The laborer is worthy of his hire, is a maxim acknowledged by every community. To defraud a mechanic is looked upon as a great moral wrong, and we trust that the day is not far distant when it will be next to an impossibility for unprincipled persons to do so. He who faithfully labors to earn an honest living, by the sweat of his brow, is a good member of society, while the man who schemes through the world, living upon the result of the hard earnings of others, is not entitled to be called a man. That this latter class is largely represented in every community, our every day experience compels us to admit. For the purpose of partially remedying this unfortunate state of things, Mr. Crooks has introduced into the Legislature of Ontario, a bill providing for giving a lien upon buildings in course of erection. Many of the provisions contained in this bill will be hailed as a boon by our tradesmen. The bill provides that any contractor or machinist building a house, or furnishing machinery for an establishment, shall have a special lien upon the same, in fact shall have a mortgage upon it, until it is paid for by the owner. Should this provision of the bill become law, the workingman will not loose his wages through the railure of his employer, because, in addition to the lien on the building, he also holds a mortgage on the land upon which it is erected. So far as the bill secures a preference claim to workingmen for their wages, it has our hearty approval. In all cases wages ought to have the first claim, because the toiling mechanic generally speaking, requires his weekly stipulation for the support of his family, and cannot afford to lose a dollar of it without suffering to those for whom he cheerfully bears the burden and heat of the day. Such lien shall absolutely cease to exist within sixty days after such work has been completed, or materials or machinery furnished, unless in the meantime proceedings are instituted under the provisions of the Act.
