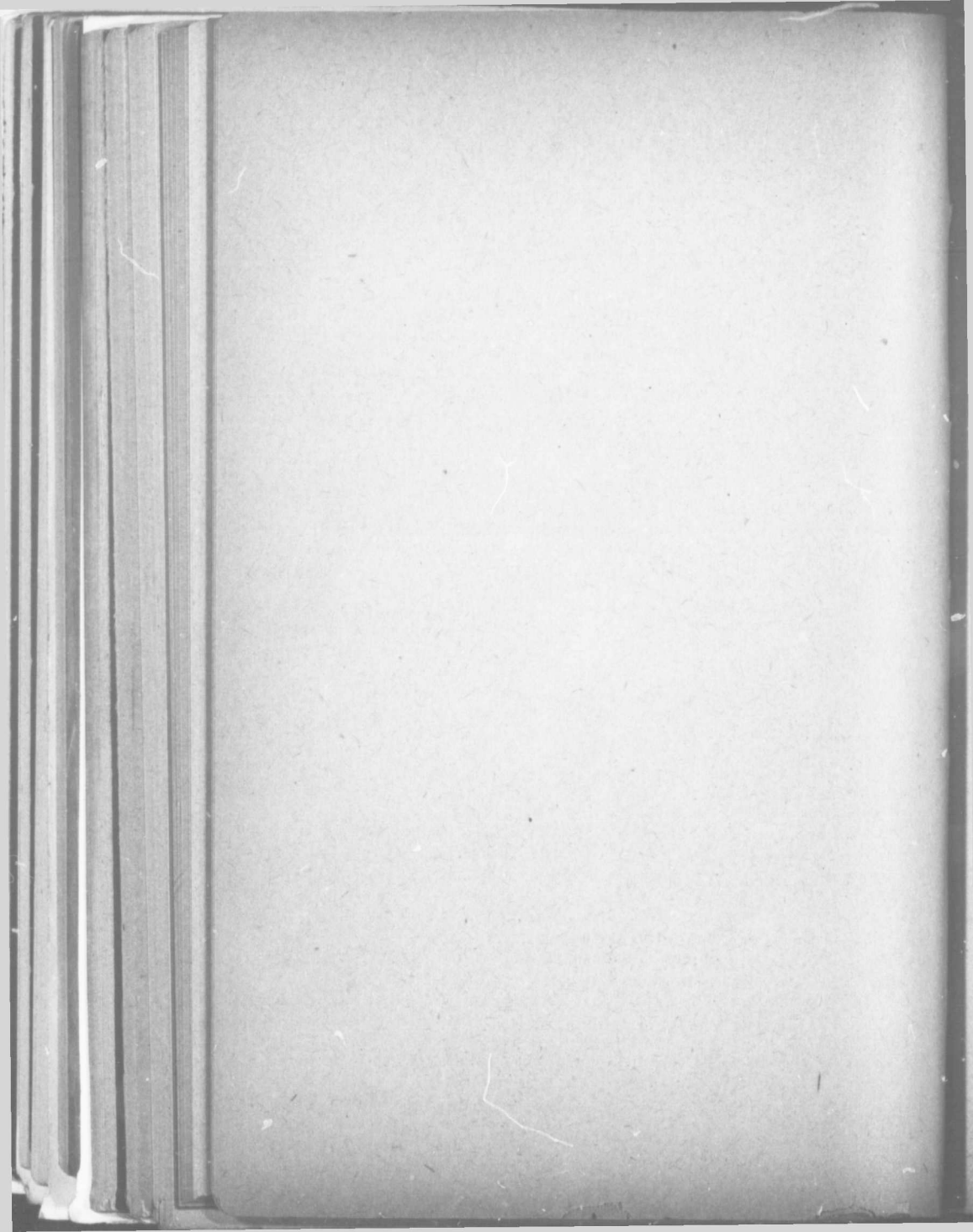

## BOYS' HOME.

### THIRTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING.

The thirty-seventh annual meeting of the Boys' Home was held in the hall of the Y. W. C. A. Building, 18 Elm St., February 22nd, 1897.

Among those present were:—Hon. G. W. Allan, Rev. H. M. Parsons, Rev. Dr. Mockridge, Dr. Thornburn, Rev. Mr. Kuhring, Rev. W. G. Wallace, Rev. Alex. McMillan, Rev. Wm. Patterson, Mr. Warring Kennedy, Mr. Angus Macmurchy, Principal Macmurchy, Mr. David Fotheringham, Ex-Ald. MacMurrich, O. A. Howland, M.P.P., Rev. Dr. Potts, Rev. Prof. Wrong.

Hon. G. W. Allan presided, and Rev. Dr. Parsons opened the meeting with prayer.

Letters of regret for unavoidable absence were read from Hon. G. W. Ross, Sir Cacimir S. Gzowski, Mayor Fleming, Rev. Dr. Sullivan, Rev. A. H. Baldwin, Mr. R. N. McPherson, Rev. Dr. Jordan, The Bishop of Toronto, and others.

The Rev. W. G. Wallace, was then asked to read the Secretary's report as follows:

The Lady Managers of the Boys' Home have much pleasure in presenting to the public their thirty-seventh annual report, which will, however, be brief, the year just ended, though rich in blessing, having been unmarked by any events of importance.

The number of boys in the Home on December 31st, 1895, was 108, and 73 were admitted during the year, making a total of 181. Of these, 13 were sent to places

and to farms, 56 were removed by parents or friends, and one died, leaving 111 in the Home Dec. 31st, 1896. During the past year 9 boys have completed their term of apprenticeship, receiving on account \$368.11. With two exceptions, all have left part of their earnings in the care of the treasurer. One of the boys drew all his money to make "first payment" on a fifty-acre farm, adjoining his home for eight years, with the kind assistance and advice of the farmer with whom he has been living, who is to exchange work, etc., with the boy, their calculations being made to pay for the farm in five years. The sum of \$419.69 has been received for the boys during the past year, making the amount \$2,294.41 at the credit of the "Boys' Apprentice Fund."

The managers regret to report the death of one boy, Henry —, from heart disease. He had been very delicate from the time he entered the Home, and in fact all his life, and to him death was a happy release.

The general health of the boys throughout the year was good, quite free from disease of any kind, until about the first of October, when from some undiscovered cause a mild form of scarlet fever appeared in one of the dormitories. The patients were at once sent to the Isolation Hospital, where they made rapid recovery. Every possible care and known precaution was used to prevent the infection from spreading to the other dormitories, and with so much success that the school was continued all the time. The managers are very thankful to report that no fatal or even serious cases resulted, and beg to express their very sincere thanks to Dr. Sheard, Medical Health Officer, for his valuable advice and kind assistance in their time of need.

The managers refer to the medical officers' report for full particulars, and again take occasion to express their deep gratitude to their most faithful and devoted friend,

Dr. Thorburn, for his continued interest in the health and welfare of the boys; and to Dr. J. E. Elliott, whose kind attention and services have at all times been ungrudgingly given. Grateful acknowledgment is made to the manager of the Victoria Hospital for Sick Children, for continued kindness in keeping an open door for the reception of any little ones who may require extra care, either in the City or in the Lakeside Home.

Some changes have taken place on the Board of Management during the past year. The managers regret the retirement, through continued absence from the City, of Miss Lawson and Miss Maude Beatty, consenting to part with tried and true friends with much regret; and with very sincere sorrow record the removal by death of a much beloved and esteemed member, Mrs. Cockshutt. We miss her, and cherish her memory with affection.

The boys continue to make satisfactory progress in the school, under the very efficient care of Miss Hodgert and Miss Kerr, whose interest and devotion to the boys cannot be too highly praised.

The continued depression, or rather the now too familiar and expressive words “hard times,” still continues. Want of work compels many unfortunate parents to part with their boys, rather than see them suffer from hunger,



and place them in a temporary home, where they know they will be kindly cared for, until they can take them home again. In consequence, the managers have been obliged to admit more than they really had room for.

The want of a nursery and additional laundry room is still very much felt.

The Sunday School is still under the care of its esteemed Superintendent, Mr. Robert Kilgour, and his devoted assistant as Musical Leader, Mr. S. B. Brush, ably supported by faithful assistants.

The managers have again much pleasure in referring to the worth of the Matron, Miss McKay, and her valued assistants, particularly in their devotion to the boys during the existence of the fever, in the latter part of the year, and it is felt that too much cannot be said in their praise.

The Christmas dinner and tree were both very successful, cheered with the presence of about ten "old boys," who assisted in the carving and other duties with real pleasure; the boys are always welcome. Particular mention may be made of one, who had come from Minnesota in search of information regarding his parents, early history, etc., and was pleased to find his correct name, and that he was twenty-nine years of age instead of thirty-five as he believed. He was an inmate of the Home about twenty-four years ago, and seemed delighted to return to this, perhaps the only home he had ever known. It was pleasing to see how kindly he remembered the Matron, Miss McKay. He is now a corporal in the regular army of the United States, belongs to the Foresters, Knights of Pythias, etc., and is really a fine-looking man.

As usual, the "Home" correspondence continues to be of interest. Charlie says:

I have a very good place, we have twenty-two cattle and three horses and a good barn, it is a good warm barn, and we have eleven sheep, nine pigs, and I have a good time.

Of course "John" helps me to feed the cattle and horses, and I don't think I could find a better place in this country, although I have to work a little bit hard. I am getting good wages, I have good clothing, and I was not out very long, it was only one summer, till they got me a good suit of clothes, and now this fall they got me a good new overcoat, and again this is all made up it makes up good wages. I don't have to work hard in the summer time at all, the first summer I just nursed the baby and fooled around. Now I will close my letter. I forgot to put this down. I had a good Christmas and a happy New Year, and I hope you had too. Please answer my letter as soon as you can. Now I will close my letter. I don't think I "spelt" every word right. Yours truly, CHARLIE.

Another says :—

DEAR FRIEND,—The weather has been fine until to-day, which has been very wet all day. I am well at present, and hope this will find you the same. *I am at home yet*, and have been all summer, as I did not get the situation calculated to get last fall, but expect to leave soon, as I am going to hire with Mr. D.'s brother, just across the road. He has offered me \$110 and my board for a year. Would you please be kind enough to tell me the amount of money that is in the Bank for me, and also the address of Thomas Cherry; he was my favorite chum at the Home, and I would like to hear from him. Take my many thanks to all the ladies of the Home. I still remain,

Your loving friend, HENRY C.

Another, whose time has just expired :

I am quite satisfied to let my money stay there. I had not the first thought of taking it out. My sister wanted me to take it out and put it in the P. O., but I think it is well with you. Mr. C. offered me 6%, but I said I would leave it where it is, if you will send me \$25, because I do not

get anything in the winter, besides the farmers would rather pay the whole at once, and I am to get \$100 at the end of the summer. I am surprised at my sister going to see you, as she would not go with me. What she wanted to know was, if I used tobacco or drink. I hope I never will, although I have had lots of offers of it, I have never tried it yet. There is a lot around here does. Next house to us there are four or five men, and they all use it, and think it smart, and I think if it suits them it suits me; I know it will never do them any good.

I thank Mr. C. for the schooling I have got. Lots of the boys do not go to school at all after they come to the farm. Nearly all the Home boys around here are from England. One fellow would not know his own name if he saw it, and others are nearly as bad. We are cutting wood for the school now. I am having an easy time since I came from Toronto. Your friend, J. C.

This boy has \$159.12 in the Treasurer's care, and of him Mr. C. says: I think you would be perfectly safe in letting John have all his money, as he seems as if he would take good care of it. He has been a good, industrious boy, I will be pleased if my own boys grow up to be as good as he is. If this boy's early home surroundings could be described, all would be better appreciated. His sister, once an inmate of the "Girls' Home," is a fine, well doing young woman.

The managers would also make grateful mention of pleasant trips to Island Park, Hanlan's Point, Victoria Park, Lorne Park, Sabbath School picnics given by Cooke's Church, Southside Presbyterian Church and All Saints, by the captains of local steamers; and to Mr. Hill, manager of the Industrial Exhibition for free entrance, and to Mr. Mackenzie for free conveyance in special cars to and from the Exhibition, all of which the boys enjoyed very much. Also to Mr. Hill for kind invitation at Christmas time to

see the Cinematograph, to Mr. Osler for his annual gift of a new ten cent piece to each boy, to Mr. Carruthers for \$25 for special Christmas treat, which, with \$5 from the Lady True Blue Orphanage and some other smaller sums, enabled the Matron to provide a nice present for each of the 111 boys, who, bright and happy, were present to receive them.

In conclusion, the managers pray that the dear Heavenly Father, whose beloved Son said, "Suffer little children to come unto Me," will bless the work they have in hand, and which He has so far allowed them to continue with success.

### THIRTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL MEDICAL REPORT OF THE HOME.

---

During the past year the Home has been visited by no fewer than three epidemics.

The first was scarlet fever (scarlatina), which broke out among the inmates early in October. Thirty-one boys were attacked by the disease, of whom twenty-one were sent to the Isolation Hospital, and ten cared for by ourselves.

The second epidemic, mumps, (parotitis) appeared in December, attacking twenty-four boys. These boys were kept at home.

The third epidemic was chicken-pox (varicella), which appeared early in January, attacking some ten boys, who were also sent to the Infirmary.

It is a somewhat remarkable fact that so many boys were affected with these three diseases; eighteen had scarlet fever, followed by mumps and chicken-pox; four had scarlet fever and mumps alone; two had mumps and chicken-pox; one had scarlet fever followed by rheumatism.

It affords me much pleasure to say that there were no deaths among these boys.

Early in the season one little boy succumbed to disease of the heart; this being the only case of death recorded during the year.

I think it might be of interest to give a resumé of the history of the Institution in regard to diseases since its establishment in 1859.

Since then 2,338 boys have been admitted. In 1862 we had an epidemic of whooping-cough, scarlet fever and measles, and two deaths occurred; in 1867 we had one death from consumption; in each of the years 1868, 1869 and 1870 we had one death; in 1871 we had an epidemic of measles and typhoid fever, and lost one boy; in 1872 measles and scarlet fever prevailed, and in that year we lost one boy from tuberculosis; 1880 quite a number of boys were attacked with croup and ulcerated throat, and one died. In 1881 there was a great deal of illness,—principally measles and whooping-cough; we escaped, however, without any deaths; in 1882 we had measles, whooping-cough and mumps; in 1883 one death occurred and in that year we had mumps and inflammation of the respiratory tract accompanied by a contagious ophthalmia; in 1886 some thirty-five boys suffered from enuresis, and there were two deaths that year; in 1887 a very troublesome scalp disease, (*tænia tonsorans*) spread among the boys; in 1888 la grippe and measles prevailed, and that year the Home met with a loss which we all very much felt, namely the death of Mrs. Munro, our excellent Matron; in 1889 we had one death, and in that year we had also measles, mumps and

la grippe, and two cases of diphtheria; in 1890 we had measles and catarrh, with one death; in 1893 we had one death; in 1895 measles, chicken-pox and ringworm were prevalent, and one death occurred.

You will remember I stated at the beginning of this report, that since its founding no fewer than 2,338 boys have received the care and protection of this Home. This alone should be a source of much gratification; but the fact that out of that large number—many of them poor and wretched, pale and emaciated, half-starved and vicious in habits and dirty in body when admitted—we have had no more than nineteen deaths, should be still more gratifying, and is truly a remarkable experience.

I frequently visited the several parts of the building and its surroundings, and found that cleanliness was a first law in the Home. The latrines are regularly flushed and kept clean, and the sanitary condition is very much improved.

I would suggest, however, when you can afford it, to have a second room for the laundry. At present there is only one room set aside for laundrying purposes, and in wet weather the clothes have to be dried in the same place in which they are laundried. The effluvia arising from this ascends to the different apartments in the building, and is not conducive to health, not to say anything of comfort.

I regret to say that on Thanksgiving day our attending physician, Dr. Elliott, received an injury by falling from his horse, so that since then I have had the whole attendance.

You will pardon me if I allude to a personal matter—I still have the greatest regard for the Home and all connected with it and feel the same interest that I did when I first became an official of it, at its inception in 1859. I feel, however, that I cannot devote that close attention to it that I formerly did. Increasing years make it a matter



of anxious labor and I think it would be advisable that a second Acting-physician be appointed, especially one residing near the Institution who might be able to act, in case from any cause, the ordinary physician could not be procured, and I would suggest the name of Dr. Wm. J. McCollum, 166 Jarvis Street, for that position.

It would be an oversight if I did not mention to you how efficiently Miss McKay performs her duties as Matron, and I could not pay her a greater compliment than to say that she is a worthy successor to the late Mrs. Monro.

The public cannot too highly appreciate the gratuitous services and sacrifices of the lady Directors.

#### MEDICAL REPORT.

We present to you to-day the Thirty-seventh Annual Report of the health of the Home. Since our last report, one boy, a very delicate lad for many months, died in May last.

During the early part of the year, the health of the boys was excellent, but in October last the Home was visited by an epidemic of scarlet fever. Thirty-one boys were attacked with it, twenty-one of these were removed to the Isolation Hospital and as there was no more room in the Hospital we were obliged to move the school to its old quarters in the main building and use the infirmary building for the remaining cases.

It is very satisfactory to know that all of these boys made perfect recoveries.

Since January 1st, 1897, five boys were attacked with chicken-pox and twenty-four with mumps. All made perfect recoveries.

During the epidemic of scarlet fever the Medical Health Officer examined the capacity of the Home and notified us that there was only sleeping space for 90 boys. It will thus necessary to refuse any further applications for admission be until the number at present in the Home has been reduced below 90.

The Home has been disinfected and every particle of clothing and bedding has been sterilized under the supervision of the Medical Health Officer.

The friends of the Home may now feel perfectly free and safe to visit it without fear of contracting or conveying any disease.

You will thus see that the late sickness in the Home has entailed a great deal of extra work and anxiety upon Miss McKay and her staff, and this report would be incomplete were we not to state that one and all did their duties with the greatest of satisfaction.

## OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

---

### *Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.*

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer, and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meeting, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minute of the preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution, and also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the Managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Society; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation shall visit the "Home" daily, each week; inspect the house; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at 11 o'clock a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the direction of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

---

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys ; to conduct the household affairs generally ; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee ; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of five to twelve are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May ; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., dinner at 12, and tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys ; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or at play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School and Divine service in a Protestant church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron ; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend of the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
