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Botsford Poor Rates.

To the Editor of the Post.

DEAR SIR:—I saw last February in one of your issues an article from some one in the Parish of Botsford, who signed himself as "Ratepayer," wanting to know the reason of the unprecedented rise in the poor bill of Botsford for the year 1886. I was as much surprised as "Ratepayer" but am unable to give the reason. Naturally the first impression on the minds of every ratepayer is that there was mismanagement somewhere. The fault may be on the part of the overseers, or it may be from different causes. Possibly the overseers, on account of the National Policy and the general prosperity of the country, though they could do better by the poor than heretofore, or it may have been owing to the prospects of a speedy relief of the Liberals to power that the overseers have fed the poor to the full, so that no charity would be required through five years of misrule and general starvation for all; but in my opinion it was owing to circumstances over which the overseers had no control. "Ratepayer" thinks the councillors should give the public more information with regard to the way the parish money is expended.
