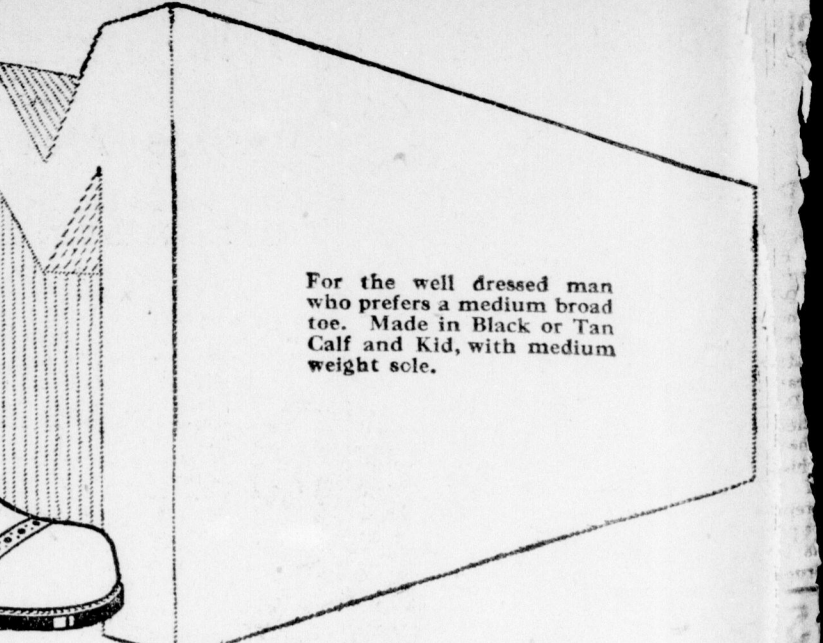

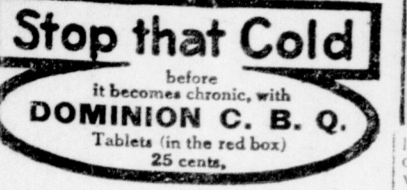

Technical Education? In the estimates \$24,100 is provided for technical education. Some Settlements Are Entirely Wiped Out.

BODIES DEVoured BY DOGS

Appalling Condition May Be Disclosed When Communication Resumes.

MONTREAL, March 26.—The Montreal Star today publishes the following dispatch from St. Johns, Nfld.: By mail to Battie Harbor and wireless to this city comes intelligence of shocking conditions in Northern Labrador as a result of influenza, small-pox and measles which swept the coast during the winter. Earlier in the season reports of deaths on the southern section of the coast showed that over twenty-five per cent of the natives succumbed.

The first reports from the northern section reached here over the wireless on approximately 30 per cent of the inhabitants on that area of the coast. At Nain forty Newfoundlanders who wintered on the coast for purposes of trade succumbed and forty old Eskimauk also died, while in districts practically the whole population of that section.

CO-OPERATIVE CO. CONTROLS NEARLY WHOLE HARROW DIST.

All Fruit Production To Be Handled by Organization.

LEAMINGTON, March 25.—The Erie Co-operative Company of this place are again widening the scope of their activities by taking over the Kingswood and Harrow fruit-growing districts, adding about thirty growers and making it practically impossible for a wholesale firm to deal with individual fruit and vegetable growers. Instead they must deal with a well-organized company, to which nearly every grower in this district belongs, each holding an equal share in the company.

CRISIS REACHED IN COUNTY OF OXFORD

No Deaths Occurred in Last 24 Hours.

[Special to The Advertiser.] WOODSTOCK, March 26.—The crisis has been reached in the influenza epidemic which has been raging both in the city and surrounding country for some time. The doctors state that no deaths have resulted in the last day or two directly from the influenza, and the improvement is due evidently to the fine warm weather, which appears to have an adverse favorable effect than the cold snappy weather of winter.

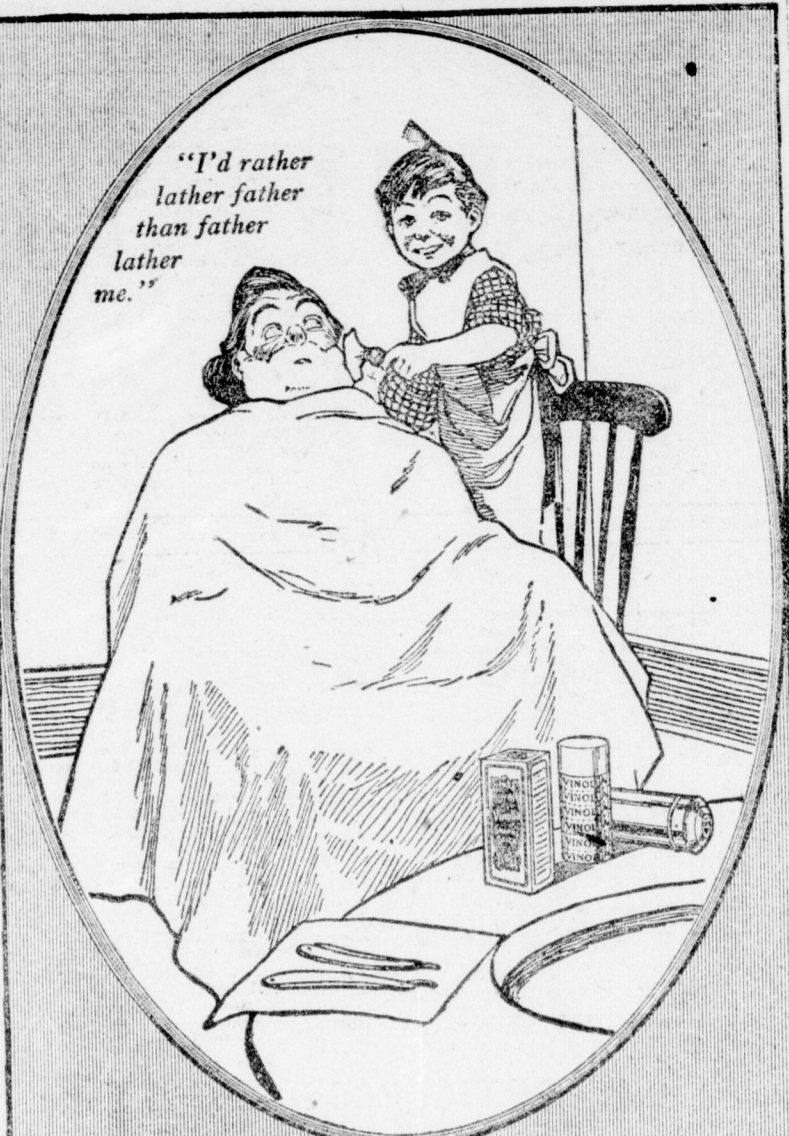

PARIS, March 26.—Premiers Lloyd George, Clemenceau and Orlando and President Wilson continued today their series of conferences to clear up the most important questions which have been debated since the return of the peace conference. PARIS, March 26.—The Prussian national assembly has voted unanimously against the relinquishment of Germany of any of the Rhine territory, especially the Sarra Basin, according to special reports from the front.

VLADIVOSTOK, March 25.—Definite corroboration of reports of Bolshevik outrages in European Russia was secured here when the bodies of two Russian officers, mutilated and showing evidence of torture, were found in First River last Thursday. 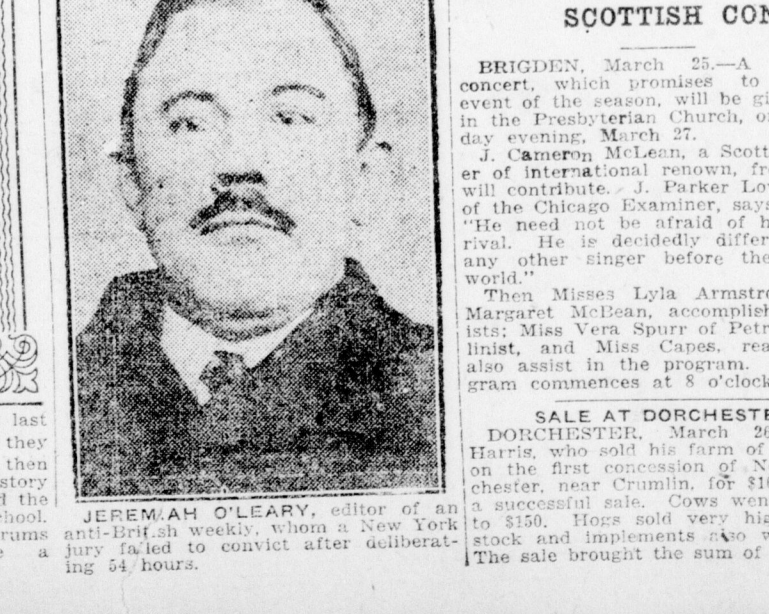

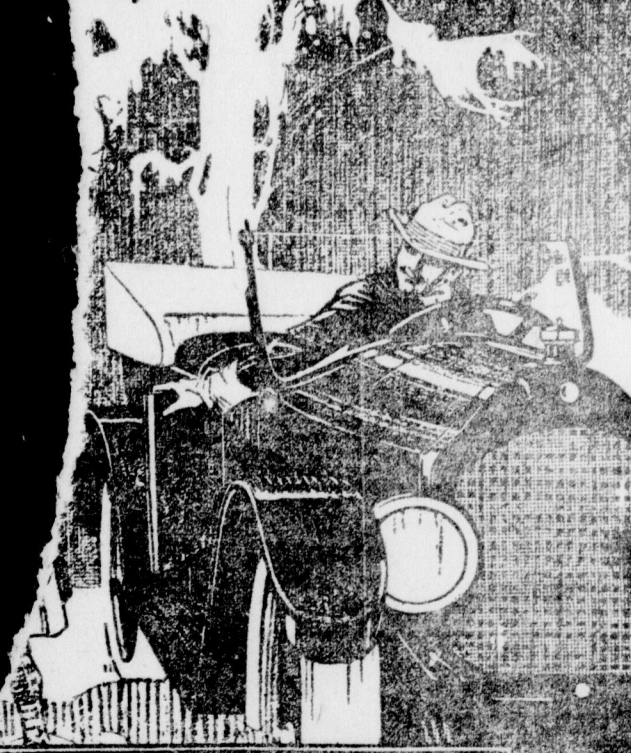

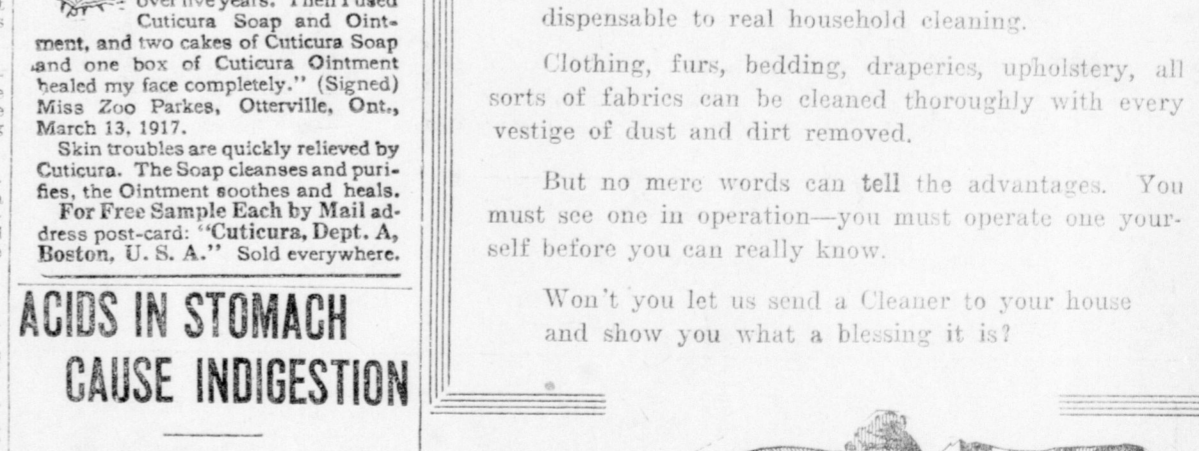
