and that a new endowment be raised for the proposed new diocese.
- 5. That such arrangements in relation to the various Trust Funds—other than Episcopal—shall be made as shall be found just and practicable.

6. Report of Committee on Provincial Reorganization :

The Committee on Provincial Reorganization herewith submit the report of the Synod of the Diocese of Toronto upon the subject, and commend the scheme therein contained to the Synod for adoption.

7. Report of a Committee of the Synod of the Diocese of Toronto on a Provincial Synod for the Civil Province of Ontario ; adopted by that Synod on the 13th of June, 1895 :

The Committee to which was referred the consideration of the steps to be taken to resolve the present Ecclesiastical Province of Canada into Ecclesiastical Provinces co-terminous with each Civil Province of the Dominion, and of the resolutions of the last session of the Synod bearing on this subject and of the report made to the Synod by the Special Committee on the Union of the Church in British North America, adopted at the session of 1889, beg to report as follows :

- 1. That this Synod should affirm its adhesion to the following recommendations contained in the report of the said Special Committee :

"(1) That the Dioceses existing within any Civil Province should have power to organize themselves into an Ecclesiastical Province. That in such Ecclesiastical Province a Provincial Council or Synod should be formed by representation, as may be agreed upon, from the several Diocesan Synods in the Province, and that the Bishops of the Province should constitute the Upper House of such Provincial Council or Synod, and that the head of such Provincial Council or Synod should be an Archbishop, to be elected by the Bishops of the Province. That, where necessary, two or more Civil Provinces may be grouped together, so as to form a Joint Provincial Synod under the presidency of an Archbishop as before provided, and that such Joint Provincial Synod should have the power of framing internal enactments for the needs of the several Provinces.

"(2) That such Provincial Council or Synod should meet regularly once in three years, and that special sessions may be held as often as the interests of the Church may require.

"(3) That the Provincial Synod should have power to act for the Church in reference to all matters of Provincial legislation affecting the Church, and should be charged generally with the oversight of all matters, educational or otherwise, affecting the welfare of the Church in such Province, and that the Synod should have power to enact Canons for the Church in that Province in reference to all questions arising out of the Church Temporalities or Religious Institutions' Acts, duties of Church officers, etc., etc. That the House of Bishops in each Ecclesiastical Province should exercise the same powers with regard to the Dioceses within that Province as are now exercised by the House of Bishops of the present Ecclesiastical Province of Canada."

2. That the memorial appended to this report, and which is submitted for approval, be presented to the Provincial Synod at its ensuing session in 1895, asking for such action to be taken as may be necessary to give effect to the said recommendations.

3. That it be an instruction to the Delegates from this Diocese to the Provincial Synod to support the prayer of the said memorial.

4. That a copy of the said memorial and of this report be transmitted to the Bishops of the other Dioceses in the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada, and to the Lay and Clerical Secretaries of the several Synods, asking for their co-operation in the matter.

5. That your Committee be reappointed for the purpose of assisting in carrying out the recommendations of this report.

But the Bishop may, for good and sufficient cause, dispense with the condition of residence.

II. Every Clergyman entering the Diocese, either by Ordination or from another Diocese, shall receive an appointment, and for one year only, either as *locum tenens* or Curate, during which time he shall be entitled to the benefits of the Mission Fund and the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, but not to any other fund of the Synod.

#### Religious Instruction in the Public Schools of Ontario.

A communication from the Honorary Secretaries of the Diocese of Toronto was read, respecting religious instruction in the Public Schools of Ontario.

On motion of the Rev. John Langtry, seconded by the Rev. C. L. Ingles, the following resolution was adopted by the Synod of the Diocese of Toronto, on the 14th of June, 1895 :

"Whereas the ultimate object of Education is not the mere imparting of knowledge, but the formation of character; and,

"Whereas it is admitted that high character and an enduring civilization can only be secured by the due exercise and development of the moral and religious element of our human nature; and,

"Whereas such exercise and development can only be secured by the constant and careful instruction of our children in the Faith of the Gospel, and by keeping before them, as the only true ideal of life, the character of the perfect and pattern Man our Lord Jesus Christ; and,

"Whereas there is no sufficient provision made in the Public School System of this Province for such systematic instruction being given during school hours;

*Resolved*—That it be referred to a Committee of this Synod to act with Committees of the other Diocesan Synods, and of the other Religious Bodies of this Province; and that this Synod do petition the Legislature of Ontario so to amend the School Law as to make provision for such Instruction being given for one half-hour daily during school hours, by the Ministers of the various Christian Communities, or their Representatives, to the children of their own Communion;

*Provided*, always, that no child shall be required to attend such religious instruction in any case where parents or guardians object, such children as are now exempt during the time allotted for religious teaching, shall be instructed in morals."

By unanimous consent, the motion, of which notice has been given by Mr. W. J. Imlach, on Religious Instruction, was taken up as bearing upon the subject of the communication.

REV. BROTHERS AND BROTHERS OF THE LAITY:—

"In looking back upon the work done, the most serious legislation which we have had was in reference to the finances of the Diocese, and I can only trust that the members will labor for

the removing of the debt and the placing of the Synod in the best possible light, and the funds on a good, sound basis. The next most important legislation is the proposed change in the limits of the Diocese. Make it a matter of prayer. It is a matter of deep moment, and we wish to do only that which is best. The appointment of a committee to see that the Public Schools are given a half-hour's religious instruction daily is also one of vast importance. The true education of our young is foremost when we see the secularization of the young of our age, and it consequently behooves us to endeavor to put in a plea for their education in the eternal truth. We will now depart with three determinations:—First, to pray more earnestly for the weal and influence of the Diocese; second, to be bound closer together in the principles of unity and fraternal love; and thirdly, to do more in our daily life in the building up of the blessed kingdom of our Redeemer and the establishment of His Church in this particular part of His vineyard."

The doxology was sung and the Bishop dismissed the Synod at 12 o'clock with the benediction.
